[redacted] first came to the attention of the Supreme Court Police in April 1995 when she sent cookies and a note expressing holiday greetings to Justice Ginsburg at the Justice's home address. In March 1996, Justice Ginsburg's Chambers forwarded a letter from [redacted] to our Threat Assessment Unit (TAU). The letter was not threatening but bizarre in nature. [redacted] expressed birthday greetings to the Justice, stated "I hope you get a jet ski", and "Enjoy a Baccardi rum key lime cake with shipped cream cheese in between the layers topped with frozen cherry cordial. She also mentioned that she [redacted] could be seen in a movie on CBS. The TAU then learned, after speaking with Chamber's personnel, that [redacted] was a frequent letter writer to Professor Ginsburg's law office and was well-known by his office staff. Around this same time, [redacted] began calling the Supreme Court Marshal's Office and mailed a number of personal papers to them. Included with the papers was correspondence from an attorney in Florida, [redacted]. It appears [redacted] was lodging complaints with the Florida Bar Association against [redacted] for the manner in which he had handled [redacted].

On March 14, 1996, SGT [redacted] SCUS Police Department, telephonically contacted [redacted] in an attempt to learn more about [redacted]. He stated that [redacted] is delusional and has been in and out of mental institutions in New York City. She calls many people on a constant basis. [redacted]

[redacted] He advised a good contact might be [redacted]. Several attempts were made to reach [redacted] but with negative results. Unsuccessful attempts were made to obtain a photograph of [redacted].

The last information the SCUS Police received regarding [redacted] was when she wrote to the Marshal's Office on March 27, 1996.

According to information we received on Friday, October 18, 1996, [redacted] was contacted by [redacted] on that date who supplied information that SUBJECT had walked away from the facility, withdrawn money from her bank account and could be headed for the D.C. area. SGT [redacted] attempted to telephonically contact [redacted] on Friday, but was unsuccessful. On Monday, October 21, 1996, [redacted] telephonically contacted SGT [redacted]. She stated that [redacted] is delusional but is probably no danger to anyone other than herself. [redacted] thought [redacted] might be headed this way because she had listed the Ginsburg's on her intake form as friends to contact in case of an emergency.

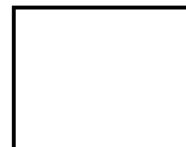

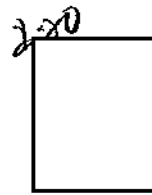

Approves Ban on Arms Exports to Militaries

WASHINGTON, June 16 — The
Security Council voted
to impose a worldwide ban on arms
exports to Haiti but backed away
from imposing the United States or
other nations to enforce the ban with
force.

Members, which were approved
and aimed at forcing Haitian
leaders to accept the re-
elected President, the Rev.
Jean-Bertrand Aristide. They were
in response to objections by
other nations that called for
relationships trying to enter Hai-

ti. He said that Brazil was able
to overcome its objections from

Advances in Detection Dilemma on Prostate

By GINA KOLATA

Prostate cancer is being diagnosed
at a higher rate than ever before re-
ported, according to new data from the
National Cancer Institute. And as more
cancers are diagnosed, record num-
bers of men are undergoing operations
to remove the prostate or are having
radiation treatment.

But no evidence exists to show that
this aggressive effort to diagnose and
treat the cancer has had any effect in
improving survival. And most of the
increase in diagnosis can be attributed
to new, more advanced diagnostic tech-
niques, researchers say.

