



## RULES AND REGULATIONS.

#### ENTRIES.

- 1. Every animal and fowl must be entered in the name of its owner as the exhibitor, and the application for entry must be signed by him. All entries are expected to be and are understood as made upon the basis of and in compliance with the rules, regulations, classification and information contained in this the revised and final Prize-List, which supersedes any preliminary or other List published previously.
- 2. Firms and copartnerships entering animals for competition must in all cases be bona fide and the names of the members of the firm and date of copartnership should be given at time of filing entries.
- 3. Entries on prescribed forms for the several Divisions must be filed with the Chief of the Department of Live Stock on or before the dates upon which entries will close, as follows:

Division A-Horses, Asses and Mules, July 16, 1904.

" B—Cattle, July 23, 1904.

C—Sheep, August 15, 1904. D—Swine, August 15, 1904.

" E-Poultry, Pigeons and Pet Stock, September 10, 1904.

F—Dogs and Cats, September 10, 1904.

"G—Southern Breeding Cattle, Monday, October 1, 1904.

H—Carload Lots of Cattle, Monday, October 1, 1904.

- 4. In Divisions A, B, C and D exhibitors will be restricted to the entry and exhibition of not more than two animals in each Section.
- 5. Application for each entry must give the name and address of the exhibitor, name and record number of the animal, the Division, Class and Section in which it is to be exhibited, and if a pure-bred be accompanied by the official Certificate of Registry, signed by the Secretary of the Association publishing a Register therefor.
- 6. The domestic and foreign books of record of pedigrees, as approved by the Secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture, will be recognized as authority in matters of registration, with such exceptions as may be hereinafter indicated for each Division.
- 7. The same animal can be entered for competition in a section for age, as a part of a herd, the get of a sire and produce of dam, and will be entered by the Chief for Championship Prize if awarded a First-Prize. No breeding animal will be entered in more than one class as of more than one breed. Fat animals will be entered in their class and in classes in which breeds and grades compete by ages.
- 8. In Classes for Fat Stock or for breeds of which there are no established pedigree records evidence of breeding satisfactory to the Chief of the Department of Live Stock must be supplied at time of making entry.
- 9. For use of the press and in the final report of the Exposition all exhibitors are urged to furnish to the Chief of the Department, at the time of making entry, two unmounted cabinet-size photographs of each animal entered.
- 10. Applications for entry of Herds, Get or Produce must give the registry names and numbers of each animal composing such Herds, Get or Produce.

- 11. Applications for the entry of animals from foreign countries owned by non-residents, in addition to the requirements provided for in these rules must have the official approval of the Chairman of the Commission appointed to represent the country from which such animals come to the Louisiana Purchase Exposition, provided such animals are sent by and exhibited under the auspices of the government of the country from which they come.
- 12. Animals owned by State and public institutions will be permitted to compete only with similar exhibits from like institutions.

#### VETERINARY INSPECTION.

- 1. The Louisiana Purchase Exposition will appoint a Veterinary Surgeon for the Department of Live Stock, and such assistants as may be necessary.
- 2. All animals before admission to the Exposition grounds will be examined and must pass a satisfactory veterinary inspection, as a safeguard against infectious or contagious diseases.
- 3. The Veterinary Surgeon of the Department shall make daily inspection of the grounds, stables, stalls and pens and make each morning a report in writing to the Chief of the Department concerning the health of animals on exhibition, the condition of the grounds, stables, stalls and pens, and any other matters pertaining to the sanitary condition of the Department.
- 4. Exhibitors will promptly report in writing to the Chief of the Department and the Veterinary Surgeon any symptom of disease in their respective exhibits.
- 5. In case of the sickness or injury of any animal while on exhibition it shall be removed upon the order of the Chief of the Department from the Exposition grounds, or to a separate enclosure, where the exhibitor may direct the treatment of the animal.
- 6. If the Veterinary Surgeon of the Department of Live Stock, or another, is employed to treat a sick or injured animal the exhibitor shall pay such Veterinary Surgeon a reasonable charge for his services, and other necessary expenses incurred.
- 7. In case of doubt or protest as to the age of an animal in competition an examination shall be made by the Veterinary Surgeon, and should his report be that the age has not been correctly stated, or should any evidence submitted as to the animal's age be found unsatisfactory, said animal shall be barred from competition.

#### QUARANTINE.

- 1. All animals from foreign countries will be subject to the quarantine regulations of the United States Department of Agriculture published herewith in this Prize-List.
- 2. No animals will be admitted to the Exposition grounds from districts of the United States from which shipment of such animals on account of infectious or contagious diseases is prohibited by the regulations of the United States Department of Agriculture or the regulations of the State of Missouri in force during the period of the Exposition.

- 3. In case of outbreak of any contagious or infectious diseases among any class of domestic animals, making it advisable for the public safety that such stock shall not be exhibited at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition, the Chief of the Department of Live Stock will have authority to withdraw the offer of prizes therefor.
- 4. Animals known to be affected by or as having been exposed to any contagious disease within thirty days next prior to August 20, 1904, will not be admitted to the Exposition grounds.

# REGULATIONS FOR ADMISSION INTO THE UNITED STATES OF LIVE STOCK FROM FOREIGN COUNTRIES.

The following rules (Circular No. 60, May 17, 1901) have been promulgated by the Secretary of the Treasury as to the entry of animals imported for exhibition at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition at St. Louis, Missouri:

- I. Entry will be made at the custom-house according to the forms prescribed.
- II. DESCRIPTION OF ANIMALS.—Accompanying the prescribed invoice, there will be filed with the surveyor such a description of each animal by distinguishing marks and characteristics as shall serve to identify the same when withdrawn from the Exposition for sale or export.
- III. WHEN MADE IN ADVANCE.—In order to avoid any risk from delay, entry of such animals may be made and completed in advance of the arrival of the vessel of importation, except that the permit will be withheld by the collector for delivery to the importer or his agent on the announcement of such arrival.
- IV. GOVERNMENT NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR SAFETY OF ANIMALS.—The Government will not be responsible for the security or safe-keeping of such animals. The transfer to the transportation line will be made under the supervision of the collector at the port of arrival.
- V. On arrival at the Exposition, the animals will be subject to such disposition as may be agreed upon between the authorities of the exposition and the Surveyor of Customs.
- VI. WITHDRAWAL OF ANIMALS.—So far as applicable, the above general regulations under the act will govern importations of such animals, and at the close of the Exposition imported animals on exhibition may be withdrawn for consumption, transportation in bond, or exportation, under articles 12 and 13 of these regulations, but animals not so withdrawn will be sold at auction, and the proceeds, after deducting duties and charges, will be held subject to the order of the owner or importer.
- VII. The regulations of the Department of Agriculture of December 28th, 1899, promulgated by the Department of the Treasury on February 16th, 1900, (Treasury Department Order No. 22014) will govern generally as to the importation of neat cattle, sheep and other ruminauts, and swine, except that the requirement of tuberculin test, and the quarantine of one week required for cattle imported from Canada which are not provided with a certificate of tuberculin test, will be waived. Should such cattle be sold and remain in the United States at the close of the Exposition, a tuberculin test will be required before they are released.
- VIII. APPLICATION.—Any person contemplating the exhibition at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition of neat cattle of Canadian origin must make application to the Secretary of Agriculture for a permit to import animals for that purpose. Said application must give the number of animals and a description of each, covering breed, registration number, and state at which of the ports hereinafter named said animals are to be imported, and the names of the railroads by which and over which said animals are to be transported to the city of St. Louis. Said applica-

tion must be accompanied by a certificate from a veterinary inspector of the Dominion of Canada where said cattle are located, affirming that no contagious pleuro-pneumonia, foot-and-mouth disease, or rinderpest has existed in said district for the past year; also that the cattle have been examined by said veterinarian and are free from contagious diseases, including tuberculosis.

- IX. PERMITS.—The Secretary of Agriculture, upon receiving an application as above provided, will issue a permit for the importation of neat cattle of Canadian origin to be exhibited at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition, and excepting said cattle from the quarantine of seven days (see Bureau of Animal Industry, Order No. 109), upon condition that these regulations are strictly complied with.
- X. CATTLE MUST BE SHIPPED ON DISINFECTED CARS.—The said cattle must be loaded at point of shipment into clean and disinfected cars for transport to the United States, and a certificate from the railroad agent must accompany said cars showing that the same were duly cleaned and disinfected in the manner prescribed by the regulations of the United States Department of Agriculture.
- XI. CATTLE TO HAVE PROPER FOOD, WATER, SPACE AND REST.—All Canadian cattle entering the United States for exhibition at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition must be loaded and shipped in cars in which they can have proper food, water, space, and opportunity to rest; said cattle are not to be unloaded until they reach the Exposition grounds at St. Louis, but can not be so shipped under the immediate-transportation act.
- XII. QUARANTINE STATION.—All cattle coming under the provisions of these regulations must be entered at designated quarantine stations, and on their arrival at either of said ports the inspector of the Bureau of Animal Industry at said port will countersign the permit herein provided for and allow the cattle, if free from disease, to proceed to St. Louis, subject to a veterinary inspection at that point.
- XIII. WILD ANIMALS AND BIRDS.—The importation of wild animals and birds for the Louisiana Purchase Exposition, under the act of May 25th, 1900, should be governed by the regulations of the Department of June 28th, 1900 (Treasury Department Order No. 22316).

#### ADMISSION OF CANADIAN ANIMALS.

The following special order (Bureau of Animal Industry No. 104) dated March 9th, 1903, providing for the importation of Canadian animals for exhibition at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition at St. Louis, Mo., has been issued by the Secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture for the guidance of collectors and other officers of the customs, viz:

"It is hereby ordered, That Canadian animals, including horses, cattle, sheep, goats, and swine, may be imported into the United States for exhibition at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition, provided they are accompanied by a certificate of a Canadian official veterinarian stating that such animals are free from any contagious or infectious diseases, and have not been exposed to the contagion of such diseases affecting each particular species for a period of three months preceding the date of shipment. All such animals must be loaded at point of shipment in Canada into clean and disinfected cars for transportation to the United States, and a certificate from the railroad agent must accompany said cars showing that they were duly cleaned and disinfected in the manner prescribed in the regulations of this Department. Such animals must be entered at one of the designated animal quarantine stations, (principal stations at St. Albans, Vt., Buffalo, N. Y., Detroit, Mich., and Port Huron, Mich.) and on their arrival the inspector of the Bureau of Animal Industry at said station will countersign the official veterinary certificate (or permit in the case of cattle) herein provided for and allow the animals, if found

free from disease, to proceed to St. Louis, subject to veterinary inspection at that point. All such Canadian animals must be loaded and shipped in cars in which they can and do have proper food, water, space, and opportunity to rest, and must not be unloaded in any public stock yards or other point until they reach the Exposi-

tion grounds at St. Louis.

"Any person contemplating the importation of neat cattle from Canada must make application to this Department for a permit to import the cattle for that purpose; said application must give the number of cattle and a description of each, covering breed, registration number, and state at what point the cattle are to be imported, the names of the railroads by which and over which said cattle are to be transported to the city of St. Louis. This application must be accompanied by a certificate from a Canadian official veterinarian stating that no contagious disease affecting cattle, excepting tuberculosis and actinomycosis, has existed in the district in which such cattle have been kept for the past year, and that the cattle have been examined by him and are free from contagious diseases.

"The cattle of Canadian origin which are not sold to remain in the United States must be immediately returned to Canada at the close of the Exposition. All such cattle that are to remain in the United States must be tested with tuberculin by an inspector of the Bureau of Animal Industry, and will not be allowed shipment to destination in the United States unless such test shows them

to be free from tuberculosis."

#### ADMISSION OF ANIMALS OTHER THAN CANADIAN.

The following special order (Bureau of Animal Industry Order No. 105), dated March 9, 1903, providing for the importation of animals (other than Canadian) for exhibition at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition, St. Louis, Mo., has been issued by the Secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture for the guidance of collectors and other officers of the customs, viz:

"It is hereby ordered, That horses from Great Britain and the Continent of Europe may be imported into the United States for exhibition at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition, provided they pass a veterinary inspection by an inspector

of the Bureau of Animal Industry at the port of entry.

"It is further ordered, That the quarantine period for cattle imported for this Exposition from Great Britain, Ireland and the Channel Islands shall be sixty days counting from the date of shipment. The period of quarantine for sheep, other ruminants, and swine, shipped from the above countries, shall be fifteen days,

counting from the date of arrival at the port of entry.

