PROSPECTUS

OF THE

St. Louis University.

THIS Literary Institution, situated in an agreeable and airy part of the city of St. Louis, was founded in 1829, by members of the Society of Jesus, incorporated by an act of the State Legislature in 1832, under the name and style of the "SAINT LOUIS UNIVERSITY," and empowered to confer degrees and academical honors in all the learned professions, and generally to have and "enjoy all the powers, rights and privileges exercised by literary institutions of the same rank." It has experienced uninterrupted prosperity, and has progressively improved so as to offer advantages not surpassed in the West. Both river and railroad facilities of communication render it easy of access at all seasons of the year.

The Institution possesses a valuable Museum, which contains a great variety of specimens, both of nature and of art, collected from various quarters of the globe, especially from our own country; also a very beautiful and complete Philosophical and Chemical Apparatus. The library belonging to the Institution numbers over 14,000 volumes, embracing almost every branch of literature and science, and containing many rare and interesting works. The select libraries open to the students, form a collection of over 7,000 volumes.

The College Villa, situated near the city, is large and beautiful, with ample buildings, spacious groves and recreation grounds. Here the students may spend their weekly holiday and the summer vacation in a manner conducive alike to health and relaxation.

Course of Instruction.

The course of instruction pursued in the University is divided into two departments—the Theological and the Collegiate.

Theological Department.

This Department comprises the study of Dogmatic and Moral Theology, Canon Law, the Sacred Scriptures, Ecclesiastical History, Sacred Eloquence, and the Hebrew Language. The course is completed in four years.

Collegiate Department.

This Department comprises two distinct Courses—the Classical and the Commercial.

CLASSICAL COURSE.

This Course, designed to impart a thorough knowledge of the English, Greek and Latin Languages; of Mental and Moral Philosophy; of pure and mixed Mathematics; and of Physical Sciences, is completed in six years.

LATIN—Syntax, Exercises, Nepos.

Second Term.—ENGLISH—The same authors continued.

GREEK—Syntax, Exercises, Plutarch, Lucian's Dialogues.

LATIN—Syntax, Exercises, Cæsar, Phædrus.

Both Terms.—Arithmetic, Penmanship.

THIRD YEAR.

FIRST HUMANITIES.

First Term.—ENGLISH—Comparative Grammar of the English, Greek and Latin Languages; General Principles of Style, Epistolary Composition, Descriptions, Essays; Modern History, Geography of Asia and Africa.

GREEK—Application of Grammar to Composition; Lucian's Dialogues; Anacreon.

LATIN—Application of Grammar to Composition; Ovid; Cicero de senectute et amicitia.

Arithmetic continued.

Second Term.—ENGLISH—General outlines of English Literature; Composition.

GREEK—General outlines of Greek Literature, Composition, Xenophon's Cyropædia, or Anabasis.

LATIN—General outlines of Latin Literature, Composition, Virgil.

MATHEMATICS—Algebra.

FOURTH YEAR.

POETRY.

First Term.—ENGLISH—Prosody, Aids to Composition, Ancient History and Geography; Weekly Debates and Essays.

GREEK—Prosody, Dialects, Homer, Composition.

LATIN—Prosody, Livy, Virgil, Composition.

MATHEMATICS—Algebra continued.

PHYSICS AND CHEMISTRY—Application of the principles of Mechanics; Hydrostatics; Hydraulics, Heat, Chemical Combinations; Non-metallic Elements.

Second Term.—ENGLISH—The same authors continued.

GREEK—Demosthenes; Composition in Verse and Prose.

LATIN—Virgil, Horace; Composition in Verse and Prose; History of the Poets and Poetry of the English, Greek and Latin Languages.

MATHEMATICS—Geometry.

PHYSICS—Pneumatics, Meteorology, Acoustics.

CHEMISTRY—Metallic Elements; Salts. Mineralogy.

FIFTH YEAR.

RHETORIC.

First Term.—ENGLISH—Blair's Rhetoric, Quintilian, Criticism, Weekly Debates, Oratorical Composition.

GREEK—Demosthenes, Euripides or Sophocles, Composition.

