- All four entrances to the underground storage were closed by bomb hits. Also one truck parked in front of one entrance was destroyed by fire.
- Five piles of oil drums were destroyed by fire. Three piles of supplies were strafed but did not burn.
- Three revetments camouflaged with thatched roofs to look like houses apparently sustained no damage from rocket and strafing hits.
- Three revetments, apparently dugouts reinforced with logs, were completely destroyed.