"Any person contemplating the importation of cattle, sheep, and other ruminants and swine, for exhibition at this Exposition must make application to this Department for a permit to import and quarantine said animals for that purpose. This application must state the number and kind of animals to be imported, the port from which shipped, and the probable date of shipment, and must further state the port at which said animals are to be landed and quarantined, and the approximate date of their arrival. United States consuls will not give clearance papers or certificates for the shipment of animals from their districts unless the importer presents a duly signed permit, issued by this Department covering the shipment.

"The regulations of this Department (Bureau of Animal Industry Order No. 109, dated April 10, 1903, superseding Bureau of Animal Industry Order No. 56), dated December 28, 1899, will govern generally the care and supervision of such animals in their shipment from the port of entry to the animal quarantine station, and after arrival at such station. The certificates of health provided for in the above regulations will also be required for animals imported for this Exposition.

"All cattle covered by the provisions of this order may be imported without a tuberculin test, provided that after the expiration of the quarantine period they

are shipped direct from the animal quarantine station to the Exposition grounds without unleading in any public stock yards or other point en route. After the close of the Exposition, however, if such cattle are to remain in the United States they must be tested with tuberculin by an inspector of the Bureau of Animal Industry and will not be allowed shipment to destination in the United States unless such test shows them to be free from tuberculosis."

#### INSPECTION AND QUARANTINE OF LIVING ANIMALS.

The regulations of the United States Department of Agriculture for the inspection and quarantine of horses, neat cattle, sheep, and other ruminants, and swine imported into the United States are in part as follows: (Bureau of Animal Industry Order No. 109, superseding Bureau of Animal Industry Order No. 56), viz.:

#### HORSES.

All horses imported into the United States from any part of the world, except as otherwise provided for the countries of North America, shall be required to pass a veterinary inspection at the port of entry by an inspector of the Bureau of Animal Industry. Such inspector shall not allow the landing of any hay, straw or forage which accompany shipments of horses originating in any country on the Continent of Europe. In case the inspector finds horses to be affected with any contagious disease, he shall isolate them and immediately report to the Chief of the Bureau of Animal Industry, who may refuse the landing of horses affected with such diseases.

#### CATTLE, SHEEP, AND OTHER RUMINANTS.

All cattle, sheep and other ruminants imported into the United States from any part of the world except as hereinafter provided for the countries of North America shall be accompanied with a certificate from the local authority of the district in which said animals have been for one year next preceding the date of shipment, stating that no contagious pleuro-pneumonia, foot-and-mouth disease, anthrax, rinderpest, or any other disease contagious to cattle has existed in said district for the past year.

#### SWINE.

All swine imported into the United States from any part of the world, except as otherwise provided for the countries of North America, shall be accompanied with a certificate similar to the one required for cattle, sheep, and other ruminants, relating to the existence of foot-and-mouth disease, hog cholera, swine plague, and erysipelas.

#### CERTIFICATE AND AFFIDAVIT OF OWNER AND IMPORTER.

All such animals shall also be accompanied with an affidavit by the owner, stating that said animals have been in the district where purchased for one year next preceding date of sale, and that no contagious disease affecting the species of animals imported has existed among them nor among any animals of the kind with which they have come in contact, for one year last past, and that no inoculation has been practiced among said animals for the past two years. Also by an affidavit from the importer or his agent supervising the shipment stating that they have not passed through any district infected with contagious diseases affecting said kind of animals; that they have not been exposed in any possible manner to the contagion of any of said contagious diseases, and that the animals, when not driven, have been shipped in clean and disinfected cars and vessels direct from the farm where purchased.

The foregoing certificate and affidavits must accompany said animals and be presented to the collector of customs at the port of entry and by him be delivered to the inspector of the Bureau of Animal Industry stationed at said port, to allow them to be imported into the United States.

#### ANIMALS.

The word "animals" when used in these regulations refers to and includes all or any of the following kinds: Horses, asses and mules; neat cattle, sheep and other ruminants; and swine. Under the word "horses" will be included asses and mules; and under the word "sheep" will be included all ruminants except cattle.

#### DISEASES.

The words "contagious diseases" when used in these regulations includes and applies to all or any of the following diseases: Glanders and farcy, maladie du coit, distemper or strangles, anthrax, contagious pleuro-pneumonia, Texas or splenic fever, tuberculosis, actinomycosis, foot-and-mouth disease, rinderpest, variola, foot-rot, scab, hog cholera, swine plague and erysipelas.

#### PERMITS FOR IMPORT ANIMALS.

Any person contemplating the importation of animals other than horses from any part of the world, except the countries of North and Central America, must first obtain from the Secretary of Agriculture two permits, one stating the number and kind of animals to be imported, the port and probable date of shipment, which entitle them to clearance papers on presentation to the American consul at said port of shipment; the other, stating the port at which said animals are to be landed and quarantined, and the approximate date of their arrival, and this will assure the reception of the number and kind specified therein at the port and quarantine station named, at the date prescribed for the arrival, or at any time during three weeks immediately following, after which the permit will be void. These permits shall in no case be available at any port other than the one mentioned therein. Permits must be in the name of the owner of, or agent for, any one lot of animals. A quarantine release will be given each owner for the number and kind of animals belonging to him which are discharged from quarantine, and this release will be a certificate of fulfillment of quarantine regulations. In case an importation of animals is owned by more than one person, a release will be issued to each owner covering the animals which belong to him. Permits will be issued to quarantine at such ports as the importer may elect, so far as facilities exist at such port, but in no case will permits for importation at any port be granted in excess of the accommodations of the Government quarantine station at such port. United States consuls should give clearance papers or certificates for animals from their districts intended for exportation to the United States only upon presentation of permits as above provided, with dates of probable arrival and destination corresponding with said permits, and in no case for a number in excess of that mentioned therein. When such shipments originate in the interior of a foreign country, these permits should be submitted to the consul of that district and through the forwarding agent to the consul at the port of embarkation.

#### TARIFF DUTIES ON IMPORTED ANIMALS.

For the information of foreign exhibitors the following extracts from the tariff act of July 24, 1897, as amended by the act approved March 3, 1903, regarding the importation of live-stock are given.

Section 218. Cattle, if less than one year old, two dollars per head; all other cattle if valued at not more than fourteen dollars per head, three dollars and seventy-five cents per head; if valued at more than fourteen dollars per head, twenty-seven and one-half per centum ad valorem.

Section 219. Swine, one dollar and fifty cents per head.

Section 220. Horses and mules, valued at one hundred and fifty dollars or less per head, thirty dollars per head; if valued at over one hundred and fifty dollars, twenty-five per centum ad valorem.

Section 221. Sheep, one year old or over, one dollar and fifty cents per head; less than one year old, seventy-five cents per head.

Section 222. All other live animals, not specially provided for in this Act, twenty per centum ad valorem.

Section 278. Poultry, live, three cents per pound.

Section 473. Any animal imported by a citizen of the United States especially for breeding purposes shall be admitted free, whether intended to be so used by the importer himself or for sale for such purpose: Provided, That no such animal shall be admitted free unless pure-bred of a recognized breed, and duly registered in the books of record established for that breed: And provided further, That certificate of such record and of the pedigree of such animal shall be produced and submitted to the customs officer, duly authenticated by the proper custodian of such book of record, together with the affidavit of the owner, agent or importer that such animal is the identical animal described in said certificate of record and pedigree: And provided further, That the Secretary of Agriculture shall determine and certify to the Secretary of the Treasury what are recognized breeds and pure-bred animals under the provisions of this paragraph. The Secretary of the Treasury may prescribe such additional regulations as may be required for the strict enforcement of this provision. Cattle, horses, sheep or other domestic animals straying across the boundary line into any foreign country, or driven across such boundary line by the owner for temporary pasturage purposes only, together with their offspring, may be brought back to the United States within six months free of duty, under regulations to be prescribed by the Secretary of the Treasury: And provided further, That the provisions of this Act shall apply to all such animals as have been imported and are in quarantine, or otherwise in the custody of customs or other officers of the United States, at the date of the passage of this Act.

Section 474. Animals brought into the United States temporarily for a period not exceeding six months, for the purpose of exhibition or competition for prizes offered by any agricultural or racing association (shall be admitted free); but a bond shall be given in accordance with regulations prescribed by the Secretary of the Treasury; also teams of animals, including their harness and tackle and the wagons or other vehicles actually owned by persons emigrating from foreign countries to the United States with their families, and in actual use for the purpose of such emigration under such regulations as the Secretary of the Treasury may prescribe; and wild animals intended for exhibition in zoological collections for scientific and educational purposes, and not for sale or profit.

Section 494. Birds and land and water fowls, free of duty.

#### SHIPMENT OF EXHIBITS.

1. The Exposition Grounds will be open for the reception of Live Stock on the following dates, viz:

Division A-Horses, Ponies, Jacks, Jennets and Mules, Thursday, August 18, 1904.

B-Cattle, Thursday, September 8, 1904.

- C—Sheep and Goats and D—Swine, Thursday, September 29, 1904. E—Poultry, Pigeons and Pet Stock, Friday, October 21, 1904.

- F—Dogs and Cats, Saturday, October 22, 1904. G—Southern Breeding Cattle, Thursday, November 3, 1904.
- H-Carload Lots of Cattle, Thursday, November 3, 1904.
- 2. All Live Stock for exhibition owned and located in the United States out side of the quarantine district should be billed in the name of the exhibitor or his agent as "Exhibits for the Louisiana Purchase Exposition, St. Louis, Mo."
- 3. All Live Stock for exhibition owned in the United States and located in the quarantine districts of the United States as well as foreign exhibits of Live Stock, will be subject to the regulations of the United States Department of Agriculture, and the Treasury Department, as published elsewhere in this Prize-List, and such stock will be shipped pursuant to such regulations.
- 4. Freight on Live Stock should be prepaid to the Louisiana Purchase Exposition Grounds, St. Louis, Mo., and advice of route of shipment, time of arrival, etc., sent by wire to the Chief of the Department of Live Stock in ample time to have the stables made ready for the stock on arrival.
- 5. Duplicate way-bill of Live Stock should be mailed by each exhibitor to the Chief of the Department of Live Stock from starting point prior to departure. The duplicate way-bill after the arrival of the stock will be checked up, certified, and made available for any rebate provided for return shipment.

Following are the Rules and Regulations promulgated by the Exposition's Traffic Bureau governing the transportation of Live Stock and for the free return to point of original departure:

Horses and mules and other valuable and fancy animals, except cattle, hogs and sheep, intended for exhibition will be charged full tariff rates in both directions. Cattle, hogs and sheep will be charged tariff rates going to the Exposition, and may be returned to the point of origin free, subject to the same rules and restrictions as apply to dead freight, provided the regulation form of live stock release shall be executed by the owners. The rules of the official Classification relating to the carriage of attendants in charge of animals will apply to all shipments of live stock.

Note.—It is not to be understood that this action requires any company to return such exhibits free.

Bills of lading and waybills covering exhibits must show the precise routes by which such exhibits are to be transported, specifying in detail every carrier and every junction of delivery to a connecting line, from starting points to the Exposition, in order that exhibited articles entitled to free return may be returned by the exact routes first used.

When exhibits reach the Exposition via routes other than those specified in the bills of lading they will be entitled to free return only when returned via the exact route first used.

All exhibits forwarded to the Exposition will be charged full tariff rates to St. Louis, Mo., or East St. Louis, Ill. Through rates to the Exposition grounds will be made by adding the rates fixed by the terminal lines and Exposition management from St. Louis, Mo., or East St. Louis, Ill., viz.:

The following are the rates of the terminal lines, and will apply from St. Louis, Mo., or East St. Louis, Ill., to connection with Exposition tracks on inbound shipments, and from connection with Exposition tracks to East St. Louis, Ill., on outbound shipments. All charges on shipments must be prepaid.

On car loads.—From St. Louis, Mo., to connection with Exposition tracks, 2 cents per 100 lbs., minimum, \$10 per car.

From East St. Louis, Ill., to connection with Exposition tracks, 4 cents per 100 lbs., minimum, \$15 per car.

To the above rates and other charges there will be added a charge made by the Exposition management of 6 cents per 100 pounds. This terminal charge covers switching within the Exposition grounds and cost of handling shipments between cars and space allotted for exhibition, and will be made in each direction.

This charge will be computed on basis of railroad billed weights and applied on all shipments of exhibits, including those of the United States Government, subject to the regularly established minimum weights.

On all exhibits destined to the Exposition, prepayment of freight and terminal charges at St. Louis will be required at points of origin; on returned exhibits prepayment will be required at St. Louis of the terminal charges at that point.