LATIN—Horace, Cicero, Composition.

MATHEMATICS—Plane and Spherical Trigonometry, Surveying.

PHYSICS—Electricity, Galvanism, Electro-Metallurgy, Magnetism, Electro-Magnetism.

CHEMISTRY—Vegetable and Animal Chemistry.

Second Term.—ENGLISH—Campbell's Philosophy of Rhetoric.

GREEK—Plato's Gorgias or Phædon, Euripides or Sophocles, Composition.

LATIN—Horace, Tacitus, Composition.

MATHEMATICS—Analytical Geometry.

PHYSICS—Optics, Photography.

GEOLOGY—CHEMISTRY—Qualitative and Quantitative Analysis.

SIXTH YEAR.

PHILOSOPHY.

First Term.—Logic; Ontology; Cosmology; Psychology; Natural Theology. Lectures in Latin by the Professor. Dissertations and Discussions in Latin by the students.

MATHEMATICS—Differential and Integral Calculus.

GREEK—Aristotle or Plato.

Second Term.—Ethics; General Principles of Law and Right. Evidences of Religion.

GREEK—Aristotle or Plato.

Analytical Mechanics; Astronomy.

COMMERCIAL COURSE.

This Course is completed in four years.

FIRST YEAR.

SECOND GRAMMAR CLASS.

Both Terms.—Grammar; Exercises; Elocution; History of the United States; Geography; Arithmetic; Penmanship.

SECOND YEAR.

FIRST GRAMMAR CLASS.

Both Terms.—Grammar; Exercises; Epistolary Composition; Elocution; Modern History; Geography; Arithmetic; Penmanship.

THIRD YEAR.

SECOND RHETORIC CLASS.

First Term.—Aids to English Composition, Essays, Elocution, Ancient History, Geography. Book-keeping. Algebra. Olmsted's Application of the Principles of Mechanics. Hydrostatics. Hydraulics, Heat. Chemical Combinations, Non-metallic Elements.

Second Term.—Rhetoric, Essays, History continued. Geometry. Pneumatics, Meteorology, Acoustics. Chemistry—Metallic Elements; Salts. Mineralogy.

FOURTH YEAR.

FIRST RHETORIC CLASS.

First Term.—Rhetoric, Composition, Weekly Debates. Mental Philosophy. Plane and Spherical Trigonometry, Surveying. Electricity, Galvanism, Electro-Metallurgy, Magnetism, Electro-Magnetism. Vegetable and Animal Chemistry. Evidences of Religion.

Second Term.—Rhetoric, Criticism, Composition, Weekly Debates. Moral Philosophy. Conic Sections. Optics. Photography. Geology. Qualitative and Quantitative Analysis. Evidences of Religion.

The Study of the French, German, Spanish and Italian Languages is optional in either course.

General Regulations.

The Academic year consists of one session, beginning on the first Monday of September, and ending about the 4th of July, when the annual commencement, the conferring of degrees, and the distribution of premiums take place.

The session is divided into two terms, the first ending on the 2d of February, and the second about the 4th of July. A thorough examination of all the classes is made at the close of each term. Every month the places or degrees of merit, obtained by the students in the different classes, are publicly proclaimed, and honors are awarded to such as have been most distinguished for good conduct, diligence and proficiency.

On the completion of the classical course, the degree of A. B. is conferred upon all those who, on examination, are found deserving of that distinction. The degree of A. M. is given to the Alumni who have devoted two years to some literary pursuit after having received the degree of A. B. Other Academical honors are granted to merit and distinction in the learned professions.

No one will be admitted unless he bears a good moral character. Students coming to the University from other institutions will be required to produce satisfactory testimonials. No one will be admitted for a shorter period than one session. No student will be received under the age of ten or over that of sixteen.

When a student enters, he is examined by the Prefect of Studies, and placed in the class for which his previous attainments have prepared him.

Bulletins are sent three times a year to the parents or guardians of the students, to inform them of the conduct, health and improvement of their sons or wards.

Thursday is the weekly recreation day. On the first Thursday of every month, the students, whose parents or guardians live in the city or vicinity, are allowed to visit them.

