A Plan of the Land given by Charles C. Pinckney Esquire to the City for a Market ^{place} lying on the East side of Meeting Street in Ward No. 1. and Channel Street now intended to be called Market Street. Shewing the Lots of land adjoining and contiguous thereto & the Streets leading thereto. From a Survey taken at the request of the Commissioners appointed by the City Council, in May 1704.

A Bounded as shown by the lines coloured yellow is given by Charles C. Pinckney Esq^r to the City for the use of a Market or Markets.
 B As represented by the line coloured blue is the Street laid out in 1742 called Channel Street being in width, between Church and East Bay Streets 40 feet and to the Eastward of East Bay Street to the Channel of Cooper River 60 feet -
 The perpendicular ^{fall} height of land between the West side of Meeting Street and the Middle of Maiden Lane is 5 feet $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches - between the middle of Maiden Lane to the East side of Church Street the Fall is $\frac{5}{10}$ of an Inch and between the West side of Church Street and the foot of the west end of the Arch of the Bridge on East Bay Street is 5 feet 9 inches - And the whole fall between Meeting Street and East Bay Street is 11 feet -
 The broken lines show Market Street continued 100 feet wide from Meeting Street to the Channel
