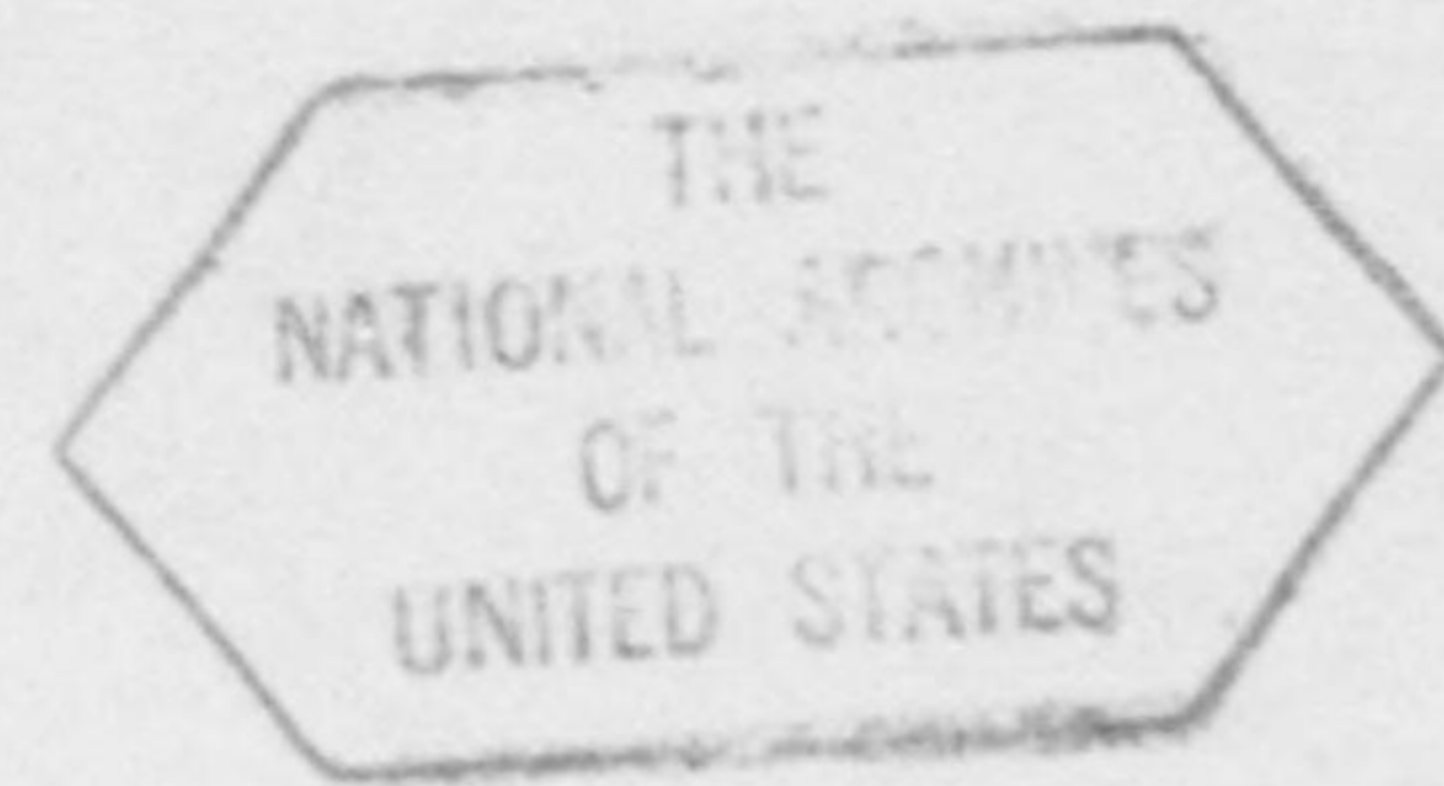

## LABOR SECTION TELEPHONE LOG--Week 17-22 October 1949

Date	Time	Conversation
17 Oct	0840	Mr. Carter, Tokyo, called--asking to speak with Mr. Camacho. No message left other than the name.
17 Oct.	0900	Mr. Peck, Chiba, called to ascertain the approximate date that he would be assigned to Tokyo. He was told the desired info was not available at this office.
17 Oct.	0915	Maj. Woodward, Yokohama, called and wanted to speak to Mr. Camacho about an Economics conference to be held in Yokohama sometime during the first week in November. Conference will concern the reorganization. Mr. Camacho was requested to call Maj. Woodward.
17 Oct.	1030	A Mrs. Weed, Tokyo, called and asked to speak with Mr. Camacho concerning tickets for the car.
17 Oct.	1140	Contacted Lt. Barker(Economics), Tochigi, and asked him to give Mr. Camacho the message about reporting to Tokyo C.A. Team on Wed. morning and to call Col. Woolume.
18 Oct.	0900	Reminded Mr. Barr, Saitama, of field trip of Mr. Davis, P-6, Labor Division to Saitama 18 Oct. 49.
18 Oct.	1145	Mr. Coolidge, Tokyo 26-8469, requested that Mr. Camacho call him.
18 Oct.	1320	Sendai called to discontinue Dispute Report.
19 Oct.	0930	Mr. Green, Union Club-Room 519 Tokyo 26-7104, requested Mr. Camacho to call him.

10 Oct.	0815	Mr. Barr, Saitama, called with info on a woman interpreter at Saitama CAT. (This info was previously requested by Mr. Camacho) Name: Mrs. Teru Bana Age: 41 Position: Tech. Advisor (Interpreter)
10 Oct	1020	Mr. Camacho spoke with Lt. Zuk, Nagano, regarding future work of the interpreter, MUKAI. Mr. Camacho assured Lt. Zuk that he would do his best to secure a position for Mukai at Region. Mr. Camacho was told by Lt. Zuk disastrous results of the recent flood.
10 Oct.	1330	Requested the Gumma Monthly Telephone Report. Checked the number of active disputes. Mr. Higuchi stated that the rest of the report would be phoned in later.
10 Oct.	1400	Mr. Peck, Chiba, phoned in the settlement of the dispute of the Tonichi Food Products Co., Choshi City. (recorded).
11 Oct.	0900	Received the Gumma Monthly Telephone Report from the Gumma interpreter.
11 Oct.	1000	Mr. Camacho spoke with Major Furillo, Tochigi, to make arrangements for family quarters for weekend of 15th and 16 Oct.
11 Oct.	1010	Mr. Camacho spoke with Mr. Kimoto, Tochigi, about reorganization set-up. Mr. Kimoto stated that the list of files and description of pamphlets previously requested by this office were being sent on this date.