During the eight days' recess which begins on the 25th of December, all who can conveniently visit their parents are permitted to do so. No other absence is allowed during the course of the session.

An experienced physician daily visits the Institution. The greatest care and attention are bestowed on the sick.

The Professors and the majority of the students are members of the Catholic Church. Pupils of other denominations are admitted, provided they are willing, for the sake of order and uniformity, to attend the public exercises of religious worship.

Students of Chemistry and Natural Philosophy, for the use of the Apparatus, pay \$10 per session.

Medicines and School Books are furnished, if parents desire it, at current prices.

Music, Drawing, Dancing and Fencing are taught, if required, and form extra charges.

Graduation fee,.....\$5 00

The Session is divided into Quarters, beginning respectively about the 1st of September, the 15th of November, the 1st of February and the 15th of April.

Payments must be made invariably quarterly or semi-annually in advance. No deduction will be made from a quarter commenced.

Directions to Parents.

The students must be provided with at least two summer and two winter suits; a sufficient number of shirts, handkerchiefs, socks, towels and napkins; a knife, fork and tumbler; combs, brushes, and other indispensable articles. All these can be had at the University, provided a sum sufficient to meet the expenses is placed in the hands of the Treasurer. The bed and bedding, when furnished by the parents, must consist of a mattress of six by two and a half feet, at least two pair of sheets, two double blankets, and a white counterpane; the bedsteads are invariably furnished by the Institution.

No student is allowed to keep money in his possession. The pocket money must be deposited with the Treasurer, and it is the wish of the Faculty that no more than fifteen or twenty-five cents per week be allowed to the students. When, at the end of the session, parents or guardians wish to have their children or wards sent home, they must give timely notice to the President, settle all accounts, and forward the necessary traveling expenses.

Parents who live at a distance should appoint an agent in St. Louis or New Orleans, who will be responsible for the regular payment of all expenses, and to whom the children may be directed on leaving the University.

Messrs. Thomas S. Elder & Co., New Orleans, who are regular agents of the University for Louisiana, Mexico, etc., will receive the payments and send on such children as shall be recommended to their care by parents and guardians.

All letters sent or received by students, unless to or from parents, are subjected to the inspection of the President.

Letters, etc., to be carefully directed to the "St. Louis University, corner Ninth Street and Washington Avenue, St. Louis, Mo."

The next session will be opened on Monday, September 3d.