In fact, they say, what is happening
is that the cancer is being caught earli-
er, at a more treatable stage. The risk
rather, is in the treatment. Removal of
the prostate not only has a higher death
rate than similar surgery, but it can
also cause impotence and incontinence

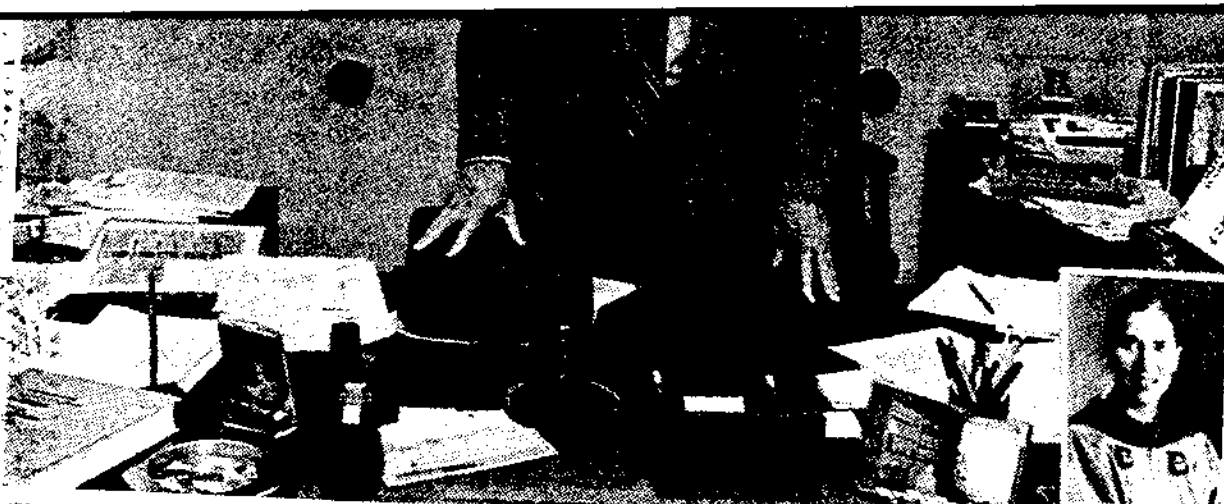

wife, Judge Kimba Wood, for Attorney General. Judge Wood was dropped by the White House after it was learned that the couple had employed an illegal immigrant to care for their son (although doing so was legal at the time).

Friends say Mr. Ginsburg worked behind the scenes to help persuade Mr. Clinton to nominate Judge Ginsburg for the Supreme Court, calling on leading scholars to write to Mr. Clinton and his counsel, Bernard W. Nussbaum.

When rumors began circulating last month that Judge Ginsburg had opposed the right to abortion, Mr. Ginsburg enlisted academics to tell the White House and others that his wife had criticized the reasoning, but not the result, of the 1973 case establishing the constitutional right.

And in a capital that has grown hypersensitive to the tax histories of nominees for high office, it was Mr. Ginsburg, one of the nation's leading tax experts, who averted any controversy about the couple's finances. On a few hours' notice, Mr. Ginsburg compiled years of financial records over the weekend. He walked Government accountants through years of filings on Sunday, as Mr. Nussbaum was interviewing Judge Ginsburg in another room of the couple's Watergate apartment on a variety of legal and personal issues.

When the Government accountants on Sunday challenged a \$100 deduction, the tax professor who had structured some of the most complex corporate transactions was able to defend the accounting easily.

Avoiding Conflicts

The financial records of the couple were significantly simplified by Mr. Ginsburg's decision in 1980 to sell all of his stock so that his wife would not have to remove herself from cases involving companies or industries in which the family had interests.

Mr. Ginsburg played down his role

in the nomination, saying he spoke to only a few legal scholars he knows, and only after a friend at the White House asked him, "What have you done about generating support from the academics?"

He said he was told: "Given that her background was as a scholar, if the world doesn't generate at least seven letters from academics then the White House will get very nervous."

The letters poured in from Gov. Ann W. Richards of Texas, the presidents of Stanford and Columbia (both

former law school deans) and an array of other legal scholars. A number were not directly solicited by Mr. Ginsburg, who said that what he did was merely repeat what he was told by the White House friend whom he declined to identify.

Letters Discounted

President Clinton said today that he was not influenced by the letters and that they showed "only that a lot of people felt a lot for her."

