THIRTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL OF ONTARIO

Toronto, December 1st, 1903.

To the Honorable J. R. Stratton,
Registrar-General of the Province of Ontario:

Sir,—I have the honor to submit for your consideration and approval the Thirty-third Annual Report made under the Act respecting Births, Marriages and Deaths in the Province of Ontario, being for the year 1902.

POPULATION.

While the immigration into Ontario during 1902, as well as the emigration from it to the Northwest Provinces has caused an unusual disturbance of the normal population, yet there being no way of estimating the relative increase and decrease, it is necessary to assume during inter-censal periods a normal increase in population based upon the surplus of births over deaths during the year. From Table 1 it will be seen that the births were 47,796 and the deaths 27,864, giving an increase of 19,932, or rather less than 1 per cent. of the census population, 2,184,144, taken as the basis of calculation for 1901. Allowing for the rather less perfect return of births than of deaths an increase of 1 per cent. has been added to the previous population as the basis for calculating the various tables of the Report. BIRTHS.

The total births, as registered for 1902, were 47,796, as compared with 46,061 in 1901, or an increase of 1,735 as compared with a decrease in 1901 of 66, and giving a rate per 1,000 of 21.7. The increases and decreases by counties are set forth in Table 1 of the Report, where it will be seen that 30 counties show an increase of 2,344 and 14 a decrease of 609. The following counties show increases of over 100: York, 595; Algoma, 413; Simcoe, 106; and Northumberland and Durham, 109; while Renfrew alone shows a decrease of over 100, it being 118. The fact that the counties with a large French population should show a decrease, Prescott and Russell having 78, and Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, 46, is a point of some interest, as probably showing like Grey, Renfrew and so on a removal of some of the young adult population to other areas. It is apparent that Algoma has been the centre of most rapid increase in the counties, apart from York, where Toronto, with 599, shows an increase greater than the total increase in the 14 cities together which have 594. The other new districts of Rainy River, Thunder Bay and Nipissing, do not show any great increase, the former showing a decrease of 11, and the other two only 80 when added together. That Carleton, which, in 1901, showed an increase of 407, should show a decrease of 53 in 1902, can scarcely be explained, except on the supposition of imperfect returns. This decrease was 55 in Ottawa, where the population increase has, for a number of years, been quite remarkable. Equally notable is the fact on the opposite side that, while in 1901 Northumberland and Durham showed a decrease of 101, in 1902 it shows an increase of 109.

The variation in the rates of births per 1,000 is further of much interest as illustrating variations in the quality of a population as regards nationality and age. In Nipissing the rate has reached 39.9, in Prescott and Russell 35.9, and in Algoma 30.3. Haliburton comes next with 29.4, Parry Sound with 29.3, Muskoka with 27.8, Essex with 25.8, and Carleton with 24.6. On the other hand, certain counties show a rate notably below the average. Of these the lowest is Prince Edward with 16.3; Peel had 17.1, Lennox and Addington 17.2, Middlesex 17.3, Rainy River 17.5, Elgin 17.7, Leeds and Grenville 17.8 and Lincoln 17.9. It is apparent that the law of the distribution of population in age periods explains in part the low birth-rate in several of these old-settled counties, though, in the two counties of Middlesex and Elgin both having a rapidly growing city in them, such rates must, as before remarked, be looked upon as due in part to imperfect registration.

