LATVJU TAUTAS TRAGEDIJA

Cik tālu vien varam atpakaļejoši sekot vēsturē, redzam smagas cīņas par mūsu tautas būt vai nebūt. Mūsu laikā vissmāgāk cieta tā tautas daļa, kas nespēja stāties pretī komūnistiem ar ieročiem rokās. Tie ir čekas moku pagrabos noslepkavotie un deportētie. Pirms astoņpadsmit gadiem vienā naktī apcietināja un aizveda vairākus desmitūkstošus labāko latviešu tautas piederīgo. Šī traģēdija sasniedza kulmināciju pēc Kurzemes cietokšņa krišanas — 1945. gada maijā. Un šodien tā nav vēl beigusies. Tik ilgi, kamēr dzīvos latviešu tauta, 14. jūnijss būs tās lielā sēru diena un reizē arī pierādījums par boļševiku mežonību un cilvēka tiesību izsmiešanu. Šī diena ir brīdinājums pasaules brīvajām tautām un atgādinājums mums pašiem — neaizmirst savu sūtību un nesamazināt cīņas sparu.

Kad Otrā pasaules kaļa laikā radās iespēja vērst ieročus pret boļševikiem, latvieši gāja nevien aizstāvēt savu dzimteni, bet arī atriebt piederīgos. Mēs pierādījām, ka kaļa laukā neesam uzveicami.

Tagad dažkārt dzirdam balsis, ka mēs pārāk dzivojot pagātnē. Bet šie pārmetumi nav dibināti, jo mūsu pagātne ir arī mūsu rākotnes cerība. Vismaz mūsu vecākai un vidējai paaudzei nav un nekur citur nebūs īstu māju, kā tikai pie Baltijas jūras, kur Visuvarenais pats ierādījis vietu mūsu tautai zem saules.

Jaunā paaudze vairs neizjūt saites ar dzimteni tādā mērā, kā mēs to jūtam. Dažkārt, kur vecie nav stāstījuši un mācījuši, viņiem to nemaz nav. Mums jābūt par vīdutājiem, lai jaunatne saņemtu dzimtenes garīgo tēlu. Nepārmetīsim mūsu jaunatnei latvietibas trūkumu, bet gan dosim vairāk viņiem no mūsu latvisķas pasaules un mūsu gara Latvijas! Palidzēsim viņiem klūt par labiem šīs zemes pilsoniem un reizē palikt krietniem latviešiem! Tas ir mūsu spēkos, ja tikai mēs to gribam un apzināmies. Tas ir mūsu neatliekams pienākums, ko no mums prasa mūsu tauta un Latvija.

Kad pirms piecpadsmit gadiem atstājām dzimteni kaļa dārdos, devāmies pretī nezināmam liktenim. Arī tagad ir līdzīgs stāvoklis, jo lielākā daļa no mums, kuŗi gribam atgriezties dzim-

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tenē, nezinām kad varēsim to darīt. Arī senie zemgalji pēc Tērvetes kaujām atstāja dzimteni apmēram 100 000 cilvēku. Viņi aizgāja uz Lietuvu, bet — cik zinām — nekad vairs neatgriezās. Cerēsim, ka mūsu liktenis nebūs tik jauns!

Apvāršni jau sārtojas, un nav vairs tālu tā diena, kad izšķirsies arī mūsu tautas nākotne.

Vācu armija jau top, un, ja naidīgiem spēkiem to neizdosies aizkavēt, tad boļševiku vara tiks iznīcināta.

Mums nav jābaidās no kaŗa, jo tas var nest mūsu tautai brīvību, kaut arī prasis upurus. Draudi ar atomu un ūdeņraža bum-bām vairāk jāvērtē līdzīgi gāzu briesmām pirms Otrā pasaules kaŗa. Nürnbergas tiesa ir brīdinājums tiem, kuri gribētu izvēlēties necilvēcīgus kaŗa vešanas paņēmienus. Jāievēro, ka arī lielākās eksplozijas vēl neizšķir kaŗu, pamatā arvien paliek cilvēks.

Dzimtenē palicēji šodien nebeidz skatīties uz Rietumiem tāpat, kā tas notika Kurzemes cietokšņa pēdējās dienās. Pirmā kārtā viņu acis meklē mūs, jo viņi domā un grib ticēt, ka mēs darām visu iespējamo savas zemes un tautas brīvības labā.

No dzimtenes pienāk ziņas par turienes nacionālo tautiešu lielo vienprātību. Viņi dalās ar pēdējo maizes donīnu un nevar saprast, kāpēc mums šeit nav kopējas politiskas vadības.

Mums jārada neatkarīgi institūti, kas zinātu laiku un vietu, kur iestāties. Būtu jārada Latvijas brīvības fonds. Ja gribam kā tauta pastāvēt, mums atliek tikai viens ceļš — cīnīties. Mēs būsim tik stipri, cik stiprs būs mūsu gars; bet gļēvi kļūsim, ja nodosimies materiālismam.

Varbūt negribam vairs dzirdēt tos vaidus, kas nāk no mūsu apspiestās zemes un no Sibīrijas vergu nometnēm?! Tur tautieša vietā, kurš vairs nespēj vergot, paņem un aizved dēlu vai jau-nāko brāli. Tai pat laikā apspiedēji runā par „režīma mikstināšanu“ un „koeksistenci“, kamēr mēs nevarīgi noskatāmies vai pat pa daļai sākam krāpniekiem ticēt. Cik tālu un cik ilgi tas tā vēl ies?

Arī šodien tirgojas ar tautām un valstīm, un to vislabāk pierāda mūsu izcilā valstsvīra Dr. M. Valtera aizrādījums Že-nevas lielo konferencē 1955. gadā. Te skaidri pierādās, ka šāda veida jautājumi nepatikami pie attiecīgu darījumu slēgšanas ne tikai boļševikiem, bet arī Rietumu sabiedrotiem, uz kuriem mēs liekam visas cerības. Būsim cīnītāji, ceļu un veidu ir daudz! Nepievilsim mūsu tautu dzimtenē, ieklausīsimies viņu lūgšanās! Mēs, visi trimdinieki, esam latvju tautas sūtī un pilnvarotie. Nesīsim un dosim kaut vai tikai desmito daju no tiem upuriem, ko viņi izcieš dzimtenē! Tad panākumi būs daudz lielāki, tie

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neizpaliks, ja bezbaigli un pašaizliedzigi cīnīsimies. Un kad pie nāks atgriešanās diena, bez kauna un bailēm varēsim skatīties tiem acīs un teikt, ka mēs piederam pie latviešu tautas, jo par to esam cīnījušies. Un kāda ir patiesība šodien? — Mēs klīstam pa svešu zemuļ lielceļiem, bieži vien nevajadzīgu putekļu ir tik daudz, ka trūkst spēka un sāk zust ticība. Kaut ko jau mēs darām — ziedojam dažus dolārus gadā aprūpei, kāra invalidiem, latvisķu kultūras saglabāšanai utt., bet pats galvenais — cīņa par Latvijas brīvību — paliek novārtā. Būsim nomodā, vērtēsim pasaules notikumus un attiecīgi iestāsimies par mūsu tiesibām, tad arī mūsu tautas traģēdija reiz izbeigsies. Neatstāsim savu tautu vissmagākajos apstākjos likteņa varā — cīnīsimies par tās tiesibām uz brīvību, tad arī Dievs mums palīdzēs un mēs visi būsim vairāk gandarīti.

Pirms četrapadsmit gadiem mūsu zemē apkusa kāja troksnis, un latviešu 19. divīzija, kas cīnījās viskrietiņāk, bija spiesta uzdot organizētu cīņu neuzvarēta. Kopā ar kurzemniekiem un Kurzemē saplūdušiem bēgļiem (ap 600 000 cilvēku) tā aizgāja Golgatas ceļu. Mēs bijām iztirgoti, bet tas nemazina mūsu karavīru nopelnus un cīņu jēgu.

Šī sēru diena sakrīt ar Mātes dienu, un nav šaubu, ka tā bija un ir vistunāšākā diena latviešu mātēm, jo viņas nesagaidīja pārnākam savus dēlus. Tikpat skumja šī diena ir arī Mātei — Latvijai, jo tad norietēja viņas brīvības saule.

Bet reiz nāks viņai atkal jauna diena, kaut arī caur jaunu postu, ugunīm un asinīm. Šai dienai mums visiem jāgatavojas! Vienosimies visi ap diviem vārdiem — par Latviju, tad arī panākumi neizpaliks. Neviena cita tauta nedz valdība šos vārdus neprot un nespēj novērtēt tā, kā mēs paši tos izjūtam, tādēļ arī bez mūsu iestāšanās tie netiks pacelti tik augstu, lai mēs būtu gandarīti!