11 Oct.	1055	Mr. Camacho spoke with Mr. Higuchi on disposition of labor section files. Mr. Camacho requested that only those files on labor relations be forwarded to this office.
11 Oct.	1120	Mr. Camacho spoke to Mr. Edgar, Tokyo, telling him he would return report to him on this date.
11 Oct.	1310	Requested that Miasawa, Yamanashi, call this office 12 Oct.
11 Oct.	1415	Reminded Mr. Barr, Saitama, of Mr. Robertson's field trip on 13 & 14 Oct. Mr. Barr stated that the trip schedule of Mr. Robertson had already been planned by Pref. Labor Dept.



## Telephone Log--Week 10-15 October 1949.

Date	Time	Conversation
12 Oct.	0830	Mr. Kimoto, Tochigi, called and stated that he has made arrangements for Mr. Camacho and his family to stay at Nikko Copper Works Club, Saturday and Sunday, 15 & 16 October.
13 Oct.	0815	Mr. Imura, IX Corps, called. He said he had taken over Sgt. Brakken's job. He requested info on present status of disputes for Yamanashi, Saitama, Gumma, and Ibaraki. This info was furnished. Mr. Imura stated that the Monthly Team Telephone Report would contain only info on disputes--that info on publication films and slides would no longer be requested.
13 Oct.	1330	Informed Mr. Kimoto, Tochigi, that Mr. Camacho would be arriving about 1800 at Utsonomiya.
13 Oct.	1410	Mr. Camacho called, saying that his departure from Tokyo would be delayed. He requested that Mr. Kimoto be contacted and asked to make arrangements for a meal for Mr. Camacho and his family this evening.
13 Oct.	1430	Called Mr. Kimoto, Tochigi, and requested that he make arrangements to furnish meal for Mr. Camacho & family for this evening. Mr. Kimoto was told that Mr. Camacho and family would be arriving in Utsonomiya at approximately 1830 this date. Mr. Kimoto said he would do what he could about making these arrangements.
14 Oct.	0815	Mr. Kida (Tokyo Shibaura) called and asked if he would be able to contact Mr. Camacho at the Kanaya Hotel in Nikko. He was told that Mr. Camacho would be at the Kanaya until tomorrow noon.
14 Oct.	0830	Called Mr. Kimoto and checked on Mr. Camacho's arrival at Utsonomiya. It was requested that Mr. Kimoto inform Mr. Camacho that Mr. Kida would contact him by telegram or telephone this evening at the Kanaya.
14 Oct.	0950	Mr. Dodds, Yamanashi, phoned stating he was sending files to this headquarters and that certain Japanese material on labor education would be turned over to the Pref. Labor Policy Section.

