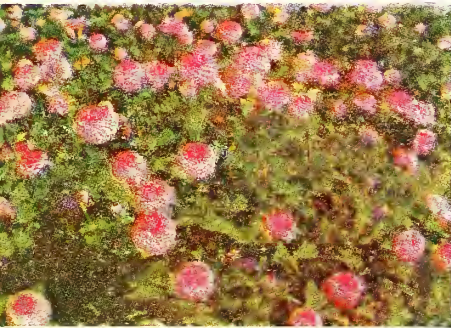

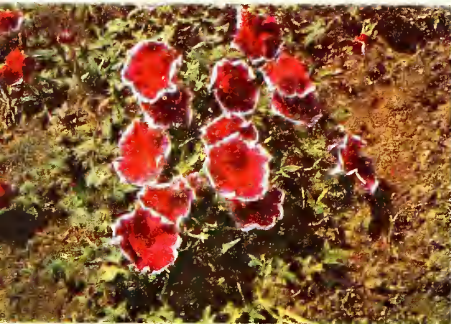

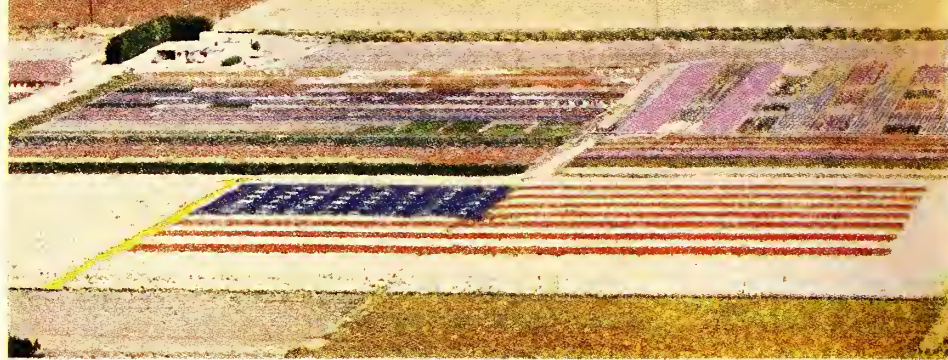

CALIFORNIA'S GIGANTIC FLORAL FLAG

The most inspiring sight this past season in the beautiful Lompoc Valley, renowned for its vast flower fields, was the Gigantic American Flag shown in our illustration. It was composed entirely of thousands upon thousands of living, growing Larkspur plants in full bloom, and measured fully three acres in size. Red and white stripes 455 feet long; ten ft. white stars in a blue field 186 by 140 feet, and a giant golden flagstaff of Calendula Chrysantha 10 ft. wide by 450 ft. in length, were boldly outlined in a 9 acre field of shimmering white.

As the tall flower spikes swayed to and fro, the flag seemed to wave gently in the breeze. Viewed from Observation Point, the sight held spectators spellbound, and for the thousands who visited Lompoc Valley in 1942 it will remain an unforgettable memory.












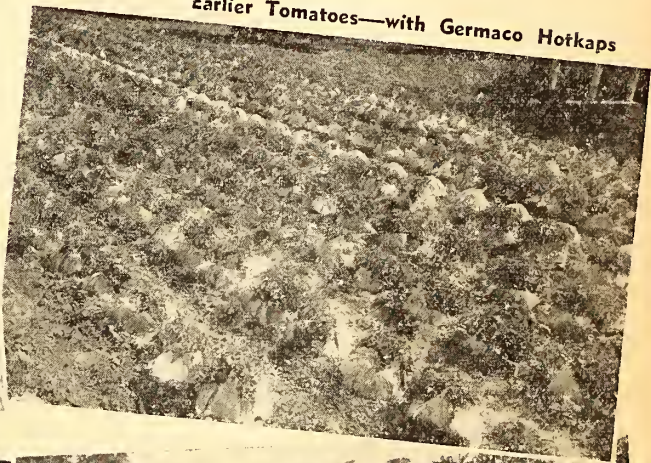

How to start Your Garden successfully

A FEW SIMPLE RULES FOR PROPER SOIL PREPARATION

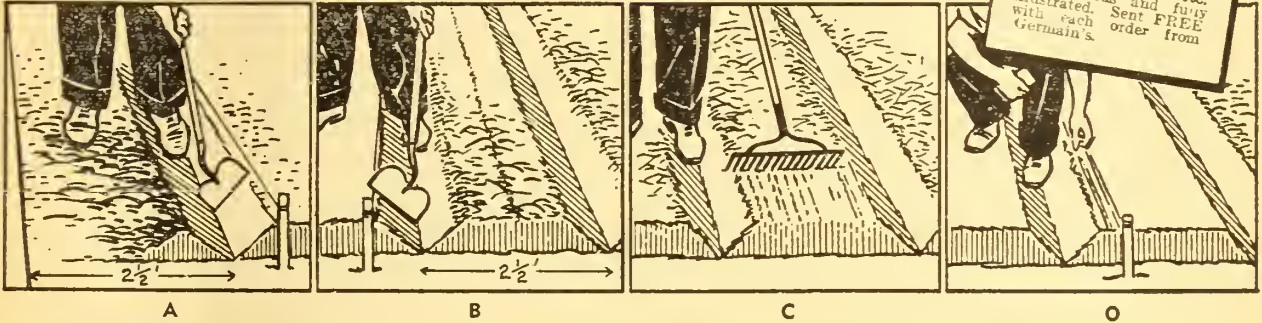
The ideal seed bed is formed when the soil has been soaked to a depth of at least three feet either by rains or irrigation, spaded or plowed to a depth of 15 to 18 inches, and carefully raked or harrowed. This will store sufficient moisture in the soil to germinate the seed, bring the seedlings above the surface of the soil, and carry them on for a week or two, until they are large enough to irrigate without danger of flooding and baking the soil around them. The stored moisture supply is drawn to the surface to evaporate, and as it

risers it keeps the seed zone moist. Bring about this condition and you can be assured of a successful garden planting—with reasonably good subsequent care, of course.

