There can be no doubt that the Democratic division has recognized the opposition to its proposed resolutions. What others might do is not known. The Southern States, which have recently been feeling of hostility towards the Democratic party, had seemed disposed, assuming rather a negative attitude, to the resolutions. So had the Radical and Advanced Democrats. In the South every element of antagonism towards the Democratic party was about to be extinguished. What they had perceived to be hotbeds of restoration would never reach their hands again. After a brief interval, the Radical party had seemed disposed to inaugurate a conservative policy, leaving only a few regressive followers in Baltimore, Louisville and New Orleans. The cause of the Radicals was dead, and the South had no alternative save to sustain the Democrats.

These ideas began to prevail very generally, and in almost every town and city of the South the individuals who have since emerged as leaders by force of circumstances have become the most powerful in the Southern States, such as Virginia, Kentucky and Tennessee, in which an opposition has existed, and where, though a majority of the people were in favor of the Union, the Radicals had no alternative save to sustain the Democrats.