3 Oct	1020	Received the Weekly Situation Report, via telephone, from Mr. Camacho.
3 Oct	1300	Requested Mr. Barr, Saitama, to send to this office a list of pamphlets, booklets, etc., which have been translated into Japanese, and the number of other pamphlets, booklets, etc., now on hand in team labor office. Informed Mr. Barr that his notebook, left at this hqgs Saturday 1 Oct., was being returned to him by the Saitama Mail Courier.
4 Oct	0910	Mr. Bulkley, Tokyo 26-6474, called, requesting that Mr. Camacho call him.
4 Oct	0930	Mr. Bulkley, Tokyo, called again saying he would like to hear from Mr. Camacho when he gets to the office, but <del>would</del> <sup>did</sup> not leave a message.
4 Oct.	0900	Requested <sup>that</sup> Mr. Peck, Chiba, <del>to</del> send in Monthly Telephone Report. Mr. Peck reported he would do so as soon as possible.
4 Oct.	0915	Requested Lt. Zuk, Nagano, to send a list of labor office files to this office. Lt. Zuk replied that it would do little good to do so as practically all files were destroyed as a result of the Nagano flood. Lt. Zuk stated that he did have some good records however, and would send these to Mr. Camacho (by box, packing list contained). Lt. Zuk requested that Mr. Camacho call him.
4 Oct	0945	Sgt. Brakken, IX Corps, reported on field trip to Saitama as follows: Personnel--Mr. Collett; Mr. Davis, Mr. McVoy, of SCAF Labor Division, and Mr. Mathews of United Kingdom Labor Ministry; and 1 Japanese National Schedule--

4 Oct	0945 (cont)	<p><u>Schedule:</u>            Ar Urawa 0900 6 Oct.; lv. 1130 6 Oct.            Ar SCAT 1140 6 Oct.; lv. 1245 6 Oct. 4 Oct	1100	Spoke to Pvt. Pickering, Saitama, and requested both Maj. Koch and Mr. Barr to call this office as soon as <i>practicable</i> re/ <i>Mr. Camacho's trip.</i>
4 Oct.	1500	Mr. Camacho spoke to Maj. Koch, Saitama. Arrangements were made to have a meeting with a small group of both employers and employees to test new program "Grievance Machinery and Seniority Clauses in Trade Agreements." Time of meeting is Friday, 7 Sep., 2 sessions (1000-1200 and 1330-1530). The Place is Urawa City.
4 Oct.	1545	Contacted Lt. Zuk, Nagano, and told him that Mr. Camacho was unable to locate Lt. Col. Stearns. Lt. Zuk replied that he was not certain as to Lt. Col. Stearns' address, and that if he could not be located, to forget about the matter. Lt Zuk said he appreciated efforts of Mr. Camacho to locate Col. Stearns. Lt. Zuk requested that Mr. Camacho contact him regarding his interpreter, MUKAI, who has been issued his 30-day discharge notice. The interpreter is anxious to find out Mr. Camacho's future plans regarding him.

Date	Time	Conversation
5 Oct	1000	Reported Chiba Monthly Telephone Report to Sgt. Brakken, IX Corps. Report consisted of only 3 films. It was pointed out that the trend re-labor education <sup>is in the</sup> diminishing stages as concerns this report. Sgt. Brakken acknowledged receipt of Nagano Monthly Telephone Report sent by penalty <del>mail</del> <sup>envelope</sup> from this office. Sgt. Brakken was told that both the Saitama & Yamanashi Monthly Telephone Reports for Sept. 1949, had been requested by this office, but have not been received as yet.
6 Oct.	0830	Checked with Mr. Barr, Saitama, on trip of Mr. McVoy, Mr. Mathews, Mr. Collett, and Mr Davis on 6 Oct. Mr. Barr had been informed of this trip by Pvt. Pickering. Mr. Barr was told Mr. Camacho would arrive 6 Oct. between 0900-1000.
6 Oct	0915	Mr. Camacho spoke to Mr. Greenberg, IX Corps, and requested any surplus material (file records etc.) concerning labor relations that Mr. Greenberg might be able to obtain and send to him.
6 Oct	1100	Requested that Mr. Dodds, Yamanashi, send to this office a list of the team labor files. Mr. Dodds' interpreter, MIASAWA, said he would arrive Shinjuku Station, Saturday, 8 Oct. at 1040. Mr. Camacho said he would send a Jeep to meet him.
6 Oct.	1330	Spoke with Mr. Higuchi, Gunma, and requested info on the present status of the Takasaki Sub-Division of the National Railway dispute. He said he believed this dispute had been settled but that he would check on it and forward info to this office. Mr. Higuchi was requested to send to this office a list of the Japanese pamphlets and the number of other pamphlets now on hand in the team labor office.
6 Oct.	1400	Spoke with Corp. Pickering, Saitama, requesting info on the present status of the strike of the Saitama Bicycle Mfg. Co., Shiki machi. Corp. Pickering reported this strike (dispute) was settled 4 Sept. 1949 (recorded).

