SUBJECT: Improvement of Wakayama City Water Supply

TO : Commanding Officer, Kinki Mil Govt Region

1. The inclosed petition, plans, list of expenses and list of materials is forwarded for consideration and possible transmission to a higher headquarters for necessary action.

2. There is a definite requirement for an improved water system for Wakayama City. At present only approximately 30% of the residents of this city can be furnished water by the existing facilities. The Military Government Team billet has a very poor water supply. Pressure is adequate only three or 4 hours per day and in order to obtain even this it is necessary to use booster pumps and an auxiliary tank.

3. In the event of a fire the chances of having effective water pressure, for even a short period of time, is very remote.

4. It is understood that the local Japanese authorities are making every effort to obtain additional funds from the Central Government as the proposed project is considered beyond the means of the local city treasury.

1. Surveillance executed by this headquarters under the provisions of Circular 154, Headquarters Eighth Army, 1947, has disclosed innumerable cases of illegal use of petroleum products by Japanese agencies. Violations have consisted largely in the use of rationed gasoline for unessential purposes, constituting a violation of the Temporary Commodities Demand and Supply Adjustment Law in that utilization is made of petroleum for purposes other than stated on the official rationing certificate.

2. On 1 February 1948 the Traffic Section of the Kanagawa Prefecture Police Department established a vehicle check point at Odawara City, Kanagawa Prefecture, to inspect vehicles for possible misuse of petroleum products. Among other alleged violations discovered, one (1) vehicle from Aichi Prefecture was apprehended travelling to Tokyo from Nagoya. It was discovered that no evidence of legal acquisition of gasoline used could be shown. Moreover, in view of the shortage of gasoline the use of a private automobile on a trip of this length does not seem reasonable.

3. Details of the case are forwarded as inclosure 1 for any action deemed appropriate. It is requested that this headquarters be advised of any punitive action taken in order to reassure the Kanagawa Police Department that severe action is being taken not only against local violators, but against all persons guilty of misusing petroleum products, despite the prefecture in which their vehicles may be registered.

SUBJECT: Allocation of Electric Power to the Fertilizer Industry.

TO : COMMANDING GENERAL, I CORPS, APO 301.

1. Reference letter, your headquarters, same subject, file 433-BA, dated 25 September 1947 and letter, this headquarters, subject: "Power Supply for Manufacture of Chemical Fertilizer," dated 3 August 1947, copies enclosed.
2. This headquarters has spent considerable time and effort in encouraging the Shinetsu Chemical Company to produce more and more fertilizer for the farmers of Japan. Subject company is in agreement with this team and higher headquarters as to the necessity for more fertilizer. Production, however, has decreased due to an alleged shortage of power.
3. The above mentioned references, and/or indorsements thereto, indicate that fertilizer production has the highest priority, yet time and again allocation of power to the Shinetsu Company has been reduced to a point inconsistent with what is felt to be the available power supply. In January, 1947, 466 tons of calcium cyanamide were produced when a similar power decline developed. This year in January only 262 tons were produced. Plans for the next two months are also out of line with that produced last year.
4. This headquarters is of the belief that if empowered to make local allocation of power, it could increase the amount allocated to Shinetsu without endangering the livelihood and production of other local industries. Increased production would also retard the suspension of trained laborers, 150 of whom are suspended until the middle of March. Another factor to be taken into consideration, is that according to a recent report of the Osaka Local Bureau of Commerce and Industry, machinery used in the manufacture of chemical fertilizer is highly susceptible to damage by continued power shortages, thus effecting the future production of fertilizers when the power shortage is somewhat alleviated.

6. Production quotas set for the fertilizer industry are minimum
 quotas. Production in excess of quota is highly desirable.

SUBJECT: Repair Necessary for Increased Power Generation

TO : Commanding General, I Corps, APO 301
Attn: Military Government

1. A special investigation has revealed the following information listed by separate installations concerning hydro-electric plants in Kyoto Prefecture. (Note: Figures on required amounts of material were compiled by a construction engineer employed by Kansai Electric Distribution agency which has received an allocation of one-hundred twenty tons of cement for 1947. This poor grade cement was designated for use on specific other projects, all of which are of a long-range nature requiring up to four years to complete. Most of the paper bag containers were torn on this shipment, leaving an average of only thirty-five out of the original fifty kilograms per bag. In addition, this cement cannot be used for construction work as it is only suitable for plastering and other architectural work.)