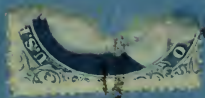

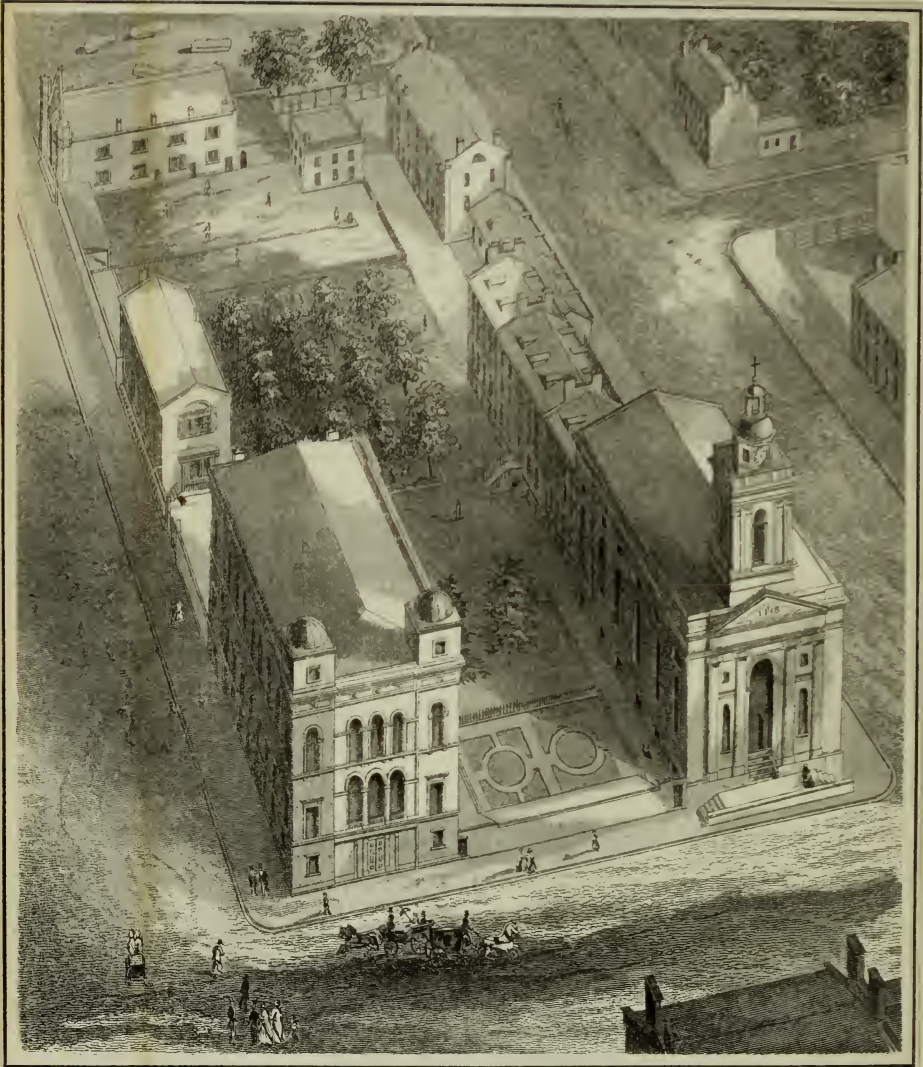

PROSPECTUS

OF THE

St. Louis University.

This Literary Institution, situated in an agreeable and airy part of the city of St. Louis, was founded in 1829, by members of the Society of Jesus, incorporated by an act of the State Legislature in 1832, under the name and style of the "SAINT LOUIS UNIVERSITY," and empowered to confer degrees and academical honors in all the learned professions, and generally to have and "enjoy all the powers, rights and privileges exercised by literary institutions of the same rank." It has experienced uninterrupted prosperity, and has progressively improved so as to offer advantages not surpassed in the West. Both river and railroad facilities of communication render it easy of access at all seasons of the year.

The Institution possesses a valuable Museum, which contains a great variety of specimens, both of nature and of art, collected from various quarters of the globe, especially from our own country; also a very beautiful and complete Philosophical and Chemical Apparatus. The Library belonging to the Institution numbers over 14,000 volumes, embracing almost every branch of literature and science, and containing many rare and interesting works. The select Libraries open to the students, form a collection of over 7,000 volumes.

The College Villa, situated near the city, is large and beautiful, with ample buildings, spacious groves and recreation grounds. Here the students may spend their weekly holiday and the summer vacation in a manner conducive alike to health and relaxation.

Course of Instruction.

The course of instruction pursued in the University is divided into two departments—the Theological and the Collegiate.

Theological Department.

This Department comprises the study of Dogmatic and Moral Theology, Canon Law, the Sacred Scriptures, Ecclesiastical History, Sacred Eloquence and the Hebrew Language. The course is completed in four years.

Collegiate Department.

This Department comprises two distinct courses—the Classical and the Commercial.

CLASSICAL COURSE.

This Course, designed to impart a thorough knowledge of the English, Greek and Latin Languages; of Mental and Moral Philosophy; of pure and mixed Mathematics; and of Physical Sciences, is completed in six years.

First Term.—Aids to English Composition, Essays, Elocution, Ancient History, Geography. Book-keeping. Algebra. Olmsted's Application of the Principles of Mechanics. Hydrostatics. Hydraulics. Heat. Chemical Combinations, Non metallic Elements.

Second Term—Rhetoric, Essays, History continued. Geometry. Pneumatics, Meteorology, Acoustics. Chemistry—Metallic Elements, Salts. Mineralogy.

FOURTH YEAR.

FIRST RHETORIC CLASS.

