And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's said College of Arms. (C. 833.)

Board of Trade, Whitehall, July 2, 1868.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, an extract from the "Moniteur," publishing two Imperial Decrees, bearing date 6th June, 1858:—

By the first a duty of 20 centim's per ton burthen is established, from the 1st January, 1869, on all ships, French or foreign, entering the port of Bordcaux laden, and coming from a long

vovage or from a foreign country.

By the second a duty of 10 centimes per ton burnen is established, at the port of Dunkerque, from the 1st July, 1868, upon all vessels, French or foreign, with the exception of tugs, pilot-boats,

and boats engaged in coast fishing.

These dues are to be levied solely for the purpose of covering the difference between the rate of interest paid by the State, for the loans contracted with the two towns of Bordeaux and Dunk rque respectively, and the rate paid by those two towns to the subscribers to the loans; and will consequently cease immediately upon the entire reimbursement of the sum which forms the difference.

II. DEBT OF THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION.

The debt is composed of two items:

- 1. The amount of the 10 per cent. Bonds issued by the Commission, and repayable at a fixed date.
- 2. The amount due to Turkey for advances made by her to the Commission until the year 1863, the date at which this amount is to be paid off not having yet been decided,

The 10 per cent. Bonds amount to 111,100 ducats, and comprise—

1. The balance of the issue of 1866, 24,550 ducats, which will be paid off in 1868, and

ducats will be paid off on the 30th June, 1868, and the balance in 1871 and 1872, according 2. 86,550 ducats realized on the issue of the 25th April, 1867. Of this latter sum 21,000 as the sums fall due.

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The debt to Turkey amounts to 320,969 ducats, 26 piastres, 12 paras.

Various sums have to be deducted from this amount, of which the principal item is the salary of the Staff of the General Inspection of Navigation, which the Commission pays for the account of the Ottoman Government.

The credit of Turkey in account current with the Commission on the 31st December, 1867, was 317,811 ducats, 27 piastres, 18 paras.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received,

from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at St. Petersburgh, inclosing an extract from the "Journal de St. Pétersbourg," of the 4th ultimo, relative to the alterations in the Customs' laws respecting the production of bills of lading at Cronstadt and St. Petersburgh, of which the following is a translation:—

1. The production of bills of lading has been suppressed at the Custom-house of St. Petersburgh, together with the formalities attending it.

2. Instead of the bills of lading at present demanded from masters of vessels on arriving in harbour, they will only be required to produce their manifests, made out in their own country and their own language, and these shall serve as the basis for drawing up the detailed account of their freight.

3. Under exceptional circumstances, however, when the vessel shall not be provided with a manifest, the regulations at present in force with regard to the production of bills of lading shall be

applicable.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from the British Commissioner of the European Commission of the Danube, inclosing the subjoined translations of:—

(1.) The Police Regulations to be observed in the interest of the Works of Improvement on the Lower Danube. (2.) The New Provisions relative to Pilotage on the Lower Danube.

And (3.) The New Provisions concerning the Lighter Service.

EUROPEAN COMMISSION OF THE DANUBE.

POLICE REGULATIONS to be observed in the interest of the Works of Improvement on the Lower Danube.

The European Commission of the Danube,

Considering that frequent damage is caused to its works and to its plant by vessels navigating between Isaktcha and Sulina, especially by steam vessels, the circulation of which becomes more and more active:

And considering Article 112 of the Regulation of Police and Navigation annexed to the Public Act signed at Galatz on the 2nd of November,

1865,

Enacts the following provisions:—

Art. 1.

The precautionary rules prescribed by Article 25 of the Regulation of Navigation and Police, under date of 2nd of November, 1865, to the captains or masters of the vessels, floats of timber, or rafts, navigating or stationary on the Lower Danube, below Isaktcha, apply specially to the floating plant employed on the works of improvement of the river and of its mouths, as well as to the works of every kind, such as piers, jetties, groynes, quays, constructed or to be constructed by the European Commission, and to the buoys and other signals placed by it on the river or on its banks.

Art. 2.

The captains or masters of vessels, floats of timber, or rafts, are equally bound to take the precautions necessary for impeding as little as possible the works in course of execution, especially the dredging operations, and the construction of the works undertaken or to be undertaken in the Sulina branch, and at its mouth.

To this end, the captains of all steam vessels are bound to slacken their speed, as much as they can do so without danger to their own vessels, or to the vessels towed by them, when they are traversing a section of the river on which dredging or other works are in course of execution, and that, as long as they are between the signal posts placed on the banks, above and below the site of the works.

Art. 3.

When the steam dredgers are employed in the Sulina Branch, or at the Tchatal of St. George during the night, the passage of the channel, where the dredging operations and discharge of stuff dredged are being carried on is forbidden, except in the case hereinafter mentioned, to all sailing, and steam vessels, rafts, or doats of timber, from seven o'clock in the evening till five o'clock in the morning.

This prohibition does not extend to packetboats making periodical voyages, and engaged in the Mail Service. except. however, in the case of special necessity, when passage by night can be forbidden absolutely, by a simple notice which the Commission will cause to be published to this

effect.

Art. 4.

Every offence against the provisions of the preceding Articles is punished by a fine of fifty

francs (£2) at least, or of 500 francs (£20) at most.

Art. 5.

When an offence committed against the preceding provisions, or one of the offences provided for and punished by Article 99 of the Regulation of Navigation and Police of the 2nd of November, 1865, above quoted, is accompanied or followed by any injury or damage whatsoever occasioned by the offending vessel, float of timber, or raft, to the works of the European Commission of the Danube, to its floating plant, or to any other of its properties, the fine incurred by the offending party, is of 250 francs (£10) at least, and of 2,500 francs (£100) at most.

6.

The infliction of the penalties enacted by the preceding 4th and 5th Articles, is pronounced by the Captain of the Port of Sulina, or by the

Inspector-General of the Navigation.

It is regulated in general, and in particular for what concerns appeals, by the provisions of Chapter II. of Part VI. of the Regulation of Navigation and Police of the 2nd of November, 1865.

Art. 7.

The present provisions shall be immediately published, and shall enter in force on the 15th of May next.

Done at Galatz the 21st of April, 1868.

EUROPEAN COMMISSION OF THE DANUBE.

NEW PROVISIONS relative to pilotage on the Lower Danube.

The European Commission of the Danube, Considering the 112th Article of the Regulation of Navigation and Police applicable to the Lower Danube, dated the 2nd November, 1865;

Whereas, in consequence of the works executed at the mouth and in the branch of the Sulina, the vessels which ascend the river are, in general, of a larger burden than formerly, and require, for that reason, more care and knowledge on the part of the pilots entrusted with the direction of them;

Whereas, in the assessment of the pilotage dues for the navigation down-stream, the tariff now in force establishes no distinction between large and small vessels, and that thus the river pilots are no longer remunerated in proportion with the services rendered:

Whereas, on the other hand, the power of obtaining a river pilot's licence implicitly granted by the Regulation of Navigation and Police of the 2nd November, 1865, to the pilots who do not exercise their calling exclusively on the Lower Danube, becomes more inconvenient in proportion as the employment of vessels of considerable size increases the difficulties of pilotage in the narrow channels of the Sulina Branch;

And in order to determine the extent of the responsibility, which falls upon the river pilots, in piloting vessels;

Enacts the following provisions:

Art. 1.

The second paragraph of Article 69 of the Regulation of Navigation and Police annexed to the Public Act relating to the Navigation of the Mouths of the Danube, under date of the 2nd November, 1865, is repealed, and replaced by the following provision:

"The licence of pilot is delivered by the Captain of the port, and must receive his visa

every year; it ceases to be valid if the annual visa is wanting."

Art. 2.

Articles 75 and 78 of the said Regulation are also repealed, and replaced by the following

provisions:

"Art. 75.—Independently of the corps of pilots charged with piloting vessels in the channel of the Sulina Mouth, and acting under the direction of the Captain of the port, there is a special service of pilots, likewise licensed, for merchant vessels navigating the river between Sulina and Ibraila.

"The corps of river pilots is placed under the authority of the Inspector General of the navigation, by whom the licence of pilot is delivered.

"This licence must each year receive the visa of the Inspector General, and ceases to be valid if the accomplishment of this formality is wanting.

"The pilotage service is directed by a chief pilot who is bound to have three offices, at Galatz, at Ibraila, and at Toultcha, and by a deputy chief

pilot residing at Sulina.

"The licensed pilots of the river service alone have authority to pilot vessels during their navigation between Sulina and Ibraila, as well ascending as descending, but they are forbidden, excepting those of the steam packets making periodical voyages, to pilot them in the channel of the Sulina mouth, or in any part of their sea voyage.

"Art. 78.—Captains will arrange with the river pilots the sum to be paid the latter for the pilotage up-stream. In case of dispute, however, on this point, the port authorities will not admit any claim on the part of pilots for a higher rate of wages than six frances a day for the

voyage, in addition to subsistence on board, for the pilotage of a sailing vessel. These wages may be raised to a maximum of one hundred francs a day for the pilots of steam vessels.

"With regard to the compulsory pilotage of the voyage down-stream, its dues are fixed as

follows, for sailing vessels:

"For the passage from Galatz, or from a port situated above this point, to Sulina, fifty centimes per register ton;

"For the passage from Reni or Ismail to

Sulina, forty centimes per ton;

"For the passage from Toultcha to Sulina

thirty centimes per ton.

"Steam vessels pay only the half of these dues, and those who make their voyages between the ports of the Danube and the ports of the Black Sea or of the Bosphorus, may be freed from them, provided that the ship's pilot is furnished with a licence as river pilot.

"The chief pilot of the river service deducts two centimes per ton from the amount of the due paid by each sailing vessel, and one centime per ton on the due paid by steam vessels; the

rest of the due accrues to the pilot.

"These dues are paid into the hands of the Cashier of the Navigation Chest at Sulina, who alone can give a valid receipt for them; it is allowable, however, to the captain of the vessel piloted to pay directly to his pilot the half of the due, as an advance.

"The calculation of the tonnage for the payment of the pilotage due, is worked out according to the rules laid down by the Tariff of Navigation

Dues of the 2nd November, 1865."

Art. 3.

The second paragraph of Article 80 of the above-mentioned regulation of the 2nd November,

1865, is repealed and replaced by the following

provision:-

"They are forbidden to have any interest, either directly or indirectly in any operation, or contract connected with Lighters, the object of which is to get afloat a vessel aground, except in the case where the operation has been undertaken by the job for the whole duration of the voyage."

Art. 4.

At the beginning of Article 81 of the same regulation, is inserted an additional provision, thus worded:—

"The Captain who has taken on board a licensed River Pilot does not, even in the case where the Pilotage is compulsory, remain the less responsible for the observance of the Regulations of Navigation and Police in force upon the Lower Danube, and especially of Articles 25 and 37 of the present Regulation.