A. Kuroda Power Plant

1. River System - Katsura River of Yodo River system.
2. Outline of repair - Repair of the whole length (3950 meters) of the open ditch to check leakage was started before the war, but had to be stopped before being completed. Now, the leakage is so marked that it must be stopped immediately. Under the present plan, stone side-walls of the ditch are to be removed and replaced by concrete for the length of 300 meters.
3. Time required for completion - 60 days
4. Increase in output after repair - 50 kilowatt (normal output - 600 kilowatt)
5. Material required - 50 tons of cement (1,000 - 50 kilogram bags).

B. Hashitani Power Plant

1. River system - Kumohara River or Yara River system.
2. Outline of repair - Waterway is 2,760 meters long and most of it is box-culvert. The culvert was constructed hastily and now it leaks badly and has collapsed at several points. As snow is usually heavy in winter season in this part of the country, there is a possibility of the culvert being blocked entirely by the weight of snow. Leakage is to be stopped and the damaged portions of the culvert are to be repaired with concrete.
3. Time required for completion - 45 days
4. Increase in output after repair - 40 kilowatts (normal output - 35 kilowatts)

BASIC: Repair Necessary for Increased Power Generation - cont'd.

5. Material required - 15 tons cement (300 - 50 kilogram bags).

C. Yamaga Power Plant

1. River system - Kamibayashi River of Yura River system.
2. Outline of repair - Hed of the 2,400 meter waterway has been washed away and the side-walls have cracks everywhere. A new concrete bed is to be built and the cracks are to be filled.
3. Time required for completion - 45 days
4. Increase in output after repair - 40 kilowatts (normal output 500 kilowatts).
5. Material required - 25 tons cement (500 - 50 kilogram bags).

D. Kowaki Power Plant

1. River system - Noma River of U River system
2. Outline of repair - Here the 2,800 meter water way consists mainly of tunnel and box-culvert. Weathering in the unlined portions of the tunnel has caused the pieces of rock to fall down from the roof and walls of the tunnel so that they obstruct the free flow of water in several places. Even the concrete lined walls are loose in some places so that they have to be supported by timber.
3. Time required for completion - 60 days
4. Increase in output after repair - 60 kilowatts (normal output 600 kilowatts).
5. Material required - 30 tons cement (600 - 50 kilograms bags).
(Note: Since this data was compiled, the tunnel has collapsed completely, causing a complete shut down and loss of the 600 kilowatt).

2. It is recommended, in view of the critical shortage of electricity, that immediate action be taken to provide necessary allocations of cement and steel to permit the completion of projects listed above, which will provide the additional current as indicated and thereby contribute to the alleviation of the current shortage.

SECTION I
GENERAL

1. REFERENCES.--a. Operational Directive 57, Headquarters Eighth Army, 16 Aug 47, subj: Civil Information Activities.

b. Operational Directive _____, now in preparation at Headquarters Eighth Army, subj: Electric Power R-rationing Program of Japanese Government.

c. CI&E Bulletin, #13, GHQ, SCAP, 22 Dec 47.

2. SITUATION.--a. Japan's economic recovery is retarded by the crippling effect of gas, coal, and electric power shortages upon essential industrial and rural production. These acute shortages may be expected to continue through January, February, and March, 1948.

b. Natural shortages; resulting from inadequate power generating facilities, low river levels, comparatively low coal production and other causes, are aggravated by wasteful and illicit use of available supplies. Illicit and wasteful practices range from excessive use of electricity in homes and business places to illegal tapping of power lines and inefficient employment of fuel by industrial concerns.

c. Conservation measures must be acted upon immediately in order to meet minimum requirements for electrical power and fuel.

3. OBJECTIVES.--The primary objective of civil information activities is to inform the Japanese of the necessity for conserving coal, gas, and electricity during January, February, and March, 1948. Intermediate objectives are to:

a. Develop public opinion against the illicit or wasteful use of electric power by residential, industrial, or business consumers.

b. Encourage minimum use of lights, heaters, and other electrical appliances.

c. Encourage efficient firing methods and equipment maintenance in fuel-burning installations.

d. Encourage voluntary "brown-outs" in non-essential businesses such as dance halls, night stalls, and restaurants.

