## How I Write My Weekly Theme

Mweekly theme gives me as much trouble as the extraction of a worrisome tooth, and, like the tooth, it has got to come out sooner or later. Then I strike an attitude resembling that which you have, no doubt, seen in pictures of great anthors at their desks-pen in hand,
hand on brow, and mind, judging from the look on their face, as hank as the paper before them.

Then for my subject. Thinking, with me, involves a relaxed position ; so I "slmmp' down comfortally in my chair and take careful aim with me pen, ready to jot down the first idea that occurs to me. I rack my brain diligently; yet find one, I cannot. A story has been told that Alfred Tennyson suffered from the same lamentable condition. resting place for flown ideas. That, however, has no connection with this theme. Gratually they return when I am abmost diseonraged, and the next difficulty is the selection of the more suitable ones. I find 1 cannot deseribe a recent snom scene without bringing in the fall of an exceelingly fat lady, that heing naturally comected with my irlea of the scene. This interesting incident not only violates the laws of rhetoric, but the dragging in of such a weighty specimen reguires both time and exertion; so I abandon my show scene enticely. It is equally hard for me to write a narrative theme, becanse I get so wrapt up in deseribing seenery, ete., my poor characters hare searcely time and space to bind farewell to the rader. I msmally resort to an exposition, as 1 ran fint a little of everything in one and receive not less than a zero.

But, as every one knows, "tempus fugit," or " yon can't keep on torever,' and hy the time I have tried my skill in all these three brand hes it is time that all little chilhtren of my age should be in hed; so I retire with the firm resolntion to write my theme the next day at school.

When the next day comes as I have only one varant period, I try to be very busy at that time. But no human could refuse such an invitation as I receive to "chase" up to the comer and procure