Births in Cities. In table 2 will be found the birth rates in the 14 cities of Ontario. The rate per 1,000 is 22.2, being 0.5 above the average for the Province. The total increase over 1901 is 554, being slightly more than 1 per cent. in a population of 479,965. Of these cities eight showed an increase, five a decrease and one no variation. Excepting Toronto, it is regrettable to remark that the total decreases were rather greater than the increases: Ottawa had a decrease of 55, Belleville 46, Hamilton 23 and St. Catharines 18; while Toronto had 599, Kingston and Chatham 32, Woodstock 19, Guelph 17, Stratford 12 and London 2, over the births of 1901. The totals as regards rate per 1,000 vary notably, and must be studied in connection with the rate of population growth in order to give a fairly true idea of the relative completeness of returns. The Toronto birth rate of 24.0 must be considered satisfactory, as compared with that of 1901, except for the fact that the 1 per cent. of increase applied to the population increase according to assessment returns is much too small and should have been over 2 per cent. The Ottawa rate of 26.3 is probably too low, remembering the very considerable French population; while that of Brantford, 24.8, illustrates probably too small an increase in the population, which is largely artizan. Hamilton with 18.0, is, there is but little doubt, badly registered; while Belleville maintains not only its old low place, but actually outdoes itself with a rate of 11.9. It is trusted that the records of the past year may not under new local conditions be repeated. London with 18.5, St. Catharines having 18.9, Stratford 18.4 and Chatham 17.9, present a group of cities in all of which there is reason to believe defective registration plays a part in the abnormally low birth rate.

Birth Rate in Towns. The towns of the Province, which include practically the county towns, are becoming yearly of increasing importance, one after another passing into the city group. Of the 31 found in Table 3 with a total population of 143,762, Peterborough has over 10,000, it being 11.351; Brockville, 9,029; Berlin, 9,844, and Owen Sound, 8,863. The rate per 1,000 of the group is 24.5, being higher than the cities. The general average is, however, affected by three anomalous rates. L'Original with 53.1, North Bay with 51.2 and Sault Ste. Marie with 51.2. In two at least of the three it is probable that the rapid increases of population have made the divisor too small. In only two or three does the rate seem to indicate imperfect registration, Brampton having but 15.1, Goderich 13.8, Orangeville 14.5 and Picton 15.3.

Taken as a whole, the returns of the birth rate for the Province, must, from the comparative standpoint, be looked upon as fairly satisfactory. It shows not only a total increase over 1901 of 3.7 per cent., but a rate satisfactory compared with the 1 per cent. increase in population. It is not complete and is not yet what is looked for, when we find that of England and Wales with 28.5 of an average, and its lowest county, Sussex, 22.6, and its highest Durham with 36.2. But with the enormous urban population there of 75 per cent. as compared with 45 per cent. in Ontario, it is worthy of remark that the average birth rate, which, in 1895, was 30.3, has there steadily decreased. Assuming the existence of defective registration of births in such cities and towns as

have been indicated, there is room for gratification when a comparison is made of the rate of population increase, when the increase of births over the deaths is considered in each case. In England and Wales while the birth rate in 1901 was 28.5, the death rate, though low relatively, was 16.9 per 1,000, while that in Ontario was 12.6. The increase per 1,000 in England was 11.6, while that in Ontario was 9.1. A similar comparison may be made with the figures for the Province of Quebec, the Report of the Recorder of Vital Statistics for 1901 giving the following: Total births, 55,398; total deaths, 32,219; or rates per 1,000 of 33.5 and 19.5 respectively. The latter comparison shows an increase of 14 persons per 1,000 as compared with 9.1 in Ontario. That there is, however, in the Province of Quebec the operation of the same law of decreasing birth rate, with the urbanizing of its population may be seen from the fact that while in 1898, there were 60,345 births and 31,871 deaths, or a population increase of 28,474 in 1901, there were 55,398 or nearly 5,000 fewer births and 32,219 deaths or 348 more than in 1898. In other words, by the operation of the two factors the population increase of 1901 was 5,295 persons less or a gross reduction of 19 per cent., while that of Ontario shows a slight increase in the rate per 1,000 of births over deaths, it being 9.1 as compared with 8.9 in 1898. It seems apparent that the increase in urban populations, when the relative age periods are taken into consideration does, under the stress of modern life, tend directly to a lessening of population increase when compared with the same people occupied in the more simple and health-giving employments of rural life.

MARRIAGES.

