Wikipedian-in-Residence

- ◆ A Wikipedian GLAM employee/intern.
- ◆ Liaison, representing both Wikipedia to the GLAM as well as the GLAM to Wikipedia.
- ◆ Works at the interface of Wikipedia and the real world.

Wikipedian-in-Residence


- ◆ Edits Wikipedia to improve content about the GLAM and its collections.
- ◆ Develops programs to link Wikipedia with the GLAM, such as editathons and backstage pass events.
- ◆ Builds an enduring relationship between Wikipedia and the GLAM.

QRpedia

- ◆ Codes can be scanned by a smartphone.
- ◆ Link to the Wikipedia article about the subject in the language you choose.

Monmouthpedia

- ◆ Monmouth, Wales, UK (pop 8,877)
- ◆ Over 1,000 QRpedia codes in Monmouth, including the museums
- ◆ Lead to over 550 new articles in 29 languages, 145 existing articles improved, over 1,000 new images and ≈400,000 more page views per year of articles relating to Monmouth.

Welcome to the [Geoffrey of Monmouth](#) writing and images challenge for Monmouthpedia. This challenge will run from now until the 1st of July 2012 (to coincide with a Wikimedia UK board meeting). Everybody can help in any language to collaborate on writing articles related to [Monmouth](#).

How it works

Any Wikipedian with a named account (on any wiki) can participate. Two Wikipedians can form a team and participate jointly: this means you don't have to be multilingual!

To participate you must sign up on the [users and points page](#): you must include a link to your talk page (it may be on any Wikipedia, but please test the link to make sure it works!)

The challenge is based on a point system, with the goal for each participant to gain as many points as possible. Details on barnstars and prizes can be found [here](#).

- 1 point: 5 new photographs added to [Wikimedia Commons](#) relating to Monmouth
- 1 point: 1 historic photograph added to [Wikimedia Commons](#) relating to Monmouth
- 1 point: geotagging 3 images on [Wikimedia Commons](#) relating to Monmouth that do not have geotags
- 2 points: [a new stub article](#) (100 words of text, with internal and external links)
- 4 points: a start article of 400 words
- 5 points: a new short article (500 words of text, with internal and external links, inline ref and image)
- 7 points: a "Did you know?" article
- 8 points: a new [Good Article](#) or [Featured Article](#)

showing the cuticles very plainly, possibly young *S. ovatus*, and a few bivalves, with a fragment of some species of *Diaphorina* and a couple of gastrapods. We reached camp at 4 P.M., hardly broke camp and reached Big Thompson just before dark. In time to set the tent before dark. McRae and Dibble went to town for provisions while Harry and I prepared the cook set. At 9 P.M. Dibble returned and we had a good breakfast supper, leaving some in the oven of the camp stove to keep warm for McRae, who returned at 10 P.M., just as I was ready to extinguish the light. It has been a hot, clear day. We are getting lots of adult in the water now.

We wrote postals and letters and Dibble went to town to mail them. I did not get through arranging, labeling, wrapping and boxing mollusca and fossils collected yesterday and ay before until six o'clock, when we had dinner. Chicken and dumplings prepared by Harry. Harry is fishing and catching chub etc. I have spent the entire afternoon in labeling and arranging the collections. Found more stuff stowed away after supper and worked until ten o'clock, with Dibble's help. All retired at 10 P.M. My back was very tame from bending over the specimens so long at a time without proper work table. Put some fish in formaldehyde - two or three species. McRae has put up a few bird skins, young birds, but has not yet obtained any mammals.