"The responsibility of the Pilot is limited to the indication of the navigable channels and of the particulars of the River Navigation. Consequently, the Captain, who abandons to his Pilot the direction of his vessel, does so upon his

own responsibility."

Art. 5.

Between the second and third paragraphs of Article 101 of the aforesaid Regulation of Navigation and Police, is inserted a new paragraph, thus worded:

"Every Pilot of the River Service who offends against the provisions of the last paragraph of the above Article 75, by piloting a vessel in the Channel of the Sulina mouth, or in the sea, is punished with a fine of 100 francs (£4) at least, or of 500 francs (£20) at most. The same penalty is applicable to the Captain who has his

vessel piloted in the Danube, between Sulina and Ibraila, by a Pilot who does not belong to the Corps of River Pilots."

Art. 6.

Article 12 of the Tariff of Navigation Dues of the 2nd November, 1865, is repealed, inasmuch as it is contrary to the provisions of the new Article 78 herein above.

Art. 7.

The present provisions will enter in force on the 1st of June, 1868.

EUROPEAN COMMISSION OF THE DANUBE.

NEW PROVISIONS concerning the Lighter Service.

The European Commission of the Danubc,

Whereas, the provisions of Part V, of the Regulation of Navigation and Police, under date of the 2nd November, 1865, which rule at present the Lighter Service, have been drawn up especially in view of the operations which are carried on at the mouth of the river;

Whereas, at the present time, on the contrary, lighters are employed principally for the passage of the shoals of the Sulina Branch, or for the conveyance of cargoes destined for sea-going

vessels, which do not ascend the river;

Whereas, moreover, the number of licensed lighters, subject to the disciplinary superintendence of the Inspector-General of the Navigation, has diminished to a considerable extent; and whereas, consequently, sea-going vessels of low

tonnage are employed, in greater numbers than

formerly, to act temporarily as lighters;

Whereas, these vessels being subject neither to the constraint of being visited and measured every year, nor to that of giving pledges for good conduct, offer less security to commerce than the licensed lighters; and whereas more frequent abuses, committed to the detriment of the lightened cargoes, have been made known to the Commission:

Whereas, it thus appears that the provisions in force concerning the Lighter Service no longer correspond with the exigencies of the Danubian Navigation in so far as they have been modified by the effect of the werks executed at the Sulina Mouth;

And considering Article 112 of the above quoted Regulation of Navigation and Police of

the 2nd November, 1865;

Enacts the following provisions:

Art. 1.

Articles 82 to 93, both inclusive, of the Regulation of Navigation and Police annexed to the Public Act, relating to the Navigation of the Mouths of the Danube, under date of the 2nd November, 1865, forming Chapters 1, 2, and 3 of Part V of the aforesaid Regulation, are repealed and replaced by the following Articles:

"PART V.

" The Lighter Service.

" CHAPTER 1.

" General Rules.

"Art. 82.—Lighterage operations are divided into two classes:

"1st. Local lighterage effected by a seagoing vessel, which, in order to cross the Sulina Bar (either ou entering or on leaving the river), or a shoal in the interior, discharges the whole or a part of its cargo into a smaller vessel in order to re-ship it

after having cleared the obstacle;

"2nd. Coasting lightcrage performed by sailing vessels, or by steam vessels and towing lighters which take a cargo in a port of the Danube and consign it to a sea-going vessel anchored in the port or on the roadstcad of Sulina.

"Art. 83.—No one can undertake lighterage operations without having previously entered at the Office of the Inspector-General of the Navigation at Toultcha, the vessels intended to act as lighters, or without having provided himself, for each vessel, with a licence delivered by the Inspector-General, and which must always be forthcoming on board.

"Before delivering the licence the Inspector-General causes the vessels, intended to act as lighters, to be visited by a commission which judges whether they are in good condition and ascertains at the same time their capacity in register tons and their burden in imperial

quarters.

"The licensed lighters are bound to submit themselves, every year to a fresh visit, the period of which is fixed by the Inspector-General: if the result of the examination is deemed satisfactory, the Inspector-General notes it on the licence of the lighter; in the contrary case, the licence is withdrawn until the necessary repairs have been made.

"Art. 84.—Vessels provided with regular ship's papers can be temporarily employed for lightening other vessels, upon condition that the captains make for each operation a special declara-

tion to the Inspector-General of the Navigation, if the lighterage is to be effected over the shoals of the Sulina Branch, or to the Captain of the Port of Sulina if the lighterage is for the passage of the mouth. This declaration is accompanied by the deposit of all the papers of the vessel intended to act as a lighter, except the muster-roll of the crew.

"If the vessel employed as lighter has entered the river with more than the third of her cargo, the dues owing for entry become demandable immediately after the first lighterage opera-

tion.

"No vessel, however, not entered as a lighter, can be employed in this capacity, during more than four consecutive months from the first operation, except after fulfilling the formalities

prescribed by Article 83.

"Art. 85.—Every master of a licensed lighter is compelled to deposit 600 francs (£24) which is paid into the Navigation Chest at Sulina. This deposit may be replaced by the liable security of a person well known to be solvent, resident in one of the ports of the Lower Danube.

"The licence cannot be delivered by the Inspector-General before the deposit has been

made, or the security accepted.

"The deposit cannot be returned or the security discharged as long as the vessel continues to act as lighter. This deposit may be appropriated to the payment of the pecuniary fines pronounced against the Master of the lighter, and, in this case the licence is withdrawn from the vessel until the deposit has been renewed entirely.

"Art. 86.—Licensed lighters, as well as vessels temporarily employed as lighters, are bound to

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have the muster-roll of their crews in order, and to present it, whenever required, to the Inspector-General of the Navigation, to the Captain of the Port of Sulina, and to the agents placed under the orders of these latter.

"Licensed lighters are bound, moreover, to bear the number of their licence, and vessels employed temporarily as lighters, the number of the last stamp, affixed to the roll of their crew in execution of Article 17 of the present regulation. These numbers must be marked in white paint on each side of the bows, in Arab figures one foot in height.

"Chapter 2.

"Local Lighterage Operations.

"Art. 87.—The superintendence of local lighterage operations, which take place in the river, is exercised by the Inspector-General of the Navigation, or by his agents, and that of the operations which take place at the mouth, by the Captain of the Port of Sulina.

"Art. 88.—When a sea-going vessel discharges the whole or part of her cargo on board of lighters, the captain is bound to place on board of each of them a guard of his own

choosing.

"For operations of local lighterage accom-plished in the internal course of the river, the lighters must, unless they are towed, navigate in company with the lightened vessels, and may not quit them, except under circumstances beyond their control, before having returned to them the whole of the lightened merchandise.

"On their part, the captains of lightened vessels are bound, before putting to sea, to pay to the masters of their lighters, the freight agreed

upon.

"Art. 89.—In the case of lighterage at the mouth of the river by vessels putting to sea, the lighters leave the port at the same time as the lightened vessels; but if a vessel employs several lighters, the Captain of the Port regulates their departure so that the latter have not to remain too long on the roadstead before they can effect the re-loading.

"In no case, whether the vessel to be lightened be leaving the Port, or entering it from the sea, or remaining anchored on the roadstead, can the lighters go out of Sulina harbour without a permit to pass from the Captain of the Port; this permit to pass is presented to the Guard-boat stationed at the mouth, in conformity with Article

16 of the present Regulation.

"Art. 90.—Licensed lighters, and vessels having acted as lighters, which ascend the river, or re-enter the port of Sulina after having lightened a sea-going vessel, may be visited by the agents of the Inspector-General of the Navigation, or of the Captain of the Port of Sulina. "The masters of lighters are consequently

"The masters of lighters are consequently bound to open the hold and the cabins of their vessels, whenever required to do so by the said

agents.

"CHAPTER 3,

"Coasting Lighterage Operations.

"Art. 91.—The operations of coasting lighterage may be carried on by all steam-vessels, towing lighters, sailing vessels or lighters provided with regular papers, on condition that the captains or masters procure for each voyage, from the Consular or competent local authorities of the ports in which they take their cargo, a certificate making known the object of the operation, and the quantity of merchandize embarked.

"This certificate must be produced in the

course of the voyage, whenever required by the

Inspector-General or his agents.

"Art. 92.—Immediately upon the arrival of a vessel, carrying on coasting lighterage, in the port of Sulina, the master is bound to repair to the office of the Captain of the Port, and to pre sent there the certificate prescribed by the preceding Article.

"If the vessel discharges the whole of her cargo in the port of Sulina, she moors alongside the sea-going vessel which is to receive the merchandize, and must not quit her, until after

having entirely finished discharging.

"If the cargo is to be discharged, wholly or partly, on the roadstead of Sulina, the master of the vessel hands over the certificate prescribed by Article 91 to the Captain of the Port, who delivers to him the permit to pass necessary for going out of the harbour.

"Art. 93.—The preceding Articles 86, 89, and 90, are likewise applicable to vessels which per-

form the Coasting Lighterage Service.

"However, steam-vessels, and towing lighters are not subject to the constraint of allowing themselves to be visited, conformably with Article 90, unless one of the parties demand it, or in case of suspicion of fraud."

Art. 2.

The period of twelve days fixed by Article 95 of the said Regulation of Navigation and Police, of the 2nd of November, 1865, is reduced to six days.

Art. 3.

Article 97 of the same Regulation of Navigation and Police is repealed, and is replaced by the following provision:—

"If it is proved that a larceny has been committed upon the cargo placed on board of a

licensed lighter, the licence of the vessel is withdrawn for three months at least, without prejudice to the application to the Captain or Master of the vessel of the fine appointed by the third paragraph of Article 102 of the present Regulation, or to the criminal proceedings belonging to the competent authorities."

Art. 4.

Article 102 of the aforesaid Regulation is repealed and replaced by the following provision:—
"Offences against the provisions of the first

"Offences against the provisions of the first paragraph of Article 83, and against those of the above Articles 84, 90, and 91 are punished with a fine of 100 francs (£4) at least, and of 200 francs

(£8) at most.

"Every offence against the provisions of the third paragraph of Article 83, against those of Article 86 and of the first paragraph of Article 88, and against those of Article 89, and of the first paragraph of Article 92, is punished with a fine of 60 francs at least, and of 120 francs at most.

"Every offence against the provisions of the second paragraph of Article 88, and of the second paragraph of Article 92, is punished with a fine of 400 francs (£16) at least, and of 1,200 francs (£48) at most, and the same penalty is applicable to the captain or master of every vessel having acted as lighter, or of every licensed lighter, which, without having been thereto compelled by circumstances beyond control, quits, on the roadstead of Sulina, the lightened vessel, before having restored to her the whole of her cargo.

"The vessel or lighter on board of which the offence is committed, remains especially set apart for the payment of the fine incurred, for the recovering of which she can be sequestered by the Inspector-General of the Navigation, or by the

Captain of the Port of Sulina, according to circumstances."