Renti iemaksās vai nu tās sapēmēja kontā Rietumvācija (ja tāds tam ir), vai arī kādā tā kontā ārzemēs. Pārējos gadījumos rentes piešķirtas pa pastu. Ja rentes sapēmējs vēlas, tad renti iemaksās kādas citas personas kontā Rietumvācijā. Formulārā ir ipašs jautājums, tur prasa, kādā veldā renti vēlas sapņt, resp. katram jāuzdod adrese, kur renti iemaksāt. Rentes ārpus Rietumvācijas izmaksās attiecīgās valsts vālūtā pēc attiecīgā vācu markas kura.

Izpildot militāro vai līdzīgu dienestu sabojājis savu veselību, 2. cietuši šādos gadījumos: a) tiešas kāja sekas (ievainoti), b) atrodoties gūstā, c) internēti kā vācieši, d) sakarā ar militāra vai tamlīdzīga dienesta sekām, ja tīcīs sodīts vai bijis ieslodzījumā, un to var uzskaitīt kā netaisnību.

Par militāro dienestu uzskata dienestu armijā, volkssturmā, lauku žandarmerijā un flaka baterijās (Heimatflabatterien). Rentes maksā arī kāja atraitnēm, kāja bārepniem un pusbārepniem un arī karākritušo večākiem (pēdējiem — ja kritušais dēls bija vai kļūtu apgādnieks un parādījās nav ienākumu).

Kāja atrašnes, dodoties jaunā laulībā, saņem vidiņreizēju atlīdzījumu 36 mēnešu rentes apmērā. Pusbāreņiem renti tomēr maksā tālāk arī šados gadījumos, t. i. ja māte devusies jaunā laulībā. (Skat. J. Logina rakstu „Pārskats par kāja invalidu rentēm”).

Rentes kapitālizāciju nevar izdarīt arī ārzemēs dzīvojošie vācieši, jo kapitālizācijai trūkst pamatojuma, resp. kapitālizēt var tikai tie, kas dzīvo Rietumvācijā un rentes kapitālizācijai ir pamatojums — māju būvel, ipašuma iegādel jeb eksistences uzbūvei piem. mašīnu un darba riku iegādel.

DROSMES UN GARA BRUNINIEKS

Bruņinieku krusta kavalleris Roberts Ancāns četrdesmitgadnieks.

Roberts Ancāns ir dzimis 1919. gada 11. novembrī Abrenes apriņķa Tilžas pagastā kā vienpadsmitā atvase Marijas un Antonas Ancānu bērniens svētitajā lauksaimnieku ģimenē. Roberts turpat Tilžā 1933. gadā pabeidza sešklasīgo pamatskolu, bet vasarās brīvlakā pilda gana galtas tēva mājās, Ilelajā Grīvu mežā, kur brīvā dabā attista savu balsi, dziedot tautas dziesmas. Dziesmu gars patikama liriskā tenora letērpa un izcilus enerģīja jubilāru ir pavadijis visus jaunības, cīpu un trimdas gadus.

Jubilāra māte bija dziļi reliģioza sieviete, klusibā viņa cerēja, ka no Roberta varētu iznākt labs garīdznieks ar skalstu balsi, tāpēc viņa sūta dēlu uz Aglonas ģimnāziju. Taču Roberts ir iepēmis prātā staigāt karavira gaitas, un tāpēc pēc gada viņš pārlet uz Kārsavas pilsētas ģimnāziju. Jau skolas gados jaunais censonis parāda ilelu interesi militāral audzināšanal, un kāja rotājās viņš arvien ir zēnu vadonis. Zēns gūst izcilus panākumus arī dažādos sports veidos, tāpat mācībās viņš ir arvien starp labākajiem. Roberts kļūst aktīvs vītējās alzsargu nodajās sportists un mazpulka dalībnieks.

1938. gada pavasarī Ancāns beldz Kārsavas pilsētas ģimnāziju, un rudenī viņš uzsāk tautsaimniecības un tiesīslietu studijas Latvijas Uni-

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versitātē. Studiju laikā arī iestājas korporācijā Lacuania. Pēc viena gada studijām Ancāns 1939. g. rudenī iestājas brīvprātīgi Latvijas Ar-mijā. Ar joli labām sekmēm viņš beidz instruktora rotu pie 1. Valmieras kājnieku pulka, un 1940. gada martā tiek pārcelts uz 1. Liepājas kājnieku pulku. Tūlīt pēc instruktora rotas beigšanas, Ancāns iestādz līgumu Latvijas Kara Skolā, lai kļūtu kadets speciālists. Dienēdams 1. Liepājas kājnieku pulkā, Ancāns ir grupas komandieris, pilda bataljona rakstveža pienākumus u. c.

Boļševiku okupācijas laikā Ancāns paliek armijā, bet, ierākot vācu armijai, viņš pieslēdzas partizāniem Olaines rajonā un sekmīgi piedalās partizānu cīņās ar atejošiem boļševikiem. Tikko sāk formēt brīvprātīgo vienības, Ancāns kā vada seržants ir 16. bataljona rindās, kpt. Matcasa rotā, un 1941. gada oktobrī viņš jau izbrauc uz fronti. Aukstajā 1941./42. gada ziemā Ancāns cīnās pie Cholmas, šeit viņu smagi ievaino. Pēc izārstēšanās Ancānu komandē uz virsnieku sagatavošanas kursiem, un 1942. gada 1. septembrī viņu paaugstina leitnanta dienesta pakāpē. Kā virsnieks Ancāns piedalās kaujās pie Leiningradas, Ostrovas un tad līdz pēdējai cīņai Kurzemes cietoksnī.

Kaujā pie Ostrovas Ancānu smagi ievaino — sadragā vairākus kauju — un pēc ilgas ārstēšanās Rīgā un Vācijā viņu atlaiž no slimnīcas kā 50% kāja invalidu — derigu likal aizmugures dienestam. Tāču Ancāns atkal brīvprātīgi piesakās uz fronti, Kurzemes cietoksnī pieda-

lās vairākās kaujās un tiek atkal trīs reizes leināots. Cīņujs, kas sadzēris ar nāvi „Tu” brālibu, nav noturāms alzmugure.

Par varonību kaujas laukā R. Ancāns ir apbalvots ar 17 varonibas un goda zīmēm, bet par Izcelus drošībū un sniegumu lieļajās Ziemsvētku kaujās 1944. gadā Kurzemē viņu apbalvo ar augstāko Vācijas varonības ordeni — Brūnlieka pakāpes dzelzs kruslu. Ancāns visā cīņu laikā ir astonas reizes leināots, un vēl šodien viņš sevī nēsā 37 granātu šķembas un vienu mašinpistoles lodi. Taču tas viņu nemaz neuztrauc, tas uzlabojot tikai asins sastāvu — tā izsakās pats jubilārs, kurš šodien, četrdesmit gadu pievārīt, ir tikpat možs un izturīgs kā sīvājās frontes cīpās. Jubilāra drosmīga karavīra stāju apliecina ne tikai daudzās atzinības zīmes, bet arī viņa dlenesta pakāpes kāpšana — no instruktora līdz kapteinim kapitulācijas dienā. Kaujas laukā ANCĀNS ir komāndējis vadu, rotu, divīzijas kaujas skolu, bataljonu un atsevišķas kaujas grupas ar Izcelus panākumiem.

Ancānu dzimta ir noteikti pretholševišķi cīniāji. Jubilāra tēvu jau Pirmajā pasaules karā bolševiki apceletināja un vairākus mēnešus turēja Ludzas cietumā, jo viņš bija pret tiem cīnīties. Vecākais brālis Pēteris piedalījās Latvijas atbrīvošanā, Latgales partizānu pulkā. Otrā pasaules karā aktīvo cīnītāju rindās iesaistītas visl seši brāļi Ancāni. Virsleitnāns Augusts Ancāns bolševiku smago gūstu neiztur un mirst 1946. gadā, Divi brāļi — Alsons un Dominiks — tiek turēti vergu noometnē līdz 1955. gadam, un tikai tad atbrīvooti ar sabeigtām veselībām. Bez jūbilāra no Ancānu dzimtas brīvajā pasaulei vēl atrodas vecākais brālis Jāzeps Jānis Austrālijā.

Roberts Ancāns brīvības krastu sasniedza pa Jūru 1945. gada maija otrā pusē, pēc Kurzemes zaudēšanas. Rietumvācijā viņš dzīvo vairākās bēgļu rotacēnēs. 1950. gada 1. septembrī Ancāns nodibina ģimeni ar Ilgu Birutu Lutumu Neuburgā pie Donavas, kur viņš strādā kā invalidu pārskološanas centra inspektors-administrātors.

Ancāns aktīvi darbojas DV organizācijā, iepriekš tajā atbildīgus amatus un nostrādā DV CV un Rietumvācljas valdē septiņus gadus. Kā vēlēts tautiešu uzticības pārstāvis R. Ancāns darbojas LNP un LCP vairākus gadus — līdz izceļošanai. Vairākus gadus viņš bija arī Augsburgas latviešu komitejas priekšsēdis un tautskolas pārzinis.