The total marriages recorded in Ontario during the year 1902, as seen in Table 1, was 18,072, as compared with 18,035, or an increase of 37. The rate per 1,000 is thus 8.2 for the Province as a whole, and is found as in former years to vary notably, being greater in the cities and town centres than in rural districts, that for the cities being 12.2, and that for the towns 12.8.

The county distribution of marriages varies greatly, that in Essex being as high as 26.7 per 1,000, while that for Rainy River falls as low as 5.3 per 1,000. Apart from these two extreme cases the rate may for an average old-settled county be taken as about 7 per 1,000, although one or two old counties have shown for several years an abnormally low rate, that of Peel being 5.9, with Halton and Frontenac having 6.1 each. It will be noticed that in each instance we have counties with, as shown by the census, a practically stationary population, resulting from the migration of persons, presumably young men from these districts. With these two or three exceptions the county rate of marriages is a satisfactory one. Thus the rate for England and Wales in 1901 was 7.95, while in several largely rural counties the rates fell to 6.4 in Hertfordshire, and 6.6 in Middlesex, Oxfordshire and Herefordshire. The highest were 8.35 in Staffordshire, 8.75 in Nottinghamshire and 8.8 in London.

Marriages in Cities. The rate in the 14 cities was 12.2 as compared with 11.5 in 1901. Separating Windsor in both years, the increase was 244, a fairly correct indication of the growth of these urban centres. That the City of Windsor is becoming a more than enlarged Gretna Green, where all persons of whatever quality can have the marriage ceremony performed *celeriter et jucundissime*, is a tact repugnant to that sense of propriety which is supposed to mark the social qualities of the Canadian people, and would seem to call for some explanation of why this practice has increased in this extraordinary fashion. Apart from this anomaly and a somewhat similar abnormal rate in Chatham, the city returns show a marriage rate of 10.8 per 1,000.

Marriages in Other Countries. That the marriage rate in Ontario is most satisfactory from the standpoint of social progress is seen in the fact that the rate of 8.2 or 16.4 persons married in every 1,000, is high in comparison to the rates in foreign countries.

Marriages by Months. The marriages by months, as seen in Table 7, held much the same relation in point of numbers as in 1900 and 1901. The month of June has quite forestalled December, there having been over one-ninth of the total marriages celebrated in that month. December follows in order, while for three years May has been lowest in the list. In all years, however, the fourth quarter of the year, ending December 31, has the largest proportion.

Marriages by Denominations. As seen in Table 8 the number of marriages by denominations maintains the same order as in 1900, the Methodists being 33.4 of the whole, Presbyterians following with 20.3, Church of England 16.1, Roman Catholics 15.3 and Baptists 6.3. To show how slow are the internal changes in an old-settled Province a comparison may be made with 1892. In that year Methodists were 35.0 of the whole, Presbyterians 20.2, Roman Catholics 14.5 and Baptists 5.7. As was noted in the Report for 1900-1, the census showed evidence of a relatively small increase, the only definite increase being in French-Canadians, of whom it was estimated that some 30,000 had come in from Quebec

Marriages by Ages. The following tables show the average ages of both brides and grooms in some of the municipalities. The high average in the older counties of Huron and Perth is quite marked, while the low age of the bride in Prescott and Russell, Algoma, and Nipissing is in keeping with the customs of the French in rural districts.

DEATHS.

The deaths recorded in Ontario in 1902 were 27,864, as compared with 29,608 in 1901, giving a rate of 12.6 per 1,000, as compared with 13.6 in 1901.

From year to year the records of deaths have been more complete and there is reason to believe that the estimate given approximates absolute correctness. A comparative study will shortly be possible of the figures of the Registrar General's returns for the census period, with those of the census returns, and through this comparison the relative mortality of the several Provinces may be estimated.

The death rate, already low, must be accepted as indicating a high average of health, compared with previous years and with other countries. The latter may be seen in the following table:

Death Rate in Cities. The death rate in the 14 cities was 15.8 per 1,000, while that in the 31 towns was 15.9. A comparison with the rates in urban centres in the United States and other Provinces shows similarly that the death rate in Ontario cities in 1902, compared most favorably with those in other cities of this continent.