Mr. Ginsburg, 61 years old, was born in Brooklyn and raised in Rockville Centre, L.I. Through mutual friends, he met Ruth Bader at Cornell, and after his two-year service in the Army and the birth of their daughter, they enrolled a year apart at Harvard Law School. While she was developing a whole new area of law involving equal rights for women, he practiced tax law.

He decided to teach full time in 1977, when he did a stint at Stanford Law School. He sought that job to be with his wife, who had been invited to be a resident fellow for a term at Stanford's Center for Advanced Study in Behavioral Sciences.

In 1971, Mr. Ginsburg met Ross

Perot when his law firm represented Mr. Perot in a deal, and the friendship blossomed. He did not work on Mr. Perot's Presidential campaign, although he spoke with his economic adviser, John White, on some issues. Mr. Ginsburg said he had supported Mr. Clinton.

By all accounts, Mr. Perot grew particularly close to Mr. Ginsburg after the lawyer resolved a thicket of thorny tax problems that had threatened the acquisition of Mr. Perot's Electronic Data Systems Inc. by the General Motors Corporation in 1984.

Mr. Ginsburg hesitated before taking the assignment because his law firm represented several of Mr. Perot's competitors. While technically it was not a conflict of interest, Mr. Ginsburg said, "It looked unseemly."

But his long friendship with Mr. Perot, combined with his intellectual interest in completing one of the most challenging mergers, prompted him to do the job. To ease tensions with his law firm, he told Mr. Perot that he would work without pay.

Ultimately, he said, Mr. Perot said he wanted to repay Mr. Ginsburg some way, and after the deal was completed his client said he would endow a chair at any university Mr. Ginsburg liked.

"I said, 'It's a bad idea,'" Mr. Ginsburg recalled. "Endowed chairs are only for dead people."

But Mr. Perot said if Mr. Ginsburg did not pick a school, then the money would go to Oral Roberts University.

"Ross said when the founder of Oral Roberts heard it was to be the Martin D. Ginsburg chair, he took a deep breath and then said, 'Well, Ross, we're all God's children.'"

In the end, the money went to Georgetown University Law Center, where Mr. Ginsburg had been teaching since 1980. But Mr. Ginsburg has not filled the chair, because, he said, he is superstitious, and the interest on the endowment has been used to pay for books at the law school library.

On a shelf in the family's Watergate apartment sits a gift from some of Judge Ginsburg's clerks: a six-inch piece of furniture with a small plaque that identifies it as the Martin D. Ginsburg chair.

Clinton says letter campaign for Ginsburg wasn't a factor

President Clinton said yesterday that he was not influenced by a letter-writing campaign orchestrated by supporters of Supreme Court nominee Ruth Bader Ginsburg to rebuff criticism of her stand on abortion.

Mr. Clinton said he read seven or eight of the letters but "I was unaware of any big letter-writing campaign."

He said the letters did show that "a lot of people felt a lot of her."

"There were also good letters, I would say, for 10 candidates" other than Judge Ginsburg, the president added.

During the past six weeks, dozens of people wrote the White House defending the 60-year-old federal appellate judge, the Baltimore Sun and the Los Angeles Times reported. Mr. Clinton nominated her to the Supreme Court on Monday.

At least one person told the Sun that Martin Ginsburg, a Washington tax lawyer and husband of the nominee, had asked for a letter.

"Martin called me and said a letter from me would be helpful if I would do it," said Barbara Allen Babcock, a law professor at Stanford

University and a longtime friend of the Supreme Court nominee.

Ms. Babcock said she wrote White House Counsel Bernard Nussbaum.

White House Press Secretary Dee Dee Myers said there were a "number of letters" sent on Judge Ginsburg's behalf, although she did not elaborate. "I don't think it had any undue influence on the process," she said.

Miss Myers said Judge Ginsburg's "resume, her writings, her work . . . are what made the difference" to Mr. Clinton. She added that it "wasn't any organized campaign" that led to the nomination.