6 Oct.	1430	Mr. Camacho spoke to Mr. Burati, E.S.S., about using the services of a translator for Friday, 7 Oct.
7 Oct.	1145	Mr. Kimoto, Tochigi, requests that Mr. Camacho contact him regarding a woman interpreter who, he said, would make a very good interpreter in the matter pertaining to Women & Minors' Bureau. Mr. Kimoto stated that his interpreter, FUJIKAKE, already has a job with C.I.C. Mr. Kimoto was informed of Mr. Camacho's field trip plans for Fri. & Sat., 14 & 15 Oct.; and that a more complete schedule would be furnished Sat., 8 Oct., or Mon., 10 Oct. It was requested that Mr. Kimoto submit to this office a list of pamphlets now on hand in team labor section.
8 Oct.	0900	Called Motor Pool & checked on having a jeep at Shinjuku Station at 1040 to pick up Miasawa.

8 Oct.	1000	Mr. Camacho spoke to Mr. Kimoto, Tochigi, about recommendations of a woman interpreter-translator, Margaret Fugimoto. Mr. Camacho's field trip on Friday and Saturday, 14 & 15 Oct., was discussed.
8 Oct.	1015	Mr. Camacho spoke with Mr. Barr, Saitama, about two interpreters and one typist. Names and brief description of these persons are as follows: 1. Labor Section--Miss Aiko Nakamura, age 23, typist (excellent). 2. Economics Section--Mr. Minoru Kobayashi, age 36, technical advisor (interpreter) 3. Legal Section--Mr. Hiroshi Ishihara, age 22, technical advisor (interpreter).

19 Sept.	1030	Mr. Camacho called Mr. Grosiak, Labor Education Section of Labor Ministry--conducted an objective survey of the prefectural labor policy sections as to their labor educational programs--(a) what materials are being prepared? (b) what use is being made of these materials? (c) how are they conducting their entire program of labor education activities. The following regions were rated as follows: (1) Kanto, (2) Hokaido, (3) Chukoku, (4) Kinki, (5) Kyushu, (6) Tohoku, (7) Tokai, (8) Shikoku. 19 Sept.	1130	From Sullivan to Col. Hester--Request that each team submit two copies of their monthly activity reports to the region labor section. This is aside from the information which they will submit to the C.O. O.D. 43--1949 rescinds O.D. 53 as to the reporting, but teams will report as if O.D. 53 were not rescinded.
20 Sept.	0830	Mr. Walsh called from Utsonomiya and talked to Mr. Sullivan regarding Monthly team reports. No stenciled copies but four regular copies and 2 copies to be turned in for the use of the Labor Section.
20 Sept.	1000	Mr. Ikezono, ESS, wants to talk with Mr. Camacho and wishes him to call him back.
20 Sept.	1005	Maj. Boaz, Tokyo Central--26-6268, wants Mr. Camacho to call him as soon as possible regarding his trip to Nagano on the special train "The Sparrow" pertaining to names of people who accompanied him on this trip.

Mr. Barr was told that this office would try to contact Robertson to check on his trip.

12 Sept.	0900	Lt. Zuk, Nagano called and stated that at a conference in Nagano with Pref. Labor Relations Committee--men present were Mr. Suzuki, chief of Pref. Labor Dept. wanted to put on the agenda the matter as to whether it was necessary for a union to be in need of the immediate services of the P.L.R.C. as a prerequisite to the obtaining of a certification of compliance with Article II and V of the Revised Trade Union Law. PLRC claims that in accordance with rules and regulations set down by the CLRC, a union must have the need of the immediate services of the committees before the latter will entertain an application for certification. Suzuki is not in accord with the aforesaid because it prevents unions from seeking certification and, in effect, compliance with T.U.S.
12 Sept.	1500	Mr. Carter, Tokyo, called--wanting to speak to Mr. Camacho. He requested that Mr. Camacho call him at 26-6897.
