1. Reference is a memorandum for the Reparations Agency, Japanese Government, file 387.6(7 Nov 50)CPC/EX, subject: "Transfer of Reparations Equipment," dated 7 November 1950.

2. Referenced memorandum is forwarded for your information and necessary action in exercising surveillance in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 3b, Operational Directive No. 11, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Affairs Section, subject: "Industry," dated 10 April 1950.

3. Surveillance of the above will be based on the following criteria:

a. The consolidation of reparation equipment which will effect substantial reduction in custodial cost will be encouraged. Attention is directed to paragraph 1d, referenced memo.

b. Special consideration will be given to applications which propose transfer of equipment at no expense to the Japanese Government.

c. This section will coordinate the transfer of dead storage reparation equipment between Civil Affairs Regions.

d. New custodial areas will not be established except where absolutely necessary.

e. The Japanese Government will not be influenced to effect transfers which exceed their reparations budget.

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Subj: Transfer of Dead Storage Reparations Equipment

f. Buildings will not be used to house transferred reparation equipment which require extensive repairs, additional guards, rent payment or other expenditures of funds which result in:

- (1) An increase of overall custody cost instead of a substantial decrease for those transfers subsidized by the Japanese Government.
- (2) Additional custody cost for those transfers made at no expense to the Japanese Government.

4. Applications from arsenals, laboratories, munitions, aircraft, machine tool and precision bearing plants for the moving of dead storage reparation items will be approved by Civil Affairs regional commanders providing the dismantling of complex integrated facilities ~~are~~ not involved and the movement is in accordance with the provisions of referenced memo.

5. Authorized use applications and transfer applications from soda, iron and steel, power, sulphuric acid, rubber and shipbuilding plants, and those involving dismantling of complex integrated facilities from arsenals, laboratories, munition, aircraft, precision bearing and machine tool plants will be forwarded, with Civil Affairs Regions' recommendations, to this headquarters for approval.

6. The reports indicated in paragraph 2 of referenced memo will be forwarded immediately to this headquarters.

7. The approved applications for the movement of dead storage reparation items will be reflected in your monthly activities report.

MEMORANDUM FOR: REPARATIONS AGENCY, JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Transfer of Reparations Equipment

1. Applications for authorization to transfer dead storage reparations equipment from one location to another will be submitted by the local agency of the Japanese Government Ministry concerned to the appropriate regional Civil Affairs Team for approval, with the guidance of the following:

a. Funds from the reparations budget may be expended for consolidation of reparations equipment when such consolidation will result in substantial reduction of custodial costs. Funds expended for transfer of a plant's equipment will not exceed plant's present cost of custody for six months. Applications which involve expenditure of reparations funds will include a request for approval for such expenditure. Applications requiring funds beyond the limitations of the reparations budget will not be submitted.

b. Applications to transfer reparations equipment for authorized use purposes will be included in the application for authorized use and will not be submitted independently.

c. Transfer of reparations equipment in order to vacate buildings for Japanese industry will normally be accomplished at no expense to the Japanese Government unless substantial reduction in custodial costs will be effected.

d. Consolidation of equipment within plants will be effected primarily with a view toward reduction in the number of guards; however, when considered more economical, consolidation will be accomplished in preference to repair of damaged buildings housing idle machines. Plant-to-plant consolidation will be effected only between government-owned arsenals and laboratories, privately-owned plants owned by the same company, or between privately-owned plants under separate ownership, with the consent of the owners.

e. Applications to transfer reparations equipment from one regional Civil Affairs Team area to another will be submitted to the regional Civil Affairs Team in which the equipment is presently located.

2. Present criterion used in screening Japanese applications for use of reparations items is as follows:


a. Approve all applications of private plants for use of their own machinery.

b. Approve all applications for use of privately-owned machinery by non-owners where the approval of the owner for use is shown.

c. Approve applications for use of arsenal facilities or equipment only when it can be shown that:

- (1) The production is necessary for Occupation Force use, export or for domestic requirements.
- (2) The equipment is necessary for this production.
- (3) The equipment is not readily available from other sources.
- (4) The rent is based on the present valuation and on the rent charged by private interests for like items.

1. Reference is made to letter General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, APO 500, file AG 387.6 (7 Jul 49)GD, 7 July 1949, subject, "Accountability of Reparations Equipment Loaned to Occupation Forces."

2. The provisions of reference letter pertain to industrial machinery and equipment. Stock records will not be maintained for expendable items of supply that are issued for consumption incident to the operation of reparations equipment loaned to the Occupation Forces. Requests for release of expendable items should, however, continue to be submitted in the same manner as for non-expendable items, in order that inventory and evaluation records of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, can be changed to reflect non-availability for removals as reparations.

Mr. F: OD 51 says, "---- ensure that the production of fertilizer is permitted only in those plants authorized by reference 1c." Reference 1c limits operations of only plants making nitrogenous fertilizers. We have chemical fertilizer plants that make other types, for instance two in Hyogo making calcium superphosphates. Is it intended that we check these also?

Maj B: No, the OD was intended to mean "nitrogenous fertilizer."

Mr. F: I have another question regarding machinery in authorized use. Since we no longer process requests for the use of machinery, and they go through Japanese channels to SCAP, have we authority to terminate authorized use where we find unsatisfactory maintenance?

Maj B: You have just as much responsibility and authority regarding equipment in authorized use as you have ever had. If they don't maintain it properly you can terminate the use of it.
