**E**VERY Florist has experienced difficulty in obtaining putty (whether ordinary or white lead) for glazing, that is satisfactory for any length of time. The fact is, putty is not adapted for greenhouse work, and cannot stand the severe and varied tests to which it is subjected.

FIRST.—There is the extreme heat both from inside and outside, rapidly evaporating the oils and drying the putty to a hard brittle substance.

SECOND.—The moisture from inside causes a continual expansion and contraction of the woodwork, loosening and throwing off the hard and brittle putty, allowing the water and cold air to enter and the heat to escape almost as rapidly as though it had never been puttied.

I have read with much surprise the report of the Baltimore Club, regarding "MASTICA." Last winter we had two very heavy snowstorms. The first piled the snow over three feet deep on one side of our house—a tremendous weight, causing the roof to strain, and, of course, breaking some glass. As soon as we could clear the snow away, we started to reset the glass. The thermometer was falling rapidly, and it was of course necessary to work fast. 