Art. 5.

The present provisions shall enter in force on the 1st of June, 1868.

Il est arrêté:-

1°. Les bagages des voyageurs qui traversent sans s'arrêter, par chemin de fer, le Royaume pourront être expédiés en exemption de visite soit à l'entrée soit à la sortie;

La visite douanière se bornera par conséquent aux menus-effets que les dits voyageurs porteront à la main, ou qu'ils voudraient garder à leur libre

disposition.

2°. Les employés du chemin de fer présenteront à la douane d'entrée les bagages à expédier par transit et en exemption de visite. La Douane,

après les avoir plombés simplement, afin que l'identité en soit maintenue, leur donnera un balletin d'assurance, dans lequel seront inscrits le nombre et la nature des colis, leur poids, et les étiquettes de service sous lesquelles ils sont indiqués dans la feuille de route.

Il sera donné autant de bulletins d'assurance qu'il y aura de Douanes par lesquelles les bagages

devront sortir.

3°. Le bulletin d'assurance sera fait au nom de l'Administration des Chemins de Fer, qui assume la responsabilité de le présenter à la Douane de sortie. Le terme accordé pour arriver à la Douane de sortie sera fixé en raison de la distance kilométrique du chemin de fer et du temps nécessaire pour la parcourir, en égard aux règlements et aux heures de départ et d'arrivée du chemin de fer même.

4°. L'assurance sera taxée en raison d'un franc

par chaque kilogramme de poids brut.

5°. Le bureau de sortie, après avoir vérifié que les plombs sont intacts, et avoir collationné les bagages avec les indications portées sur le bullctin, permettra, si rien ne s'y oppose, la sortie, et délivrera le certificat de service.

6°. Si des colis arrivent sans leurs plombs, ou altérés extérieurement, dans le cas où l'on puisse constater qu'il n'y a eu ni fraude ni tentative d'en commettre, on appliquera les dispositions de l'Art. 78c du Règlement des Douanes.

TAKING into consideration the serious inconvenience to which travellers would be exposed who cross the Kingdom by railway, without stopping, in the event of their being obliged to have their luggage examined on entering and leaving;

Recognizing the necessity of taking some measures on this head, which, whilst maintaining the interests of the Treasury, should not hinder the rapidity of communication which is so essential to

those travelling long distances;

And having, in consequence, made the necessary arrangements with the Railway Company of Upper Italy, which is acting in concert with the other Railway Companies in this matter;

It has been decided:-

1st. Baggage belonging to through railway passengers can be forwarded without examination, either on entering or leaving.

Consequently, the Custom-house search will be limited to such personal articles as the said travellers carry by hand, or to those which they wish

to take charge of themselves.

2nd. The railway officials will hand over the baggage to be sent by transit and without examination, to the Frontier Custom-house officers, who, after having simply sealed it, so that its identity may be established, will give them a certificate on which will be written the number and nature of the packages, their weight, and the service labels by which they are entered in the way-bill.

The same number of certificates will be given

as there are Custom-houses through which the

luggage has to pass.

3rd. The certificate will be made out in the name of the Railway Company, which is charged with the responsibility of presenting it at the Customhouse at the place of departure. The time allowed for arrival at this Custom-house will be fixed in relation to the mileage of the railway, and the time it takes to traverse it having reference to the railway regulations and the hours of departure and arrival of the trains.

4th. The certificate will be taxed at the rate of

one franc for each kilogram of gross weight.

5th. The Burcau, at the place of departure after having ascertained that the seals are unbroken and after having compared the luggage with the descriptions set forth in the certificate will allow it to pass, if there is nothing to prevent it and will deliver up the service ticket.

6th. If any articles arrive without their seals, or externally disfigured, and it can be proved that there has been neither fraud, nor attempt at fraud, the dispositions of the Article 78 c., of the Custom-

bouse regulations shall be put in force.

If, on the contrary, a fraud is proved, or if a package is missing, the certificate shall only apply to such portion of the luggage as has been found to be in order, so that the Frontier Custom-house may proceed on the basis of the certificate which is spoken of in Article 4, in the terms of Article 69 of the "Custom-house Regulations."

A tonnage duc of 12 centimes per ton burthen will be levied at the port of Dunkerque, on and after the 1st January following the publication of the present Decree, upon all vessels, French or foreign, entering laden into the port, and which shall come from long voyages or from foreign countries.

This due is not applicable to Imperial men-of-

war.

The levying of this due has been granted to the town. The receipts will be applied exclusively to cover the difference between the rate of interest paid by the Government to the town and that paid by the town to the subscribers to the loan authorized by the Law of the 20th May, 1868.

The due will cease to be levied immediately upon the entire reimbursement of the sum which forms the above-mentioned difference.

ART. 2. The Decree of the 6th June, 1868, is and remains repealed.

The President of the Republic of Honduras to the Inhabitants.

KNOW all that the Supreme Congress of the Republic, desirous of encouraging immigration to Roatan, and promoting the progress of the same Island, which is the most important one in the Bay:—

Decrees-

ART. 1. The Port of Coxim Hall in Roatan is declared free; and this port shall for the future be called the Port of Medina.

ART. 2. Vessels, both native and foreign, that anchor in the said port, shall pay no other duty than the following:—Ships that do not measure more than 100 tons one dollar; those which are

more than 100, but do not exceed 200, two dollars; and those which have more than 200, three dollars.

ART. 3. In the same port the entrance and exit of merchandize of every kind shall not occasion any impost, but merchandize consumed in the place shall pay a very moderate one for the support of the local Government, in conformity with the order that will be issued by the Supreme Executive Power, after having first consulted the local authorities of the Island.

Her Majesty's Most Gracious Speech, delivered by the Lords Commissioners, to both Houses of Parliament, on Friday, July 31, 1868.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I AM happy to be enabled to release you from your labours, and to offer you my acknowledgments for the diligence with which you have applied yourselves to your Parliamentary duties.

My relations with foreign Powers remain friendly

and satisfactory. I have no reason to apprehend that Europe will be exposed to the calamity of war, and my policy will continue to be directed to secure the blessings of peace.

I announced to you at the beginning of this session that I had directed an expedition to be sent to Abyssinia, to liberate my Envoy and others of my subjects detained by the Ruler of that

country in an unjust captivity.

I feel sure that you will share in my satisfaction at the complete success which, has attended that expedition. After a march of 400 miles, through a difficult and unexplored country, my troops took the strong place of Magdala, freed the

captives, and vindicated the honour of my Crown; and by their immediate return, without one act of oppression or needless violence, proved that the expedition had been undertaken only in obedience to the claims of humanity, and in fulfilment of the

highest duties of my Sovereignty.

The cessation of the long-continued efforts to promote rebellion in Ireland has for some time rendered unnecessary the exercise by the executive of exceptional powers. I rejoice to learn that no person is now detained under the provisions of the Act for the suspension of the Habeas Corpus, and that no prisoner awaits trial in Ireland for an offence connected with the Fenian conspiracy.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

I have to thank you for the liberal supplies which you have voted for the public service.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I have had much satisfaction in giving my assent to a series of measures completing the great work of the Amendment of the Representation of the People in Parliament, which has engaged your attention for two Sessions

I have seen with satisfaction that the time necessarily occupied by this comprehensive subject has not prevented you dealing with other questions of great public interest, and I have gladly given my sanction to Bills for the better government of Public Schools, the regulation of railways, the amendment of the Law relating to British Sea Fisheries, and for the acquisition and maintenance of Electric Telegraphs by the Postmaster-General; and to several important measures having for their object the improvement of the Law, and of the Civil and Criminal Procedures in Scotland.

By the appointment of a Comptroller-in-Chief in the War Office a considerable reform in army administration has been commenced, which, by combining at home and abroad the various departments of military supply under one authority, will conduce to greater economy and efficiency both in

peace and war.

It is my intention to dissolve the present Parliament at the earliest day that will enable my people to reap the benefit of the extended system of representation which the wisdom of Parliament has provided for them. I look with entire confidence to their proving themselves worthy of the high privilege with which they have thus been invested; and I trust that, under the blessing of Divine Providence, the expression of their opinion on those great questions of public policy which have occupied the attention of Parliament and remain undecided, may tend to maintain unimpaired that civil and religious freedom which has been secured to all my subjects by the institutions and settlement of my realm.

Then a Commission for proroguing the Parliament was read; after which the Lord-Chancellor said:

THE following further Despatch has been received from Lieutenant-General the Lord Napier of Magdala, G.C.B., G.C.S.I, lately commanding the Abyssinian Expeditionary Force:-

(Sir Robert Napier to the Military Secretary, India Office).

Paris, 1st July, 1868. SIR.

I HAVE the honour to forward for submission to the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for India, the report of Lieutenant-Colonel Warden, Director of the Transport Corps in Abyssinia, with a report attached from Captain Hand, Sub-Director, Transport Corps, on the Highlands.

Enclosure No. 1.

Report on the Transport Train, Abyssinian E.F., by Lieutenant Colonel R. Warden, Bombay Staff Corps.

This train was organized under the orders of the Bombay Government in August, 1867, and Lieutenant-Colonel R. Warden was appointed director to organize the same, under the orders of the Commissary-General of the Army.

2. The establishment for every 2,000 animals was laid down by Government Resolution, No. 144a, of the 28th September, 1867, at the 3 F 2

strength as per margin* for 14 divisions in the train, and which, with the commissariat, was placed under the orders of Lieutenant-Colonel W. H. Holland, Controller of Supply and Transport, Abyssinian Expeditionary Force.

3. At the first starting the sole work of organization fell upon the director, without a second in command, staff, or any officer to assist him.

4. The duty of supervision devolved at first on the inspectors and head muccadums, consisting chiefly of civilians, i.e., persons who may have been or were then attached to the Commissariat, Railway, and similar departments. Among the muleteers and muccadums, a few were collected who had belonged to the field column carriage under the Commissariat; the rest were the offscouring of the Bombay streets, consisting of broken-down native tradesmen, discharged Europeans and Eurasians from other departments, and the class termed "loafers."

5. Prior to their embarkation, the first detachment that proceeded with the advanced brigade, strength as per margin,† were inspected by His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief, in Bombay, who expressed himself as under the gravest apprehension in regard to the stability of a transport founded upon such a nucleus, and on the 15th of October, 1867, a military organization was sanctioned approaching very nearly to the first scheme, as laid down by the director in his report dated 15th August, 1867.

6. On the 4th November, 1867, a second de-

tachment of the Transport Train was despatched

to Abyssinia, strength as per margin.*

7. The change in the organization of the corps by the Order of the 15th October, 1867, was as follows:—

Four head inspectors to be European non-commissioned officers of good character, and able to read, write, and keep accounts, and of some education.