It is often important to use commercial fertilizer in the initial soil-improvement program, and your garden supply dealer will gladly give you the proper amounts to apply to your particular garden size.

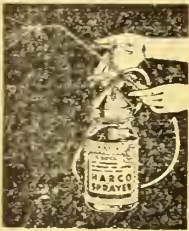

HOW TO MAKE UP PLANTING BEDS WITH A HOE—Set a guide line, as in "A," and open a "furrow," drawing the soil all to one side. Then measure off thirty inches, and reset the line, opening another "furrow" as in "B," this time throwing the soil toward the first furrow. This completes one "bed." Continue to make these, level off the beds, as in "C," and planting on each "shoulder," as in "O" can then be started. It is well to irrigate after planting, particularly in summer and fall months when the soil dries out rapidly.

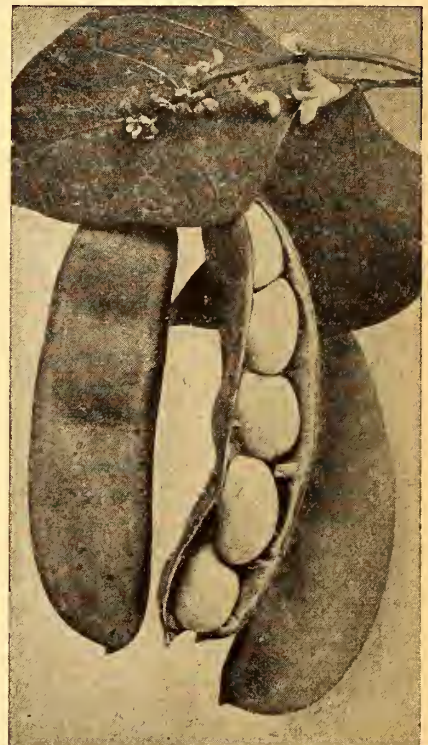

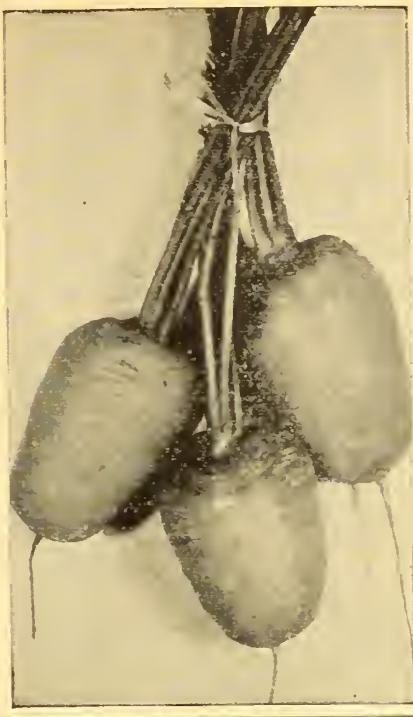

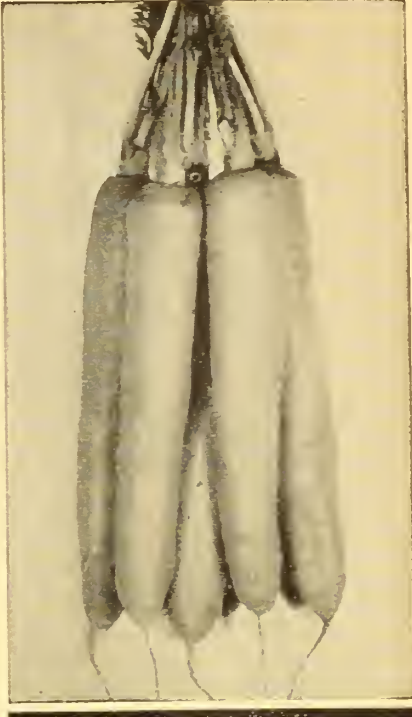

On receipt of shipment unpack immediately, and if not planted at once place the roots of the trees in a trench, cover with soil, and water thoroughly. It is of great importance to dig holes deep and large to admit all the roots in their natural position. Any injured roots should be cut off with a sharp knife. Fill the hole with the surface soil, so that the tree, after the earth has settled, will stand about as deep as it did in the nursery, a line which can usually be noted by a difference in color.

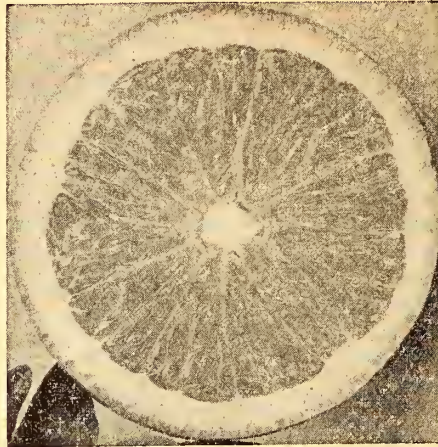

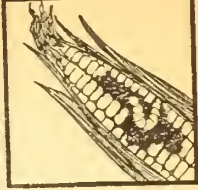