Death Rates in Towns. The rate in the 31 towns where the deaths are separately tabulated was 15.9. The towns, as North Bay and Port Arthur, which are essentially railway terminal towns in a new district, have inevitably brought to them persons dying by accidents, and thus the rates are increased. The rate of 20.8 in Owen Sound is in keeping with the high marriage and birth rates, and evidently indicates that the population, taken as an estimate for calculation, is too small. Similarly it would appear that the population given in Cayuga and Orangeville are higher than they should be to give such low rates as 6.4 and 9.9 per 1,000.

Deaths by Age Periods. The observations made in the Report for the census year relating to the relative variations in the populations at different age periods in Ontario, as compared with other Provinces and with other countries, have proven of interest, and the same subject has been dealt with by Mr. Tatham in the Annual Report of the Registrar-General of England for 1901. The Registrar-General states: "The tabulated results of the census of 1901 showed such a remarkable change in the age constitution as to make it evident that the proportion of deaths to population in 1901 and recent previous years, was not comparable with those in earlier years. Accordingly corrected figures have been made for all years prior to 1901, showing the death rates as they would have been had the age and sex constitution throughout the entire period been the same as that of 1901." Dr. John Tatham, in his study of the causes of deaths, says in the same Report: "As regards those diseases that chiefly affect particular ages, comparisons of the county death rates at such ages may safely be made. For example, the distribution is fairly shown of the diseases that are chiefly fatal to very young children. But in comparing the local prevalence of diseases that are common to all periods of life a difficulty arises which has often been adverted to in these reports." The mortality from most diseases varies with the age of the patient, and for the reason that the proportion of the population living at each age also varies, according as the community is mainly urban or mainly rural in character, it follows that all crude death rates at all ages calculated without allowance for these variations must be regarded as at best but roughly comparable."

"Reference to Table D on page xvii, shows that almost without exception the general death rates in the counties which are mainly urban have been increased, and those in the mainly rural counties have been reduced by correction for age and sex.

constitution of the population. If then a comparison between Lancashire and Norfolk is made and the correction applied it is found that the death rate in the first is raised from 19.4 to 21.1 and the latter decreased from 16.2 to 13.8 per 1,000. In other words, whilst the crude rates of mortality show an excess in the case of Lancashire amounting to 20 per cent., the corrected rates show an excess of 53 per cent."

These conditions were referred to in the study of the deaths for 1900 where the variations between the deaths in 1891 and 1900, as affected by distribution of population, were fully illustrated.

Reference to the following table will show the variation for the several periods in 1901 and 1902:

The comparison may be instituted between these several years, and within more narrow limits certain variations in the same age period are apparent in spite of the fact of the annual mortality rate varying quite notably in some years. This is well illustrated by comparing the year 1900 with 1902. The latter year has a total of 1,630 fewer deaths, but the deaths under one year are 829 less; the deaths between 1 and 5 are practically the same. The same is true of the periods 5-9 and 0-14, but the period between 15-29 shows a notably less number in 1902 than in 1900. The next three decades are practically the same, while the deaths in the three last decades of 1902 are mostly the same, although comparatively they should have been somewhat lower had they maintained the general characteristics of the year.

The low mortality rate during the years of school life is especially significant and illustrates what will be seen in a further table regarding the deaths from contagious diseases.

With the quite notable increase in immigrants to Ontario, the increasing number of industries and the growing population of towns, as shown in the increased birth rate, it is probable that the distribution of population in age periods shown in the Report of 1900 to be abnormal, will during the present decade again approach a normal. Especially will the tendency be in this direction as the present old persons who were immigrants between 1840 and 1860, during which nearly one million were added to the population, must necessarily, year by year, become less in number.