Labi pazīstot kara invalidu mentālitāti un atzīstot daudzās karā invalidu speciālproblēmas, Ancāns 1955. gada vasarā konā ar daudziem citu latviešu novietu kāja invalidiem atjauno bijusās Latviešu Kara Invalidu Savienības darbību. Ancānu levl par pirmo LKIA priekšsēdi.

1955. gada decembrī Ancāns ar ģimeni Izceļo uz ASV un apmetas Nujorkā uz dzīvi. Sākumā viņš strādā uz būvēm, bet jau kopš 1957. gada sākuma par technisko zīmētāju plaši pazīstamajā lietu firmā „Otis”. Ieceļojis ASV, Ancāns uzsāka LKIA organizēšanas darbu Ameri-

kas kontinentā. Sevišķas pūles Ancāns veltīja karā cietušo renšu izcīņai no Vācljas valdības, daudzas reizes apmeklēja Vācljas ģenerālkonsulu ASV, gatavoja iestiegumus, sniedza informāciju pārējiem un daudziem palidzēja renšu formallāšu kārtošonā. LKIA Amerikas kontinentā Ancāna vadībā ir Izvīrzijs les par spēcīgu vlenību ar daudziem un lieliem nākošes plāniem. Ancāns ir aicināts par referantu uz daudziem latviešu centriem ASV, un iespēju robežas to arī ir darījis. Tautieši Ancāna referātus novērtē atzinīgi, to pierāda lielais apmeklētāju skaits.

Uz jautājumu par nākošes nodomiem Ancāns atbild: „To ir daudz, ņēl tikai, ka par maz laika, jo malzes darbs paņem daudz“. Viņš ir pārliecīnāts, ka arī mūsu tautai reiz ausis brīvības rīts, un reizē atzīst, ka trimdas latvieši par maz paši dara, lai to ātrāk izcīnītu. Ja mēs dotu tikai mazu daju, ko mūsu tauta tagad upurē dzimtenē, būtu daudz valrāk panākts.

Un tieši par LKIA problēmām Ancāns ar gandarijuma smaidu piebilst: „Rentes tagad ir izcīnītas, bet vēl jāpanāk, ka tās izmaksātu par visu laiku, kopš Izbraucām ne Riebumvācijas. Ancāns apmierināts saka: „Problēmu netrūks arī turpmāk, kā atpūtas nama iegāde, pensiju saņemšanas pielīdzīnāšana kā amerikānu karā invalidiem. LKIA bibliotēkas noorganizēšana utt.“ Viņš ir pārliecīnāts, ja trimdas sabiedrība dos pilnīgu atbalstu, tad arī viegлāk īksim ar visu galā.

Jautāju — un kā ir ar DV organizāciju? — viņš atbild: „Mums nav ne pamata, ne arī vajadzības apkāroties. Un mēs ceram, ka ar laiku varesīm sadarboties. Mums taču ir vairākas karavīru organizācijas, kā kalpakieši, strēlnieki, läčplēši, tās visas bija Latvijas brīvvalsti, un nav arī ar tām mums domstarpību tagad.“

LKIA un bijušie karavīri novē Robertam Ancānam arī turpmāk tādu pat enerģiju un sirds skaldību mūsu kopējā darbā, kas, runājot Jubllāra vārdiem, ir Izteikts divos vārdos: „Par Latviju!“ Ja to mēs visi levērosim, tad noteikti iztiksim ar mazāk nevajadzīgiem putekļiem un ātrāk sagaldīsim to dienu, kad Tērvzeme mūs sauks.

PERSONAL HISTORY STATEMENT

I, Roberts Ancans, was born on 11 November 1919 on the Ancans farm in Tilza county (Latvia). After ending the primary school of Tilza county, I entered Aglona High School in 1933. From Aglona I transferred to Karsava High School, which I completed in 1938. I immediately entered the University of Latvia, in the political economics faculty and jurisprudence.

In 1939 I volunteered into the Latvian Army with the ~~xix~~ aim of completing my studies and the War College. When the Bolsheviks occupied Latvia in 1940, I had gone through the non-commissioned officers' company and the course for officer-candidates. I was obliged to remain in the army until World War II, when I went over to the partisans, on 25 June 1941, in Rayon near Olaine, and took part in severe fighting.

In October, 1941, I went to the front with the 16th Zemgale Battallion. After being wounded a second time, in 1942, I finished the Officers' School. On 19 March 1943, I was wounded for the third time, and the fourth time near Ostrav in February 1944. I came back to the front in Kurzeme, where, in the Christmas Battle of 1944, I was encircled by the Bolsheviks for three days; there, with hand grenade we destroyed 12 Bolshevik tanks, took about 70 prisoners, and destroyed about 400 attacking Bolsheviks. At that time, I commanded the Battle School of the Division (non-commissioned officers' course, tank course, close combat course, snipers, storm weapons, and in-fighting courses). After the break-through, I was decorated with the Knight's Cross of the Iron Crosses (Ritterkreuz).

I was at the front in Kurzeme until 19 March 1945, when I was wounded for the eighth time. At the front I commanded units up to and including batallion. After my recovery I was promoted to the position of commandant on the staff of General Bangerskis. On the 8th of May, 1945 (day of the capitulation), I found myself in the Liepaja military hospital, from where I travelled to the sea by the last possibility. On 16 May, I stepped out on the shore of Germany; in the beginning I attempted to restore my health, yet later, when the danger of being delivered up to the Bolsheviks continued, I changed my name to Juris Polis.

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When I settled as a resident of the US Zone in the Summer of 1946, I abandoned this assumed name.

In Germany, I was in the DP Camp in Bad Wörishofen until 1948, in Neuburg until 1950, and afterwards in Augsburg. I was an IRO official the whole time, in various positions.

I am now Chairman of the Latvian Committee in Augsburg and also Chairman of the Camp Committee (Camp Höchfeld).

I have been married since the summer of 1950, and have a daughter, Rita (two months old).

I have been in the following organizations: Mazpulki,
Jaunsargi (Youth Section of the Aizsargi), Daugavas Vanagi, and the student organization "Lacuania."

1939. bin ich freiwillig in die Armée Lettlands eingetreten mit der Absicht die Kriegsschule und das Studium zu beenden(um Kriegsjurist zu werden). Als die Bolschewiken 1940. Lettland occupierten, hatte ich die Unteroffizierskompanie und die Offiziersanwärterkurse beendet. In der Armée mußte ich bis zum II Weltkriege bleiben, als ich den 25. Juni 1941. zu den Partisanen in Rayon bei Olaine überging und an schweren Kämpfen teilnahm. Im Oktober 1941. fuhr ich mit dem 16. Zemgales Bataillon zur Front. Nach der zweiten Verwundung im Jahre 1942. beendete ich die Offiziersschule. Den 19. März 1943. wurde ich zum dritten Male verwundet, im Februar 1944. das vierte Mal bei Ostrov. Zurück zur Front kam ich in Kurzeme, wo in den Weihnachtskämpfen 1944. ich auf drei Tage von den Bolschewiken umzingelt wurde, dort vernichteten wir mit Faustpatronen 12 Panzer der Bolschewiken, nahmen ungefähr 70 Gefangene und vernichteten ungefähr 400 angreifende Bolschewiken. Damals kommandierte ich die Kampfschule der Division(Unteroffiziers-, Panzer-, Nahbekämpfungs-, Scharfschützen-, Sturmgewehr- und Nahkampfkurse). Nach dem Hervorbrechen wurde ich mit dem Ritterkreuz des Eisernen Kreuzes ausgezeichnet.

In der Front in Kurzeme war ich bis zum 19. März 1945., als ich das achte Mal verwundet wurde. In der Front habe ich Einheiten bis Bataillon einschließlich kommandiert. Nach der Genesung war ich als Kommandant im Stabe General Bangerskis vorgesehen. Den 8. Mai 1945(Tag der Kapitulation) befand ich mich ins Lazarett Liepaja, woraus ich bei der letzten Möglichkeit ins Meer fuhr. Den 16. Mai stieg ich in Deutschlands Ufer hinaus; anfangs versuchte ich meine Gesundheit herzustellen, doch später, als die Gefahr bestand an Bolschewiken ausgeliefert zu werden, wählte ich meinen Namen auf Juris Polis.

Als ich mich in der US Zone wohnhaft niederließ im Sommer 1946., warf ich den angenommenen Namen wieder fort.

In Deutschland war ich in DP Lager in Bad Wörishofen bis 1948., in Neuburg bis 1950. und nachdem in Augsburg. Die ganze Zeit war ich IRO Beamter, innehabend verschiedene Stellungen.

Jetzt bin ich der Vorsitzender des lettischen Komitee in Augsburg und Vorsitzender des Lagerkomiteés.