Except as specified in the first of the foregoing regulations (relating to horses, mules, etc.), and subject to the conditions hereof and of the Western Classification and Exceptions, exhibited articles will be returned free of all charges, except those of the Exposition management, switching, bridge tolls and terminal charges, over the railways in St. Louis only on the following terms and conditions:

- (a) Paid freight bills or original bills of lading, both of which should name the precise routes first used, and certificates signed by the proper officer of the Exposition, must be presented to show that exhibited articles paid freight one way and have not changed ownership.
- (b) It must be distinctly understood that shipments of exhibits entitled to free return must be returned via same routes first used.
- (c) They must be consigned to the points from which they were sent on the forward journeys, and over the same routes first used.
- (d) Releases must be executed upon the agreed form, relieving the carriers from liability on the return journey, in consideration of free return.
  - (e) No charges will be advanced on articles returned free.
- (f) Persons accompanying exhibits which are returned free will be charged fare.
  - (g) Certificates and releases must be attached to the manifests.

For uniform release for returned exhibits, see page 33 of Rules and Regulations issued by C. L. Hilleary, Exposition Traffic Manager, and obtainable from him on application.

#### ANIMALS.

- 1. All animals must be on the grounds of the Exposition and in place two days prior to the first day of the exhibition specified for the Division to which they respectively belong, and must remain on the Exposition Grounds until the closing date for the exhibit in such Division unless special permission for cause is granted by the Chief of the Department for their prior removal.
- 2. All delivery of animals at the Exposition Grounds and barns and removal therefrom will be by and at the expense of their exhibitors.

- 3. For the convenience of exhibitors arrangements will be made to receive animals in each Division three days prior to the first day advertised for the show in the respective Divisions.
- 4. Every animal entered in the show will be assigned a number by which it will be known in the official catalogue and in the show arena. This number will be printed on a card which will bear thereon the age and weight of the animal and must be displayed with such animal when outside its stall or pen.
- 5. An exhibitor may for satisfactory reasons substitute and show an animal, otherwise qualified, in lieu of the one previously entered, in any of the Sections for Herds, Breeding Sections, Get, or Produce, due notice having been given to the Chief of the Department prior to the date of going to press of the official catalogue.
- 6. The owner of the dam at the time of service will be considered the breeder of the animal exhibited.
- 7. Ages of cattle, except as noted, and draft breeds of horses, also jack stock and mules, will be computed from birth to September 1, 1904.

The basing date for computing ages in Sections 4, 6, 10 and 12 of the classes for Short-horn, Hereford, Aberdeen-Angus, Galloway, Red Polled, Devon, Polled Durham and Brown Swiss cattle will be January 1.

Ages of horses other than of draft breeds will be computed by years, beginning

January 1 of the year in which born.

Ages of sheep and goats and swine will be computed from birth to September 1, 1904.

- 8. No castrated or barren animal of either sex will be eligible for competition or exhibition in any section with breeding animals.
- 9. Evidence satisfactory to the Chief of the Department must be submitted on the prescribed form:
- (A) That Stallions four years old or over have sired a foal within two years immediately preceding August 22, 1904; that Mares four years old or over have produced a live foal within two years immediately preceding August 22, 1904, Standard Trotters, Thoroughbreds and Saddle Horses excepted.
- (B) That Bulls three years old or over have sired a calf within two years immediately preceding September 12, 1904; that Cows four years old and under five have produced one calf, and that Cows five years old or over have produced at different periods preceding September 12, 1904, not less than two calves.
- (C) That Rams two years old or over have sired lambs within one year immediately preceding October 3, 1904; that Ewes three years old or over have produced a lamb within one year immediately preceding October 3, 1904.
- (D) That Boars two years old or over have sired a litter of pigs within one year immediately preceding October 3, 1904; that Sows two years old or over have farrowed within one year immediately preceding October 3, 1904.
- 10. Male animals shown in any breeding section must be entire, and no animal affected with any chronic disease, deformity, or serious imperfection shall be eligible for entry, exhibition or award.
- 11. In the sections for "get of one sire" or "produce of one dam," whether in the Divisions for horses and asses, cattle, sheep and goats, or swine, the presence of the sire or dam will not be required.
- 12. Should any exhibitor misrepresent or conceal any material fact or attempt to perpetrate a fraud upon any competitor or upon the Louisiana Purchase Exposition he will thereby forfeit all rights as an exhibitor, and the animal or animals entered by him will be promptly excluded from the grounds.
- 13. In addition to the exhibits provided for, the Chief of the Department of Live Stock is authorized to admit for exhibition, but not for competition or award, animals which in his opinion possess sufficient merit, interest or utility to entitle them to recognition and admission to a universal exposition.

- 14. The Chief of the Department is authorized to provide classes in addition to those enumerated in the Prize-List when in his judgment the interests of the Exposition and the Live Stock industry will be advanced thereby. Animals entered in such additional classes will have the right to compete for such prizes as the Chief of the Department may designate at the time the classes are formed.
- 15. In case exhibits of any breed of Live Stock creditable in extent and quality to a universal exposition are not assured on or before the date of closing entries therefor, the Chief of the Department may withdraw the prizes offered therefor, or otherwise apportion them.
- 16. The Louisiana Purchase Exposition invites competition and visitors from all nations, and urges the importance of having the Live Stock assembled consist of only the best representatives of the respective breeds. For this reason the Chief of the Department is directed, if any animal offered for exhibition is not worthy, or a creditable representative of a recognized valuable breed, to promptly remove the same from the Exposition grounds.
- 17. The Chief will order the removal of vicious, fractious or diseased animals from the grounds, and the right is reserved to the Chief to order at his discretion the peremptory removal from the grounds of any animal.
- 18. Cattle, horses, ponies, jacks, jennets, mules, and so far as is practicable, swine and sheep will be exhibited for awards and display in the Live Stock Arena, subject to such regulations as may be promulgated.
- 19. No animal shall be decorated with any unnecessary trappings during its examination by the Judge.
- 20. In the event of the death of any animal duly entered for competition, or such disability as in the opinion of the Chief of the Department disqualifies such animal for exhibition, the Chief may authorize the substitution of another animal eligible to entry at date of filing the original application.
- 21. The Louisiana Purchase Exposition Company, its agents or employes, are not in any instance to be held responsible for any injury to, exposure of, or for the death of any animal or exhibit while on the Exposition's premises or otherwise; nor for any feed, freight or other bills or charges connected with exhibits of any character in the Department of Live Stock.

#### STALLS AND PENS.

- 1. The Louisiana Purchase Exposition will provide stabling accommodations for such exhibits of Live Stock as may be accepted by the Chief of the Department of Live Stock.
- 2. All stalls and pens will be numbered with reference to the Exposition catalogue. Numbers on cards corresponding with the Official Catalogue will be furnished exhibitors for each entry and no animal will be allowed to pass from its stall or pen without having the proper number displayed conspicuously on the person of the attendant.
- 3. Exhibitors will be required to keep their stalls or pens and the floor adjacent thoroughly clean and wholesome, and have their exhibits and quarters ready for inspection by visitors from nine o'clock A. M. to sunset. They will be given permission to decorate their stalls and pens on approved plans, and to attractively display prize ribbons, badges, medals and certificates of award in the quarters occupied by their exhibits.

- 4. Failure to fully comply with the regulations, or the orders of the Chief, as to cleanliness and order will subject the exhibit concerned to immediate removal from the Exposition grounds.
- 5. Applications for stalls and pens should be filed at the time of making entries and specify the number of box or open stalls needed.

#### FORAGE AND FEED.

- 1. Ample facilities will be provided for the distribution of feed and water throughout the grounds.
- 2. Forage, grain and bedding of good quality will be available to exhibitors at reasonable prices at warehouses conveniently located within the grounds.
- 3. Exhibitors if they desire may bring to the Exposition with their stock a supply of forage and grain.

#### EXHIBITORS.

- 1. In addition to the general rules, exhibitors in each Division will be subject to special rules and regulations governing the respective Divisions, herein or hereinafter promulgated.
- 2. An exhibitor will not be allowed in the Arena while a Judge is on duty, except as an attendant and in uniform.
- 3. Exhibitors will at all times give the necessary personal attention to the animals they may have on exhibition and immediately on the close of the period assigned for the exhibition of a given Division remove the animals belonging to such Division from the Exposition Grounds.
- 4. Any exhibitor or attendant who refuses to accept or who tears off a prize badge or authorizes another person to do so in the Arena or in presence of the Judge, or shall otherwise insult the awarding Judge or the Superintendent shall forfeit the prize awarded and be excluded from further competition.
- 5. Exhibitors are expected to recognize the right of visitors to inspect animals in their stalls and pens so far as is practicable, and to courteously afford all reasonable opportunity for such inspection and for the acquiring of instructive information.
- 6. Exhibitors, their employes and the representatives of the Exposition only will be allowed in the barns and buildings after the hour for closing each evening.

#### ATTENDANTS.

1. Every animal appearing in the Arena must be in charge of a competent and neat-appearing attendant, dressed in a clean, new suit consisting of a blue denim blouse and trousers and a white duck cap. Attendants without the prescribed uniform will not be admitted.

- 2. Exhibitors will be required to furnish for their animals all necessary attendants, who will be subject to the rules and regulations governing employes of the Department of Live Stock and of the Exposition.
- In case of failure on the part of any attendant or employe to obey the rules and regulations the exhibitor shall promptly remove him from the Exposition grounds upon the request of the Chief of the Department of Live Stock.
- 4. Attendants upon stock while in the Arena are forbidden to converse with a Judge while he is engaged in the performance of his duties, except to answer inquiries, and they must promptly and in good faith comply with any directions given them by the Superintendent pertaining to their stock or their own personal conduct.

#### PROGRAM OF EXHIBITION.

1. The dates for exhibition of Live Stock in the several Divisions will be as follows:

Division A-Horses, Asses and Mules, Monday, August 22, to Saturday, September 3, 1904, inclusive.

B-Cattle, Monday, September 12, to Saturday, September 24, 1904, inclusive.

C-Sheep, and D-Swine, Monday, October 3, to Saturday, October 15, 1904, inclusive.

E-Poultry, Pigeons and Pet Stock, Monday, October 24, to Saturday, November 5, 1904, inclusive.

F—Dogs and Cats, Tuesday, October 25, to Friday, October 28, 1904, inclusive.

G-Southern Breeding Cattle, Monday, November 7, to Saturday,

November 12, 1904, inclusive. H—Carload Lots of Cattle, Monday, November 7, to Saturday, November 12, 1904, inclusive.

- 2. Animals entered for competition must be ready to promptly enter the Arena at the hour when the section is advertised in the official program.
- 3. Superintendents shall exclude stock from competition in case of unnecessary or embarassing delay on the part of exhibitors in bringing animals into the Arena.
- 4. Any owner of an animal entered for competition who shall refuse, without reasons satisfactory to the Superintendent or Chief of the Department, to display, parade or exhibit when called upon by the Superintendent or Chief shall thereby forfeit his rights and prizes as an exhibitor.
- 5. Awarding of prizes will begin in the Arena promptly at the hour announced on the official Bulletin Board in the Live Stock Arena, on the dates named above, continuing from day to day as directed by the Superintendent in charge, and exhibitors will govern themselves accordingly without further notice of the time of exhibition.
- 6. Animals must be shown in such manner as the Judge may prescribe and any exhibitor who refuses to comply with the proper requirements of the Judge will thereby forfeit his rights in the competition.

#### JUDGES.

- 1. All prizes in the Department of Live Stock of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition will be awarded by individual Judges or the "one-judge system", and by comparison. These Judges will be chosen for their especial qualifications and their intimate knowledge of the characteristics and qualities that make valuable the breeds upon which they will give judgment, and their awards will be final.
- 2. Judges will report to the Superintendents in the Arena at nlne o'clock A. M. on the day fixed for awarding prizes in the sections which they are respectively to judge.
- 3. Only such animals as have been awarded First-Prizes in their respective Classes at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition will be eligible to Championship Awards, and the Championships will in each instance be awarded by the Judge who awarded the breed's Class prizes.
- 4. In case of doubt on the part of a Judge as to any material fact in connection with the entry of an animal in competition, satisfactory proof in writing must be promptly furnished by the exhibitor to the Superintendent for the use of the Judge within a time specified by such Judge. Should any doubt arise as to the regularity of any important matter which the Judge declines to decide he shall at once report the same in writing to the Chief of the Department of Live Stock for decision, which will be final.
- 5. Upon the completion of the examination of each breed its Judge will compare the award-cards with the record of prizes entered in the prize-record book, and if found correct sign the record in the proper place and later file a detailed report giving a general description of the entire Class, to be followed by his reasons for the awards as placed, with any other information relating to said exhibits desirable to publish in the final report of the Exposition.
- 6. In awarding prizes in Divisions A, B and C the Judges will examine all animals exhibited in each Section placing them in the order of merit from right to left beginning on the right with the best, and rank consecutively to the left all the other animals in the respective sections. In Divisions D, E and F exhibits will likewise be ranked in the order of their merit. The Judges will indicate by numerals on the award-cards containing the entries in each ring the rank given the competing exhibits, and after signing these cards file them with the Superintendent of the Class, to be posted in the official book of entry and award.
- 7. No person shall act as Judge in any Class in which he may be interested as exhibitor, agent, employe of an exhibitor, or otherwise, and the Chief of the Department of Live Stock will immediately remove any such interested Judge on presentation of satisfactory evidence of such interest.
- 8. JUDGES ARE INSTRUCTED TO AWARD IN EACH INSTANCE ONLY PRIZES OF SUCH GRADE AS THE MERITS OF THE INDIVIDUAL ANIMALS FULLY JUSTIFY. ABSENCE OF COMPETITION WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AS JUSTIFICATION FOR AWARDING A HIGH-CLASS PRIZE TO AN ANIMAL OF MEDIUM OR INFERIOR QUALITY.
- 9. Having reason to believe that an exhibitor, by false entry or otherwise, attempts to deceive the Judge, the Exposition or the public and obtain a prize by misrepresentation or fraud the Judge shall report the facts at once in writing to the Chief of the Department for his decision, which will be final.
- 10. Objections to a person serving as a Judge must be submitted to the Chief of the Department in writing prior to his making any award, with good and sufficient reasons therefor, upon which the Chief shall have full power to act.