Deaths by Counties. These may be studied in Tables 1 and 9 in the special tables, and as usual show several notable variations. Accidental conditions of location have given to Thunder Bay, with many men engaged in railway work, a disproportionate number of deaths, there being 16.8 in 1,000, while Nipissing has similarly 16.8. It is quite probable, however, that the influx of settlement has made the population taken as a divisor too small. Carleton, with Ottawa city, shows, as in previous years, an unduly high rate. York is low, remembering that Toronto is situated within her boundaries. The large agricultural counties of Huron with 10.4, Dufferin with 9.0, Elgin with 10.6, Huron with 10.0, Peel with 10.8 and Waterloo with 10.0 may be taken to illustrate the very high position Ontario stands in the matter of healthfulness.

Deaths by Cities and Towns. The deaths from all causes for the fourteen cities will be found in Table 2. It will be noticed that the average, 15.8 per thousand of the population is 1.2 less than in the preceding year. Ottawa is again the highest in the list, 19.6 with Guelph the lowest, 12.2. From the following table of deaths in fifteen of the large towns of the United Kingdom it will be seen that the death rates of the cities of Ontario compare most favorably with these.

By reference to Table 3 it will be noticed that while the average death rate in the towns, 15.9, is less than last year, yet the town of Sault Ste. Marie, 26.3, stands abnormally high, with North Bay, 25.0 a close second; while, at the same time, the birth rate in both these places is also abnormally high, being 51.2 in each case. These apparently high figures are, no doubt, due to an increase of population above that used as divisor. This is shown in the latter town, where a recent report places the population at 3,650 instead of 2,555, which gives a corrected death rate of 17.5 and birth rate of 35.8 per thousand.

Deaths by Classes of Diseases. It will be found from Tables 10 to 15 inclusive, that the class "Communicable (epidemic) Diseases," shows a marked decrease over 1901 of 24.9 per cent., the figures standing at 2,590 and 1,944 respectively. The decrease is also marked in other general diseases, there being 17 per cent. less than in 1901, the figures being 4,407 as against 5,327. There is very little change in the returns of the other groups.

Deaths from Enteric Fever. The deaths from this disease still continue to make the favorable diminution referred to last year, when they fell from 682 in 1900 to 500, or a decrease of 26.6 per cent. For 1902 the total is 392, being a decrease of 21.6 per cent. The deaths in the cities and towns were 0.22 per thousand of the population and in the rural districts 0.15 per thousand. The deaths in the city of Toronto were slightly lower than this latter figure, being 0.14 per thousand, while in the county of York the death rate was 0.13. The two towns which present the highest death rate from this disease are Sarnia with 1.5 and Sault Ste. Marie with 2.0 per thousand. The cause in the latter case was the use of water from springs which at one time were pure, but became contaminated as the population increased before the public water supply and sewerage systems could be extended. This marked diminution in the deaths from this disease, while, in fact, due to seasonal causes, is ascribable in part to the extension of water works in our cities and towns and to the greater interest shown and care taken in securing unpolluted water supplies in the farming districts.

Deaths from Smallpox. The death rate from this disease stands at the same figure as for 1901; but the total number of cases of the disease is less, as will be seen by the Annual Report of the Provincial Board of Health. The case, mortality, was somewhat higher than in 1901. The total deaths for the year were seven.

Deaths from Measles, Scarletina, and Whooping Cough. The decrease has been in the deaths from measles; but both the latter show a marked increase. That from scarlatina was 25.3 per cent. greater than in 1901, the figures being 346 as against 248; while the increase in whooping cough is 23.4 per cent., or from 166 in 1901 to 205 in 1902.

Deaths from Diphtheria and Croup. While the deaths from this disease show a decline from those of 1900 and 1901, when they were respectively 772 and 738, yet the decline has not reached that of either 1898 or 1899. A study of the distribution of this disease would indicate that during the year it has been slightly more fatal in rural districts than in cities, the decrease in the cities being 22.1 per cent. from 1901. The figures for the two years are as follows:

Deaths from Influenza. The decrease in the number of deaths from this disease is most marked, the 152 being only a little more than one-fourth of those in 1901. A comparison made for a series of years makes it evident that influenza shows the peculiarities of an infectious disease and would seem to be especially associated with certain climatic conditions.

