When I am seated comfortably within hearing distance of the phone, I rub my hands together in joyful anticipation of—I know not what; possibly that I am about to accomplish a great work. Then I strike an attitude resembling that which you have, no doubt, seen in pictures of *great* authors at their desks—pen in hand,

hand on brow, and mind, judging from the look on their face, as blank as the paper before them.

Then for my subject. Thinking, with me, involves a relaxed position; so I "slump" down comfortably in my chair and take careful aim with my pen, ready to jot down the first idea that occurs to me. I rack my brain diligently; yet find one, I cannot. A story has been told that Alfred Tennyson suffered from the same lamentable condition. It seems that in a letter to a friend Mrs. Tennyson writes: "My Dear Delia: Can't you suggest something for poor, dear Alfred to write on? Once he has a title suggested to him, there is no difficulty in his turning out a magnificent work, as you know. However, my ideas are all exhausted and we are in despair." So I smile and console myself with the thought that I possess at least *one* quality of a genius—that I cannot think of a subject—and I am proud of it.

resting place for flown ideas. That, however, has no connection with this theme. Gradually they return when I am almost discouraged, and the next difficulty is the selection of the more suitable ones. I find I cannot describe a recent snow scene without bringing in the fall of an exceedingly fat lady, that being naturally connected with my idea of the scene. This interesting incident not only violates the laws of rhetoric, but the dragging in of such a weighty specimen requires both time and exertion; so I abandon my snow scene entirely. It is equally hard for me to write a narrative theme, because I get so wrapt up in describing scenery, etc., my poor characters have scarcely time and space to bid farewell to the reader. I usually resort to an exposition, as I can put a little of everything in one and receive not less than a zero.

But, as every one knows, "tempus fugit," or "you can't keep on forever," and by the time I have tried my skill in all these three branches it is time that all little children of my age should be in bed; so I retire with the firm resolution to write my theme the next day at school.

When the next day comes, as I have only one vacant period, I try to be very busy at that time. But no human could refuse such an invitation as I receive to "chase" up to the corner and procure

"eats." So at the first opportunity, money in hand—well, it is just like what an old negro said: "It shorely am a sin ter put whisky in the way uv a honest nigger, then ax him is he drunk it."

On my return I find I have exactly fifteen minutes in which to help eat the articles, wash my hands, find ink, and write my theme—leaving, I think, about four minutes in which to "select ideas, arrange them logically, and connect them well." Writing hurriedly, I jot down something any self-respecting Subfreshman would be ashamed of, thanking Providence the while that a wicked girl has talked, and, therefore, invoked a lecture from a well-known and highly honored official. This, keeping the classes late, gives me time to assume a languid air and ruff my hair in front. But I congratulate myself that my tooth is written, or my theme is pulled, as you please.

So any one can see that it takes a genius to write a theme, and geniuses in a preparatory school are *made*, not *born*.
