## FISHERIES RIGHTS

Fisheries Rights Reform Schedule Revised

a. The Fisheries Agency has revised the schedule for the implementation of fisheries rights reform. This revision is a result of recommendations made by prefectural government fisheries officials during a recent nationwide meeting. The consensus of the prefectural officials was that the original schedule did not provide sufficient time for determination of the number, location, and contents of fishing rights and licenses to be established in the various sea areas. The officials also believed that the importance of adjustment and reorganization of the licensed coastal fisheries had been underestimated in the original schedule.

b. The revisions made in the schedule do not alter the date (March 1952) originally set for completion of the reform measures. (The original schedule appeared in Weekly Summary No 226.) "Fishing grounds planning" as used in reference to fisheries reform is the determination of the number, location, and contents of fisheries rights and licenses to be established in each sea area. The "contents" of rights and licenses include gear to be used, kind of fish permitted to be taken, length of season, and similar stipulations that the Sea Area commissions believe necessary to be a condition upon which licenses or rights to fish are issued. The revised schedule follows:

SUBJECT: Themes for Fisheries - August

1. On 15 August there will be held one of the most important elections for fishermen in the history of Japan -- the election of commissioners for the Sea Area Adjustment Committees. It is these committees which will resolve during the next twelve months the whole problem of fisheries rights, determining which fishermen shall have access to which areas. If these committees are to function democratically in furthering the interests of all, they must be comprised of intelligent, competent men. Fishermen must be encouraged to vote for such men in order to provide for their own future security. During July pamphlets, leaflets, and wall-newspapers concerning Fisheries Reform in general and the Sea Area Commission election in particular are being distributed throughout Japan by the Fisheries Agency, Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry. Steps should be taken to insure that all of this material reaches each fishing family.

2. After the election is held wide publicity should be given to the "Fishing Grounds Planning" project of the Fisheries Reform Operation. This project is one of the most important bases of the law and will particularly affect future conservation movements.

3. Most Fisheries Cooperatives have now been functioning for a year. In order to further their development, adequate measures need to be taken for the establishment of their sound financial condition and for the stabilization of their management.

4. For the purpose of maintaining the health of the consumer, it is essential that all necessary steps be taken to insure the freshness and the cleanliness of marine products. Producers should be reminded that better quality fish will result in more profits through increased demand.