Judge Ginsburg has criticized the 1973 Roe vs. Wade decision, saying the country would have been better off if abortion rights had been established more gradually.

Ms. Babcock said Judge Ginsburg had told her she feared her chances of being named to the high court were fading because younger women seemed to find her views on women's issues out of date.

Ms. Babcock said she also decided on her own to make calls to others who knew the judge to ask them to write the White House.

When Mr. Clinton introduced her

Monday, the White House released several letters it had received praising her, including the letter from Ms. Babcock.

New York lawyer M.E. Freeman, one of Judge Ginsburg's former students at Columbia Law School, said she received a telephone call from a Washington lawyer friend, whom she would not identify, who told her about the letter-writing campaign.

Ms. Freeman said that in addition to Mr. Nussbaum, she also wrote to Sens. Orrin Hatch of Utah and Daniel Moynihan of New York and urged others to do the same. Ms. Freeman said she called Judge Ginsburg's husband before writing the letter to see if he approved.

"I didn't want to do something that wasn't politically correct," Ms. Freeman said. "He said, 'No, that would be great. I got the sense he was gratified people were speaking up for Ruth. He didn't want this canard. He wanted to refute it.'"

Sen. Strom Thurmond of South Carolina, the Judiciary Committee's ranking Republican, presented her to his colleagues, as he does with all high court nominees, and gave her a pocket edition of the Constitution.

Lesbian former law clerk lauds Ginsburg

In her interview for a law clerk's job with U.S. Court of Appeals Judge Ruth Bader Ginsburg, Barbara Flagg said she "gently" tried to bring up the fact that she is a lesbian.

Judge Ginsburg didn't pursue the point, offering her the job on the spot. And Miss Flagg, now a law professor at Washington University in St. Louis, still doesn't know if Judge Ginsburg was aware of her sexual orientation when she hired her for the 1987-88 court term.

"She certainly knows now," said Miss Flagg, who has written a legal memo in support of Judge Ginsburg that has been circulated to homo-

sexual-rights groups, some of whom have expressed reservations about Judge Ginsburg's nomination to the Supreme Court.

The reservations, prompted by Judge Ginsburg's refusal to re-hear a case involving the dismissal of a homosexual sailor, are not shared by Miss Flagg.

She believes Judge Ginsburg would make a superb Supreme Court justice. And, Miss Flagg said, those looking for clues to the kind of justice she would be need look no further than Judge Ginsburg's speech accepting the nomination.

"She came across as herself in the speech, remarkably I think," Miss Flagg said. "The two major areas of

her life are her work on the court — she loves being a judge — and her family.

"Her speech showed her scholarly abilities," Miss Flagg said. And her emotional references to her family demonstrated that "she is perhaps warmer than you'd expect from her opinions."

During Miss Flagg's year as a clerk, Judge Ginsburg served as an intellectual role model and as a mentor, helping Miss Flagg find a faculty job when her term as clerk ended.

"She's intellectually demanding," Miss Flagg said. "You wouldn't describe her as easygoing, because the level of work is intense."

Husband Triggered Letters Supporting Ginsburg for Court

Backers Sought to Clarify Abortion Stance

NEW YORK, June 16—Supreme Court nominee Ruth Bader Ginsburg's husband said today he triggered letter-writing campaigns this spring to let the White House know about his wife's supporters and to clarify her record on abortion rights.

Martin D. Ginsburg, a Georgetown University law professor, said he made two separate rounds of calls—without his wife's knowledge or consent—to former academic colleagues and members of the women's movement who knew and supported his wife of 39 years.

"If there was something I could have done to be helpful, I would have done it, because I think my wife is super, and the president couldn't have made a better appointment than the one he just made," Ginsburg said.

Ginsburg's efforts generated dozens of letters supporting his wife at a time when she was widely mentioned as a possible Supreme Court nominee. But some members of the women's movement had suggested the questions Ginsburg raised about the constitutional grounding of *Roe v. Wade*, the 1973 Supreme Court decision recognizing a constitutional right to abortion, would keep her from winning the nomination.