Seit Sommer 1950. bin ich verheiratet und habe eine Tochter Rite(2 Monate alt).

Bin in folgenden Organisationen gewesen: Mazpulki, Jaunsargi (Jugendabteilung der Aizsargi.-Übersetzer.), Daugavas Vanagi, Studentenburschenschaft "Lacuania".

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



LATVIAN ACTIVITIES IN THE UNITED STATES

On November 22, 1963, Reverend Adolfs Klaupiks, Relief Director, Baptist World Alliance, 1628 16th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., was interviewed.

Background

Reverend Klaupiks advised that he resides at the World Alliance headquarters while in Washington, D. C., but has his permanent address at Baptist Parish of Latvians in Bucks County, Rural Free Delivery 3, Quakertown, Pennsylvania. Klaupiks stated that his father was Jānis Klaupiks, who is deceased. Reverend Klaupiks stated he is acquainted with many of the Latvian emigres in the United States, many of whom he sees during his frequent lecture tours throughout the United States. Klaupiks stated that he also shows various films which he has prepared commemorating various famous Latvian personages and holidays, and he travels to various cities narrating these films. During the course of these trips he is able to re-establish old relationships with his many Latvian acquaintances.

Trip to Soviet Latvia

Klaupiks discussed his recent trip to Soviet Latvia as a member of a cultural exchange group sponsored by the United States Department of State (USDS). He said that he was able to see many of his old friends and again observe the changes taking place in Latvia. During the course of his stay he had received a number of documents from a woman of many years acquaintance, whom in fact he had married long ago in his church in Latvia. She asked that the documents be taken and published in the United States. He said that he was hesitant about taking these documents

which consisted essentially of hand-written poems and notes regarding the conditions in Latvia. Klaupiks stated he made the mistake of taking these documents to his room whereupon he was visited by the KGB (Committee of State Security) and charged with receiving from a Soviet citizen, material detrimental to the Soviet Union. He stated that over the next three days he was interrogated by the KGB and accused of being a provocateur, a spy and a person who was looking for a way to embarrass the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR). Klaupiks denied all of the accusations, and all of the materials he had received from different persons was removed by the KGB. Klaupiks explained that appearing in Latvia as a native Latvian, but now an American, is unbelievable in its effect upon the average Latvian. Everywhere he went Klaupiks stated that people pressed upon him personal notes and messages of all kinds, asking that conditions within the country be made known to outsiders. He said many of these messages he refused to take, however, many were stuffed into his pockets.

While in his hotel room which was being searched, Klaupiks asked for a doctor since he had a very bad cold. A young woman doctor appeared and was quite open in her conversation with Klaupiks, much to his surprise. She told him about her job, her pay was 72 rubles per month, and the fact that she would receive a raise in a few years. She talked about her family and indicated both she and her husband worked to make ends meet.

After some days of interrogation the Soviets released Klaupiks with his assurance that he would not make an official complaint about this. Klaupiks said that he was treated well and at no time did any of the Soviets touch him physically.

Latvian Emigre Groups in the United States

With regard to the Latvian emigre groups in this country he said that they were essentially made up of various social and fraternity groups which are represented in the American Latvian Association (ALA). This is a National Organization with offices in Room 206-7 Edmunds Building, 917 15th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. The Chairman of this group is Professor Peter Leizing of the University of Maryland, a leading sociologist and well thought of man in the Latvian community. Leizing is married to an American woman thought to be of German extraction. Klaupiks named the officers of the ALA as follows:

With the exception of Norvillas, all officers are in Washington, D. C.

Reverend Klaupiks stated the membership is composed of persons who are interested in Latvian affairs, the restoration of a Free Latvia, and is a cohesive force among the emigres.

There are a number of Latvian fraternities, the members of which attended the University of Latvia or the University of Riga. He said that these groups hold their fraternity meetings, usually no women allowed, and talk over old times and engage in a social evening. Members of these fraternities are usually also members of the ALA. Although he was not acquainted with the names of all fraternity members of the various groups, Klaupiks was familiar with the fact that Ivars Dorkins, who was formerly employed by the Bureau of Public Roads and who resided at 1567 Colonial Terrace, Arlington, Virginia, would soon leave his employment here and move to New York. Dorkins will be going to work for a wealthy Latvian builder, Janis Ristars in the building business. Klaupiks did not know the exact date of departure. Beivins is the chairman of the Latvian Youth Association. Klaupiks stated that in this connection all of the Latvian student groups met in Boston, Massachusetts, November 8, 9, and 10, 1963, to celebrate Latvian holidays.

Klaupiks stated that he is acquainted with Heinrich Bagaltsis who resided in New York, only by virtue of his association with the organization, Drugavas Vanagi, a veterans organization of former members of the Latvian Legion who fought against the Russians during World War II. Klaupiks stated that this organization has been under attack by the Soviets for many years, the accusations being that the organization permits war criminals into its membership. In connection with this organization the Soviets are now circulating a film in this country called "Villainy". This film, which Klaupiks was invited to see in Latvia during his last visit, is a propaganda type picture which purports to show the traitorous parts played in the history of Latvia by various members of Drugavas Vanagi, who are mentioned in the picture by name, and who are now in the United States.

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Some five to six years ago the Daugavas Vanagi came under attack by various members of the Latvian community as the result of the dissatisfaction of some with the way various monies of the organization were expended. Various Latvian War invalids alleged that although Daugavas Vanagi purported to help disabled veterans, no monies were actually so expended. A new group which calls themselves the Latvian War Invalid Association was formed. This group collects monies from their members and other contributors and uses it to help invalids. In this connection Klaupiks stated that a camp for invalids is maintained in the Pocono Mountains. The chairman of this association is Robert Ancans, a former officer in the Latvian Legion. Klaupiks stated that it is his understanding that this is a legitimate organization although he has not been intimately connected with it. He said that some people suspect this new group because the Soviets have apparently chose not to attack it or its members. Klaupiks states that he does not feel the Soviets have much discrimination at this time inasmuch as they have attacked Daugavas Vanagi so continuously that any group which broke away could not be criticized with any consistency.

Shipments to Latvia

Klaupiks stated that on many occasions members of the Latvian community will enlist his aid in sending packages or money to relatives in Latvia, USSR. He stated that from past experience, and from the people themselves in Latvia with whom he has spoken, this business of sending packages is sometimes in the hands of unscrupulous persons. He stated that he has a list in his office of travel agencies who are approved by Intourist, Official Soviet Travel Agency, to send packages to the USSR. He said that he makes an effort to try as many different agencies as possible to find those most reliable. He said that recently he sent a package through the Globe Travel Agency in Philadelphia simply to determine the reliability of this agency. He said that he knew no one there but he had some business with them previously. Klaupiks added that there is no significance to his use of this agency or any other travel agency in the United States. In fact, according to Klaupiks many of the emigres are getting away from sending parcels to their respective countries because of the unreliability of the people involved and also because of the cost. Many of them are now sending the men by directly to Scandinavian countries along with a list of items to be purchased. These are then sent directly to the country involved. Klaupiks has heard from the recipients that this system has been working most satisfactorily and in the future most of this business will be done in this manner.

Miscellaneous

Mr. Klaupiks stated that George Lejinski Leigh and James

Zivtine, both of Washington, D. C., were members of the "Fraternitas Cursica".

Klaupika identified Peter Krum as one Peteris Kruvins. Source said that he met this man one time in New York about nine months ago when he had gone there to show and narrate a film about Latvia which he has prepared. Klaupika stated that after the showing of the film there followed the usual social hour, at which time a man answering the description of Peter Krum, approached and introduced himself by his Latvian name of Peteris Kruvins. He congratulated Klaupika on his narration of the film and said that he was a merchant seaman. He went on to state that as a seaman he made frequent trips to Europe and has gone into Latvia a number of times as a tourist. Kruvins extolled the progress being made in Latvia and said that while in the country he stayed with his relatives and when he decided to stay longer, simply had his visa extended. Kruvins told Klaupika that he had plans to lead a tourist group on a tour of Latvia this past summer, however, Klaupika does not know if this trip actually took place. Klaupika said that there was a group of Latvians who visited Latvia this year from New York, however, he does not know if this group was under the direction of Kruvins.

Klaupika said he was surprised to hear of all of this activity in and about Latvia from Kruvins. Klaupika stated he has visited Latvia a number of times since World War II, both as a member of the Baptist World Alliance and also as a member of official United States cultural delegations. He has had considerable experience with the Soviets as regards the obtaining and extension of visas and also the obtaining of permission to stay with relatives while visiting the USSR. He said he was amazed with the apparent ease with which Kruvins arranged matters during his trip, if in fact, he actually did these things. If true, Klaupika stated Kruvins has "interesting connections".

