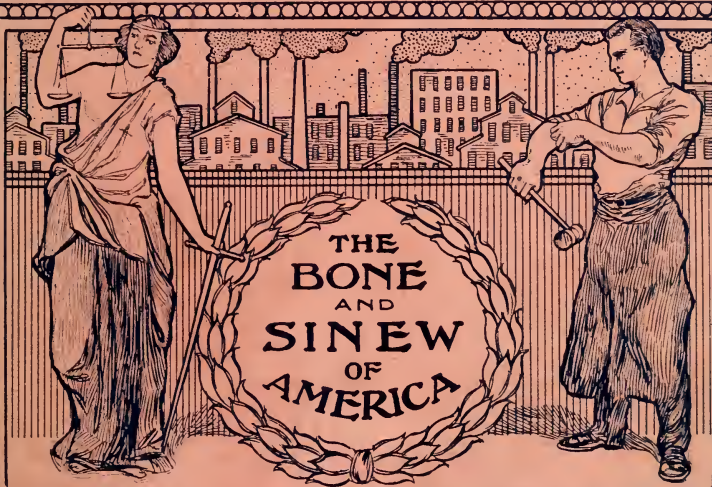

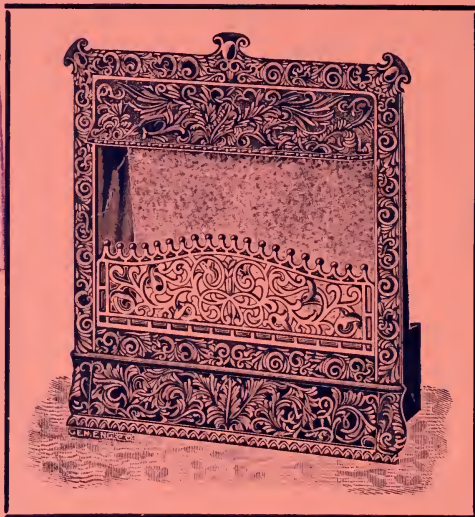

INTRODUCTORY.

We take pleasure in presenting you this Union Buyers' Guide and Directory and hope it will be a means of enlisting your active and effective co-operation in the movement to secure and purchase all union made goods. As a simple business proposition, you will readily see that if you in making your purchases demand an article union made you are to the extent of that purchase giving employment to a brother member and furthering a good cause. If the two million members of organized labor in this country, together with their families, representing in all ten millions of people, or one-eighth of the entire population of the United States, were to demand goods union made, the aggregate results to the toilers of every craft would unquestionably be far reaching.

It must be admitted, however, that there is a tendency among a large number of members of each craft to be more or less lukewarm in their enthusiasm about the union made goods. To remedy this, effective educational work must be continued until every union man in every craft will regard it as a solemn duty to see that the union label is on every article purchased by himself or his family. A union man purchasing an article not union made is likely to be giving employment to a non-union workman and encouraging a non-union manufacturer.

Union made goods, like everything else in creation, is regulated by the time-honored law of supply and demand, and if you will demand from your dealers union made goods, and refuse to take any other, your dealer will in turn demand the same from the manufacturer, and instead of your having to petition the manufacturer to place the label on the products of his plant, he will come to you and ask for the privilege of using the label. The custom of great manufacturing concerns when introducing an article on the market is to create a demand for it by extensive advertising among the purchasers, and when this is accomplished the retailers are forced to handle this article regardless of its cost or quality. The same principle is involved in booming the products of union labor. Union made goods represent the practical side of organized labor. It would be difficult to over-estimate the value of this insignia in advancing the cause of labor. It carries with it a world of meaning and should be regarded as sacred by every loyal member of a trades union.

We would also ask you, as a union man, to educate every member of your family on the importance of securing union made goods, and further than that would recommend that you also get your friends, whether they are members of a union or not, to co-operate with you. You can readily see that if a non-union manufacturer cannot sell his goods to union men and their families that his trade is necessarily limited, and as a business proposition it will pay him to unionize his plant in order that he may secure the trade of the union family.

Union made goods are the purest and best to purchase. It remains with you to do your part to make this effective.

Important to Each Union Brother.

In calling on the retail merchants of this city we are often met with the complaint that some union men do not pay their bills, and consequently the merchants who had not been paid did not care to aid us in this movement. One union brother who does not deal fairly and honestly with his fellow-man causes many union men to be looked on with suspicion, and oftentimes they are unable to get credit when they are out of employment and need it badly. The union brother is placed in about the same position as the man who professes to be a Christian. He is looked upon as being different than the non-union man or the unprofessing Christian, and when either of them do wrong it is pointed out as a greater sin than the same thing would be if it had been done by a non-union man or an unprofessing Christian

In San Francisco a union card will get you credit at any store, and if each union man in St. Louis will keep his agreements and pay his bills promptly when promised, he will be able to get the same credit here.

This is important in many ways. It shows the public that a union man is better than the non-union man, and is to be trusted. In case of a strike the retail dealer will stand by you, which means that if your money gives out you will still be able to feed and clothe your family and continue the battle until you win. Should you move to another city you would have no trouble in getting the same credit and assistance there should you need it. We trust each union brother will use his best efforts to bring about this condition, as it is of the greatest importance to each and every one of us.

You are a member of one of the greatest organizations in the world. Let all of your acts be such as will add to the honor and glory of that organization and never do anything that will dishonor it.