President Clinton said today that he had seen "seven or eight letters for her" but was "unaware of any big letter-writing campaign." The president said he was not influenced by the letters which came from lawyers, academics, women's rights and Jewish leaders and Ginsburg family friends.

Martin Ginsburg said that in April a "very savvy" friend at the White House whom he would not identify, told him that if he wanted to help his wife he could ask several members of the academic community to write on her behalf.

The friend said that "if the White House doesn't receive something

that shows how good the academic community feels about her, they could be nervous about it," he recalled. "I repeated that story to two friends of mine, both in the academic world" which he assumed resulted in letters to White House aides.

The second pitch came after columns in the *New Republic* and the *New York Times* suggested that some women's groups were not supporting Judge Ginsburg because of the *Roe v. Wade* issue. President was unaware of Ginsburg letter drive

WASHINGTON — President Clinton said yesterday that he did not know that several of the letters he read on behalf of Supreme Court nominee Ruth Bader Ginsburg were part of a letter-writing campaign orchestrated by her husband and friends.

"I read some of the letters that came in on behalf of many candidates," the president told reporters in the Oval Office for a photo session, "but I was not aware of any big letter-writing campaign. I read seven or eight."

Earlier in the day, White House Press Secretary Dee Dee Myers said 30 to 40 letters were sent to the president on behalf of Judge Ginsburg, but said there were similar letters sent by fans of other candidates.

The Sun disclosed yesterday that Judge Ginsburg's husband, Georgetown University law professor Martin Ginsburg, made calls to longtime friends and admirers of Judge Ginsburg when it appeared her chances for the court were fading, urging them to contact the White House.

Asked yesterday how much the letter-writing campaign influenced him, Mr. Clinton replied, "Only that a lot of people thought a lot of her."

But on Monday, White House officials indicated that they had, indeed been impressed by the outpouring for Judge Ginsburg.

The White House listed eight of the letters in a biographical packet

distributed about the judge. The president himself lauded Judge Ginsburg with language nearly identical to that used in three of the eight letters.

Traditionally, judges and lawyers hopeful of being appointed to the Supreme Court do little more than sit with their fingers crossed.

Competition for the current vacancy to replace retiring Justice Byron R. White, however, was particularly fierce because it was the first nomination by a Democratic president in almost 26 years.

Judge Ginsburg was the surprise pick of the president less than 72 hours after his top aides indicated it had come down to a choice between Interior Secretary Bruce E. Babbitt or Boston appeals court Judge Stephen G. Breyer.

Judge Ginsburg declined to answer questions about this matter yesterday, referring questions to her husband.

"My spouse is an independent person," she said in between visits to senators on Capitol Hill. "Any questions that you have of him you should pose directly to him."

Mr. Ginsburg was out of town, his office said, and not returning phone calls yesterday.

White House officials, obviously relieved to have the tortuous three-month search for Justice White behind them, did not act troubled by the letter-writing campaign.

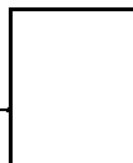

[REDACTED] advised she continues to correspond with candidate and sees candidate whenever she is in Washington, D.C. [REDACTED] advised she feels she has a fairly close personal relationship with candidate, adding that candidate [REDACTED] on several occasions. [REDACTED] advised she has nothing but good things to say about candidate, both professionally and personally. She advised that as [REDACTED] for candidate, she did the basic [REDACTED] responsibilities, such as writing bench memoranda, discussing cases with candidate, writing drafts of opinion, etc., and she found candidate to be an excellent employer. [REDACTED] advised it is a wonderful opportunity for law clerks to work for candidate, stating that she found candidate to be a bright and outstanding attorney and Judge. [REDACTED] advised that as [REDACTED] for candidate, one could learn a lot from her about the law, how a Judge approaches cases, and in particular, about her writings which are very meticulous and stylish and conveying in the sense of saying what candidate means. She further stated candidate was an excellent employer in the sense of developing a relationship and rapport with her law clerks. [REDACTED] advised candidate treated her law clerks as an extension of her family and took an interest in them, both professionally and personally. [REDACTED] stated candidate is an excellent Judge as well as an attorney and she could not think of anyone who has a more judicial type temperament than candidate. She advised candidate decides cases the way she thinks Judges should in the sense candidate thoroughly familiarizes herself with the case and applies the law to the case and does not arrive at results because candidate likes one of the parties over the other. [REDACTED] added that candidate follows the Judge's rules faithfully.