Inquiry was made as to whether Klaupika ever knew that Peter Krum owned a tavern in Brooklyn, New York. He said he did not but related the following "interesting" story:

He said that there now resides in Brooklyn, New York, one Elza Febrantska, maiden name, who was formerly a famous opera star in Latvia. He stated that in about 1936 or 1937, much to the surprise of the Latvian emigre community in the United States, Febrantska went to Latvia to visit with her relatives. While in Latvia, she was featured on radio and television, over which particular channels, political statements extolling the progress being made in Latvia and the freedom existing there. She was interviewed by the press on a number of occasions and her utterances were to the same favorable view to the regime. Upon her return to

the United States, she was besieged by many in the Latvian community for some explanation as to her actions. Klaupiks said she has never uttered a word as to what she did in Latvia and has refused to discuss this with anyone.

In 1960, Zebrowska made another trip to Latvia and, in fact, had somehow arranged to give a concert in Riga, Latvia. This concert, according to Klaupiks, was poorly attended and received a poor press. After some time, Zebrowska again returned to this country and was again mute about her trip and has not, to the knowledge of Klaupiks, discussed the trip with anyone. Klaupiks stated that the whole purpose of his conveying this information is that Zebrowska is reportedly married to a man who owns a tavern in Brooklyn. Klaupiks stated that he does not know the name of this person, but it was interesting to him that Krumins also owned a tavern and had apparent ease in arranging trips to Latvia as did Zebrowska.

CONTRADICTORY PERSON.

His biography in the magazine "Kara Invalids" (Disabled Veteran) #3 contains interesting data on these contradictions. In 1939 he joined the Latvian Army voluntarily, when?

For what reason, after graduation from a training company, was not he sent to courses for non-commissioned officers (usually done with all high school graduates).

During the time of the Russian occupation remained in service with the Red Army.

2. The times of the last war are described with many errors (which ever information one takes, because the data for this article was given by R.A. himself who probably wanted to make himself more important).

1) Several bones in his body were not broken (page 46 of the above magazine).

He never was 50% disabled, probably 30%. Otherwise he would have been relieved from service at the front lines.

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MY BRIEF CHARACTERIZATION.

Rob. Anc. is undoubtedly a very ambitious person. He is impudent, shameless, and at the same time naive. It would be difficult for me to say that he has any connections with the communists (particularly now), but certainly it is always possible that communists (through other persons) can influence or utilize him for their purposes.

Personally I saw R.A. only occasionally (after the war) in 1947 and I know him from work with the organization Daugavas Vanagi.

R. A.'s WORK WITH DAUGAVAS VANAGI.

He was a member of this organization for many years, about 10. Also in Germany (at this time he was a member of the central committee) he was a leading person. He was silent and inactive, he did not take any active assignments.

During 1954-55 it was established that he was not able to handle the things of honour. He had to go to the court of honour with captain Z. Butkus (now living in Milwaukee, Wisc.) and Ancans was not able to defend his case. As a consequence the DV organization's leadership stood by Butkus, and Ancans was not re-elected as a member of the committee.

LATVIAN DISABLED VETERANS' SOCIETY (LKI).

Established in Germany (Latvian Occupation Memorial day - 17 Jun, in 1955) brought nothing but astonishment. Nobody doubted that this was more or less created by the forms trying to disturb the unity of Latvian ^{Emigre} , because several years ago (and also today) Communist underground publications in Germany and also Dzintenes Balss (Voice of the Motherland) attacked the organization of Daugavas Vanagi and its leadership's activities. Communist instructions were seen on how to destroy this organization.

This (the LKI's connection with Communism) was also confirmed later by two active LKI' founders -- GAVARS, from Oldenburg, and Schuler (who came from

the US occupation zone), who were founders of LKIA and collaborators of the Communist underground publications in Germany. They later revealed their "heroic deeds" after their repatriation to Riga (written up in the local papers). Roberts Ancans was elected the first chairman of LKIA, which was a surprise. There is no doubt that he took over this assignment only because of his ambition /rest of the sentence is unintelligible/.

After having moved to the United States he (R.A.) founded an LKIA US section and has been its chairman ever since.

The mentioned organization is not large but very active, and an obstinate destroyer of "Daugavas Vanagi". The LKIA is also a weakener of the fighters for liberty and of the emigres in general.

SOME OBSERVATIONS:

LKIA organization's publications (magazine Kara Invalids) #5 contains the following:

1. First and second pages contain unfounded and incorrect attacks on leading emigre personalities.
2. The second page speaks about restoring the reputation of Latvian soldiers, as if it were not so (I think that it /the reputation/ is very high, and since this is shameless I am not going to talk about it), and calling and forming Veterans' councils. LKIA have already founded such councils, but without the knowledge and consent of veterans. LKIA attached certain assignments to weak people (DAUTUJIEKS, LAVENIEKS) also to uninformed people (GALINIEKS and LAVENIEKS), and to old soldiers, whose names (who does not know them) they use to deceive Latvian society (helpless old man, quarrelsome, not good for society) etc.

/Following two sentences unintelligible/.

SECRET INFORMATION SOURCE

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Those who know the circumstances have no doubt that the purpose of all these formations of councils is not to enforce but to weaken the strength of Latvian emigrés. They follow the same path as Dzīstības Palsa (Voice of the Motherland) which is in accordance with the aims of the Communist party.

LKIA also openly tries to divide Latvian society in general. "Kara Invalids" #5 (pages 12 and 13) highly praises Dr. A. VALDMANIS and Dr. V. VALTERS, both harmful Latvian citizens, to whom Latvian unity is of no value at all. That is why this is an open demonstration against Latvian nationals who are fighting for liberty --standing united against Communism.

Praising both the above men is wrong and their "merits" in regard to Cēdel-gemas/sic/ times does not correspond to the truth at all.

Page 56 of the same publication is again full of unfounded reproaches cast upon the Daugavas Vanagi. This does not help the consolidation of veterans. Other issues of this magazine are the same (in regard to their contents). How much of this is Roberts Ancans' fault — I do not judge.

People who know him better; such as, V. JANUMS, A. BERZINS, V. PAUTERS, and M. LECHMANIS(all in Germany) could give more information about him. Probably also the intelligence section of the Latvian Legion could help. Although I do not know the functionaries of the Legion, probably A. SIEGALIS (now in Canada) or A. PLEMSNERS (now in Sweden), who were commanders of the staff of this legion, know them.

I personally do not believe that R.A. is communist oriented, but at the same time I maintain the thought that he is harmful to the combatants for Latvian liberation, that undoubtedly behind the LKIA founders and their successors stands a certain "black hand", which is not known by the active functionaries of LKIA.

It is worth investigating all this. Particularly the striking recent activities indicate that collaborators of "Dzīstības Palsa" are living and

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working among emigres (as it was with SAULITE in Sweden) and very obediently fulfill the orders of their Riga bread-fathers(sic). To destroy the strong emigre society and to turn them one from another is the aim of these persons; and in this direction also LKIa with its satellites is dilligently acting.

On April 4, 1962, ARTUR VALTERS, carpenter, 537 Herzl Street, Brooklyn, New York, Apartment E8, advised he had not known ROBERTS ANCANS personally in Latvia or Germany, but he had heard of him. During the past four or five years he has met ANCANS and his wife casually at social affairs, but he does not know them intimately.

VALTERS said he did not really know anything about ANCANS character and reputation. He has heard several rumors about him, but they are strictly rumors, and he did not know if there was any real basis to the stories. Shortly after ANCANS came to the United States, there was a story circulated that he had a typewriter, the type of which was similiar to that appearing on a mimeographed leaflet circulated from Germany among the Latvian people. A second story was that an article by ANCANS had appeared in an emigre Latvian paper in Europe, which was devoted primarily to the interest of older Latvian immigrants, that is, those who left Latvia before 1918, and many of whom therefore have tended in the past to indicate some sympathy for the present Latvian Government under Communism.

VALTERS advised he knew that ANCANS had fought in the Latvian Legion against Russia, and had received a German decoration of which only eight or nine were given to members of the Latvian Legion. He said ANCANS had been active in Daugavas Vanagi, but quite some years ago left, and has been active in a Latvian Disabled Wars Veteran group. VALTERS who is a past President of the New York Chapter of Daugavas Vanagi said he did not know ANCANS in connection with Daugavas Vanagi.

VALTERS said he did not know anything about ANCANS family or background. He said that other than the foregoing, he does not know anything concerning subject's past or present political sympathies or attitude toward the Soviet Union.