#### AWARDS.

- 1. Except where otherwise indicated in the Classification and Prize-List First-, Second-, Third-, Fourth-, and Fifth-, cash Prizes are offered in Divisions A, B, C, D and G.
- 2. Certificates of award will be given by the Chief of the Department of Live Stock to the prize-winning exhibitors following the close of the Live Stock Show stating the amounts due each for the prizes specified. Certificates of High Commendation and of Commendation will be issued for the two animals given first and second place next respectively in order of merit to those to which cash prizes are awarded.
- 3. In event of the expulsion or disqualification of an animal after an award thereto its rating will be cancelled from the record and the animals with the next lower ratings in the Section will be correspondingly advanced.
- 4. Awards to breeders will follow those in the regular Classes to owners and consist of badges and certificates. The badges and certificates will be provided for the purpose of thereby giving due prominence to the breeder's skill, which makes possible the exhibition of animals worthy of a prize at the Universal Exposition of 1904.
- 5. The prizes awarded in the Arena will be indicated by colored badges as follows: A blue badge will indicate a First-Prize; a red, a Second; a white, a Third; a pink, a Fourth; a yellow, a Fifth; a green, a Sixth; a brown, a Seventh. A Championship Award will be designated by a royal purple badge, and a Grand Championship Award by a red, white and blue badge.
- 6. The Premier Championship prizes will be awarded to the exhibitors and the breeders making the best showing in the respective Classes in the several Sections where the animals are shown by ages, as determined by the largest aggregate amount awarded to animals owned respectively by the breeders or exhibitors represented.
- 7. No animal deemed unworthy shall be awarded a prize, nor shall a prize be withheld merely because of lack of competition; but where there are fewer entries in a Section than prizes offered the Judge shall in his discretion award a prize or prizes of such grade as the merit of the animals may warrant.
- 8. Any exhibitor who as a result of misrepresentation or fraud may be awarded a prize in violation of the spirit or letter of the rules governing the Department of Live Stock will upon conviction forfeit the prize to the Exposition.

#### PROTESTS.

- 1. The right of protest is guaranteed to interested parties, who will be required as an evidence of good faith to deposit with the protest \$25, which amount will be forfeited to the Louisiana Purchase Exposition Company in case the protest is declared not sustained; otherwise the \$25 will be returned to the party making the protest.
- 2. Protests must be in writing, verified by affidavit, and filed with the Chief of the Department of Live Stock not later than twenty-four hours after the award to the section in which the protested animal is entered.
- 3. Protests against the eligibility of an animal for exhibition must be filed with the Chief of the Department before the hour of exhibiting if the error or fraud specified in the protest is known.

4. The Chief of the Department, in the absence of protest, reserves the right to take cognizance of fraud, which may have been consummated or attempted, and to deal with the person or persons implicated in such manner as may from the evidence be deemed just and proper.

#### SUPERINTENDENTS.

- 1. Superintendents in the Department of Live Stock will receive their instructions from and be subject to the orders of the Chief of the Department and make at the close of each day's duty a written report of the services rendered during the day, including therein such recommendations as are likely to require the attention of the Chief.
- 2. Superintendents will exercise great care in preserving and returning entry or other books used in the discharge of their respective duties. They will give a receipt for each entry or other record book of the Exposition at the time of receiving the same, and will be held responsible for its return.

#### OFFICIAL CATALOGUE.

- 1. The official Catalogue of the Live Stock Show of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition will contain the official number, name and Herd Registry Number of each animal exhibited in Divisions A, B, C and D, with the name and address of the breeder and exhibitor, also the Registry name and number of the sire and dam.
- 2. The animals will be assembled in the Catalogue under the Class and Section in which they will be respectively exhibited.
- 3. Each exhibitor on his arrival at the Exposition will upon application to the Chief of the Department receive duplicate entry cards with numbers to correspond with the official Catalogue, one of which cards shall be attached to the most conspicuous part of the stall, pen, or place where the exhibit is quartered and the other card will be displayed with the animal when on exhibition in the Arena.

#### SHOW ARENA.

1. Aside from the Judge and one attendant upon each animal, no one but the Chief, his representative, the Marshal and the Superintendent will be permitted in the Arena while a section is being judged, except that in Division A (Horses, Asses and Mules) one additional attendant will be permitted each exhibitor.

[As the time of making awards in any given section at an Exposition of the character of this one is the crucial and culminating hour in the history of an exhibit, and possibly of the exhibitor, there and then at the bar of the highest tribunal for the trial of such cases, every safeguard against interference with, or hindrance or distraction of the Judge in his examinations, deliberations and conclusions, is the due of all. It is expected to afford the press and public the fullest opportunities for securing information of exhibits and awards as soon as awards are made, but while doing their work the Judges must be unhindered by the presence of persons not immediately in charge of animals under examination.]

- 2. The Marshall will assemble the exhibits in the Arena and announce the awards.
- 3. The time for the various exhibits and displays of Live Stock in the Arena will be posted on the official bulletin board and exhibitors will be required without further notice to promptly comply with the orders so announced.
- 4. Only the classes of Stock officially announced for exhibition will be admitted to the Arena between the hours of nine o'clock A. M. and the completion of judging for that day.
- 5. The Arena may be used for exercising Live Stock and private exhibitions prior to nine o'clock A. M. and after the close of the awards in the afternoon, unless otherwise ordered by the Chief of the Department.
- 6. No charge will be made for admission to the Forum while the Live Stock is on exhibition.

#### PARADES OF HORSES AND CATTLE.

1. There will be parades of horses and cattle on the Exposition grounds as follows:

Horses, Asses and Mules, Tuesday, August 23, and Friday, September 2.

Cattle, Tuesday, September 13, and Friday, September 23.

- 2. On the day following the close of the awards to each breed or class of horses and cattle all the prize-winners in the respective classes will be paraded together in the Arena and through the streets of the quarters occupied by the Department of Live Stock.
- 3. Exhibitors of horses and cattle will be required when directed by the Chief of the Department to make such other displays in the Arena from time to time as will enable visitors to examine the assembled stock to advantage and assist in maintaining such a lively interest in the Live Stock Show as will be of benefit to the owners and to the Exposition.
- 4. A refusal or failure to thus parade stock will forfeit to the Exposition all prizes won, unless an excuse in writing is furnished that is satisfactory to the Chief.

#### AUCTION SALE OF LIVE STOCK.

- 1. Provision will be made for the accommodation of the various National Live Stock Breeders' Associations desiring to sell at auction animals of the breed the respective Associations represent, no sale to exceed in number one hundred animals of any one breed, such animals to be selected by their breed Associations from those entered and actually competing for prizes.
- 2. The auction sales of animals of any given breed will be made within the period in which such breed is on exhibition, in a suitable building convenient to the Live Stock Forum, conveniently arranged for the purpose, and be under the auspices of the Breed Associations, who will alone be responsible for all matters in connection therewith.
- 3. All requests for catalogues and information concerning these auction sales should be addressed to the managers of the sales, or the Secretaries of the respective Breed Associations.

## DIVISION A.-HORSES, ASSES AND MULES

Entries in this Division on the prescribed form must be filed with the Chief of the Department of Live Stock on or before July 16, 1904.

The Exposition grounds will be open for the reception of horses, asses and mules on Thursday, August 18, and their exhibition will begin Monday, August 22, and close Saturday, September 3.

Exhibitors will at all times give the necessary personal attention to the feed and care of the animals they have on exhibition, and on the close of awards in that Division promptly remove such animals from the Exposition grounds.

Ages of horses other than draft breeds will be computed by years beginning January 1, of the year in which born.

### Class XXIII .- BUSINESS HORSES.

(Trade and Delivery Horses and Vehicles.)

Prizes will be awarded on the points named below, due consideration being given to the superior adaptability of the horses, wagons, harness and general equipment, to the work for which such teams are used, the management of the team by the driver, as well as the proportion and weight of the wheel, swing or center, and lead horses composing four and six horse teams—the taste and judgment in mating the teams. Vehicle, horses, harness and livery should harmonize. Judges in awarding the prizes will critically examine and duly consider the

Judges in awarding the prizes will critically examine and duly consider the quality, style, action, soundness and serviceability of the horses, the wagons, harness, grooming and condition, and the complete outfit in general, viz:

SOUNDNESS.—Soundness to be decided on the basis of serviceable soundness as determined by veterinary inspection of the Chief Veterinarian of the Exposition.

SERVICEABILITY.—Serviceability, as indicated by long and continued service rendered on the streets, and conformation, condition of feet, legs, etc., for extended future usefulness.

WAGONS.—The construction, style, material and adaptability of the wagon, truck or van for the use of the exhibitor, as well as the condition of the vehicle—time in service to be considered.

HARNESS.—The construction, material, style and adaptability of the harness for the use of the exhibitor and the condition of same—time in service to be considered.

GROOMING, CONDITION, ETC.—The condition of the horses, harness, vehicle, shoeing and appearances, indicating kind, careful and intelligent attention to the feeding, grooming and shoeing, cleaning and oiling harness, care of wagon, and general stable management.

## Class XXIV .- HORSES OF COMMERCE.

This class is provided for an exhibit of horses of the various types in demand for commercial and military purposes, and may be designated as the "Market Class".

This class provides for an exhibit of horses of the leading types that find ready sale at trade centers and that are especially deserving of the attention of breeders who appreciate the advantages of a profitable home and foreign market assured for all worthy specimens.

The exhibit of horses in the market class is confined to geldings four years old or over, bred and adapted for the specific purposes named and shown in harness or under saddle. Mares will be eligible in the section for Saddle Horses.

The requirements for the various types to be exhibited in this class are given for the information of exhibitors and the guidance of the Judges, who will be experienced buyers on the market, or officers of the United States Army, when horses for military purposes are considered.

#### ARTILLERY HORSE.

The United States Army regulations contain the following requirements for horses selected for artillery service:

"The artillery horse is required for quick draft purposes, and should move the carriage ordinarily by weight thrown into the collar rather than by muscular exertion.

"The animal must be sound, without blemish or defect, well bred, of a superior class, of a kind disposition, and free from vicious habits, a square trotter; well broken to harness and gentle under the saddle, with easy mouth and gait, and with free, prompt action at the walk, trot and gallop; and otherwise conform to the following description:

"A gelding of uniform and hardy color, in good condition, from 15:1 to 16 hands high; weight of the lead horse not less than 1050 pounds and that of the wheel horse not more than 1200 pounds; from 5 to 8 years old, head and ears small, forehead broad, eyes large and prominent, vision perfect in every respect; chest full, broad and deep; forelegs straight and standing well under; shoulders sufficiently broad to support the collar, but not too heavy; barrel large and increasing from girth toward flank; withers elevated; back short and straight, with broad, deep loins, short coupled with solid hind quarters; hocks well bent and under the horse; pasterns slanting and feet sound and in good order. Long-legged, loose-jointed, long-bodied and narrow-chested horses, as well as those which are restive, vicious or too free in harness, or which do not, upon rigid inspection, meet the above requirements in every respect will be rejected."

