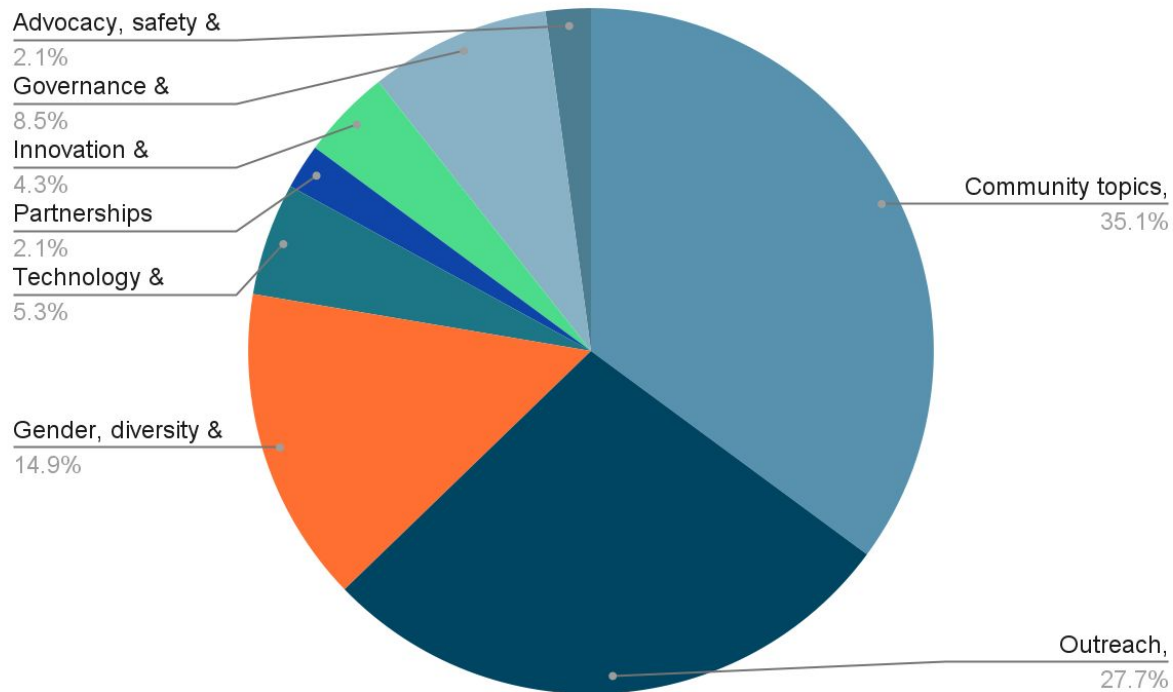

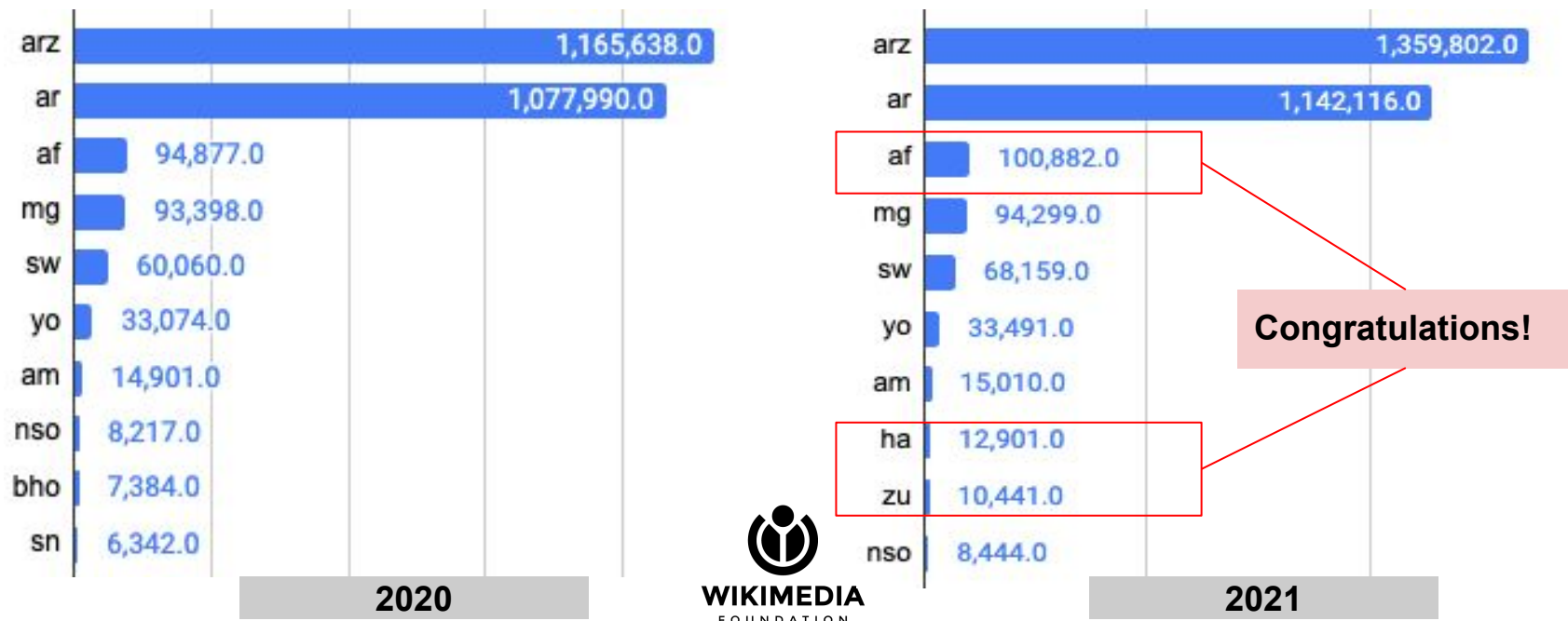

- Sophisticated documentation

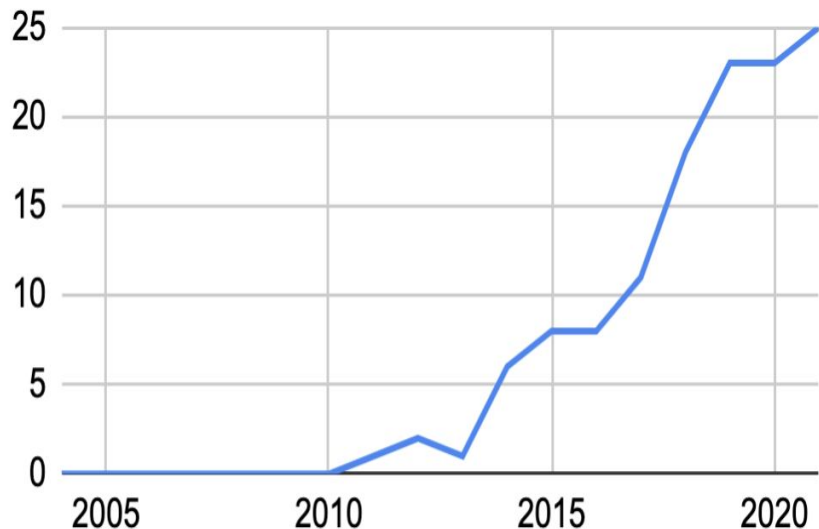
# Challenges & Opportunities for Editors

We also have five (5) more community groups working towards affiliation:

