I wish here to call particular attention to my stock of nearly 200,000 Peach Trees, and to the choice collection of varieties listed.

For the past seven years I have been continually securing, and planting in my own orchards, all such varieties of peaches as promised to be of value for Florida and the extreme South, and such of these numerous varieties as have proved to be valuable have been, from time to time, added to my nursery stock.

No expense or labor has been spared in trying to make this collection of peaches the most valuable ever grown in America, of varieties adapted to Florida and the Gulf Coast Region. All the prominent new varieties that have originated from the Peen-to and Honey have been secured, many of them at large expense. For one variety, the Angel, I paid \$25 for a single tree one year ago. One or two valuable varieties have also originated in my own seedling orchards, where large numbers of seedlings of the Peen-to and Honey and other valuable Southern varieties have been planted.

The stocks on which these peaches are budded are all home-grown by myself, from *Florida native seed*, of which fifty bushels, or more, are planted annually. Only budded varieties of peaches are listed. Seedlings will be priced upon application.

Please notice that everything shipped from these Nurseries is warranted positively free from root-knot or other insects, and fully up to the high standard maintained by these Nurseries during the past six years.

The low prices herein named are only guaranteed to hold good on stock engaged, and orders accompanied by one-fifth of the amount, previous to the issue of my fall Catalogue. Place your orders early, and thus make sure of just such stock as you want, and at low prices.

NOTE—The time of ripening of any particular variety varies considerably in Florida, as elsewhere, according to season and locality. Under the heading of "Season," Very Early means from April 20th to June 15th: Early, from June 1st to July 16th; Medium, from July 1st to August 10th; Late, from August 1st to September 20th; Very Late, from September 10th to November 1st.