## CAVALRY HORSE.

The United States Army regulations contain the following requirements for horses for cavalry service:

"The cavalry horse must be sound and well bred; of a superior class, gentle under the saddle; free from vicious habits; with free and prompt action at the walk, trot and gallop; without blemish or defect; of a kind disposition; with easy mouth and gait; and otherwise conform to the following description;

"A gelding of uniform and hardy color; in good condition; from 15:1 to 16 hands high; weight not less than 950 or more than 1150 pounds; from four to eight years old; head and ears small; forehead broad; eyes large and prominent; vision perfect in every respect; shoulders long and sloping well back; chest full, broad and deep; forelegs straight and standing well under; barrel large and

increasing from girth toward flank; withers elevated; back short and straight; loins and haunches broad and muscular; hocks well bent and under the horse; pasterns slanting and feet small and sound."

#### COACH HORSE.

The typical coach horse stands 15:2 to 16 hands high, weighs from 1100 to 1350 pounds, and is heavier, smoother and more compact than the average good roadster.

His work requires soundness, with clean-cut and well muscled legs, sloping pasterns and shoulders; short back closely coupled to smooth hind quarters, well packed with muscle. The hind quarters rounded, and not straight and angular. Tail well set and carried high; withers high and thin; the neck smoothly joined to long, clean shoulders, with full crest; head fine and of medium size, with fine ears, a full, clear eye, and large open nostrils. Good conformation and spirited action are necessary to give the requisite form and style, and breeding that insures high knee action as well as sharp hock action so essential to a fine actor.

#### DRAFTER.

This class includes the horse used for drawing large loads at the walk, weigh-

ing not less than 1600 pounds in fair flesh.

He has a strong neck and well set shoulder to take the collar well. Back short, well muscled, strongly and closely coupled to hind quarters, which should be rounded, smooth and plentifully supplied with muscle. The hock should be well set, neither crooked or straight. Legs moderately short, with broad, flat bone. In brief, the draft horse should have a stout, compact body on short, strong legs, with a head and neck in proportion to size of the horse. The general appearance should be massive and give evidence of spirit without nervousness.

### EXPRESSER.

This class includes the best finished of the lighter draft horses, that have the spirit and action to move a moderate load at the trot.

The expresser should be not less than 15:3 hands or over 16:3, and weigh not less than 1100 or over 1475, according to size of wagon to be drawn. In color, he should be bay, black, gray (not white), or roan.

This type is of upstanding appearance with strong, closely coupled body, good width of chest and hips, and sound, clean limbs with the best of feet.

The desired finish with needed weight gives the expresser the outline of a medium draft horse with fine coach appearance. The quick movement required of the expresser makes desirable a straight, frictionless gait, as smooth as possible, nimble and regular, with good knee action, and that he travel wide behind.

The business expected of an expresser requires a high order of intelligence,

kindly disposition, neither "hot-headed" nor lazy, and that he be thoroughly broken to either single or double harness. The horse for this service should have an attractive and well-shaped head with full eyes wide apart and disposed to carry his head up without check. He should be a good walker.

The arduous work and attractive conformation required make it essential that the expresser be of the blocky type, have a short neck well set on shoulders with short back, moderately short legs, good feet and limbs. The bones of the legs should be flat and clean, and feet round and high with healthy frogs.

#### FIRE DEPARTMENT HORSE.

The work required of a horse best suited to fire department service necessitates almost human intelligence. Such a horse must be well-bred, sound in every particular, quick to observe, prompt and willing to respond to every call, and as well ambitious to discharge his numerous and unusual duties under constantly differing surroundings. In selection the first requisites are evidence of tractability, good feet and legs with bone and hoofs of the best texture; a short, strong back, and well proportioned fore and hind quarters well covered with firm, elastic muscle. The hose carriage horse should weigh 1450 to 1500 pounds, and the engine and truck horses up to 1650 pounds.

The typical fire department horse should possess not only intelligence, strength, activity, speed, endurance, style and finish, but have feet, pasterns, legs and muscular development that equip him for the most arduous service on hard and

uneven pavements, or streets deep with mud.

## OMNIBUS HORSE.

The "busser" should be from 16 to 16:1 hands high and weigh from 1200 to 1300 pounds. He should have some style and carry a fairly high head. In conformation, a compact, rugged horse approaching the draft type, standing well up, on short, strong, broad, flat legs and sound feet. He should have a short back and be strongly coupled, with the muscular development needed for drawing heavy loads at a moderate pace over paved or other streets.

His work is generally done at a trot, which requires plenty of action, and the

movement should be quick, straight, elastic and smooth, without friction.

The "busser" should be a good feeder, of even temper; intelligently respond to every call to pull or back, and have the enduring qualities for long-continued night-and-day service.

### ROADSTER.

The typical roadster stands from 15 to 15:3 hands high and weighs 900 to 1150 pounds. He is deep of chest and middle, and when in racing condition shows considerable angularity. It is highly essential that feet and legs be sound and of correct conformation. Pasterns should be sloping and strong, and the shoulders deep and sloping, extending well into the back. Withers high and sharp; the back strongly muscled, short and closely coupled, and the hind-quarters long and heavily muscled. The bones from elbow point to knee and from stifle to hock should be nearly twice as long as the cannon bones in their respective limbs, thus giving long leverage, and muscles that are long and therefore quick to respond, and placing the fulcrums of these levers close to the ground, giving strength, steadiness and poise.

The neck should be long, smoothly joined to the shoulder and clearly defined, with a clean-cut throatlatch. Head fine and clean-cut, with an erect, neat, medium-

sized ear, a full, clear eye, and open, good-sized nostrils.

Stamina is a prime requisite and generally accompanies a high degree of quality. The conformation and action in a roadster that enable him with ease to

draw a light vehicle on the road at a fairly high rate of speed, for a considerable distance, are desired. Prompt, straight and frictionless action in the roadster is required.

#### SADDLE HORSE.

The size and weight of the Saddle Horse vary with the weight and character of the work expected. The range in height and weight is 15:1 to 16:2 hands high

and from 1000 to 1250 pounds.

The conformation of an easy riding horse requires sloping pasterns and shoulders. The extension of the shoulders into the back and the shortness and strength of coupling are extremely important. The saddle-bred Saddle Horse shows more style and quality than any other type of horse and is not surpassed in beauty of form. The Saddle Horse should have a spirited, stylish appearance, with high carried head and smartly set tail. The ideal Saddle Horse is noted for great intelligence and his harmony of purpose with that of the rider.

# COW DEMONSTRATION.

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE DEMONSTRATION OF THE QUALITIES AND PRODUCTS OF THE VARIOUS BREEDS OF COWS.

It is proposed by the Louisiana Purchase Exposition to conduct on the grounds of the World's Fair at St. Louis, beginning Monday, May 16, 1904, a Demonstration illustrating in a practical way the adaptability of the various breeds of purebred cows (including the dual-purpose breeds) for dairying and beef-production, and how economically their products can be obtained under given conditions.

The Demonstration for the production of butter will be continued for one hundred and twenty days from and including May 16, 1904, and the cheese and other tests for such periods as may hereafter be determined by the Chief of the

Department of Agriculture.

The cows participating are to be delivered at the Exposition grounds before May 1, 1904, at the expense of the Associations or individuals furnishing the same. The Exposition Company will not be responsible for injury to or the health of any cow competing in this Demonstration.

BARNS.—The Exposition Company will provide barns constructed for the special use of the cows entered, equipped with conveniences for their care, health and management.

MANAGEMENT.—The cows will be under the general supervision and direction of a Superintendent appointed by the Chief of the Department of Live Stock of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition, who will have the general oversight of their

feeding, care, milking and management.

Each Association or individual having cows in the Demonstration shall recommend to the Chief of the Department of Live Stock the name of a suitable person to serve as the Association's or individual's representative in the feeding, care and milking of the cows furnished by the Association or individual, and such person shall be recognized by said Chief for the supervision of the work during his pleasure.

ENTRIES.—Each Association intending to furnish cows for the Demonstration must notify the Chief of the Department of Live Stock of such intention on or before October 1, 1903, and individuals on or before December 1, 1903. A statement giving the names and pedigrees of all such cows must be furnished not later than May 1, 1904; also the number of calves each cow has produced, the date of birth of her last calf, and the date of the last service of bull since her last calf was dropped.

A statement must be submitted giving approximately the method and character of feeding that has been followed with each cow for one year previous to the

commencement of the Demonstration.

CLASSES.—The Demonstration will embrace four classes, designated as Test "A", Test "A", Test "C" and Test "D".

Test "A"—Herds and individual cows entered for demonstrating the economic

production of butterfat and butter.

Test "B"-Herds and individual cows entered for demonstrating the economic

production of milk for all purposes related to dairying.

Test "C"-Herds and individual cows entered for demonstrating all the products of the cow, viz: beef and milk, with their calves judged for their beef merits.

Test "D"—Herds and individual cows entered for demonstrating the greatest net profit in the production of market milk on the basis of quantity and quality of milk of a given standard.

Cows of any pure breed may be entered by the Association representing the same, or by any individual, in one or more of the demonstrations, provided there be not less than five nor more than twenty-five cows of any one breed entered. but no entries of less than ten cows shall be made except of the following breeds: Brown Swiss, Devon, Dutch Belted, Polled Durham and Red Polled.

Applications must be filed on or before May 1, 1904, with the Chief of the Department of Live Stock for the entry of each cow and be accompanied with the official certificate of registry signed by the Secretary of the Association pub-

lishing the Herd Register therefor.

WEIGHT OF COWS.—Each cow will be weighed on each of the first five consecutive days and the last five days of the Demonstration, and the averages of the first five and the second five weighings be recorded as the weights of the cow respectively at the beginning and close of the Demonstration. Such weights and other data as may be required by the Chief of the Department of Live Stock will be kept of record by the Superintendent.

FEED .- All foods will be supplied and fed entirely at the expense of the Associations or individuals having cows in the Demonstration, who shall designate the character, kind and quantity of food to be used and direct the care, feeding

and immediate management of their cows.

The commercial valuations of all foods used will be fixed by the Chief of the Department of Live Stock upon bases recommended by the United States Department of Agriculture, and the values thus fixed will be made known on April 15, 1904, to each Association or individual furnishing cows.

The weight of water consumed by each cow on each of the first five consecutive days and the last five days of the Demonstration shall be recorded.

MILK AND BUTTER.—The milk from each cow will be weighed immediately after milking and correct samples taken under the supervision of the Chief of the Department of Agriculture of the Exposition for such approved test as may be necessary to determine the total solids, fat, and solids not fat contained in the milk, and from the computations made from such tests the values will be deter-

mined for crediting each individual cow and herd as specified hereafter.

From the aforementioned and any other essential tests the various products and their values will be determined for each individual cow and herd.

Once each week the composition of the butter made will be determined by chemical analysis calculated on the basis of 85.7 per cent fat. Sample prints of such butter, free from artificial coloring matter and broken to show grain, together with samples of whole milk, will be on exhibition in the Dairy Section of the Department of Agriculture of the Exposition.

Such of the milk and the products therefrom, as may not be required by him for tests and experimentation, will without unnecessary delay be placed by the Chief of the Department of Agriculture at the disposal of the respective Superintendents having charge of the cows, who will promptly remove the same for such

disposition as the Association or individual interested may direct.

WITHDRAWAL OF ANIMALS.—No cow shall be withdrawn except upon the presentation of a certificate of her illness signed by the Veterinarian of the Department of Live Stock, and said certificate must be promptly filed with the Superintendent of the Demonstration and approved by the Chief, and no such cow shall be replaced by another. If, however, a cow so withdrawn is certified by the Veterinarian as able within seven days from the date of such withdrawal to resume her place in the Demonstration, she will be credited for such withdrawal period with a daily amount equal to her daily average product for the five days preceding such withdrawal and the first five days following her return.

VALUES.—The values of milk products, other than beef, will be on such bases as the Chief of the Department of Agriculture of the Exposition may determine and announce on or before April 1, 1904.

RECORDS.—The Superintendent of the cows will keep a careful record, covering the amount, kind and cost of feed consumed daily, and also of the weight of milk produced by each cow daily, and such other data as may be called for by the Chief of the Department of Live Stock.

The Chief of the Department of Agriculture will keep a careful record of the otal solids, and solids not fat, found in the milk, and other desirable information obtainable from the Demonstration.

A bulletin board will be placed near each cow, upon which shall be the name of the cow, her pedigree and previous weekly record, including cost of feed and amount and quality of milk and butter, etc., produced. The record of each cow will be renewed and posted each week. The weekly record of the respective herds will be posted on the bulletin boards in the several barns.

The record books will be open to public inspection when not in use in the office of the Superintendent, and at the close of the Exposition all records will be compiled and published or disposed of as the Exposition Company shall direct.

AWARDS.—In Class "A" prizes will be awarded to cows and herds making the

best showing in the economic production of butterfat and butter.

In Class "B" prizes will be awarded to cows and herds showing the greatest net profit in the economic production of milk for all purposes related to dairying.

In Class "C" prizes will be awarded to cows and herds making the best showing for all the products of the cow, viz: beef and milk, with the calves judged for their beef merits.