Synopsis:

NY T-1 furnished information from NY T-2 that subject, prior to World War II, was convicted for Communist activity while student in high school in Latvia, but later released because of age. Two sisters also reportedly arrested in Latvia for Communist activities before World War II. After Soviet domination of Latvia, one of subject's brothers became member of Latvian puppet parliament in 1940. Subject one of founders of Disabled Latvian War Veterans, allegedly founded to split existing Latvian war veteran organization Daugavas Vanagi. NY T-1 stated subject, since being in US, has been instrumental in trying to create discord in recent national meetings of American Latvian Association and has tried to belittle anti-Soviet activity on part of organization. Subject residing with wife, two children and mother-in-law at 103-33 115th St., Richmond Hill, Long Island. Employed as draftsman, Otis Elevator Company, NYC. Subject born 11/11/19, Tilzas, Latvia, and entered the US 12/16/55. Information re bank account set out. NY T-4 advised subject serving in Latvian Army when Russia took over Latvia in 1940, and was mobilized into Red Army. Subsequently he became a Lieutenant in the Latvian Legion and served as officer until end of war. NY T-4 stated subject under intelligence observation in Latvian Legion, but no derogatory information obtained. It was NY T-4's recollection subject had worked for a short time for CIA in Germany, before 1951 or 1952.

DETAILS:

On September 14 and September 25, 1961, NY T-1 advised that he had received the following information concerning subject through NY T-2:

ROBERTS ANCANS, 103-33 115th Street, Richmond Hill, New York, was born in a province of Latvia closest in geographic location and sympathies to the Soviet Union. He is approximately 45 years of age and he came to the United States in 1955 or 1956. His occupation is unknown. ANCANS is considered somewhat of a national Latvian hero, inasmuch as he received one of the highest decorations possible when he fought with the Latvian Battalion on the Eastern Front during World War II.

The subject, before World War II, while Latvia was still free, was convicted in Latvia for Communist activity while a student in high school. He was released shortly after his arrest because it was felt his activities were motivated by his immaturity and the misinformation sometimes prevalent in students of his age.

During active military service in the Latvian Army, the subject was under constant observation by the Security Division of the Army and was politically doubtful. However, no positive information was ever received about his pro-Communist activities during this time. NY T-2 personally knew of this constant observation of the subject in the Army.

Two of the subject's sisters were arrested in Latvia for Communist activities before World War II.

After the Soviet domination of Latvia, one of subject's brothers became a member of the Latvian puppet parliament in the early stages of Soviet occupation, right after the annexation of Latvia by the Soviet Union in 1940.

After World War II, in Latvia, the subject was one of the founders of a disabled Latvian war veterans organization entitled, "Latviesu Kara Invalidu Apvieniba". This organization was founded to split up the already existing Latvian war veteran organization entitled "Daugavas Vanagi", and to

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weaken its activity. This latter organization had information that the first mentioned organization had within its ranks planted Communist reporters or observers dedicated to the discrediting of organizations striving for a free Latvia. However, no names or confirming information was ever specifically obtained.

NY T-1 stated they have no specific information that the subject is an espionage agent. However, since he has been in this country he has been instrumental in trying to create discord in recent national meetings of the American Latvian Association and is trying to belittle anti-Soviet activity on the part of this organization. NY T-1 stated therefore, because of his activities and background, ~~subject has come under suspicion by some Latvian leaders in this country as a tool of the Soviet Union.~~

The June 27, 1961 Queens Address Telephone Directory lists ROBERTS ANCANS with telephone number VI 3-6527 at 103-33 115th Street. Also listed at this address was HAROLD P. WILHELM, telephone VI 5-7606.

The 1958-1959 Queens Address Telephone Directory lists ANCANS with the same telephone number at 104-41 104th Street, Ozone Park.

The indices of the New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) contain no record on HAROLD P. WILHELM.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York, as furnished by PAULINE DE FIORE to IC JOHN T. DOWNEY on October 17, 1961, contained a report dated July 11, 1961, reflecting that ROBERTS ANCANS had been living at 103-33 115th Street, Richmond Hill, Long Island, for 3½ years. He was 43 years of age, married, with two children. His wife's name was given as ILGA BIRUTA. He was a draftsman with the Otis Elevator Company, 260 11th Avenue, New York City, and had a special checking account with the Chemical Bank New York Trust Company, 475 West 23rd Street, New York City. There was no derogatory information concerning the subject.

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Records of the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, New York City, as furnished by K. ROBERTSON to IC JOHN J. CAREY on November 1, 1961, reflect that 1961 registration QX7916, was registered for a 1955 green and white Chrysler sedan serial number WE55-61994, under the name of ROBERTS ANCANS, 103-33 115th Street, Richmond Hill, New York. His date of birth was given as November 11, 1919, and his business as the Otis Elevator Company, Bld., 260 - 11th Avenue, New York City. There was no current driving license listed to date for ANCANS.

On October 19, 1961, Mrs. EDITH WHITING, Personnel Office, 6th floor, Otis Elevator Company, 260 11th Avenue, New York City, advised that ROBERTS ANCANS, 103-33 115th Street, Richmond Hill, Long Island, was presently employed as a "Draftsman A", and his employment was satisfactory. She stated there was nothing derogatory in his file. He entered employment with Otis Elevator Company on June 20, 1957, as a "Draftsman B".

An application dated June 19, 1957, reflected ANCANS was then residing at 104-41 104th Street, Richmond Hill, Long Island, telephone VI 3-6527. He was born November 11, 1919. He attended Riga High School for five years and the University of Riga for two years, taking a course in mechanical engineering. He was admitted to the United States on December 16, 1955, and held AER #10233846. He was married, had four dependents, and rented his present dwelling. He listed his height as 5' 10" and his weight as 194 pounds. He listed languages spoken as Latvian and German.

As dependents living with him, ANCANS listed his wife IIGA, 29; daughter, RITA, six years; son, GVIDO, 5 years; mother-in-law, MARTA LUTUMS, 52. Subject listed the following references:

The indices of the New York Office of the FBI
contain no record of JURIS UPESLESA, JANIS CILDERMANS and
IVARS LANS, and subject's mother-in-law, MARTA LUTUMS.

On October 30, 1961, FRANK INCORVAIA, Bookkeeper,
Air Research Associates, 22 East 42nd Street, New York City,
advised that ROBERTS ANCANS, 104-41 104th Street, Ozone Park,
New York, telephone VI 3-6527, was employed by that company
from March 25, 1957 to June 7, 1957, at \$70.00 per week.
His Social Security number was 129-30-2534. He was born
November 11, 1919, and had five dependents. It was
indicated he had no Blue Cross.

INCORVAIA advised that F. M. NOLAN, Senior Engineer,
was the only employee around who actually remembered ANCANS.
NOLAN advised INCORVAIA that ANCANS was not much of a
draftsman and was released soon after he had been hired.

NOLAN further advised that no employment applications were filled out at that time, but the Social Security number and the age of a prospective employee were all that were required.

On October 19, 1961, NY T-3 advised that in addition to special account number 014-500566, ROBERTS ANCANS had a savings account number 14-7407, at the Chemical Bank New York Trust Company, 23rd Street and 10th Avenue, New York City. He opened this account October 6, 1958, with a deposit of \$2000. The only other deposit in the account was for \$170.00 on October 1, 1959. The remaining entries are withdrawals, generally in low three-figure amounts. The balance in the account now is \$5.28, which was reached on October 28, 1960.

The signature card dated October 6, 1958, for ROBERTS ANCANS reflects that he was a draftsman residing at 104-41 104th Street, Richmond Hill, Queens, New York. He was born November 11, 1919, in Latvia. He listed his father as ANTON, his mother as ZELCS, and his wife as ILGA.

In an application dated October 6, 1958, for a special checking account, he stated that he had been employed with the Otis Elevator Company, 260 11th Avenue, New York City, for two years. He listed his telephone number as CH 4-8000, Extension 697.

On November 2, 1961, NY T-3 furnished the following information concerning checks drawn on ROBERTS ANCANS special checking account number 014-500566:

MARTIN the INS file number A10233856, on ROBERTS ANCANS, which reflects the following information:

An application for Immigrant Visa and Alien Registration I-1072440, reflects ANCANS, who stated he was born November 11, 1919, Tilzas, Latvia, stated he was also known as POLIS WELLINGTON. His last permanent residence was 55 Vogesenstr., Augsburg, Germany. He was destined to HEINRICH'S BAGATAIS, 410 East 163rd Street, Bronx 56, New York. He was described as 5' 8"; 205 pounds; dark blond hair; grey blue eyes; fair complexion; stateless Latvian; scars on forehead and left cheek; occupation, professional army officer, now painter and driver. He spoke Latvian, German, Russian and some English. ANCANS listed previous residences at Tilza - 1938; Riga - 1939; Army service and P.O.W. in Latvia, Russia and Germany - 1946; Bad Woerishofen - 1948; Neuburg - 1950; Augsburg/Hochfeld, Germany, to date.

Subject listed his relatives as follows:

ANCANS filed an Affidavit in Lieu of a Birth Certificate, a marriage certificate, an Affidavit in Lieu of Discharge Certificate, police record, Certificate of Readmission and verified Assurance Number 38657, approved June 29, 1955. He claimed to be a non-quota immigrant eligible as an escapee, and stated that in 1949, he had applied for an immigrant visa at the IRO Office, Newburg/Do., Germany, and in 1952, applied again at the United States (US) Consulate in Munich, Germany.