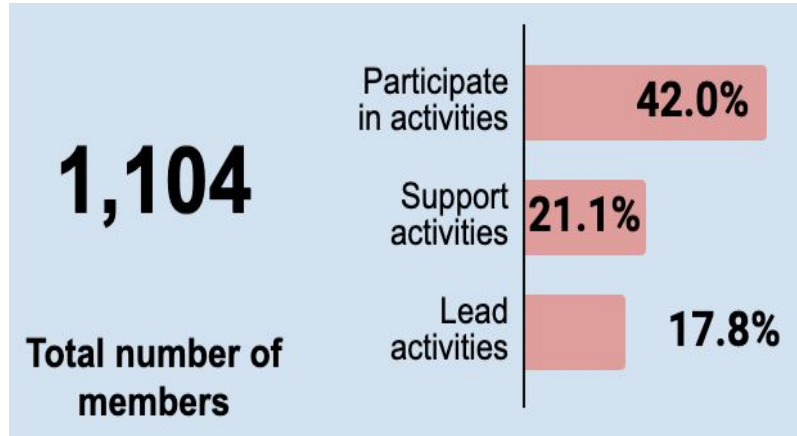

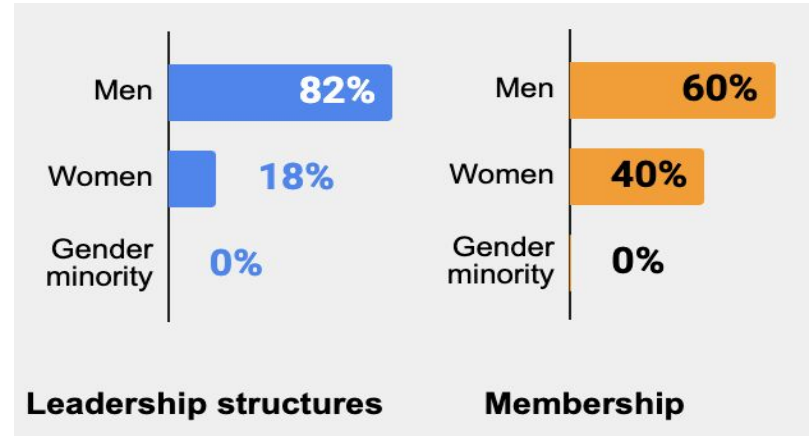

African affiliates have a good Membership pool from which to draw volunteers to participate, support and lead activities.

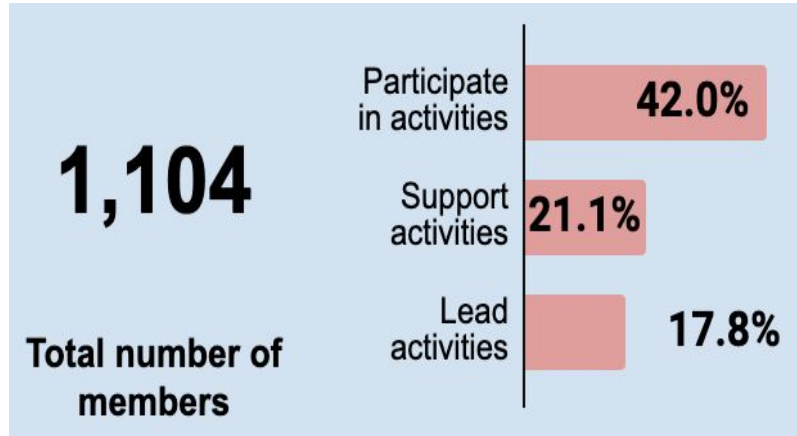

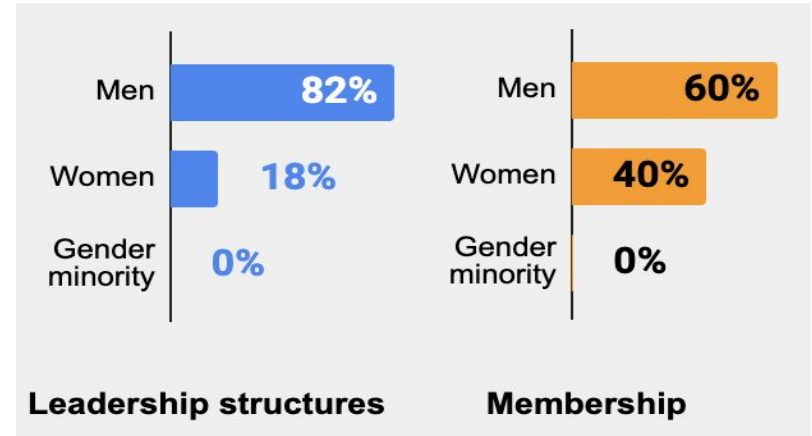

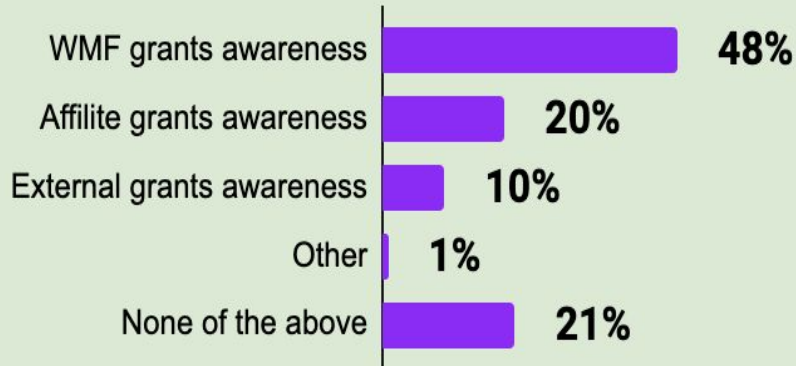


# Affiliates Need to Plan for Growth

- 3 On-wiki Technical Skills 14%

## Top 3 Program types focused on:

- 1 Meet-ups 27%
- 2 Content Editing activities 22%
- 3 Photo-Upload activities 15%