First Term.—Rhetoric, Composition, Weekly Debates. Mental Philosophy. Plane and Spherical Trigonometry, Surveying. Electricity, Galvanism, Electro-Metallurgy, Magnetism, Electro-Magnetism. Vegetable and Animal Chemistry. Evidences of Religion.

Second Term.—Rhetoric, Criticism, Composition, Weekly Debates. Moral Philosophy. Conic Sections. Optics. Photography. Geology. Qualitative and Quantitative Analysis. Evidences of Religion.

The study of the French, German, Spanish and Italian Languages is optional in either Course.

General Regulations.

The Academic Year consists of one session, beginning on the first Monday of September, and ending about the 4th of July, when the annual commencement, the conferring of degrees, and the distribution of premiums take place.

The session is divided into two terms, the first ending on the 2d of February, and the second about the 4th of July. A thorough examination of all the classes is made at the close of each term. Every month the places or degrees of merit, obtained by the students in the different classes, are publicly proclaimed, and honors are awarded to such as have been most distinguished for good conduct, diligence and proficiency.

On the completion of the classical course, the degree of A. B. is conferred upon all those who, on examination, are found deserving of that distinction. The degree of A. M. is given to the alumni who have devoted two years to some literary pursuit after having received the degree of A. B. Other Academic honors are granted to merit and distinction in the learned professions.

No one will be admitted unless he bears a good moral character. Students coming to the University from other institutions will be required to produce satisfactory testimonials. No one will be admitted for a shorter period than one session. No student will be received under the age of ten or over that of sixteen.

When a student enters, he is examined by the Prefect of Studies, and placed in the class for which his previous attainments have prepared him.

Bulletins are sent three times a year to the parents or guardians of the students, to inform them of the conduct, health and improvement of their sons or wards.

Thursday is the weekly recreation day. On the first Thursday of every month, the students, whose parents or guardians live in the city or vicinity, are allowed to visit them.

During the eight days' recess which begins on the 25th of December, all who can conveniently visit their parents are permitted to do so. No other absence is allowed during the course of the session.

An experienced physician daily visits the institution. The greatest care and attention are bestowed on the sick.

The professors and the majority of the students are members of the Catholic Church. Pupils of other denominations are admitted, provided they are willing, for the sake of order and uniformity, to attend the public exercises of religious worship.

Medicines and School Books are furnished, if parents desire it, at current prices.

Music, Drawing, Dancing and Fencing are taught, if required, and form extra charges.

Graduation fee,\$5 00

The Session is divided into quarters, beginning respectively about the 1st of September, the 15th of November, the 1st of February and the 15th of April.

Payments must be made invariably quarterly or semi-annually in advance. No deduction will be made from a quarter commenced.

Directions to Parents.

The students must be provided with at least two summer and two winter suits; a sufficient number of shirts, handkerchiefs, socks, towels and napkins; a knife, fork and tumbler; combs, brushes, and other indispensable articles. All these can be had at the University, provided a sum sufficient to meet the expenses is placed in the hands of the Treasurer. The bed and bedding, when furnished by the parents, must consist of a mattress of six by two and a half feet, at least two pair of sheets, two double blankets and a white counterpane. The bedsteads are invariably furnished by the Institution.

No student is allowed to keep money in his possession. The pocket money must be deposited with the Treasurer, and it is the wish of the Faculty that no more than fifteen or twenty-five cents per week be allowed to the students. When, at the end of the session, parents or guardians wish to have their children or wards sent home, they must give timely notice to the President, settle all accounts, and forward the necessary traveling expenses.

Parents who live at a distance should appoint an agent in St. Louis or New Orleans, who will be responsible for the regular payment of all expenses, and to whom the children may be directed on leaving the University.

Messrs. Thomas S. Elder & Co., New Orleans, who are regular agents of the University for Louisiana, Mexico, &c., will receive the payments, and send on such young gentlemen as shall be recommended to their care by parents and guardians.

All letters sent or received by students, unless to or from parents, are subject to the inspection of the President.

Letters, etc., to be carefully directed to the "St. Louis University, corner Ninth Street and Washington Avenue, St. Louis, Mo."

The next session will be opened on Monday, September 2d, 1861.