Four, second inspectors (two European and two native non-commissioned officers); they were also required to be equally efficient.

Ten, third class (half European and half native), the latter to be able to keep accounts in the

vernacular; and

Twenty, fourth class (all native), to be drawn

from native regiments.

8. On this, circulars were issued to officers commanding Her Majesty's British and Native Regiments of Artillery, Cavalry, and Infantry, to collect good intelligent men for this work, and the following numbers were received:—

European Regiments . . . 160 Native Regiments . . . 405

9. This supervision was found, however, by experience when the work actually commenced in Abyssinia, to be still inadequate, and His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief therefore increased the same by attaching 37 men from the 3rd Regiment N.I. in Abyssinia.

10. It may be added that the 14 divisions of the Transport Train now included the Lahore

and Rawul Pindee Trains.

11. The proportion of men to animals, i.e, mules and camels, was fixed at one to three, but

as it will be shewn hereafter, the difficulties were so great that it became self-evident such a proportion could not answer, and in the advance of the army on Magdala, every mule had one man, either a soldier or muleteer, to look after it.

12. The establishment of officers of one captain and two subalterns to a division of 2,000 animals was found to be equally inadequate, for it became necessary that an officer should accompany every convoy, also one at each post to superintend the passing and returning of convoys with regularity and order, to supervise the feeding and watering of the animals—the latter under the circumstances a most important duty, and as in most places the supply of water was such as to require the greatest care in distribution.

13. Again, at the larger stations, such as Koomaylee, Senafe, Antalo, &c., officers were placed in command, with staff officers to assist them.

14. As may be imagined, these appointments drew away a considerable number of officers from the original strength, and His Excellency therefore drafted in a large number of officers as subalterns to be attached to the several divisions, so that there might be a better supervision over the men and their animals, which is so necessary to the well being of a transport.

15. On the 5th December, 1867, a second in command and staff officer were appointed, and on the arrival of the head-quarters in Abyssinia, the director for the first time was allowed a paymaster and quartermaster.

16. The paymaster was a most important post, and has been well and ably filled by Lieutenant Clark, Madras Cavalry; but it would have been better had this appointment been sanctioned in the first instance, instead of throwing this duty

upon captains of divisions, assisted by a subaltern, with one or two of their head inspectors to assist.

17. This arrangement, as soon as the working of the campaign really commenced, broke down altogether; for it was found that the out-door duties were such as to require the presence of every officer and non-commissioned officer day and night, and His Excellency then ordered that non-commissioned officers from each British regiment in the force should be detached as pay clerks to each division, but the full number, 14, could never be obtained.

18. As the army advanced, and the distance from the base of operations, where the head-quarters of the director was established, became so great, 4 out of the 14 divisions comprising the Transport Train were formed into what was termed a Highland Train, in contradistinction to the remaining 10 divisions, which were called the Lowland Train; Captain Hand, 82nd Foot, being appointed to the command of the former, and his report upon train is herewith annexed.

19. In addition to the establishment of officers, inspectors and muleteers, artificers, as per margin,* were attached to each division of 2,000

animals.

20. The strength of the corps under the Command of the Director, finally reached the gigantic proportions shewn at the close of the campaign, viz:

80 Commissioned Officers.
160 European Inspectors.
400 Native In pectors.

12,000 Followers.

21. The organization of the train was much

affected by a change in the class of muleteers, for besides those sent from Bombay at the commencement, a very large number of muleteers, or

believed to be such, were sent from Suez.

22. They consisted of every European nationality besides Turks and Egyptians, and the interpreters were very few in proportion, many among these were so open to bribery and corruption, that the correctness of their interpretation had had to be purchased by the men.

23. The wanton barbarous cruelty of these men to their animals, their unwillingness to work or to bear privations beside being insubordinate in the extreme, led to their being discharged, and during the months of January, February, and March, 2,100 were sent back.

24. They were replaced by some 5,000 men collected from the "Punjab," who answered admirably, and without which the train could not possibly have worked.

They had great endurance, were very willing and tractable, and once they knew what was required of them worked both cheerfully and

well.

- 25. The organization of the Transport Train, with the changes that occurred in the same having been shown, the working of the Train next comes into consideration, which commenced with the arrival of Captain Griffith and Lieutenants Mortimer and Hennell, with the advance brigade. The officers were followed by Captain Young and Lieutenants Sturt and Onslow and Captain Waring followed with Lieutenant Caldecott and Cornet Lucas.

N. Mules (Rawul Pindee).

O. Pack Bullocks.

P. Camels.

And Captains Griffith and Yonge commenced the formation of "A" and "E" Divisions, and Captain Waring, "P" Division.

27. Difficulties and disasters met these officers at every step. Mules landed without equipments in hundreds, and with muleteers of the class already spoken of.

28. At that time these officers having no subordinates had to look to every thing themselves, and this with the scarcity of water and forage combined, led to a loss to the army at this critical

period of an immense number of mules.

29. As regards the camels, these were procured by the contractors at Aden, and Mr. Houseman's language fails to describe the pitable condition of these animals when landed. Some were too young for work, others with sore backs, and ulcers frightful to behold, others so young, averaging from six months to one year, were utterly useless, and the majority landed in such a weak, and debilitated condition, that they could barely carry 100lbs. The proportion also of drivers to animals was so small that before long hundreds of these useful beasts were lost to the army.

30. The Director was detained in Bombay for work connected with the Finance and equipmentof the Train by the Commissary General; and left Bombay on the 19th December, 1867, arriving here on the 31st December, 1867, only 3 days before His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief.

- 31. Besides the above mentioned work at the Presidency, he was enabled to form two complete divisions of bullocks, before his departure, viz.: "B" and "F," which were detained for tonnage, and the last of the divisions did not arrive here till March, 1868.
- 32. A short time previous to the departure of the director, Capain Twentyman proceeded in command of the first detail of the military element, consisting of 26 European and 35 Native Inspectors whose arrival was most welcome to the officers, then organizing the "A," "E" and "P" Divisions, and Captain Twentyman himself commenced the formation of "D" Division. These two Divisions, "D" and "A" subsequently formed one-half of the Highland Brigade already alluded to.
- 33. The state of the Transport on the arrival of the Director was truly appalling, for what with the wretched state of the animals, insubordination of the Suez muleteers, and the enormous pressure put on the Train by the Commissariat and other departments, to meet the requirements of the army daily landing, success seemed hopeless, and but for the untiring energy and perseverance, and hard work day and night of the above mentioned officers, the Train must have been lost altogether.
- 34. However, day by day, a fresh and better class of animals were received, especially camels from Soakim and the interior. The Lahore, and Rawul Pindee Mule Trains arrived. Muleteers from the Punjab came to be exchanged for Egyp-

tians, Turks, &c., and matters began to assume a more hopeful aspect, although much remained to be done to render the Train effective.

35. At Koomaylee a large depôt was established, which became the great point where stores and provisions were accumulated, and from thence passed on to the front. For some time it was the Head-Quarters of seven divisions. Its command fell upon Major Nuttall, second in command, and the selection was a happy one.

36. The duties required of him were constant out-door supervision from morning till after midnight, of the numerous Convoys that had to start, and to his untiring energy must be attributed the great success and utility of this

depôt.

37. A similar post was established at Senafe, and the selection was again equally fortunate, and Captain Annesley worked so ably and successfully in the command of this important post that he received the highest encomiums from General Officers passing through.

38. The Sub-Officers placed at intermediate posts also did their duty well, and frequently called for the commendations of General Officers for the neatness and order of the several stations

under their command.

39. Among the many and severe duties the officers had to perform Convoy duty was the hardest, and under which many who had so long borne the burden and heat of the day had at last to succumb.

40. It must be acknowledged that the losses have been very great, both of animals and stores, but under the then existing circumstances it was literally beyond human control, the long marches (one especially of 32 miles) when the water supply at Undul Wells was very limited, without

any streams on the way-side at which men and animals could refresh themselves, they would arrive at night utterly prostrate with fatigue, and without any hope of rest until the animals had been unladen, watered and fed, and this in a narrow crowded pass where only a few animals could be watered together, which took up a considerable time.

41. After this the men had to cook their own food, and they could barely lay down for rest and sleep, ere they were again called to load and re-

sume their march.

42. This work of loading was in itself a very severe task for one man to load three unbroken and in many cases vicious animals, with no one to assist, was an impossibility, and when two or three combined together, the mules that were laden would either break from their pickets, throw off their burdens or roll on the ground till they had released themselves.

43. Thus hours passed in simply loading and re-loading, and the sun was well up before the

convoy commenced its march.

44. These convoys covered an immense length of space, often extending for two miles; and when animals laid down or dropped with fatigue, they had to be unladen, and the spare animals put into their places.

45. The percentage of spare animals was ten per cent., but when the pack bullocks came into use, they were so wild, so unbroken, and many of them in such wretched condition, that even

twenty-five per cent. was not enough.

46. As soon as the road between Zoulla and Senafe had become passable for wheeled carriage, the train was strengthened by a supply of Bombay bullocks and Maltese mule carts.

47. But for this timely assistance, it would

have been sorely straitened; as mule carriage in the lowlands began to fail, and the supply of camels, which had for awhile revived in quality

and numbers, also began to diminish.

48. The first passage of carts up the Senafe Ghaut, consisting of a convoy of eighty carts, in sole charge of a native military inspector, was so successful, that every effort was made to increase this kind of carriage. Captain L. A. M. Graeme, 102nd Foot, was chosen, to raise and organize the cart division; and his efforts were crowned with the utmost success, which he richly merited, as he devoted all his energies and time to this one work, seeing to everything himself, and his conduct is beyond all praise.

49. It must be here mentioned, that as the supply of draught mules had ceased, and those in use beginning to fail from hard work, with the sanction of the Controller of Supply and Transport, Captain Graeme commenced converting mule carts with broken shafts into bullock carts

with the ordinary Indian yoke.

50. This was a great success, as we were enabled to purchase a very fair supply of draught bullocks from the natives of the country, and thus had as many as 600 carts at a time available.

51. The Veterinary Department was a source of great anxiety; for, on leaving Bombay, the establishment was miserably small, and at no time has it been possible to increase it; but among the French and Italian muleteers there were collected some eight or ten men who had some knowledge of the first principles of veterinary practice.

52. This was the utmost help that could be rendered to the veterinary surgeons, many of whom were young men recently entered the army, but who nevertheless, by energy and good-

will, did good service.

53. These officers were under the immediate orders of First Class Veterinary Surgeon W. Lamb, whose services were indeed valuable, for his charge was something enormous, consisting of upwards of 30,000 animals, with only ten veterinary surgeons to assist him, who had frequently to perform extraordinary and unusual duties, having constantly to compound their own medicines, administer them, and attend individually to the washing and dressing of the animals in the sick lines, for want of subordinates to assist them.