In Class "D" prizes will be awarded to cows and herds showing the greatest net profit in the production of market milk on the basis of quantity and quality of milk of a given standard.

AWARDS AND RECORDS.—The Chief of the Department of Agriculture will provide uniform packages for all butter produced by each breed, and the score on such butter shall be determined weekly by a Jury appointed by said Chief.

Each cow or herd will be credited with the value of the butterfat produced, at a rate per pound to be determined by the Chief of the Department of Agriculture.

Each cow or herd will be credited with the value of the solids not fat produced, at a rate to be determined by the Chief of the Department of Agriculture.

The butter will be judged upon the following scale of points:

In case the authorized representative of a breed competing protests against the result of any analysis, two other analyses will be made immediately. If the average result of such analyses is practically the same as the first, the first will be recorded as the final result; otherwise the average of the last two analyses will be accepted as final. All protests of this character must be made in writing and filed with the Chief of the Department of Agriculture during the day on which the analysis protested is made.

The bases for determining the competition in the Dual-Purpose Cow Demon-

stration will be as follows:

The dairy performance of the cow in the yield of dairy products as determined in the Dairy Demonstration of the Exposition.

Second. The beef conformation of the cow, and her gain in live weight

during the Demonstration.

The beef merit as shown in the quality and growth of the calf and Third. as a prospective profitable butcher's beast.

The points and their values considered by the Judges in making the award to be:

First. Dairy Performance of Cow	35 "	6.6

EXPENSES.—The Department of Live Stock of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition will not assume or pay any expenses connected with or arising from this Demonstration, nor compensate any person or committee connected therewith, except its Superintendent, it being understood that the Associations or individuals interested are to provide for all resulting expenditures of any nature, and receive and have the disposition of the products from their respective cows.

In case of any misunderstanding as to the intent, purpose or interpretation of the foregoing rules the matter in question shall be submitted in writing to the Chief of the Department having jurisdiction thereof, for adjudication, with the privilege of an appeal from the decision of that officer to the Director of Exhibits, whose action shall be final.

# THE DAIRY BARN RULES FOR COW DEMONSTRATION OF THE UNIVERSAL EXPOSITION ARE AS FOLLOWS:

BARNS.—The barns will be open to visitors from 9 o'clock A. M. to 6 o'clock P. M. The barns to be well cleaned each morning not later than 9 o'clock, and to be in readiness for morning inspection at 10:30 o'clock A. M. All manure must be promptly removed from the barns as voided between the hours of 9 o'clock A. M. and 6 o'clock P. M.

COWS.—The cows to be properly groomed not later than 10 o'clock A. M. and be kept scrupulously clean between the hours of 9 o'clock A. M. and 6 o'clock P. M. The cows are not to be disturbed for the inspection of visitors or otherwise at any time.

MILKING.—The three daily periods for commencing to milk are 4 o'clock A. M., 12 o'clock M., and 7 o'clock P. M.

The two daily periods for commencing to milk are 6 o'clock A. M. and 6 o'clock P. M. The milking will be done under the supervision of the representative of the Committee of the Agricultural Experiment Stations.

The milk to be weighed and sampled by the representative of the Committee of the Agricultural Experiment Stations and by him made a matter of record.

FEEDING.—The three daily periods for commencing to feed are 4 o'clock A. M., 12 o'clock M., and 7 o'clock P. M.

All feed to be weighed by the representative of the Committee of the Agricultural Experiment Stations and by him made a matter of record. Said representative will see that the feed weighed for each cow daily is fed to the respective animals as specified by the barn Superintendent.

ATTENDANTS.—Only the attendants are to be admitted within the railing enclosing the cows without passes.

The milkers to be neatly attired in clean white suits and the other attendants to have clean suits of blue denim; the white suits should be freshly ironed for the noon milking.

The milkers will care only for the cows placed in the especial charge of each by the barn Superintendent, to whom they will look for all orders.

VISITORS.—Visitors desiring information will make application to the barn Superintendents and not interfere by questions or otherwise with the attendants in the discharge of their duties.

All applications of visitors for admission within the railing enclosing the cows must be made to the respective barn Superintendents.

No loud talking or noise tending in the least to disturb the cows will be permitted.

# DIVISION C.-SHEEP AND GOATS.

Entries in this Division on the prescribed form must be filed with the Chief of the Department of Live Stock on or before August 15, 1904.

All sheep and goats must have been evenly, closely and properly shorn on or after the first day of April, 1904, and the date of the shearing must be certified on the application for entry. Sheep or goats unevenly or stubble shorn, or that have been clipped to conceal defects or to mislead will not be allowed to compete. The Judge shall disqualify for competition any sheep or goat deemed by him as having been improperly or stubble shorn, or with its fleece otherwise treated for purposes of fraud or deception.

The Exposition grounds will be open for the reception of sheep and goats on Thursday, September 29, and their exhibition will begin Monday, October 3, and close Saturday, October 15.

Exhibitors will at all times give the necessary personal attention to the feed and care of the animals they have on exhibition and on the close of awards in that Division promptly remove such animals from the Exposition grounds.

In the breeding classes for sheep and goats shown respectively in any of the sections in classes for Shropshire, Cotswold, Oxford, Southdown, Hampshire, Cheviot, Leicester, Merino A, Merino C, Rambouillet, Dorset and Lincoln sheep and Augora goats, the animals must have been born respectively as follows:

- 1— 6. Two years old or over, birth prior to September 1, 1902.
- 2-7. Eighteen and under 24 months, birth between September 1, 1902, and March 1, 1903.
- 3-8. Twelve and under 18 months, birth between March 1, 1903, and September 1, 1903.
- 4-9. Six and under twelve months, birth between September 1, 1903, and March 1, 1904.
- 5-10. Under six months, birth between March 1, 1904, and September 1, 1904.

The rules of the Department of Live Stock of the Exposition published in this Prize-List will, wherever applicable, govern in this Division.

A copy of the certificate showing registration in the respective flock books named below, signed by the Secretary of the Association publishing the same, must accompany each application for the entry of sheep and goats of the following named breeds, except as noted below, which certificate must be filed on the form prescribed by the Louisiana Purchase Exposition:

# DIVISION E.—POULTRY, PIGEONS AND PET STOCK.

T. E. ORR, Superintendent.

Entries of poultry, pigeons and pet stock must be filed with the Chief of the Department of Live Stock on the prescribed form on or before September 10, 1904. An exhibitor of poultry, pigeons or pet stock will be permitted to enter and present for award not to exceed four entries in any single competition.

The Exposition grounds will be open for the reception of poultry, pigeons and pet stock on Friday, October 21, 1904; the exhibition will begin Monday, October 24, and close Saturday, November 5, 1904.

A committee of the American Poultry Association has contracted with the Exposition to receive, coop, feed, water, exhibit and return in the best manner at the close of the exhibition all poultry, pigeons and pet stock exhibited at the World's Fair, at the very moderate expense to exhibitors of one dollar for each single fowl or specimen of pet stock, two dollars for each breeding pen, and fifty cents for each pigeon.

Poultry, pigeons and pet stock must be consigned in care of the committee of the American Poultry Association, World's Fair, St. Louis, Mo., U. S. A., who have given bond to guarantee all exhibits proper care, feed, supervision and exhibition, and the Exposition authorities are not to receive, feed, care for or assume any responsibility in connection therewith. No entry fees will be charged for exhibits.

Standard-size coops suitable for fowls, turkeys, geese, ducks, pigeons and pet stock respectively, will be provided by the committee of the American Poultry Association, on the Exposition grounds, in sufficient numbers to meet all requirements, and the rental therefor must accompany the entry application on the form prescribed by the Exposition. All poultry, pigeons and pet stock must be exhibited in these coops. (See announcement following, by committee of American Poultry Association.)

On the basis of the total number and the value to the industry the varieties of poultry, etc., except as noted, have been divided into three classes and prizes will be given thereon as follows:

Group "A", Cock, Hen, Cockerel and Pullet; To each, seven prizes, viz.: A first-prize of \$10; a second of \$6; a third of \$4; fourth, a certificate of High Commendation; fifth, Commendation; sixth, Second Commendation; and seventh, Third Commendation. Breeding Pen; To each, seven prizes, viz.: A first prize of \$10; a second of \$6; a third of \$4; fourth, a certificate of High Commendation; fifth, Commendation; sixth, Second Commendation; and seventh, Third Commendation.

Group "B", Cock, Hen, Cockerel and Pullet; To each, seven prizes, viz.: A first prize of \$7; a second of \$5; a third of \$3; fourth, a certificate of High Commendation; fifth, Commendation; sixth, Second Commendation; and seventh, Third Commendation. Breeding Pen; To each, seven prizes, viz.: A first prize of \$7; a second of \$5; a third of \$3; fourth, a certificate of High Commendation; fifth, Commendation; sixth, Second Commendation; and seventh, Third Commendation.

Group "C", Cock, Hen, Cockerel and Pullet; To each, seven prizes, viz.: A first-prize of \$6; a second of \$4; a third of \$2; fourth, a certificate of High Commendation; fifth, Commendation; sixth, Second Commendation; and seventh, Third Commendation. Breeding Pen; To each, seven prizes, viz.: A first prize

of \$6; a second of \$4; a third of \$2; fourth, a certificate of High Commendation; fifth, Commendation; sixth, Second Commendation, and seventh, Third Commendation.

For Caponized Fowls, Turkeys, Ducks and Geese; seven prizes will be given to each section, as follows: A first-prize of \$10; a second of \$6; a third of \$4; fourth, a certificate of High Commendation; fifth, Commendation; sixth, Second Commendation; and seventh, Third Commendation.

In Sections for Turkeys and Pea Fowls, Class "A" and "B" prizes will be given as noted for Cock and Hen, hatched prior to 1904, and Cock and Hen, hatched in 1904.

In section for Ducks, Class "A" and "B" prizes will be given as noted for Drake and Duck, hatched prior to 1904, and Drake and Duck, hatched in 1904.

For the Geese and Swans, Group "A", "B" and "C" prizes will be given as noted, for male and female hatched prior to 1904, and male and female hatched in 1904.

All entries are to be shown singly or in breeding pens. A breeding pen will consist of one male and four females. Birds entered in single classes cannot compete in the breeding pens.

Labels and leg bands will be sent on receipt of application for entry of poultry. The reverse of each label must show the senders name and address legibly written thereon, and the name of the Express Company for return delivery. Express charges must in all cases be prepaid. All exhibits of poultry must be banded. The intending exhibitor must put the Louisiana Purchase Exposition leg bands on his poultry before making shipment. These bands must be sealed by exhibitors who have sealers, or they will be sealed by the Committee immediately upon the arrival of the exhibits at the Exposition grounds. No charge will be made for leg bands and only bands for poultry furnished by the Louisiana Furchase Exposition will be recognized.

No names, marks or decorations will be allowed on the coops until after prizes have been awarded.

Unworthy or unhealthy specimens will be excluded from competition and from show.

At the close of the exhibition in Division E exhibits are to be promptly removed from the Exposition grounds.

All poultry, pigeons and pet stock will be judged and awards made by comparison.

The rules of the Department of Live Stock of the Exposition published in this Prize-List will, wherever applicable, govern in this Division.

#### TO EXHIBITORS OF POULTRY AT THE UNIVERSAL EXPOSITION OF 1904.

The undersigned Committee of the American Poultry Association has completed arrangements with the Universal Exposition of 1904 whereby this Committee is to receive, coop, feed, care for, exhibit and return to their respective owners upon the close of the Show, the poultry, pigeons and pet stock exhibited at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition, October 24, to November 5, 1904, inclusive.

The Committee has arranged for standard-size coops, of the proper size for turkeys, geese, ducks, poultry, pigeons and pet stock, and will provide at the Exposition grounds an ample supply to meet all requirements.

The Committee will provide feed and water for all the poultry, pigeons and pet stock on exhibition, their cleanliness, and the necessary utensils for the same, and furnish all necessary help for the proper feed, care and exhibition of the poultry, pigeons and pet stock and its shipment to and from the Exposition.

The Committee, for all the necessary accommodations other than the barns, including coops, furniture and all services in connection with the shipment, feed, care and exhibition of poultry, pigeons and pet stock specified above and such as are usually provided for such exhibition, agree to accept from exhibitors in full for first-class service and accommodations, one dollar for single exhibits, including pet stock, two dollars for breeding pen and fifty cents for each pigeon.

The Committee will assume all responsibility to and for exhibitors in connection with the exhibition of poultry, pigeons and pet stock at the World's Fair, but assumes no responsibility for the loss of exhibits in course of shipment or by disease, handling or accident while on exhibition.

