





1. The above referenced letter was returned to Region in order that inventory code numbers pertaining to the equipment listed may be furnished.

2. Colonel Wheetman of Logistics has requested that this reparations equipment be made available to NPR for delivery to Camp McKnight. It is his impression that the equipment in question can be made available at no expense to NPR other than shipping charges from depots, where presently located, to the shipping destination. It was contemplated that Maj. 

1. Transmitted herewith is an application from Hyogo Prefectural Government requesting release as melt-down scrap of 80 items of equipment at subject plant.

2. Inspection of the installation revealed that all of the equipment applied for is beyond economical repair due to deterioration. Deterioration is principally due to frequent inundation of the plant area over a long period by high tides from Osaka Bay, adjacent to which the plant is situated. Inundation is a frequent occurrence due to subsidence of the ground in the area of the Osaka Bay shoreline. The equipment was further seriously damaged by the typhoon of 3 September 1950. Average age of the items applied for is fifteen years.

3. The only reparations equipment at the installation other than those desired for melt-down are three 300 KVA transformers, inventory numbers IA5-1, 2 and 3, and one 20 KVA transformer, inventory number IA5-4. Although repair of these transformers is economically feasible, their reparations value is questionable due to cost of repairs and the fact that they are more than 12 years old.

4. Release as melt-down scrap of the items listed in inclosure is recommended. Considering that the four transformers mentioned in the preceding paragraph will be the only reparations items remaining at the installation, if the equipment listed in inclosure is scrapped, release of the transformers for disposition as desired by the plant management is recommended.

1. Reference: Memorandum from the Civil Property Custodian for the Reparations Agency, Japanese Government, 387.6(2 Jun 50)CPC/EX, subject: "Expenditure of Funds for Maintenance, Centralization of Machines, and Repair of Buildings in Reparations Plants," dtd 11 September 1950.

2. Attention is invited to the inclosed application from the Kinki Finance Bureau, requesting approval of expenditure of reparations funds for repair and replacement of fencing at subject installation under the provisions of the memorandum referred to above. Previous fencing was almost completely destroyed by the typhoon of 3 September 1950.

3. Contrary to the procedure specified by the memorandum, the Kinki Finance Bureau completed the work without obtaining prior approval from this headquarters. Wooden fencing was erected at a cost of 729,600 yen, as reported by inclosure.

4. As a means of minimizing expenditure of government funds, and based on the theory that even the most elaborate fencing will not prevent entry of persons intent on burglarizing a reparations installation, the policy of this headquarters has been to replace damaged fences with barbed wire instead of the more costly wooden or meshed wire barriers. The barbed wire fencing, made up of two strands and standing five feet high, averages 25 yen per linear foot in cost. In cases where the plant management desires to erect more elaborate barriers, expenditure of government funds is approved on the basis of 25 yen per linear foot, with the plant making up the difference from its own funds. Thus, had this headquarters been consulted, barbed wire fencing at a total cost of 157,500 yen (6300 feet @ 25 yen per foot) would have been recommended instead of the more costly wooden fence.