54. The Director would beg especially to bring to the notice of his Excellency the services of the Veterinary Surgeons Lamb and Anderson.

• 55. This latter officer had also great professional skill and experience; and the skill with which he speedily established a most useful sick depôt at the Pioneer Wells, as also one at Koomaylee, each containing over 1,000 animals, de-

serves the highest praise.

56. As a general rule, the European and Military Native Inspectors answered my expectations; but, of course, among such a large number, amounting to-Europeans 160, Natives 440-it was to be expected that a certain proportion would fail; but it was found that when really good men came from regiments, it was entirely owing to the selections made by the commanding officers; for when care was taken to select good and efficient men for this special service, they invariably turned out well, and showed wonderful examples of endurance and persevering energy when in charge of convoys; for this class of men in the train were frequently twenty-four hours without food, and a murmur of complaint I never heard.

57. Cavalry men, of course, are best suited for this work, and the train is much indebted to

the officers commanding the 3rd Dragoon Guards, 11th Hussars, and Royal Artillery, in Bombay, for the careful selection of men they made for the

Transport Train.

58. The pleasing task now remains of bringing to the special notice of His Excellency the names of such officers more especially deserving of his kind consideration, and whose efforts came under the personal observation of the Director, who from first to last never failed,-

Major Nuttall, 2nd in command,

Captain C. M. Griffith, Bombay Staff Corps, Captain W. L. Twentyman, 18th Hussars,

Captain E. Boyle, 90th Foot,

Captain L. A. M. Graeme, 102nd Foot, Captain H. Waring, 2nd Foot,

Captain C. McInroy, Madras Staff Corps, who commanded the first divisions that were raised; and it is difficult to find language to express the extent and value of the assistance they afforded.

59. They were materially assisted by their

subalterns,---

Lieutenant F. G. Mortimer, Royal Horse Artillery,

Lieutenant J. B. Hennell, Bombay Staff

Lieutenant T. T. Hodges, 76th Foot, Lieutenant W. S. Daniels, 105th Foot, Lieutenant H. W. Faulkner, 95th Foot, Lieutenant A. D. Strettell, 109th Foot, Lieutenant F. J. Caldecott, Royal Horse Artillery,

Lieutenant D. du McGunton, 96th Foot, Lieutenant W. G. Gerard, Royal Artillery. Cornet C. A. De N. Lucas, 2nd Dragoons.

60. To these are added the names of officers who, although not among the first to join, yet by the ability, energy, and zeal they brought to bear on their work, at once placed themselves on the same footing,—

Captain T. Kelly,

Lieutenant C. S. Sturt, Bombay Infantry, Lieutenant A. E. Pearse, 76th Foot,

Lieutenant S. M. Onslow, Madras Cavalry, Lieutenant H. de P. Rennick, 21st Foot.

61. The Sub-Director has brought to the notice of his Excellency such officers as served immediately under him in the Highland Brigade; and as this officer was selected for this important post by His Excellency, and those whom he recommends as well as himself having worked under the immediate and constant supervision of His Excellency, it would be out of place for the Director to add anything in this report.

62. The Director would beg to bring forward

the names of his personal Staff,-

Lieutenant Clark, Paymaster, Lieutenant Carr, Quartermaster.

- 63. Lieutenant J. D. Clark, Madras Cavalry, although Paymaster to the Corps,—an office of great responsibility, considering the enormous number of men in the Train,—has, in addition to this duty, frequently in times of great pressure, been both disembarking and embarking Officer, Staff Officer, &c., &c.—in fact, has made himself generally useful. Lieutenant Clark, with the small establishment allowed him for the Pay Department, has had very many difficulties to contend with, but has nevertheless managed to keep a regular and concise account of all his disbursements, which often amount to very large sums.
- 64. The stores required for the Transport Train have been considerable, and the creditable and efficient manner in which Lieutenant N. E.

Carr, 10th Foot, has performed these duties under the most trying circumstances, has called

forth unqualified approbation.

65. As His Excellency is aware, the difficulties of the Transport Train have been from the first to last of no ordinary kind, and but for the peculiarly fortunate selection of officers from the several Presidencies and armies, the torrent could never have been stemmed. The high, gentlemanly tone of the officers, their strong esprit de corps, the cheerful alacrity with which every order was obeyed, has been the brightest feature in the existence of the Train.

66. They were placed in isolated command, and away from the personal control of the Director, who, however, commenced by placing both entire confidence and the credit and honour of the Train in their hands, and most nobly has it

been repaid.

67. With reference to the annexed report on the working of the Highland Brigade by Captain Hand, Sub-Director, the Director quite concurs with him as regards the equipments; but with respect to drill and discipline, he would go still further, especially in the former; the men should be well armed, and well drilled in the same, as they would in that case be able to protect their own convoys, and not draw on the strength of the army.

68. The Jemadars and non-commissioned officers should be all well mounted and armed, and the Director would introduce as nearly as possible the drill and discipline of an irregular corps.

69. Any one who has had any experience with the Abyssinian Force must see the necessity of keeping up the nucleus of a Transport Train; and where wheeled carriage forms a part of the same, nothing could be a better guide in its

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whole formation than that of the Train des Equipages of the French army, of which the Director can speak from personal observation in the Crimea.

Report upon the "Highland Transport Service."

Abyssinian Field Force, Camp, Antalo, 13th May, 1868.

The Highland Transport was separated from the General Transport raised in Bombay for service in Abyssinia, on the 14th February, 1868; but it may be said to have derived its origin from the two Punjaub Trains specially organized in October, 1867, for this campaign, to which it owes both its foundation and organization.

Organization.

It consists of four divisions of 2,000 mules each, which are subdivided into troops of 150, and the following is the scale of the establishment of each division:—

1 Captain.

3 Subalterns.

4 European Inspectors (selected from British regiments).

20 Jemadars, or Troop Serjeant-Majors.

80 Duffadars, or Serjeants.

667 Muleteers.

2 First Class Nalbunds, or Farriers.

10 Second Class Assistant Nalbunds, or Farriers.

1 Head Native Blacksmith.

10 Second Asssistant Blacksmiths.

10 Bheesties, or "Water Carriers."

2 Ropemakers.

1 Salootrie, "Native Veterinary Surgeon."

1 Moonshie, or Native Writer.

At the commencement of the campaign, one man had charge of two mules only; and it is as

much as he can look after properly.

Stable, watering and all other line duties at fixed hours are conducted with the same discipline, and in precisely the same routine as in the Bengal Irregular Cavalry regiments.

The muleteers are trained and drilled to their work, and kept in as strict a state of discipline as the circumstances of its being a newly raised

corps will admit of.

The Jemadars keep in Persian the "nominal roll" of each man in their troop; also the pay account.

The "long roll" of every man is kept in Persian by the Moonshie; also the pay account, which is also kept in English by the Captain.

The officers commanding the Punjaub Trains have summary powers, and can sentence to two years' imprisonment, in addition to corporal

punishment.

The whole is under the direction of a Sub-Director, who is one of the Head Quarter Staff, and reports direct to the Assistant Quartermaster-General, Army Head Quarters, assisted by a Staff Officer and Officer Inspector, the latter of whom constantly travels from one station to another, and reports direct upon all matters that may come under his observation.

The Train has worked regularly between Addigerat and Magdala,* principally in carrying

baggage, ammunition, hospital stores, and commissariat supplies for the Force for one month.

At intermediate large stations a Staff Officer has been permanently appointed to receive all reports from officers in charge of convoys, and he forwards the same to head-quarters. At these posts small reserves are kept, from which sick and weakly mules are replaced.

We have had in work mules purchased in Spain,

Egypt, India, Persia, and Abyssinia.

Mules.

The Spanish mules are principally large and ill-bred, and, from my own observation, are naturally of a weak constitution, and unable to bear great changes in climate. They have suffered much from a want of sufficiency of food, especially of grass, of which they do not eat enough even when it is procurable, for that which is obtained is dry and coarse, and they don't relish it.

When once in low condition, it is almost impossible to bring them round even with rest and grazing, abundance of which they get at the sick depôts, the few well-bred Spanish mules we have

had have answered well.

The Persian, Indian, and Egyptian mules on the contrary are very much more enduring, require less grain, will eat any description of grass,

and thrive upon it.

During the operations before Magdala, when the animals had for some days to endure hard work upon little food and water, which latter was very bad, the large mules fell off in condition very rapidly, whereas the others showed comparatively little change. The difficulties of the road, crossing and recrossing the rivers Bashilo and Jidda, enervated as they were, was most trying, and many succumbed.

Return of Mules from 1st March.

The Abyssinian mules are not enduring; all those we purchased were then in good condition and fresh, still they have broken down in larger numbers than any others.

On the 1st of March there were 5,412 animals in the Highland Train, and of these 1,002 were sick. On the 1st April there were 6,661, and of

these 1,002 sick.

On the 1st May, 7,690; and of these, 1,944 sick. Since the 1st March we have purchased in the country on the Highlands 2,720, and 1,740 have been transferred from the Lowlands.

Since the same date we have lost on the road 449, and 1,257 have been sent to the Lowland sick depôt at Koomaylee, and struck off our returns, and 309 were destroyed or died at Highland sick depôts.

2,418 were discharged from Hospital and sent

to work.

The mules had scarcely a fair start, for they were generally put to work the day after disembarkation, after some weeks between decks in a tropical climate.

Causes of Sick.

I have at all times consulted with Staff Veterinary Surgeon Hallen as to the causes and remedies for the large number of sick, and I consider the chief causes to be:—"Hard work at great altitudes."

"Constant exposure, with want of rest."

"Insufficiency of food and bad quality of grass."

"Irregularity in feeding."

"Galls, owing to bad saddles; want of time and means for repairing the same."

"Carelessness in saddling and loading."

Men.

The drivers of the train were entertained as syces or muledrivers, in the position of public followers from the Punjaub for the divisions raised in that district, and men from the same part of India were subsequently substituted for the Egyptians and Turks in the other two divisions, as the latter were found to be lazy, apathetic, and totally unmanageable. The jemadars and duffadars were selected from the drivers. To get men qualified for these posts has been a source of some difficulty; for, with the exception of the Punjaub Trains, the men were sent to the country quite untrained.

It is impossible to overrate the necessity of thoroughly training the men to a rigid system in the care of the animals, on the line of march as well as in the lines previous to their being sent

on service.

A marked difference is apparent in the working of the men who were sent here without the advantage of any such training, and of those who had marched with their mules from Rawul Pindee to Kurrachee, a distance of nearly 1,000 miles.

The men evince an impression that they are looked down upon by their enlisted friends and relatives, consequently they take no interest in, and do not like their work.

It is therefore most desirable that the corps should be so constituted as to induce men to seek service in it, so that an "esprit de corps" will naturally become inoculated, and this can never be the case as long as the men are looked upon as mere followers, and in no way superior to the cavalry syee or grass-cutter.