She stated that she does not recall specifically whether candidate drinks at all, however, stated that she probably does have a glass of wine with dinner, adding that candidate, if she does drink at all, only drinks socially. [REDACTED] advised she has never known candidate to ever associate with any groups or individuals which she would consider disreputable or disloyal in nature and she has never heard nor was there any indication that candidate is biased or prejudiced against any groups or individuals based on sex, race, religion, etc. She stated she would absolutely recommend candidate to any position of trust and responsibility with the United States government, adding that she considers candidate to be outstanding in every way, adding that it would be hard to find anyone who fits the bill like candidate does. [REDACTED] advised candidate enjoys an exceptional integrity, as well as exceptional legal ability; two qualities which you would look for in a Judge, adding that those qualities make a great combination.

is that it was only for [redacted]. He occasionally has maintained
contact with Judge GINSBURG, especially at the clerks' and
judges' reunions.

He feels that if law clerks could be given a life
tenure he would have never left his job working for the
candidate. He described her as extremely competent, dependable,
hard-working, and bright. In fact he stated that she is one of
the brightest people he has ever met. He felt that she is fair
and at the same time a tough task master, but that she is
incredibly thorough in her work.

She reads everything that the clerks prepared on all
the briefs, and is minutely knowledgeable about all the cases
presented before her. She did a lot of work on her own and he
felt that she was a very active judge and not passive at all in
exploring what the law is on the subject being presented before
her.

[redacted] advised that Judge GINSBURG was very demanding
of counsel during oral arguments and that she expected high
standards at all times. He stated that she was always very
concerned to reach the right decision in every case as is spelled
out by the particular law. He thought she had very good judicial
temperament while on the bench and worked well with other judges
to convince them through intellectual persuasion that the
position she had reached was the correct one. He stated that she
more than held her own with justices such as BORK and SCALIA.
[redacted] felt that Judge GINSBURG created conditions of consensus
judgements rather than polarizing different judges about her
position.

He considers the candidate to be of excellent character
and reputation and knows of no disreputable or disloyal
associates. He has no reason to doubt her loyalty to the U.S.
government. He does not know her to abuse alcohol, prescriptive
drugs or to use controlled substances. He feels that she is in
good physical condition and used to spend part of her time
exercising with the female law clerks. He knows of no derogatory
or unfavorable information which would reflect on the candidate's
nomination, knows of no financial problems, nor of any biases or
prejudices towards any individual or group due to race, creed, or
national origin.

[redacted] highly recommended the candidate for a position
of trust with the U.S. government.

prepared a list of questions regarding the memos. He stated that
she had extremely good relations with other judges who were
REAGAN and BUSH appointees. They seemed to be particularly
interested in her opinions on their positions which they had
written. He felt that those judges took her very seriously in
regards to her written opinions. As far as attorneys appearing
before her, she always demanded a no nonsense approach and wanted
the oral arguments to focus on any problem areas they may have.
[redacted] felt that some attorneys might find her demanding, but it
seemed to him that that's what her job was, to direct these
attorneys towards the problem areas and not to waste the court's
time by not focusing on a particular issue.

