When people feel the need of an acid, if they would let vinegar alone and use lemons or sour apples, they would feel just as well satisfied and receive no injury. And a suggestion may not come amiss as a good plan when lemons are cheap in the market. A person should at these times, purchase several dozen at once and prepare them for use in the warm days of spring and summer, when acids, especially citric or malic, or the acids of lemon and ripe fruits are so grateful and useful. Press your hand on the lemon and roll it back and forth briskly on the table to make it squeeze the juice into a tumbler—never into tin; strain out all the seeds as they give a bad taste. Remove all the pulp from the peels and boil in water—a pint to a dozen pulps—to extract the acids. A few moments' boiling is enough, then strain the water with the juice of the lemons; put a pound of white sugar to a pint of the juice; boil ten minutes; bottle it, and your lemonade is ready. Put a teaspoonful or two of this syrup in a glass of water, and you have a cooling, healthful drink.

The bread on the waters has returned to a young lady in Clappertown, Pa., after a few years. On December 28th, 1873, she met on a railroad train a lady who was very ill, and she kindly ministered to her, taking care of her and accompanying her to her place of destination. When they parted the sick woman offered to reward the young lady for her kindness and attention, but she would take nothing. The old woman wrote down the name and address, nodded familiarly to her, and said, "You will be paid some day." The young lady never saw her chance acquaintance again, but the sum of \$90,000 has recently been bequeathed to her. Healthfulness of Lemons.

When people feel the need of an acid, if they would let vinegar alone and use lemons or sour apples, they would feel just as well satisfied and receive no injury. And a suggestion may not come amiss as a good plan when lemons are cheap in the market. A person should at these times, purchase several dozen at once and prepare them for use in the warm days of spring and summer, when acids, especially citric or malic, or the acids of lemon and ripe fruits are so grateful and useful. Press your hand on the lemon and roll it back and forth briskly on the table to make it squeeze the juice into a tumbler—never into tin; strain out all the seeds as they give a bad taste. Remove all the pulp from the peels and boil in water—a pint to a dozen pulps—to extract the acids. A few moments' boiling is enough, then strain the water with the juice of the lemons; put a pound of white sugar to a pint of the juice; boil ten minutes; bottle it, and your lemonade is ready. Put a teaspoonful or two of this syrup in a glass of water, and you have a cooling, healthful drink.