To render it popular as well as efficient, I am of opinion that the men should be enlisted as mule drivers; they ought not to be overdrilled, and should not take any military duty except in connection with their own branch—such as guards

to convoys, and in their own line.

I should like to see them lightly equipped, dressed in a loose blouse and knickerbockers of a khakee colour, with bandages, as worn by the Himalayan mountaineers, in place of gaiters, and each man furnished with a small kit-bag capable of containing one suit of clothes. The blanket and great coat should be carried by the man, and each mule his own cleaning things and picketing gear.

I would arm each man with a pistol and kookery (Nepaulese knife), which is a formidable weapon, and can, if required, be used for cutting wood or grass without injury. The Ghoorkas use it for various rough purposes, and it continues

serviceable.

There should be ten spare men per troop, who, as well as the jemadars and duffadars, and artificers, might, in lieu of the pistol, be armed with a carbine, and they should be ample to render the corps independent of the regular army for escorts on convoys, or men cutting

grass in an enemy's country.

This protection in the corps was much needed in this campaign, in parts of the country were armed and predatory bands were constantly on the look out for unprotected parties, such as grasscutters, &c. It is true that all the men with this train were armed, but they turned their swords to so many purposes that they have become almost useless.

Should it ever be contemplated to raise a permanent Transport Corps in India, it is to be hoped that the system and interior economy may be entirely under military organization, and that

it, as with the Highland Train in this campaign, may work under one Department, viz., the Quartermaster-General's.

Report on Pack Saddles.

Otago weight 43 lbs. This saddle is decidedly the best adapted for general purposes, owing to the facility in loading it, and its general excellent manufacture. It seldom requires repair, except re-stuffing, which is easily and quickly done.

It is, however, apt to gall on the shoulder and hip, unless very carefully fitted. The leather of the pad should not project beyond the stuffing.

It is not suited to small mules, such as those obtained in the Punjaub and Persia; and even if sizes sufficiently small for them were built, I doubt much if the tree would present sufficient surface to carry an ordinary load.

The Punjaub pad weighs 33 lbs., and is the best saddle for small mules. If carefully put on and

girthed, it never galls.

All suleetah (loose canvass bags) saddles of which this is one, are bad in hilly countries, owing to the difficulty in fastening the loads to the saddle, to prevent its slipping during ascent or descent. This difficulty, however, can be overcome; and Captain Bambridge, Commanding Rawul Pindee Train, is now trying a plan he has adopted, of a rope let into the pad, which can be used for boxes in a manner similar to the loading-strap of the Otago, or to fasten the "suleeta" and load to the pad.

The Kumaon pad, used in 5-25 Royal Artillery, weighs 36 lbs., and is similar to the Punjaub pad.

The Bombay pad weighs 40 lbs., and rarely galls, but it is badly made, unwieldy, and constantly requires repairs.

The Bombay Arsenal pad weighs 26 lbs. We have had more mules galled by this pad than by

any other.

The McMahon weighs 66 lbs. This includes a waterproof sheet. It has not yet had a fair trial, but its excessive weight is a great objection to it.

Foreign Office, August 5, 1868. (General.)

THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received, from the Acting British Consul-General at Havana, the following translation of the new Regulations to be observed by Masters of vessels trading with the Island of Cuba:—

Rules to be observed by the Masters or Supercargoes of Spanish and all other Vessels trading with the Island of Cuba.

1. All masters or supercargoes of vessels from foreign ports, engaged in the import trade of Cuba, are required, on being visited by the Health boat, on their arrival, to deliver up a statement of the cargo, certified by the Spanish Consul, and also a general manifest of said cargo, without any alteration.

These documents must express the name of the master and that of the vessel, her nationality, her Spanish tonnage, the port she eomes from, the number of bales, packages, and every other article composing the eargo, with their respective marks, numbers, and description, according to bill of lading, their weight in kilograms, even though they are intended to be bonded or are in transit; bearing in mind that any addition or alteration in the manifest or statement of the eargo, or any entry to order, is absolutely prohibited; and that,

should there be any difference between the statement of the cargo and the manifest, such difference will be visited by fine, according to the Regula-tions. If the whole or part of the cargo is composed of rod or sheet iron, metal plates, timber, jerked beef, salt, cocoa, or any article shipped in bulk, they must be manifested by decimal weight or measurement; adding, at the end of said manifest, a list of the ship's stores, ammunition, and armament, the coals, if the vessel be a steamer, and the unmanifested merchandize which the crew may carry to the value of one hundred dollars each. When the cargo comes from a port where there is no Consul or Vice-Consul, and if the residence of those agents is more than thirty kilos from the place of sailing, the master or supercargo will be exempted from presenting said Consular manifest; but, to enjoy this exemption, all the cargo must be of one kind, and must be composed of either of the following articles; viz, raw hides, timber, shooks, dye woods, coal, or horns; and provided that these articles are the production of the country from whence the vessel sailed, that the voyage has been direct, and that the duties will be paid in bulk.

2. The masters or supercargoes of vessels arriving in discress must also deliver a manifest of their cargo, in the same manner as those engaged in the

import trade.

3. Masters or supercargoes of vessels arriving in ballast, are subject to the same rules and obligation of delivering a Spanish Consular manifest and an uncertified one.

4. When the master of a vessel has been obliged by stress of weather, or any unforeseen cause, to throw any portion of the cargo overboard, he must state on his manifest the quantity of the cargo lost, specifying the number of packages, the class

and kinds of goods; being also obliged to produce his log-book at the Custom-house, to prove the truth of his declaration.

- 5. All masters of vessels coming from Spanish Ports with the clearance of the respective Customhouse, are only obliged to deliver an additional manifest of such goods as they may have taken on board after receiving said clearance, not included in the same, and also of all the ship's stores and armament.
- 6. Should the master or the supercargo not present the statement certified by the Spanish Consul or the manifest of being in ballast within the fixed time, they will incur a fine of 200 dollars; if said manifest is not in accordance with Rule No. 1 they will incur a fine of 25 dollars, and one of a hundred dollars if not certified by the Spanish Consul.

7. If the master, when requested by the head Custom-house official, does not immediately present the statement of the cargo or the manifest; or should these documents not be properly made out, he shall be subject to a fine of 500 dollars,

unless the vessel has put in in distress.

8. In the event of there being any erasures or alterations in the said documents, the masters or supercargoes will be liable for the charge of forgery, whether the vessel is in ballast or whether

she has cargo on board.

9. The exhibition of the statement of the cargo and of the manifest is obligatory in all the ports, creeks, or anchorages of the island, the vessel may enter, even should she be in distress, in which case the Custom-house officials will take a copy and return the original to the master, that he may present it at the port where his voyage ends.

10. All packages omitted in the statement of the cargo or in the manifest will be confiscated,

and the master will be fined double their value, should the amount of duties to be paid on the contents not exceed 400 dollars, but should the duties exceed this sum, and the goods be the property of the owner, cor signee, master, or supercargo of the vessel, then, instead of the fine, the vessel together with her freight and appurtenances will be confiscated.

11. If after the vessel's final discharge, one or more of the manifested packages should be found wanting, no invoice of the contents having been previously presented, it will be inferred that the master or the supercargo has defrauded the Revenue, and they will be fined 200 dollars for each missing package.

12. When the owner, or consignee of goods not manifested by the master, produces, within fortyeight hours, the note or invoice of the said goods, he will not incur any penalty, and the goods will be delivered to him; but the master or the supercargo will pay a fine equal to the value of the

goods so omitted in the manifest.

13. Nothing whatever can be discharged without the permission of the collector and the inspection of the chief of the Coast Guard. For the mere landing of any articles, no matter its value, or whether it is free of duty, the master or the supercargo will be fined 1,000 dollars, and the goods will be confiscated, together with the boat or lighter which conveys them; should the amount of the duties to be assessed not exceed the sum of 200 dollars, but if they should exceed this sum. the vessel will be seized in lieu of the fine.

14. No goods whatever, be the quantity large or small, can be transferred from one vessel to the other in the harbour, without the necessary requisites of the Custom-house having been complied with; a violation of this rule subjects the masters or the supercargoes to the legal penalty (1,000 dollars).

- 15. Should a vessel discharge merchandize, be the quantity large or small, in a port not open to general commerce, said merchandize, as well as the vessel and all her appurtenances, will be confiscated.
- 16. If in the Custom-house visit, previous to clearance, an excess of cargo should be detected, the goods will be seized, and the master will be fined a sum equal to the value of the excess.
- 17. All goods, produce, or any other article seized in the act of being fraudulently shipped, shall likewise incur a similar penalty.
- 18. If the master or supercargo should be unable to pay the fines and costs imposed, the vessel will be held responsible and seized, unless the consignee voluntarily assumes the payment.
- 19. The master who does not declare the exact Spanish tonnage of his vessel, will pay the cost of measuring her, if the excess is ten per cent. over the tonnage given.
- 20. Passengers luggage must be presented for inspection at the Custom-house depôt; and if there should be found merchandise in it not exceeding 100 dollars in value, the passenger will pay the usual duties, presenting a note of the contents at the Custom-house; should the value of these goods be more than 100 dollars, and less than 200 dollars, they will pay double duty; but if the value is greater, the merchandise will be liable to seizure; unless in either case the party interested has previously presented a list of said merchandise; in which case it will pay duty according to the Tariff.
- 21. No manifest will be translated, nor permits granted for discharging, unless the master or the

consignee has previously presented the ship's register at the Custom-house.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Stockholm, a translation of a Decree of the Royal Swedish Government, prohibiting the sale and transport of nitro-glycerine, as well as the manufacture, stowage, transport, and sale of dynamite.

The decree is to the following effect; viz.:-

That from the 15th of August proximo, and until it shall be otherwise decided, it is prohibited to sell or transport nitro-glycerine from one place to another; and whosoever shall transgress this command shall be liable to a fine of not less than one hundred rix-dollars, half of which shall be given to the prosecutor, and the remainder to the Crown; and such person shall further be declared

to have forfeited the illegally sold or transported

property.

In addition to this, and for the better means of preventing accidents occurring in the manufacture, stowage, transport, and sale of the newly-discovered explosive matter, dynamite, it is decided that, until the said compound be better understood, and anything further be decided thereon, the gracious Decrees of October 1, 1858, and of April 10, 1863, relating to gunpowder, shall be applicable to it; it is also to be borne in mind that no person shall have more than two pounds weight of dynamite in their possession without special permission.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following translation of a Decree of the Royal Swedish Government, prohibiting the importation of certain domestic animals from particular countries into Norway; viz.:—

WE, Charles, by the grace of God, King of Norway and Sweden, the Goths and Vandals, maketh known:—

In virtue of the Law established in consequence of the noxious and contagious epidemic among domestic cattle, of the 27th February, 1866, § 8, it is determined hereby that this import prohibition shall supersede the placard of the 13th January last.