[redacted] stated the candidate is of extremely excellent
character and reputation and that she has no known disreputable
or disloyal associates. He considers her to be one of the best
loyal Americans that he knows. He knows of no alcohol problems
the candidate may have, does not know her to use prescriptive

Ginsburg only a 'ground rule double'

If Judge Ruth Bader Ginsburg is really as wonderful as President Clinton made her out to be, how come she was not always at the top of his list? Why did he finally settle on her only after Judge Stephen Breyer's tax problem was publicized and after Secretary Bruce Babbitt's environmental supporters persuaded the president he was too valuable in the Interior Department?

Why was she not even on the longer short list, which included Judges Jon Newman and Gilbert Merritt? The answers to these questions tells us something not only about Justice-designate Ginsburg, but about the entire process by which Supreme Court justices are currently nominated.

When Justice Byron White announced his intended resignation from the high court, President Clinton said he would "pick a person that has a fine mind, good judgment, wide experience of the law and in the problems of real people, and someone with a big heart." He has also talked about the need for a justice who could help create a consensus within the Supreme Court.

Judge Ginsburg is one of several dozen very able sitting judges on the United States Court of Appeals. Her decisions over the past dozen years have been characterized by a rigid proceduralism. She has a sharp mind, but it is the mind of a tax

lawyer rather than a constitutional lawyer. She always seems to focus on the fine print rather than on the big picture. She has little experience with "real people," and if she has a "big heart," she has kept it well hidden during her years on the bench.

Most important, she is anything but a consensus builder. Her reputation among her colleagues — judges, law clerks and lawyers — is that she is a "difficult person," who alienates many of those around her. She has been compared to Justice Scalia, whom she admires and likes. Lawyers who have appeared before her have characterized her — according to the Almanac of the Federal Judiciary — as "picky," "impatient," "schoolmarmish," "a procedural nut," and a judge who "likes to lecture in a sarcastic way."

Now that Judge Ginsburg has been nominated and seems likely to be confirmed, few lawyers will say anything negative about her — at least not in public. But the public has the right to know what lawyers who know her best really think about her judicial temperament and philosophy.

The process by which Judge Ginsburg was nominated has also been called into question by the timing of the president's decision. Late last week, he dragged Judge Stephen Breyer down to Washington from a

Cambridge hospital bed where he was recuperating from a bicycle accident. At the time, he knew all about Judge Breyer's tax situation. Yet Breyer remained his first choice — over Ginsburg — for several days. Only after several women's groups and senators complained of a "double standard" if Breyer were nominated, after Zoe Baird and Kimba Wood were disqualified as attorney general, did President Clinton go back to a judge who he had previously passed over for the high court.

He then proceeded to describe her in terms that even her most ardent admirers would not recognize. He characterized her as the Thurgood Marshall of the women's movement, thus denigrating the memory of a hero who had risked his life fighting for basic equality in the deep south for more than a quarter century. Ginsburg, on the other hand, had argued a handful of appeals at a time when women's rights were voguish and certainly not life or career threatening.

The reality is that Ruth Bader Ginsburg was a fairly good lawyer, a fairly good judge and a fairly decent person. President Clinton told friends that he wanted his first nomination to the Supreme Court to be "a home run." Judge Ginsburg is a ground-rule double.

Perhaps she will turn into a triple or even a home run, but there is little in her background to guarantee that she will be anything more than she has been as an appellate judge over the past 12 years — namely a narrow stickler for procedural regularity who has made little contribution to jurisprudence. After so many years without a Supreme Court vacancy to be filled by a Democratic president, one would have hoped for better.

Moreover, after the rather shabby way in which Judge Breyer was treated, it will become even more difficult for the president to find excellent candidates for high office who will be willing to subject themselves to the vicissitudes of the selection process. The best thing Judge Ginsburg may have had going for her was that her husband is one of the ablest tax lawyers in the country, and probably one of the few people who knew that Social Security taxes had to be paid on every babysitter, mother's helper, house cleaner and cookie-baker.

But knowing the tax code and thinking like a tax lawyer should not be the main criteria for promotion to the Supreme Court. A broader vision is required — both by the nominees and by the president who makes the nominations.