SECTION II
THE PLAN

4. PRINCIPLES.--a. With the assistance of CI&E Section, GHQ, SCAP, national information activities are to be conducted primarily by the "Headquarters to Meet the Electric Crisis", a semi-governmental agency composed of power company and governmental representatives and sponsored by the Ministry of Commerce. The basic conservation program is the responsibility of the Ministry of Commerce and is administered through its regional offices.

b. In their respective areas, regional power distribution companies (HAIDEN) are planning civil information activities in consonance with national plans, and in cooperation with regional Bureaus of Commerce and Industry. Names and addresses of responsible officials are:

c. The power and fuel conservation program warrants temporary priority over other civil information programs, especially in areas where the electric power and fuel problems are critical. Immediate action of short duration is necessary to assist Japanese agencies concerned in the planning phase of their programs. Sustained effort by military government beyond this stage is not considered essential. However, it is desirable to exercise observation over Japanese implementation of the program to the extent practicable under local circumstances.

d. Effective liaison between Economics and CIAE Officers at all echelons of military government is considered essential.

e. Military government units will be notified of pertinent national plans and activities.

5. METHODS.--a. In the national information program, primary emphasis will be placed upon the following:

- (1) Direct information and persuasion of individuals by neighborhood "Electricity Conservation Committees" and assisting student committees.
- (2) Top-titled newsreels.
- (3) Colored cartoon posters.

b. Regional HAIDEMs have no connection with item a(2), above, but probably give considerable use of items (1) and (3). Assistance given these agencies by regional military government authorities should emphasize practical planning, and production and distribution of information materials. Utilization of press and radio should be minimized on a regional basis and encouraged in the prefectures in accordance with regional plans. At both echelons, Japanese agencies should be impressed with the necessity for expeditious action.

c. It is essential that prefectural military government teams be fully and continuously informed concerning Japanese or military government regional activities affecting their respective prefectures.

d. Prefectural military government teams can be particularly effective in:

- (1) Observing and guiding the distribution and use of posters and other information materials received by Japanese agencies from national source or prepared by HAIDEMs with regional military government assistance.
- (2) Encourage prefectural governmental or power company agencies to organize "Electricity Conservation Committees" to the extent considered necessary in cities, towns, and villages.
- (3) Encourage Japanese agencies concerned to plan their information program in accordance with regional plans and with emphasis upon item d(2), above.
- (4) Relations with the press, radio, public address agencies, et cetera, should be conducted entirely by the Japanese concerned with assistance being given by the local military government team as necessary. Such materials as are required, i.e. press releases, public address system and radio announcements, et cetera, should also be prepared by the Japanese agency. Japanese employment of media may be encouraged along lines described in following paragraphs.

6. PRESS.--a. Press participation may be initiated by a conference featuring the governor as spokesman wherein the power and fuel problem is outlined and the prefectural plans for conservation described. Where necessary, a joint press conference, with the military government team commander and governor acting as spokesmen, may be conducted wherein military government's interest in the problem and approval of prefectural plans therefor is expressed.

b. Encourage follow-up press coverage and editorial opinion on the activities of conservation committees and other newsworthy related events.

7. RADIO.--Radio participation also may be initiated by a short address by the governor covering in general the same subject material as in paragraph 6, preceding.

a. Radio news coverage on activities of conservation committees and other related newsworthy events is to be encouraged.

b. Spot announcements, prepared by radio station or other Japanese agencies, urging conservation of fuel and power may also be used.

8. PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEMS.--Announcements on public address systems, both in railway stations and motion picture theatres, may be prepared by power company, radio station, or prefectural agencies to:

- a. Urge conservation of power and fuel.
- b. Publicize the activities of conservation committees.

9. CONSERVATION COMMITTEES.--Conservation committees may be organized through power company or governmental channels. Such committees already have functioned with considerable success, with press support, in the Tokyo and Kanto area. Student committees, following the example of the conservation committees, also have been active in ranging the streets at night, checking the district electric meter, and using megaphones to warn the citizens that too much power is being used. Prefectural activities with respect to these committees may be given encouragement and considerable emphasis.