- 1. It shall be prohibited to import from the Austrian ports, and all Russian ports, with the exception of those of the Arctic Ocean, as well harbours in the White Sea as along the coast of Finland:
 - a. Horned cattle (large cattle), sheep, goats, and other ruminating animals, as well as pigs.
 - b. Raw parts of these animals, such as raw skins and hides (dried and salted included), unprepared hair, bristles, wool, horn, hoofs, and bone, unsalted or unprepared meat and pork, and unmelted tallow.
 - c. Forage; such as grass, hay, and straw.
 - d. Cowhouse implements that have been used.
- 2. It shall also be prohibited from German ports in North or East Sea, as well as from Great

Britain, Ireland, Holland, and Belgium, live norned cattle, sheep, and goats.

from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Note which has been received from the Greek Government by Her Majesty's Minister at Athens, on the subject of the Greek Quarantine

Regulations.

This Note states that, by virtue of the Royal Decree of the 25th August (o. s.), 1857, steamboats and merchant vessels, whatever their nationality or port of departure may be, are not required to be provided with a bill of health visé by a Greek Consul (or in default of such an officer, by the Consul of some other Power), unless cholera or any other infectious disease is prevalent on the coast of the Mediterranean. If, however, cholera does exist in any part of the Mediterranean, and there is no Greek or any foreign Consul at the port of departure, on the arrival of a vessel from such place the Greek authorities will ascertain the sanitary condition of the port of departure, and take such steps with regard to quarantine as seem to them best calculated to promote the public health. In such a case the certificate of a Merchant, Greek or foreign, at the port of departure would influence the quarantine authorities in their decision, but could not be binding upon them.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from Her Majesty's Consul at Algiers, a copy of a Decree, dated the 16th July last, published by the Governor-General of Algeria, fixing the conditions of shipping and discharging cargo at that

port. The following is a translation of the Articles of that Decree:—

DECREE.

ARTICLE I. When contracts between parties shall not have provided for them, the conditions for charging and discharging merchant vessels in the port of Algiers are fixed as follows:—

DISCHARGING.

Sec. 1. The discharge of cargo from ships, whatever their port of departure or tonnage, is to be undertaken at the expense and under the superintendence of the master; the delivery of the goods taking place on the quay.

Sec. 2. The amount of merchandise to be dis-

Sec. 2. The amount of merchandise to be disembarked per working day has been fixed as

fellows :-

Cereals.

Ships of less than 60 tons, 150 sacks, of 1 hectolitre.

Ships of from 60 to 100 tons, 200 sacks, of l hectolitre.

Ships of from 101 to 300 tons, 400 sacks, of 1 hectolitre.

Ships of more than 300 tons, 600 sacks, of I hectolitre.

Timber.

Uncleft timber or oak, 30 cubic mètres. Other kinds, 40 cubic mètres.

Wines and Spirits.

In casks, 200 hectolitres.

Other Merchandise.

25 tons, of 1000 kilog., or of 1 m. 44 each.

STIPULATED TIME FOR DISCHARGE OF CARGO.

Sec. 3. The time stipulated for the discharge of cargo, on arrival, will commence from the day after that on which the masters of vessels shall apprise the consignees, by means of their broker, that they are ready to discharge it.

If the bill of lading is to order, the consignee must be informed by means of a notice inserted in the papers appointed for the publication of legal announcements; the time stipulated for the discharge of cargo to commence, in this case, from

the day after the publication.

Sec. 4. Days during which the discharge of cargo cannot be carried on in consequence of bad weather, duly verified, are not to be comprised in the stipulated time. This verification will be made, at the request of the parties interested, by the Director of the Port.

DEMURRAGE.

Sec. 5. The demurrage, or days of delay in the shipping or discharge of the cargo caused by the act of one of the parties, to be compensated for, in favour of the other party, by a payment of 0 fr. 50 cent. per day and per ton burthen of the ship employed. This payment will commence from the day after that on which the simple stipulated time, as determined by paragraph two of the present regulations, shall have expired.

Sec. 6. If the demurrage is prolonged beyond a period equal in duration to the original stipulated time, the rate of compensation will be increased from 50 cent. to 75 cent. for all the prolonged

time.

Sec. 7. The indemnities provided above are payable daily and in advance.

Sec. 8. The delay cannot give rise to an action

for damages on either side, unless demanded in due form of law.

SHIPPING CARGO.

Sec. 9. Embarcations are subject to all the regulations above enumerated. The merchandize to be shipped must be handed over to the master of the vessel upon the edge of the quay.

ARTICLE II. The conditions contained in these regulations will come into force, as "usages" adopted for the use of the Port of Algiers, on and

after the 1st October next.

All local decrees and regulations concerning the police of the port and the quays, embarcation and disembarcation, are hereby annulled in all points in which they differ from the rules abovementioned.

ARTICLE III. This Decree, inserted in the "Official Bulletin of Government Acts" and in the "Moniteur de l'Algérie," will be communicated by the Préfet of the Department to the Chamber and the Tribunal of Commerce of Algiers. It will in addition to this be addressed to all the Chambers of Commerce at the ports of the French Empire, and to the representatives of the European Maritime Powers at Algiers.

an Imperial Decree, dated 12th September, 1868, authorizing the importation of merchandize under any Flag into the French Settlements on the Gold Coast and the Gaboon.

The following are the Articles of this Decree: -

ART. I. Merchandize of every description, and from any port of departure, may be imported under any Flag into the French Settlements on the Gold Coast and the Gaboon.

ART. II. On and after the 1st January, 1869, these Settlements will be subject to a tax, the maximum of which is fixed at 4 per cent. ad valorem.

ART. III. This tax can be diminished or suppressed by an Ordinance of the Governor in command of these Settlements.

ART. IV. Produce shipped on board foreign vessels in the French Settlements on the Gold Coast or the Gaboon, is subject, on its importation into France, to a Flag-tax of 20 francs per ton of freight, in conformance with the provisions of the Law of the 30th July, 1861, relative to the Customs' Regulations of the French West Indies and the Island of Réunion.

Declaration relative to the duty to be levied in France on refined sugar imported from Great Britain, Belgium, and Holland.

Signed at Paris, November 4, 1868.

(Translation.)

Declaration.

THE Governments of Great Britain, of Belgium, of France, and of the Netherlands, having delegated Commissioners to find out the means of removing the difficulties which have arisen from the application of the second paragraph of Article XIII of the Convention of the 8th of November, 1864, relating to the sugar system; and those Commissioners having recognized, in Conferences held at the Hague, the impossibility, for France, of establishing an absolutely exact relation between the bases of the tax and the duty applicable to refined sugars, so long as there does not exist in that country a precise correlation between the duties to be levied on raw sugars and the yields fixed by the Declaration of the 20th of November, 1866: the undersigned, duly authorized to that effect, after having taken cognizance of the final Protocol of the Conferences above mentioned, dated the 21st of August of the present year, have agreed upon the following

arrangements:-

Article 1. Until the 31st of December, 1869, the duty on the importation into France of refined sugars coming from the other Contracting States is fixed at forty-eight francs eighty-five centimes (48 francs 85 centimes), an amount in relation with the average duty on raw sugars and a yield of 88 per cent.

Art. 2. The present arrangement, concluded provisionally, shall come into execution in eight

days from the date of its promulgation.

In witness whereof the undersigned have drawn up the present declaration, and have affixed to it the seal of their arms.

At this new Custom House, all goods as well as passengers' luggage destined for the States of the Zollverein may be entered for import duties and eleared, or may be passed free if not subject to duties; and all goods destined for exportation may be entered outwards, and pay the export

duties when due.

The officers of the Custom House are likewise authorised to make special arrangements for the visitation and clearance of all goods and effects passing by the ports and railways, and to grant all requisite certificates and documents.

Several villages and places to the north as well as the south of Hamburg, and likewise the Bailiwick of Ritzebuttel at the mouth of the Elbe have, since the 1st November, been annexed to the Zoll-

verein.

The city and port of Hamburg, however, with its suburbs of St. George and St. Paul (as well as the outer harbour of Cuxhaven), still remains a free port, so that neither the Zollverein Custom House nor the extension of the Customs' Frontier imposes any restriction upon the freedom which foreign commerce has hitherto enjoyed in that eity, or upon the liberty of warehousing and of forwarding goods in transit.

ART. I. The lighthouse due, established by the Colonial Decree of the 23rd June, 1845, at a rate of 25 centimes per ton upon vessels coming from abroad, without distinction of nationality, has been raised to 50 centimes per ton from the date of

ART. II. Our Minister of Agriculture, Commerce, and Public Works, and our Minister of Finance, are charged, each in his own department, with the execution of this decree.

A declaration relative to the application of Art. 13 of the Convention of the 8th November, 1864, to the system of sugar duties in France, having been signed at Paris on the 4th November, 1868, between France, Belgium, Great Britain, and Holland; the said Declaration, the tenor of which is as follows, has been approved, and shall be inserted in the Bulletin des Lois:—

DECLARATION.

The Government of France, Belgium, Great Britain, and Holland, having appointed Commissioners to find means of removing the difficulties which the application of the 2nd paragraph of Art. 13 of the Convention of the 8th November, 1864, to the present system of sugar duties has given rise to, and these Commissioners having recognised, in a conference held at the Hague, the impossibility on the part of France of establishing an absolutely exact proportion between the bases of the tax and the duty applicable to refined sugars, as long as there does not exist in that country a precise correlation between the duties levied upon raw sugar and the yields (rendement) fixed by the Declaration of the 20th November, 1866, the undersigned duly authorized to that effect, after having taken cognizance of the final protocol of the above-mentioned conference, on the 21st August of the present year, have agreed to the following regulations:-

ART. 1. Until the 31st December, 1869, the import duty in France upon refined sugar coming from the other contracting States has been fixed at forty-eight francs eighty-five centimes (48 fr. 85 cent.), a rate in proportion with the mean

duty upon raw sugars and a yield (rendement) of 88 per cent.

ART. 2. The present arrangement, which has been concluded provisionally, shall come into

execution one week after its promulgation.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committe of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid, enclosing copy and translation of a Decree issued by the Provisional Government of Spain, on the 22nd ultimo, re-establishing in the ports of that country the Customs' duties which were levied prior to the Revolution.

The following are the Articles of this Decree: -

ART. 1. The term granted to commerce by some of the revolutionary Juntas for the introduction of goods through the Custom-houses, with the reduction of some part of the tariff dues. or the entire abrogation thereof, shall be considered as ended on the 16th of October last, which was the day fixed by the Juntas themselves.

ART. 2. Where such reductions may have continued in any shape subsequently to the said date, merchants who have been in the enjoyment thereof shall repay to the public treasury the sum of such

reductions.