In estimating the cost necessary for the receiving, cooping, feed, care, exhibition, return, and other expenses at the show this Committee have made a most careful estimate based upon the number of probable entries. While it is not thought the sum named will more than equal expenses, yet if any surplus should result the amount will be employed for additional testimonial prizes to be awarded to the exhibitors winning prizes at the show.

# DIVISION F.-DOGS.

As a Universal Exposition Kennel Show, owing to its international character, cannot be held by the Louisiana Purchase Exposition under the exclusive rules of any one national kennel club, it will therefore be conducted under the Exposition's own code of rules to provide for the due recognition of the registration and exhibition of Dogs with equal privileges from all countries, recorded in the home and foreign Kennel Stud Books approved by the respective governments represented in the show.

The Universal Exposition Kennel Show of 1904, to be held by the Louisiana Purchase Exposition at St. Louis, Mo., U. S. A., will be for the promotion of the special interests of the breeders of pure-bred dogs. The classification will include only established breeds of record and the competition be limited to the open class. No previous prize-winner properly entered will be debarred from competition.

Application for the entry of dogs of the recognized breeds of record owned in the United States must be accompanied by a certificate on the prescribed form of the Exposition, showing registration in the Stud Book of the American Kennel Club and otherwise conform to the rules governing entries.

Application for the entry of dogs of the recognized breeds of record not owned in the United States must be accompanied by a certificate on the prescribed form of the Exposition showing registration, signed by the Secretary of the Kennel Club or Association publishing the respective Stud Books, and such certificate must be attested by the Chairman of the National World's Fair Commission representing the country from which such dogs come to the Louisiana Purchase Exposition.

#### RULES.

The following rules will apply to the Universal Exposition Kennel Show:

Entries of Dogs must be filed with the Chief of the Department of Live Stock on the prescribed form on or before September 10, 1904. The Exposition grounds will be open for the reception of Dogs on Saturday, October 22, 1904. The exhibition will begin Tuesday, October 25, and close Friday, October 28, 1904.

An exhibitor of dogs will be permitted to enter and present for award not more than two competitions in each section or ring. Each dog or puppy can be entered only in its respective section or as one of the get of a sire or produce of dam in its breed class.

Every dog must be entered in the name af its bona-fide owner as the exhibitor, and the application for entry must be signed by the owner.

Address labels will be sent upon receipt of application for entry of dogs. The reverse of each label must show the sender's name and address legibly written or printed and the name of the express company for return delivery. Express charges on exhibits shipped to the World's Fair must in all cases be prepaid. Exhibitors before making shipment must attach to the collar of each dog a card of identification, giving the name of the animal, name of the owner, and the class and section in which entered for exhibition.

The word dog where used in these rules includes both sexes over twelve months of age, and the word puppy includes both sexes over six and under twelve months of age.

The owner of the dam at the time of service will be considered the breeder of the animal exhibited.

The age of a dog or puppy shall be reckoned from the date of birth to the tenth day of September, 1904.

Unworthy or unhealthy specimens will be excluded from competition and the show. The dogs on arrival at the Exposition and daily during the show will be inspected by the Veterinarian of the Department of Live Stock.

No names, marks, or decorations will be allowed on the cages until the prizes have been awarded.

All dogs will be judged and awards made by comparison.

Any dog winning champion honors in the Kennel Club or Association by which it is certified to the Exposition by reason of prizes received at the World's Fair of 1904 will, upon official certification to the Chief of the Department of Live Stock by the Kennel Club interested, be given the diploma of the Universal Exposition setting forth the World's Champion honors.

In order to furnish data for such further recognition in the way of champion honors as the various kennel clubs may hereafter decide to award to their respective patrons for prizes won at the Universal Exposition Kennel Show of 1904, all dogs exhibited in each section will be placed by the judge in the order of merit from right to left, beginning on the right with the best and rank consecutively to the left all other animals in the respective sections.

A committee on behalf of the American Dog Fanciers has contracted with the Exposition to receive, cage, feed, water, exhibit and return in the best manner at the close of the Exposition, dogs exhibited at the World's Fair at the very moderate expense to exhibitors of \$2.50 for each single specimen.

Dogs must be consigned prepaid in care of the committee on behalf of the American dog fanciers to the Louisiana Purchase Exposition grounds, St. Louis, Mo., U. S. A. The committee has given bond to guarantee all exhibits proper benching, eaging, care, feed, supervision and exhibition, and the Exposition authorities are not to receive, feed or care for the same.

No entry fee will be charged by the Exposition for competition.

Standard-size benches and cages will be provided by the committee representing the American dog fanciers on the Exposition grounds in sufficient numbers to meet all requirements and the rental therefor must accompany the entry application on the form prescribed by the Exposition. All dogs must be exhibited in these cages (see announcement following by the committee representing the American Dog Fanciers).

Insofar as is practicable the rules and customs governing all American Dog shows will be followed and enforced.

The rules for the Department of Live Stock of the Universal Exposition will wherever applicable govern in this Division.

#### TO EXHIBITORS OF DOGS AT THE UNIVERSAL EXPOSITION OF 1904.

The undersigned Committee on behalf of the American dog fanciers who contemplate making exhibits of Dogs at the Universal Exposition of 1904 have completed extremely satisfactory and advantageous arrangements with the Department of Live Stock of the World's Fair, whereby the Committee is to receive, cage, feed, care for, exhibit and return to their owners at the close of the Kennel Show the dogs exhibited at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition, October 25 to 28, 1904, inclusive.

The Committee has arranged for standard-size benching and cages for the dogs and will provide at the Exposition grounds an ample supply for all requirements. The Committee will also provide feed and water for all the dogs on exhibition and the necessary utensils for the same and furnish all needed attendants.

The Committee for all the necessary accommodations other than the buildings, including cages, furniture and all services in connection with the receipt, feed, care, exhibition and return of dogs, such as are usually provided for like exhibitions agree to accept from exhibitors in full for first-class service and attention two dollars and fifty cents for each dog or puppy exhibited.

The Committee will provide for the best sanitary arrangements, and the proper care and feed of the dogs during the show, which will be held under the immediate personal supervision of competent attendants of dogs and recognized authorities in such matters.

The Committee will use due diligence for the care and safety of all dogs exhibited. Watchmen will be kept on duty day and night; but it must be distinctly understood by all exhibitors that the management will not be responsible for loss or damage to any dog exhibited, whether the result of accident or other cause.

The Kennel Show of the Universal Exposition of 1904 has been planned on the most advanced and satisfactory lines for the promotion of the special interests of the breeders of pure-bred dogs and has received pledges of the cordial and hearty support of the Kennel Clubs of this and foreign countries.

The international character of the Universal Exposition Kennel Show and the necessity for the due recognition of the registration of dogs from all countries, recorded in the home and foreign Stud Books has made it necessary and desirable that the World's Fair Kennel Show be held under the Exposition's own code of rules, which meets all the requirements necessary to insure competent and just awards and the best care of exhibits and is fully approved by the Presidents of home and foreign Kennel Clubs.

It has been decided that inasmuch as the World's Fair Kennel Show is universal in character and is to be held under rules approved by the officers of the kennel clubs of this and foreign countries, we will favor the proposition that the wins at the Universal Exposition of 1904 shall be published in the home and foreign Kennel Club Stud Books.

In estimating the cost necessary for the benching, feeding, care and other expenses at the show, this Committee have made a most careful estimate based upon the number of probable entries as indicated in correspondence with dog owners conducted by the Exposition management and through other channels. While it is not thought the sum named will more than equal expenses, yet if any surplus should result this Committee will employ the same for additional testimonial prizes to be awarded to exhibitors winning prizes at the show.

## DIVISION F.-CATS.

As a Universal Exposition Cat Show, owing to its international character, cannot be held by the Louisiana Purchase Exposition under the exclusive rules of any national cat club, it will therefore be conducted under the Exposition's own code of rules, to provide for the due recognition of the registration and exhibition of cats, with equal privileges, recorded in the home or foreign Stud Books approved by the respective governments represented in the show.

The Universal Exposition Cat Show of 1904 to be held by the Louisiana Purchase Exposition at St. Louis, Mo., U. S. A., October 25, 26, 27 and 28, 1904, will be for the promotion of the special interests of the breeders of pure-bred cats, and the exhibit consist of such cats and kittens over three months of age as are usually shown in the open class. No previous prize-winner properly entered will be debarred from competition.

Application for the entry of cats of the recognized breeds of record owned in the United States must be accompanied by a certificate on the prescribed form of the Exposition, showing registration in the Stud Book of the American Cat Association, or the United States Register and Stud Book for Cats, and otherwise conform to the following rules governing entries:

Application for the entry of cats of the recognized breeds of record owned by non-residents must be accompanied by a certificate on the prescribed form of the Exposition showing registration, signed by the Secretary of the Cat Club or association publishing the respective Stud Books, and such certificate must be attested by the Chairman of the National World's Fair Commission representing the country from which such cats come to the Louisiana Purchase Exposition, provided such animals are sent by and exhibited under the auspices of the country from which they come. The following rules will apply to the Universal Exposition Cat Show.

Entries of cats and kittens must be filed with the Chief of the Department of Live Stock on the prescribed form on or before September 10, 1904. The Exposition grounds will be open for the reception of cats on Saturday October 22, 1904. The exhibition will begin Tuesday, October 25, and close Friday, October 28, 1904.

An exhibitor of cats will be permitted to enter and present for award not to exceed two entries in any single competition. Each cat or kitten can be entered in one class only.

Every cat must be entered in the name of its bona-fide owner as the exhibitor, and the application for entry must be signed by the owner.

Labels will be sent upon receipt of application for entry of cats. The reverse of each label must show the sender's name and address legibly written thereon and the name of the express company for return delivery. Express charges must in all cases be prepaid. Exhibitors before making shipment to the Exposition must attach to each cat a card of identification, giving the name of the animal and the class and section in which entered for exhibition.

The word cat where used in these rules includes both sexes over six months of age, and the word kitten includes both sexes under six months and over three months of age.

The owner of the dam at the time of service shall be considered the breeder of the animal exhibited.

The age of a cat or kitten shall be reckoned from the date of birth to the tenth day of September, 1904.

Unworthy or unhealthy specimens will be excluded from competition and the show.

No names, marks or decorations will be allowed on the cages until the prizes have been awarded.

All cats will be judged and awards made by comparison.

Prizes to the breeds named will be given cats and kittens, male and female, over six months, and three and under six months of age, as follows: A First-Prize of \$5; a Second of \$3; a Third of \$2; Fourth, a certificate of High Commendation; Fifth, Commendation; Sixth, Second Commendation, and Seventh, Third Commendation.

Any cat winning champion honors in the cat club or association by which it is certified to the Exposition by reason of prizes received at the World's Fair of 1904, will upon official certification to the Chief of the Department of Live Stock by the cat club interested be given the diploma of the Universal Exposition setting forth said World's champion honors.

The American Cat Association will give full recognition in its Stud Book to champion honors won by its patrons at the Universal Exposition of 1904. In order to furnish data for such further recognition in the way of champion honors as the various National Cat Clubs may hereafter decide to award to their respective patrons for prizes won at the Universal Exposition Cat Show of 1904, all cats exhibited in each section will be placed by the judge in the order of merit from right to left beginning on the right with the best and rank consecutively to the left all other animals in the respective sections.

A committee of the American Cat Association has contracted with the Exposition to receive, cage, feed, water, exhibit and return in the best manner at the close of the exhibition, cats exhibited at the World's Fair at the very moderate expense to exhibitors of two dollars for each single specimen.

Cats must be consigned, prepaid, in care of the committee of the American Cat Association, to the Louisiana Purchase Exposition grounds, St. Louis, Mo., U. S. A. The committee has given bond to guarantee all exhibits proper caging, care, feed, supervision and exhibition, and the Exposition authorities are not to receive, feed, care for or assume any responsibility in connection therewith. No entry fee will be charged by the Exposition for exhibits of cats.

Standard-size cages will be provided by the committee of the American Cat Association on the Exposition grounds in sufficient numbers to meet all requirements, and the rental therefor must accompany the entry application on the form prescribed by the exposition. All cats must be exhibited in these cages. (See announcement following by committee of the American Cat Association).

The rules of the Department of Live Stock of the Universal Exposition will wherever applicable govern in this Division.

### TO EXHIBITORS OF CATS AT THE UNIVERSAL EXPOSITION OF 1904.

The undersigned Committee of the American Cat Association has completed extremely satisfactory and advantageous arrangements with the Universal Exposition whereby the Committee is to receive, cage, feed, care for, exhibit, and return to their owners upon the close of the show the cats exhibited at the Louislana Purchase Exposition, October 25 to October 28, 1904, inclusive.