He was granted an immigrant visa number 59438 on November 10, 1955, as a stateless Latvian by G. MICHAEL BACHE at Munich. He held Reiseausweis number 0020306 dated November 10, 1953, at Augsburg, Germany, expiring November 10, 1956.

It was certified that subject had arrived at the

Port of New York December 16, 1955, on the USNS General W. G. Langfit.

By card dated February 8, 1956, ANCANS advised that he was living with his family at 124 10th Street, West Babylon, New York, and his last address was 506 Eastern Parkway, Brooklyn 25, New York. He was employed by the Niedritis Construction Company, Incorporated, Bellamore, New York.

On June 16, 1956, ANCANS stated that he was now residing at 104-41 104th Street, Ozone Park, New York, and was employed by Eriks Niedritis, Construction Company, 35 Seaman Street, Rockville Centre, New York. His last address was 124 10th Street, West Babylon, New York.

An affidavit dated April 29, 1955, by LILJA ABOLTINS, 180 Washington Park, Brooklyn 5, New York, sponsored ROBERTS ANCANS and his wife, Mrs. MILDA ANCANS, born January 6, 1929, Riga, Latvia, and their children, RITA ANCANS, daughter, born August 7, 1951, Augsburg, Germany, and GVIDO IMANTS ANCANS, son, born March 8, 1952, Augsburg. Subject was to be a laborer to be trained to assist a carpenter in framing construction of new buildings at the Niedritis Construction Company, Incorporated, 1146 Bushwick Avenue, Brooklyn, New York. He was to reside with HEINRICHS BAGATAIS, 410 East 163rd Street, Bronx, New York. LILJA ABOLTINS was born in Riga, Latvia, February 2, 1912, and her daughters, BEATRICE and BAIBA ABOLTINS, were born March 25, 1938 and December 22, 1939, respectively. This affidavit was made before the Director of the Methodist Committee for Overseas Relief, 150 5th Avenue, New York, New York.

The indices of the New York Office contained no record concerning POLIS WELLINGTON, HEINRICHS BAGATAIS, MARIJA ANCANS, MILDA ANCANS, LILJA, BEATRICE and BAIBA ABOLTINS or ERIKS NIEDRITIS.

On October 30, 1961, NY T-4 advised that he first knew ROBERTS ANCANS in Germany, possibly in the spring of 1947. ANCANS lived in Augsburg, which was in the American sector. ANCANS was on the Central Board of Daugavas Vanagi in Germany until about 1954, when the Congress elected a

new member and he was out. With his friends in Hamburg, Germany, in 1955, subject formed the Disabled Latvian War Veterans, of which he was elected Chairman. The organization is still active, and it is located in New York.

ANCANS was serving in the Latvian Army when Russia took over Latvia in 1940. The Latvian Army was mobilized into the Red Army and ANCANS was accordingly mobilized with it. He left the Army as a corporal or sergeant. Subsequently, ANCANS became a lieutenant in the Latvian Legion and served as an officer in the Legion to the end of the war.

NIKOLAI LECMANIS, now working for the newspaper "Latvia" in Germany, served as an intelligence officer with the Latvian Legion. ANCANS was under observation by LECMANIS, but LECMANIS never obtained any derogatory information against ANCANS.

NY T-4 stated that there were two rumors against ANCANS in Germany. One was that one or two of his sisters was arrested as a Communist and sentenced to prison. The second rumor was that a brother of ANCANS was elected to parliament when it was first organized in cooperation with the Communists, after the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR) took over Latvia. ANCANS came from a big family. NY T-4 stated he did not know if there was any substance to these stories at all. However, it was his opinion that ANCANS was "somewhat stupid", and was not intelligent enough to be active as a Soviet agent.

It was NY T-4's recollection that ANCANS had worked a very short time for the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) in Germany before 1951 or 1952, and he believed this information came to him through VITIS JANUMS, who is still in Germany.

On June 3, 1960, IC THOMAS G. CLEARY received a telephone call from an anonymous female complainant who stated that she was a German Jew, and that her husband, a household service man, had been doing some work in the home of ROBERT ANCANS at 103-33 115th Street, Richmond Hill, Queens, and he noticed that one of the subject's walls was almost entirely covered with a mural or photo of himself in a German storm trooper uniform.

In connection with the foregoing, NY T-4 advised that the uniform of the Latvian Legion was similar in all respects to the German Army uniform with the exception of the collar tabs which contained a different insignia.

DETAILS:

On June 12, 1962, ROBERTS ANCANS, 103-33 115th Street, Queens, New York, was interviewed by SAs ROBERT S. KIRKEMUR and RALPH E. MILLER. ANCANS advised he is presently employed as a craftsman with the Otis Elevator Company in New York City and his wife is employed as a waitress in a luncheonette in Manhattan.

ANCANS stated that his father was a farmer near Tilzas, Latvia, and he himself was born November 11, 1919, at Tilzas. He had five brothers and two sisters. His parents died about thirty years ago and one of his sisters died in 1930.

ANCANS stated he attended high school in Riga and also spent two years in the University of Riga. In 1939 he began his service in the Latvian Army and was a corporal at the time of the invasion of Latvia by the Soviets in June, 1940. At the time of the invasion of Latvia by the Germans, ANCANS had escaped into the woods and was fighting as a partisan against the Russians.

ANCANS related that although many Latvians were not particularly pro-German, they saw in the German Army a possible hope of freeing Latvia from the "Bolsheviks". ANCANS joined the Latvian Legion under the Germans and at the end of the war had been wounded eight times and had risen to the rank of captain.

ANCANS was captured in the late stages of the war and during this time he used the name of WETLEDYTON. He said he did not recall using the last name of WETLEDYTON. He said that like most other Latvians he endeavored to conceal it while fighting his battle from the Russians and others. After the war ended on May 9, 1945, he was in a hospital in Germany, eventually made his way to America.

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In Germany he was contacted by someone from American intelligence, which he believes was CIC, and he did for a time furnish military type of information to the Americans. He said he was using the name POLIS at that time but did not recall his ever using the name WELLINGTON, although he could have done so. He spent a considerable time in Germany, where he eventually met his present wife and he eventually made his way to the United States in 1955.

He stated he had never been involved in any Communist activities nor had he been arrested in connection with any such activity. He stated that one time while he was in Riga, he had been questioned by the police concerning the activities of several students who were or were believed to be Communists. ANCANS had roomed with one of them for a while.

He stated his sisters had never been engaged in any Communist activities and had never been arrested for any such activity. Likewise, none of his brothers, to his knowledge, had ever been members of the Communist Party nor had any of them ever served in the Latvian Parliament to his knowledge.

Subject said that one older brother, PETER ANCANS, who is now about sixty years old and who had fought in World War I, had been a mayor of a small town in Latvia both before and during the last part of World War II, but he was never a member of the Latvian Parliament to his knowledge.

Subject stated that he presently has a brother, ALFONS ANCANS, residing on part of the old family farm in Tilzas, Latvia. A sister, PITRANS, also lives on a farm about two kilometers away at Vilmane.

ALFONS had been sent to Siberia for ten years by the Russians and only returned to the farm

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some years ago. He said he has occasional correspondence with his brother, writing to his sister and using his wife's maiden name as the sender. However, he has not been able to learn very much personal knowledge concerning his family through this method as they have to be extremely discreet.

As to the remainder of his family, the subject stated that his brother, PETERS ANCANS, who was formerly active in the Latvian Army in World War I and who was a mayor of a small town in Latvia, is now in Stockholm, Sweden. A second brother, JANIS JOSIFS ANCANS, is presently living in Sydney, Australia. A brother, AUGUSTS ANCANS, who was an officer of artillery in the Latvian Army, was captured by the Soviets and died of tuberculosis after about six months. The last brother, DOMINIKS ANCANS, was also taken prisoner by the Soviets and spent eleven years in Siberia. He died in 1960.

He stated that he is President of the American Latvian Handicapped War Veterans, Incorporated. The secretary of the organization lives in Manhattan but he does receive some correspondence at his residence. He said that they have no actual physical headquarters. He said the organization actually goes back to World War I and they have some members from World War I, some from the "Freedom War" in Latvia in the early 1920s, as well as veterans from World War II.

He stated that he has never been a Communist and has never been active on behalf of the Soviets. He noted that he had been wounded eight times during World War II while he was engaged in fighting against the Soviets. He said he had no knowledge of any particular activity by the Soviets among the Latvians in the United States but would advise the Federal Bureau of Investigation in the event any such activity came to his attention.