ART. 3. In places where a reduction shall have been made, with reference to all or some articles, greater than one third part of the dues, merchants, who may have imported the said articles even although they may have done so within the specified term, shall repay to the revenue the difference between the exceptional reductions and the reduction of one third, which shall be considered as general.

ART. 4 If in any part of Spain no reduction has been granted even previously to the 16th of October, merchants who may have imported goods before that date, paying the entire dues, shall be allowed discount on future payments of the third part which they paid extra. For the enjoyment of this discount merchants shall be allowed three months, counted from the date of this decree.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid, inclosing copies and translations of two Decrees, published in the Madrid Gazette of the 23rd ultimo, by the Provisional Government of Spain, (1), one of which modifies the differential and other dues charged on foreign commerce and Shipping in Spanish ports, and (2), the other, permits the introduction of foreign built ships and materials for ship-building. The following are the Articles of these decrees:—

No. 1.

(Translation.)

ART. 1. The charge levied on the dues imposed on merchandise, in accordance with the Customhouse regulations, under the name of differential

duty, is removed.

ART. 2. This suppression shall begin to take effect from the 1st of January, 1869, in regard to all articles imported into the Peninsular and adjacent islands, except those included in the annexed schedules, marked A, B, and C.

ART. 3. With respect to the articles of merchandise excepted in the preceding Article, the differential duty shall be changed into a fixed one; viz.:—I real vellon per 100 kilograms, on those included in schedule A; 5 reals vellon on those included in schedule B; 10 reals vellon on those included in schedule C.

ART. 4. The duties exacted in virtue of the preceding Article shall remain in force up to the 1st of January, 1872, when all flags coming from any part of the world, and all merchandize, without exception, shall enjoy the same rights as the Spanish flag.

ART. 1. Ships of all classes, whether of wood or iron, may be introduced into Spanish dominions upon payment of the following dues:—

Wooden ships of 100 tons of a cubic metre
shall pay per metrical ton 130
Those from 101 up to 300 tons, shall pay
Those from 301 tons upwards 50
Iron ships of whatever tonnage ... 50

ART. 2. The tons of a cubic metrc spoken of in the preceding Article, shall be those which the ships measure on the whole, without subtracting any space or compartment below deck; but the dues payable on all instruments, machinery, and fittings to which caps. 20 and 21 of the existing Custom House Regulations refer, are included in the duties payable on each ton.

ART. 3. Any Spanish ship may be freely

careened and repaired in any foreign place.

ART. 4. Masters of Spanish ships are at liberty to sell or hypothecate them to persons of their own nation or to foreigners, for which purpose Art. 592 of the Commercial Code is abrogated.

ART. 5. The ships may be manned with what-

ever number of men the Captain and fitter out may think proper, keeping in view Art. 24, cap. 10 of the Ordinances of Register now in force, and the royal decree of 27th November, 1867, Articles 1 and 4. When in a foreign port the Captain or fitter out do not find a sufficient number of men of their own nation, the crew may be made up with foreigners, with the compliance of the Consul or marine authorities.

ART. 6. All dues, of any class whatever, including sanitary ones, with the sole exception of the special ones for quarantine and lazaret, at present exacted from ships, are reduced to one single duty, which shall be called "duty on unloading cargo" (de descarga), and which shall be paid on the ton of 1000 kilograms of the merchandize unloaded. This duty shall be at the rate of ten reals the ton of 1000 kilograms of goods unloaded in regard to ships which navigate the high seas, and at the rate of three reals on those which do the coasting trade. In the last case ships under twenty tons burthen shall only pay half the amount.

ART. 7. The carrying of passengers shall also be subject to a special duty; viz.: two reals for every person who disembarks from a ship employed in the coasting trade, and five reals for any one who disembarks from a ship which navi-

gates on the high seas.

ART. 8. Steamers making regular journies can make special agreements with the administration respecting the duty on unloading cargo and on passengers.

ART. 9. When a ship is obliged to put into port from stress of weather or any other cause, and transfers her cargo to another ship, or unloads it with the intention of reloading, no duty shall be paid, as it is only leviable on goods unloaded for introduction into the country.

ART. 10. Anchorage, light, and health dues, and dues for loading and unloading, are abolished, as also those levied in certain places under the names of "Derechos de Castillo de San Anton," "Cofradio de San Telmo," and any others which at present are exacted from ships entering, stopping in, or leaving port, with the exception of the lazaret and quarantine dues mentioned in Art. 6, and those which have to be paid for private services freely asked for and freely given.
The pilot service is regulated by the rules which
the Minister of Marine prescribes or may prescribe.

ART. 11. The single tax on discharging cargo shall be collected by the Custom-house, and the products paid into the public treasury like those

of the other general duties.

Art. 12. The whole of the charges and special taxes which, in accordance with the existing laws, are at present levied in some ports for the earrying out of works, shall be transformed into a proportional part of the new tax, and, added to the same, the Ministries of Finance and Public Works coming to the necesary agreement on the subject.
ART. 13. Materials of all classes imported from

abroad for the construction, eareening, or repair of iron or wooden ships of whatsoever tonnage, articles necessary for the fitting out of the same, and the materials introduced for the construction and repair of ships, engines, and boilers, of what-ever system and power the said apparatus may be, shall pay the dues appointed by the Custom-house

Regulations; but such dues shall be returned to the constructors and manufacturers, on their petitioning and proving that the said materials and articles were introduced for and used in the abovementioned constructions and repairs of ships, en-

gines, or boilers.

ART. 14. For the return of the dues, the weight or bulk of the materials or articles shall be valued, according to how they are marked in the Custom-house Regulations, by the weight or bulk used in the work donc; so that the dues which belong to the waste or residue resulting from the construction or transformation when the said materials are applied to the above mentioned works, remain to the credit of the Finance Department.

ART. 15. An order issued for the purpose shall establish the rules which are to be followed for the return of the dues mentioned in the preceding

Article.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, copy and translation of a Notification, issued by the North German Confederation on the 18th ultimo, extending generally the provisions of the Zollverein Treaty of July 8, 1867, to certain parts of the Prussian territory mentioned in that Treaty, to the Grand-Duchies of Mecklenburgh Schwerin and Mecklenburgh Strelitz, to the Duchy

of Lauenburg, to the Hanseatic town of Lubeck, and to a part of the territory of the Hanseatic town of Hamburg. The following is a translation of this Notification:—

(Translation.)

PROCLAMATION touching the execution of Article 6 of the Zollverein Treaty of July 8, 1867. November 18, 1868.

Whereas the Presidency of the North German Confederation, by reason of the conditions of Article 6 of the Treaty between the North German Confederation, Bavaria, Wurtemburg, Baden, and Hesse respecting the continuance of the Customs and Trade Union of July 8 of last year (Federal Laws, 1867, p. 81) has informed the Governments of the other contracting Powers that the reasons have ceased which excluded the complete application of this Treaty to certain parts of the Prussian country named in the above-mentioned Treaty, to the Grand Duchy of Mecklenburgh Schwering and Mecklenburgh Strelitz, to the Duchy of Lauenburg, to the Hanseatic town, Lübeck, and to a part of the territory of the Hanseatic town of Hamburg. And whereas the resolutions of Articles 3 to 5 and 10 to 20 of the Treaty have come into activity in these towns and countries at the time determined by the Federal Council of the Zollverein, these resolutions are now valid in the whole of the North German Confederation, with the following exceptions:-

(a.) In Prussia:—The town of Altona, a portion of Wandsbeck and of the village of Marienthal, the seaport Geestemunde, the fortress Wilhelm in Bremerhaven, the islands in the Elbe of Altenwerder, Krusenbusch, Finkenwärder, Kattwieck, Hohenschaar, Neuhof, and Wilhelmsburg, and

the village of Aumund.

(b.) In Oldenburg:—The seaport town Brake.

(c.) The free town Bremen and its territory, exclusive of the Hollerländischen Ausserdeichsländereien, and the territory situated on the right bank of the Wumme and the left bank of the Ochum.

(d.) In the territory of the free town of Hamburg: — The town of Hamburg, the suburb St. Pauli, the districts Eimsbüttel, Rotherbaum, Harvestehude, Eppendorf, Winterhude, Eilbeck, Borgfelde, Hohenfelde, Hamm, Horn, the Elbe islands of Finkenwärder and Moorwärder, the southern portion of the district Alsterdorf, the south-west portion of the district Barmbeck, together with Rönnhaide the western portion of the districts of Billwärder-Ausschlag and Billwärder-an-der-Bille and Cuxhavener Aussendeich.

A decision of the Council of the Empire, which received the sanction of His Majesty the Emperor on the 14th November last, suppresses the free importation of foreign salt into the ports of the White Sea, with the exception of the Murmansk Coast and the town of Kola, where the importation will continue free, as hitherto. The prohibition will come into force on and after the 14th October, 1869. Salt eoming from the Government Salt Works at Archangel, which shall be forwarded at the Murmansk Coast shall be exempt from excise duty, provided that every dispatch shall weigh 1,000 pounds at least, and shall be effected, with the permission of the local administration of exeise, at one of the following ports, viz.:—Archangel, Onega, Sumskoï, Kem or Kola.

Sea salt from the sea coasts of the White Sea and Arctic Ocean, destined for the salting of fish upon the spot, or forwarded to the Murmansk Coast or to Kola, shall be also exempt from the excise duty.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Brussels, inclosing a Decree, dated 8th December, 1868, relative to the transport of petroleum, naphtha, &c., on rivers and canals in Belgium.

The following arc the Articles of this Dccree:— The transport of pctroleum, naphtha, and other hydro-carbons on the rivers and canals under Government management shall be subject to the

following precautionary measures :-

ART. 1. Boats laden with materials of the above-named descriptions can only be stationed at places pointed out either by the local authorities or by the agents entrusted with the water police. Any stoppage without good reason in the boats' course is forbidden.

ART. 2. These boats must discharge their cargo

immediately on arrival at their destination.

ART. 3. When "en route" these vessels must, as far as possible, keep out of the way of any vessels they may meet, as well as of banks upon which there are any buildings.

ART. 4. They must not have on board either fires or matches and they must be as open as possible, without cabins or any part covered in, in

which explosive gases could accumulate.

ART. 5. They shall take precedence of other boats in passing through locks, with the exception of boats laden with gunpowder, gun-cotton, and explosive materials, to which the Royal Decree of

the 15th July, 1859, is applicable.

ART. 6. Any infraction of the preceding regulations shall be reported by the agents entrusted with the "surveillance" of the rivers and canals and any other agents of public management having power for that purpose, according to the provisions of the law of the 29th Floreal in the year X, as well as the Decrees of the 16th December, 1811, and 10th April, 1812; and shall be punished by the penalties laid down in Art. 1 of the law of the 6th March, 1818, provided that the law shall not have stated the penalties which shall be specially applicable.