The Committee has arranged for standard-size benching and cages for the cats and will provide at the Exposition grounds an ample supply for all requirements. The Committee will also provide feed and water for all the cats on exhibition and the necessary utensils for the same and furnish all needed attendants.

The Committee, for all the necessary accommodations other than the building, including cages, furniture and all services in connection with the receipt, feed, care and exhibition and return of cats and such as are usually provided for such exhibition, agree to accept from exhibitors in full for first-class service and attention two dollars for each cat or kitten exhibited.

The Committee will provide for the best sanitary arrangements for the proper care and feeding of the cats during the show, which will be held under the immediate personal supervision of competent attendants of cats and recognized authorities in such matters.

The Committee will use due diligence for the care and safety of all cats exhibited. Watchmen will be kept on duty day and night, but it must be distinctly understood by all exhibitors that the management will not be responsible for loss or damage to any cat exhibited, whether the result of accident or other cause.

The Cat Show of the Universal Exposition of 1904 has been planned on the most advanced and satisfactory lines for the promotion of the special interests of the breeders of pure-bred cats and has received pledges of the cordial and hearty support of the leading cat clubs of this and foreign countries.

The international character of this show and the necessity for the due recognition of the registration of cats from all countries recorded in the home and foreign Stud Books has made it necessary and desirable that the World's Fair Cat Show be held under the Exposition's own code of rules, which meets all the requirements necessary to insure competent and just awards and the best care of exhibits, and is fully approved by the American Cat Association.

It has been decided that inasmuch as the World's Fair show of cats is universal in character and is to be held under rules approved by the American Cat and other Associations, the wins at the Universal Exposition of 1904 shall be fully recognized and published in the stud books of the American Cat and other Associations the same as if held under the regular and exclusive cat show rules usually recognized.

In estimating the cost necessary for the benching, feeding, care and other expenses at the show this Committee has made the most careful estimate based upon the number of probable entries as indicated in correspondence with cat owners conducted by the Exposition management and through other channels. While it is not thought the sum named will more than equal expenses, yet if any surplus should result this Committee will employ the same for additional testimonial prizes to be awarded to the exhibitors winning prizes at the show.

# DIVISION G.-SOUTHERN BREEDING CATTLE.

Entries in this Division on the prescribed form must be filed with the Chief of the Department of Live Stock on or before October 1, 1904.

The Exposition grounds will be open for the reception of breeding cattle from the territory south of the Federal quarantine line on Thursday, November 3, 1904, and the exhibition will begin Monday, November 7, 1904, and close Saturday, November 12, 1904.

Exhibitors will at all times give the necessary personal attention to the feed and care of the cattle they have for exhibition and on the close of awards in that Division remove such cattle from the Exposition grounds.

The Louisiana Purchase Exposition has appropriated a total of \$9,500 or so much thereof as may be awarded as a prize fund for exhibits of Short-horn, Hereford, Aberdeen-Angus, Galloway and Jersey breeding cattle owned and exhibited from points south of the Federal quarantine line.

This appropriation is conditioned that the aggregate sum of \$9,500 be prorated to the prize winners in the breeding classes for all Southern cattle specified, using as a basis for computation the classification and amounts set apart by the Exposition for Northern cattle of the same breeds, provided that in no case shall the single prizes for Southern breeding cattle exceed the single prizes paid for Northern breeding cattle in corresponding sections.

The basing date for computing ages in sections 4, 6, 10 and 12 of the classes for Short-horn, Hereford, Aberdeen-Angus and Galloway cattle (and excepting Jerseys) will be January 1, and in sections 1, 2, 3, 5, 7, 8, 9 and 11, for these breeds, the ages will be computed from birth to September 1, 1904, and the animals in all the sections must have been born respectively within the periods as follows:

- Sections 1 and 7. Three years old or over, birth prior to September 1, 1901.
- Sections 2 and 8. Two years and under three, birth between September 1, 1901, and September 1, 1902.
- Sections 3 and 9. Eighteen and under twenty-four months, birth between September 1, 1902, and March 1, 1903.
- Sections 4 and 10. Twelve and under eighteen months, birth between March 1, 1903, and September 1, 1903.
- Sections 5 and 11. Six and under twelve months, birth between September 1, 1903, and March 1, 1904.
- Sections 6 and 12. Under six months, birth between March 1, 1904, and September 1, 1904.

The rules of the Department of Live Stock of the Exposition published in this Prize-List will wherever applicable govern in this Division.

# DIVISION H.-CARLOAD LOTS OF CATTLE.

Entries in this Division on the prescribed form must be filed with the Chief of the Department of Live Stock on or before October 1, 1904.

The Exposition grounds will be open for the reception of the carload lots of cattle on Thursday, November 3, 1904, and the exhibition will begin Monday, November 7, 1904, and close Saturday, November 12, 1904.

Exhibitors will at all times give the necessary personal attention to the feed and care of the cattle they have on exhibition and on the close of the awards in that Division remove such cattle from the Exposition grounds.

Grass- and hay-fed cattle are defined and classed as "grass-fed" and such cattle may be entered and compete only in the "grass-fed" classes.

Cattle that have been fed grain of any sort, cotton seed, oil cake, gluten meal, or any like concentrated food or condiments, are classed as "grain-fed," and such animals may be entered and compete only in the "grain-fed" classes.

A carload of cattle will consist of fifteen head of steers or heifers, or both.

Grass-fed cattle must have been bred and reared within the district named in the application and can be entered only in the class provided therefor. Unquestioned evidence of the district in which the cattle have been bred and reared must accompany the entry. The statement of the inspectors of the various Associations will be accepted in case of branded cattle.

Grain-fed cattle must have been fattened in the district named in the application and can be entered only in the class provided for the district, but cattle bred in any district may be grain fed or fattened in any other district.

Exhibitors of carloads of cattle will file with the applications for entry information so far as known concerning the ages, improved breeding of the exhibits, the method and locality of rearing and feeding, and any other information of practical value to breeders, feeders and shippers of cattle, and parties interested in the slaughter and consumption of beef products.

Any dispute or contest as to the ages of cattle exhibited in carload lots will be decided by the Veterinarian of the Department of Live Stock.

The ages will be computed from birth to September 1, 1904, and the cattle exhibited in carload lots must have been born respectively and as nearly as may be determined as follows:

Cattle three years old or over, birth prior to September 1, 1901.

Cattle two years and under three, birth between September 1, 1901, and September 1, 1902.

Cattle one year and under two, birth between September 1, 1902, and September 1, 1903.

Cattle under one year, birth between September 1, 1903, and September 1, 1904.

The rules of the Department of Live Stock of the Exposition published in this Prize-List will wherever applicable govern in this Division.

No separate show of Missouri Stock will be made, and all State awards will follow the rating of the animals in order of merit in each class in the general competition by the respective judges of Live Stock appointed by the Louisiana Purchase Exposition.

No animal deemed unworthy for lack of individual merit will be awarded any part of the State appropriation.

No animal will be awarded a prize or duplication in more than one class.

Any Missouri exhibitor found guilty of perpetrating a fraud or attempting to do so will forfeit thereby all claim for the participation in the State appropriation.

All breeders who share in said appropriation must be bona-fide residents of the State of Missouri, and all animals shown by them must be owned within the State. The Missouri Commission reserves the right to interpret this rule or amend if justice requires, and to be fully convinced of the facts as set forth above before paying to any exhibitor any part of the State's appropriation for Live Stock, and every exhibitor who enters for any participation in the State fund thereby agrees that the decision of the Missouri World's Fair Commission in regard to any controversy shall be final.

### PLAN FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF STATE MONEY.

1st. All cash prizes won by Missouri exhibitors in competition with the world from the prize fund offered by the Louisiana Purchase Exposition will be duplicated in full.

2nd. State prizes are offered as set forth on the foregoing pages, and competition for same is limited to exhibitors from the State of Missouri.

3rd. The remainder of eighty-five thousand dollars not awarded by the above plan (provided such sum does not exceed \$20,000) will be paid to all worthy animals exhibited from the State of Missouri in the proportion of \$12 per head to horses in breeding classes, jacks and mules; \$10 per head to cattle; \$8 per head to hogs; \$6 per head to sheep and \$4 per head to goats, provided that pigs, lambs and kids under two months of age, colts and calves under three months of

age not to be counted, and provided further that pigs, lambs and kids two and under six months of age, colts and calves three and under twelve months of age, and also Shetland Ponies receive only half the amounts paid to mature animals as set forth above.

No separate show of Illinois live stock will be made, and all of the awards and State premium money will follow the rating of the animals in order of merit in each class in the general competition as placed by the respective judges of live stock appointed by the Louisiana Purchase Exposition.

No animal will be awarded a prize or duplication in more than one class.

All breeders and exhibitors who share in the aforesaid apportionment must be bona-fide residents of the State of Illinois, and all animals shown by them must be owned within the State.

The Illinois Commission reserves the right to interpret these rules or to amend if justice requires, and to be fully convinced of the facts as set forth above before paying to any exhibitor any part of the State's apportionment for live stock, and every exhibitor who enters for any participation in the state fund hereby agrees that the decision of the Illinois Commission in regard to any controversy shall be final.



CHANGES IN THE WORLD'E PAIR PRIZE-LIST.

Since the preliminary edition of the prize-list for the World's Fair live stock show was issued Chief Coburn of the Expocition Department of Live Stock has made a number of important.

additions and corrections. The most important chlargements in the live stock classification are the new provision for the competition by ages of first-prize steers, wethers and barrows of the respective breeds and grades in the champion and champion-overall classes for fat stock, and the provision in the cattle classes regarding herds bred by the exhibitor. Breeders who are arranging to show stock at St. Louis this year will find much of value in the following summary of these changes:

ADDITIONAL BOOKS OF FECOFD: -- The following books will be recognized in connection with foreign entries of German Coach horses: East Friesland Coach, Ostfriesisches Stutbuch "Morden", Holstein Coach, Verband der Prerderüchter in den Holsteinischen Marschen; Oldenburg Coach, Verband der Züchter des Oldenburger eleganten schweren Kutsenpferdes, Rodenlirchen--all of Germany. The following books recognized and recommended by the Department of Agriculture of the Dominion of Canada will be entered on the proper pages of the revised Prize-List: Dominion Clydesdale, Shire, Hackney and French-Canadian Stud Books; Dominion Short-



horn and Hereford Herd Books, Canalian Ayrshire Herd Book, Holstein-Friesian Herd Book of Canada, French Canadian (Race Canad dienne) Herd Book; Dominion Swine Breeders' Record,

CATTLE--For cattle an important change is made in the sections for the "herd bred by exhibitor". An entirely new section has been added, thus providing for two such herds instead of one, and it is not necessary that the bull shown in either of those herds shall be bred by the exhibitor. The sections for "aged herd, females bred by exhibitor," will provide for a herd consisting of bull two years old or over; cow three years or over; neifer two years and under three; heifer one year and under two, and heifer under one year, the females to be of exhibitor's breaking. The new section is provided for "young herd, females breaky exhibitor", composed of a bull under two years old; two here fers one year and under two, and two heifers under one year.

The cash to be offered in each of these herd sections is \$200 in the classes for Short-horns, Herefords, Aberdeen-Angus, Gallanary Polled Durhams and Brown Swiss.

Two entirely new classes have been arranged for champion pure-bred and grade fat cattle by ages. These will be for direct competition by Snort-horn, Hereford, Aberdeen-Angus, Galloway. Red Polled, Devon, Polled Durham and Brown Swiss steers and spayed heifers. The new classes for champion pure-bred and grade fat cattle are arranged as follows:

POULTRY....Twelve additional varieties of poultry have been added, including Rose Comb Brown Leghorns in the Mediterranean class, Black Red game bantams, buff turkeys, and the following non-standard varieties: Gray Japanese bantams, Indian game bantams, Jersey Blues, Klondikes, Partridge and Silver Fenciled Plymouth Rocks, Pea Comb Rhode Island Reds, White Crested White Polish Bearded bantams and White Javas. Some other varieties are under consideration and will probably be added before the publication of the final Prize-List,

PIGEONS--Classes CVI, CXIV, CXVI, CXXIII, CXXVIII and CXXIII will probably be eliminated. Other classes not complete as printed will be enlarged.

The Exposition dog show will be held under Universal Exposition rules, inasmuch as the international character of the World's Fair makes it impracticable to restrict all exhibitors to the regulations of any national kennel club. The kennel club stud books of the different countries will be recognized in this arrangenent, and certificates will be required showing entry in the stud book of the country from which the dog is exhibited. The preliminary work for the kennel show is well in hand, as is that for the country and pet stock show. The period for the exhibition in Division F, Dogs and Cats, has been changed to Tuesday, November 8, to Friday, November 11, 1904, inclusive.
