PLACE:	The Oval Office The White House

President: You will be leaving soon.

<u>Bush</u>: The day after tomorrow. Don't ask me about China! I had a good dinner last night with Ambassador Scali, Secretary Kissinger and the Chinese. They said they approved me quickly. The big thing will be the Kissinger trip in November. David Bruce said the big thing was the one thing that was never discussed with him--Taiwan.

<u>President:</u> That will be a political issue to manage domestically. here.

Bush: I konw you're busy. I just wanted to say goodbye.

<u>President:</u> We couldn't have found anyone more qualified.

<u>Bush:</u> If there is anything I can do to help you politically as '76 approaches, just let me know.

President: Thanks. I may try to visit you there by then.

Bush: That would be great! Many thanks for the time.
