la Oswaldo DORTICCS, president of Cuba, arrived in Lina on 4 June where he was met by President FRADO and a handful of diplomats and government officials. At the Peruvian military's insistance, no military honors were accorded. The Feruvian Government, acting at the last moment, ordered DURTICUS' plane to land at Las Palmas, a restricted military base, and in doing so upset Aprista and Communist plans to hold a demonstration of support at the airport. The two-day visit was marked by a rather cold reception from the local covernment and press, with only La Tribuna, the Aprista newspaper, diving the visit front page publicity. In summary, Station Line believes that DORTICUS' visit was a failure as far as increasing public sentiment in support of Cuba is concerned.

2. The Station's KUCLGE effort to counter any adverse effects of DORTICUS' visit were instrumented by a variety of agents. The program was as follows:

a. Through DixiR-3, some 15,000 copies of a leaflet written by the Station based on Reference 1, were distributed in Lima on 3 June and 4 June. An additional 10,000 copies of a smaller heaflet propared by DikkER-3 were also distributed. Copies of these leaflets are forwarded as attachment A.

b. On 4 June Productivit devoted his nocutime radio program to an attack against Communist Febetration and manipulation of the Cuban revolution. The program was announced through paid newspaper advortisements which are forwarded for Headquerters only as attachment S. Reference B material was passed to EUF DECIMAL for his use on this progree.

o. [DELIFORGE and DUBRICH, collaborating with Aprista university students, were responsible for erecting two large banners reading. "Estamos con Cuba, pero no al Commismo", one across the entrance to the airport and another across Avenida Arequipa, one of Liza's rost traveled streets. Those banners were put up early on 4 June and later that day Communist teams managed to destroy both of them but not before they were seen by thousands of people. In addition, 30,000 copies of three other leaflets, attachments C. were distributed before and during DORTI-CCS Visit. RIDILIPORGE reported toat the Communists were distributing leaflets of their own, attachment D for headquarters only, and one of his distribution teams was attacked in the vicinity of San Marcos University.

d. In addition to highlighting anti-CANTRO, anti-Communist material on his
4 and 5 June radio and TV process. DUBHEAD also made use of a series of articles
from Caracas opposing DORTICES visit to that country.Defines articles were forwarded by Station Caracas and sale available to DUBREAD by Station Limal DUBREAD OF
Gave the articles to Aurelia Flat Quesada of El Comercia, who in turn presented them at the editorial board meeting of his paper. El Comercio, taking the clippings as an example of hecisteric solidarity against DATICOS' trip, altered its own policy somewhat and in both editorial and news columns attacked the DCRTICCS' visit. The articles are forwarded as attachment E for Headquarters only.

e. [DUBASIC, in the 4 June issue of the DUPLICITY-I magazine, launched an attack against APAA and especially Armando VIII ANUEVA for his support and promotion of the CASTRO revolution. According to DULIFORGE, this article was much discussed by the Arristas, causing a great many second thoughts on the continuation of APRA support for Cubs.

3. The Station realizes that a majority of its JMNANE progress depends on leaflots, but it is believed that it is justified when the increasing amount of Communist propaganda being produced in this manner is taken into consideration. Attached for Headquarters only are examples of La Tribung's coverage of DCRTICOS visit as well as an example of the type of Cuban propaganda which is receiving attention in Peru.
