

k. MCO - Expiration date of Category IV, VI, VII and VIII personnel.

l. Column C - Month and year of birth, enter a four-digit number, e.g., January 1902 would be entered as 0102.

m. Column D - Date of Return from overseas service (Mo. and Yr.).

n. Column E - Months of overseas service, cumulative from 7 December 1941 through 30 ~~June~~ ^{July} 1946 will be entered in this column. After determining the number of whole months, give credit for an additional month for a fraction of 15 days or more - not over ~~30~~ months.

o. Column F - Volunteer for overseas service (indicated by asterisk).

4. The Certificate Stamp on the original and all copies of each roster will be completed as to strength and signed by the unit or personnel officer. It is to be noted that two strength figures are required, the total number of colored personnel assigned and attached unassigned, and the total number of personnel other than colored who are assigned or attached unassigned. The total of the two will agree with total morning report strength of that date. Attached personnel are not included in strength figures.

5. The original and two copies of officers' rosters properly authenticated will be returned to The Adjutant General's Office, Strength Accounting Branch, WD, Machine Records Section, Room 1-D-816, The Pentagon, Washington 25, D. C., within forty-eight (48) hours of receipt.



TO: State-War-Navy Coordinating Committee

1. In order to establish actual requirements for general officers by grade in the interim Army, the Director of Organization and Training, WDGS, has requested this office to submit the requirements of the Secretary of War Group for general officers, by grade, as of 1 July 1947.

2. It is emphasized that the present grade or assignment of general officers does not, in itself, establish a definite position and grade requirement; conversely, the lack of a general officer for assignment to a position does not eliminate the position requirement.

3. It is desired that these positions be listed according to major activity, unit, or headquarters and the recommended rank indicated for each position. A statement of justification should be included for each position or grade which might be questioned.

4. In addition to requirements for positions allocated under bulk allotment, all Table of Organization and Equipment Unit positions for general officers should be listed, and the unit designation, Table of Organization and Equipment number, and date should be shown. Any such position not considered as an essential requirement during interim period should be indicated by inserting an explanatory note of the reason for elimination.

5. The requirements of your office or a negative report should be forwarded so as to reach Management Branch, OSW, not later than 28 November 1946.

1. The National War College for Army, Navy and State Department officers has been established and is located in Washington, D. C. on the premises formerly occupied by the Army War College. The college will be the highest level educational institution of the Armed Forces. Officers attending will study joint problems of national defense.
2. The duration of the first course is 3 September 1946 to 21 June 1947. The Army quota will be prorated among the three major commands.
3. The purpose of the school is to develop officers for the exercise of command and joint staff duty with the highest echelons. Great care will be exercised by all concerned in their nominations to the War Department. The Army Ground Forces will consider for nomination officers whose basic branch is one of the following, regardless of present world-wide assignment, less officers presently on duty with the Army Air Forces: Cavalry, Coast Artillery Corps, Field Artillery, Infantry. The Army Service Forces will consider for nomination officers, regardless of present world-wide assignment, less officers presently on duty with the Army Air Forces, whose basic arm is Medical Corps, Dental Corps, Veterinary Corps, Pharmacy Corps, Adjutant General's Department, Chaplain Corps, Chemical Warfare Service, Finance Department, Judge Advocate General's Department, Ordnance Department, Quartermaster Corps, Corps of Engineers, and Signal Corps. The Army Air Forces will consider for nomination Air Corps officers and ASWAAF'S officers regardless of present world-wide assignment. Officers who are detailed in an arm or service other than their basic arm or service will be considered as members of the arm or service in which they are presently detailed.

4. Qualifications for attendance at the school are as follows:

- a. Regular Army officers or other than Regular Army officers category I.
- b. Be of a temporary or permanent rank, lieutenant colonel or above.
- c. General efficiency rating of superior.

d. Be graduates of Command and General Staff School or possess equivalent qualifications from war-time experience.

e. Will have attained their 35th birthday but will not have attained their 48th birthday in the case of officers of the permanent grade of colonel or in the case of the officers of the present temporary grade of colonel or above.

f. Will have attained their 35th birthday but will not have attained their 40th birthday in the case of officers of the permanent grade of lieutenant colonel or in the case of officers of the present temporary grade of lieutenant colonel.

g. Be physically qualified for general service.


h. Will have indicated by actual performance of duty a potentiality for high command or staff position.

5. All officers will be considered for nomination regardless of present considerations of availability.

6. Agencies of the five War Department Groups will nominate to the appropriate major command not later than 15 April 1946 officers under their assignment jurisdiction who meet the qualifications for attendance at the school.

7. The Commanding General, Army Ground Forces will nominate 52 officers to attend the course who meet the prescribed qualifications. The Commanding General Army Air Forces will nominate 42 officers to attend the course who meet the prescribed qualifications. Officers will be listed in order of priority. Nominations will be submitted so as to reach The Adjutant General, attention AGPO-A-S, on or before 18 April 1946.

Plastic canteens are not authorized for personnel travelling to Alaskan Department, Central and Eastern Canada, Greenland, Iceland, Newfoundland and Northwest District, Fifth Army Area.

II - Immunizations will be accomplished in accordance with par. 10, POR, June 1945.

Smallpox - for all destinations.

Tetanus - for all destinations.

Typhoid - for all destinations.

Bubonic Plague - Azores only.

Diphtheria - for all personnel under the age of 35 years traveling to the European and Mediterranean Theaters on permanent duty.


Cholera - for Asiatic Theater, Persian Gulf, Russia, Pacific Theater and all personnel moving to destinations west of Suez Canal and Red Sea including Syria and Turkey. Personnel moving through an area for which Cholera immunization is required will receive the immunization.

Yellow Fever - For Central Africa and for personnel whose destination is Panama, South America and the islands lying immediately adjacent thereto. The ten days waiting period prescribed in TE Med 114 is waived for all individuals whose final destination is Panama, Trinidad, Curacao or Aruba and who will not traverse any other endemic area enroute. (not applicable to Ascension Islands).

Typhus - for Alaskan Department, Asiatic Theater, Central Africa, European Theater, Middle East, Mediterranean, North Africa, Pacific Theater, Persian Gulf, Russia and personnel moving to the mountainous regions of South and Central America. (not applicable to Panama, and Ascension Is.)

(NOTE: - Personnel moving to an oversea destination through an area for which yellow fever or typhus immunization is required will receive the immunization required for that area (Par 11, AR 40-210) except that transit through the Panama Canal with brief sojourns within the terminal port cities or military posts within the Canal Zone will not be considered as travel in an endemic area.