10. BULLETIN BOARDS.--Town and village officials should be urged through normal administrative channels to make maximum use of bulletin boards, not only for the display of posters, but other materials as well. An open letter from the governor urging conservation of electricity and fuel or increased production of charcoal might be effectively posted. Other materials suggested for display are newspaper clippings or notices originated by town or village authorities.

11. LABOR UNIONS.--Japanese agencies may be encouraged to investigate the possibility of enlisting the aid of labor groups to promote conservation of electricity and fuel. This media may be particularly effective in areas where industrial consumption is particularly high and shortages especially critical.

SECTION III THEMES

12. THEMES.--The following themes are applicable as personal appeals, or for adaptation to posters, radio, press, or public announcements:

- a. Electricity hogs cheat everyone else in the district. Share equally. Use only the ration allocated to your family.
- b. Electric power thieves must be caught. Illegal tapping of power lines is draining away Japan's only hope of economic rehabilitation -- increased industrial production. Help Japan's recovery. Save power and fuel.
- c. Everyone in Japan must use electricity sparingly. The electric power situation is worse this year than it has been in many years. Do your part to save electricity.
- d. Turn off that light immediately when not needed. In this critical time of electricity shortage, every little bit must be saved. Do your part.
- e. The transportation problem may become worse unless everyone in Japan cooperates to save electricity, coal, and gas. During this "dry season", electric power generators burn coal. Coal is scarce. In the home, in the office, in the factory, use electricity and fuel sparingly.
- f. Farmers! Fertilizer production is falling off because chemical companies cannot get sufficient electric power. If farmers produce more charcoal, city dwellers will require less electricity for light and cooking. Help to meet this crisis. Increase the charcoal supply so that electricity will be spared for fertilizer production.

g. Electricity, gas, and coal must be conserved to insure your food supply. To import food, Japan must export goods. Factories producing export goods need power. Wherever possible, Save electricity, or gas, or a shovelful of coal. Do your part.

h. Everyone must cooperate in conserving electricity, gas, and coal in order to rehabilitate Japan's economy. Let every Japanese do his part.

i. Housewives! Rice rations may be delayed because there is insufficient power to operate rice-milling machines full-time. Conserve electricity! Help make more power available for milling rice. Do your part!

1. Reference letter this headquarters, same subject, dated 1 November 1946, copy enclosed, and letter this headquarters dated 3 August 1947.

2. The Takefu Branch of the Shinetsu Chemical Fertilizer Company has unofficially received from Central Ministry a quota of 350 tons of Nitrolime for the month of January. This is the third reduction in quota since August 1947. Quota has been cut from 1100 to 350 tons monthly, apparently due to a prospective shortage of electric power. This headquarters cannot concur in such a drastic reduction of production of fertilizer. In view of information contained in indorsements to above referenced letters that fertilizer production has the highest priority for electric power consumption, it is felt that monthly production quota should be raised to maximum capacity of subject company which is 1200 to 1400 tons of nitrolime monthly.

3. This headquarters has on a prefectural level adjusted past difficulties to a great extent. Recommend that officials in Central Ministry be reminded of the critical part chemical fertilizer plays in the present day Japanese economy.

1. General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, is aware of the reduction of electric power allocations to the chemical fertilizer industry. The most essential industries have been given priority in the allocation of power. The chemical fertilizer industry has been classified as Priority A-b by the Japanese Economic Stabilization Board and should receive power in accordance with that priority classification and commensurate with the power available in the district. The critically short supply of power during January and February has necessitated a large reduction in power allocated to even this high priority industry.

2. The present production of nitrolime, or calcium cyanamide, is limited only by the availability of power, since supplies of other required raw materials are ample to meet the low production schedules necessitated by the restricted allocation of power. The monthly allocation of power is based on the total estimated quantity available. If the supply proves in excess of original estimates, the allocation program calls for delivery of additional quantities of power to the more important industries.

3. Attention is invited to paragraph 5 of letter, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 675 (21 Nov 47)Ess/IN, to Commanding General, Eighth Army, subject: Japanese Electric Power Rationing Program, which empowers local military government teams to supervise corrective action by the local Japanese agencies where indifference to responsibility, serious and repeated errors in judgment, unjust discrimination, or mal-practice in the administration of the program are preventing satisfactory results.

4. Request is made for continued surveillance and action by local military government teams based on the policy outlined in Eighth Army Operational Directive No. 2, dated 7 January 1948.