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Rev. ZARINS, Latvian Lutheran Church, NYC, advised ROBERT'S ANCANS is Catholic, but wife, ILGA, is member of Latvian Lutheran Church; has met subject at various social functions. He advised subject fought in Latvian Legion against the Russians and now active in disabled war veterans organization. He knew nothing derogatory concerning him. DR. LUIZA MIKELSONS knows the subject and wife very briefly and states subject anti-Communist. JANIS LACIS, President, NY Chapter of Daugavas Vanagi, has known subject since 1942, in Young Officers School in Latvia. During the war, he read reports of his fighting and being decorated with various medals. Advised subject had been active in Daugavas Vanagi, Latvian War Veterans organization, but split off from Daugavas Vanagi with some followers in 1956 or 1957 in Germany and founded Disabled War Veterans Association which is active in NY and Germany. Believes subject anti-Soviet. States subject writing about self in the army and believes he wants to be popular. INS information concerning wife, ILGA, and mother-in-law, MARTA LUTUMS, set out.

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DETAILS

On November 22, 1961, Reverend RICHARD ZARINS, Latvian Lutheran Church, residence 564 Second Street, Brooklyn, New York, advised that ROBERTS ANCANS was a Roman Catholic, but his wife, ILGA, was a Lutheran and attended the Latvian Lutheran Church. She has been a member of the Reverend ZARINS' church for several years. Her mother also had been a member of this church, but she was sickly and died several years ago. The ANCANS have two children.

Reverend ZARINS stated he has met subject at various social functions. He described him as a "pleasant but energetic man". He fought in the Latvian Legion against the Russians and proved himself valorous and was decorated by the German Army.

Reverend ZARINS stated he did not know subject in Latvia and did not know anything regarding his family.

He advised subject is very active in the Latvian Disabled (or Handicapped) Veterans Organization. He stated that Latvians during World War II had not fought for Germany, but had fought for their own country against the Soviets as well as the Germans at times. After the war, these veterans found their lot very hard. An organization of Latvian war veterans called Daugavas Vanagi was formed in Belgium. Subject was in Daugavas Vanagi, but split-off later from the organization with a number of followers to form a disabled war veterans organization. Recently this group had bought a piece of land in the Catskills, which will be for the use of the organization. Reverend ZARINS said he believed this was a good thing since prior to this about the only thing these disabled war veterans used to do was "to sit around and drink and be depressed." He felt the start toward a new activity might stimulate them.

He said he did not know anything derogatory regarding the subject.

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On January 8, 1962, Dr. LUIZA MIKELSONS, 156 East 21st Street, Brooklyn, New York, advised that she knew ROBERTS ANCANS and his wife very briefly. He was the head of a disabled war veterans group. She believes he has a German decoration from the time he fought in the Latvian Legion during World War II. She said ANCANS is anti-Communist and that she knew nothing derogatory concerning him.

On January 18, 1962, JANIS LACIS, 611 Argyle Road, Brooklyn, New York, advised he has known the subject since 1942 when they were both in Young Officers School in Latvia. During the war LACIS read reports of subject's fighting achievements. Subject was decorated with all kinds of medals, according to LACIS. LACIS, who is the current president of the New York Chapter of Daugavas Vanagi, stated that ANCANS had been a member of Daugavas Vanagi when it was founded in Europe, however, subject split-off from Daugavas Vanagi with a number of his followers and founded the "Kara Invalidu Apvieniba", (Disabled War Veterans Association) in 1956 or 1957 in Germany. It is now active in New York and Germany, although it is much smaller than Daugavas Vanagi. Subject's organization has no headquarters, but recently they bought a cottage in the Catskills.

LACIS stated that he believed subject was anti-Soviet. He thinks that now, subject wants to be popular and he writes about himself in the army. He feels subject wants to remember his past, which is generally contrary to the feelings of most of the Latvian war veterans. He said some of the pieces about ANCANS had appeared in the Latvian language newspaper, "Laiks". LACIS said he knew nothing derogatory concerning the subject and did not believe that he would be engaged in any activity on behalf of the Soviets.

On January 19, 1962, SIDNEY A. DAVIS, Assistant Chief, Records Administration and Information Section, Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), 20 West Broadway, New York City, made available INS file A10233916 on MARTA LUTUMS, subject's mother-in-law. This file contained an application for Immigration Visa and Alien Registration I1072181 dated November 9, 1955 at the American Consulate General's Office, Munich, Germany, by MARTA LUTUMS nee MUELLERS,

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residence, Vogesenstr 55, Augsburg, Germany. She was born October 12, 1904 in Jaunpils, Latvia. She was destined to Mrs. VILLIA VAKSMANIS, 355 Lafayette Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, and her address was to be 301 Lafayette Avenue, apartment 3L, Brooklyn 38, New York.

MARTA LUTUMS was described as 5'4", 128 lbs., blonde hair, blue eyes, fair complexion, and married. She was a housewife and spoke Latvian, Russian, German, and some English.

Her residences had been as follows:

Jaunpils, Latvia, 1904 - 1909.

Raiskums, Latvia, 1909 - 1915

Birska, Latvia, 1915 - 1919

Riga, Latvia, 1919 - 1944

Neuberg, Germany, 1944 - 1952

Her parents, ROBERT MUELLERS and ELIZABETH MUELLERS nee LAPINS, are deceased. Her husband, ANDREJS LUTUMS, is missing.

Immigration Visa number 59432 was issued to her on November 9, 1955 and she entered at New York on December 16, 1955 aboard the "USNS General W. C. Langfitt". An affidavit of support on the letterhead of the Methodist Committee for Overseas Relief, Church World Service, 150 5th Avenue, New York City, was signed by VILLIA VAKSMANIS, 355 Lafayette Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, for MARTA LUTUMS care of Mr. and Mrs. ROBERT ANCANS, 55 Vogesenstrasse, Augsburg, Germany. Mrs. VAKSMANIS advised that she was a friend of MARTA LUTUMS' daughter, MILDA, and that the applicant would be employed as a domestic worker in the household of Mrs. SOPHIE BERZINS at 301 Lafayette Avenue, apartment 3L, Brooklyn, New York. The affidavit, which was dated June 3, 1955, reflected she had a daughter, INARA VAKSMANIS, born December 5, 1941.

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An affidavit dated October 3, 1955 in Augsburg, Germany, reflected that MARTA LUTUMS was born October 12, 1904 in Jaunpils, Lettland; that she married ANDREJS LUTUMS on December 25, 1926 in Lielwarde, Germany; that he was born December 6, 1900 in Lielwarde; that they had two children, JANIS HARIJS LUTUMS, born June 23, 1927 in Lielwarde and ILGA, born June 1, 1928 in Riga, Latvia, and that her parents were JURIS and ANNA LUTUMS.

An affidavit was submitted in 1955 in Augsburg, which stated that she had lived with her husband in Latvia until 1944. On September 1, 1944, she was sent to Germany and her husband remained in Latvia. She has never heard of him since. A card dated June 16, 1956 reflected that MARTA LUTUMS, AER number, 10233916, had moved from 124 10th Street, West Babylon, New York, to 104-41 104th Street, Ozone Park, New York.

INS file A10233854 reflected that ILGA ANCANS nee LUTUMS, 55 Vogesenstr., Augsburg, Germany, made an application for Immigration Visa and Alien Registration number I1072441 at the American Consulate General's Office, Munich, on November 9, 1955. Her address in the United States was given as 410 East 163rd Street, Bronx 56, New York, and the person to whom she was destined was HEINRICH'S BAGATAIS.

She was born June 1, 1928 in Riga, Latvia, and was described as 5'5", 147 lbs., blonde hair, blue eyes, fair complexion. She had been an assistant nurse and pharmaceutical clerk and spoke German, Latvian, and English.

She had resided in Riga until 1944, Neuberg, Germany until 1946, Munich, Germany until 1948, Neuberg, Germany until 1959, and Augsburg, Germany to date. Her family consisted of husband ROBERTS ANCANS, and daughter RITA and son GVIDO. Her parents were ANDREJS LUTUMS and MARTA LUTUMS nee MUELLERS.

In 1949, she had applied for an immigrant visa for the United States at the IRO Office, Neuberg and again in 1952 at the United States Consul's Office in Munich. An Immigration Visa number 59439 was issued to her on November 10, 1955 and she arrived in New York December 16, 1955 on the "USNS Langfitt". A marriage certificate reflected that

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ROBERTS ANCANS, Catholic, born November 11, 1919 in Tilza, Lettland, and ILGA LUTUMS, Evangelican, born June 1, 1928 Riga, were married on September 2, 1950 in Neuberg.

An affidavit dated September 29, 1955 reflected that their daughter, RITA, was born July 8, 1951 in Augsburg and her son, GUIDO IMANTS, was born August 3, 1952 in Augsburg. Her father was born on December 6, 1900 in Lielwarde, and her mother on October 12, 1904 in Jaunpils.

A card dated June 16, 1956 reflected that ILGA ANCANS, AER number A10-233854, had moved from 124 10th Street West Babylon, New York, to 104-41 104th Street, Ozone Park, New York. She was working for or attending school at Michael Baumler, West 18th Street, New York, New York.

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