Deaths from Pyaemia and Septicaemia. The decline noticed in 1899 is continued this year, the deaths included in this group being 238, as compared with 572 in 1901. The erratic rise and fall would indicate something more than a greater precision in diagnosis in the years of increase in deaths and may perhaps be accounted for by extrinsic influences, which affect the resisting powers of the individual and at the same time increase the activity of the specific organisms. The distribution by months seems to be practically independent of seasonal conditions, no particular quarter showing any notable excess over others.

Deaths from Cancer. There were 1,048 deaths from this cause, being slightly lower than 1900, when there were 1,055.

Deaths from Tuberculosis. The deaths from this disease show a very material decrease over previous years, there having been 2,694 deaths, which is 1.22 per thousand of the population and 90.6 per thousand deaths. The ratio for the preceding five years is as follows per thousand deaths: 1897, 106.8; 1898, 127.8; 1899, 118.6; 1900, 118.1; 1901, 109.5. These figures are particularly gratifying from the fact that the decline is not confined to any particular district and is general in both urban and rural municipalities. The mortality in the Province compares most favorably with that of Great Britain, when for the year 1901 the deaths were at the rate of 181.1 per thousand of the population, or 118.7 per thousand deaths. As compared with other zymotic diseases, tuberculosis

shows a remarkable persistency of deaths in all the months of the year. Thus the monthly reports give the following deaths from consumption by months during the past year:

But if the chronic character of the disease is illustrated by the figures there is to be found some satisfaction in knowing that the monthly rate already shown in the yearly decreased rate, is in spite of there having been in the first six months of 1903 1,022 more deaths than in 1902, marked by a greater decrease in the deaths from consumption than in the previous years. This is seen in the following table:

Without forgetting that individual seasons affect notably diseases of the respiratory organs and that the four months, January, February, March and April of 1901, were very fatal to old persons, the fact remains that with returns increasing in exactness year by year the succeeding months have, with few exceptions, shown a decrease in the deaths from tuberculosis. If the average for the nine months of 1903 is applied to the balance of the year there would be 2,286, 2,614 and 1,996 deaths in the three succeeding years, which with an increasing population would seem to mark a notable decrease in deaths from this cause. To a greater diffusion of knowledge of its infectiousness amongst the people and to the growing practice on the part of physicians and Local Boards of Health to advise isolation of patients in the advanced stages and to disinfect premises where patients have resided must be ascribed at least a part of this decrease.

The Distribution of Tuberculosis by Counties. The following table gives the relative prevalence in the several counties of Ontario for the years 1901 and 1902:

Omitting reference to the great differences seen in Algoma, Rat Portage, Nipissing as new districts where the floating population engaged in public works prevents normal increases or decreases in population, it will appear that in most counties there is an evident reduction in the deaths from tuberculosis. That this is not merely accidental would seem evident from the figures already quoted. The interesting fact must be noted, not only of the high continued standard of freedom in the upland, inland counties where the soil is generally of the Saugeen sands and gravels with Erie clays in some places and at other limestones beneath, supplying good local drainage but also in addition to this, as has been before noted, their distance from the Great Lakes which remain open all winter makes these inland climates notably different as regards moisture from those along the lakes. That it is perhaps as much or more a question of local drainage than of proximity to the lakes would seem to be gathered from the very marked decrease in the several counties of the western and eastern peninsulas bordering on Lake Erie. The counties of Kent and Essex within the past thirty years by public drainage works and the cutting down of the forest have been in large measure reclaimed from marsh, while similar improvements have in recent years been carried on in Welland and Lincoln counties. Where there is no decrease in a county would seem to be in those as Wentworth and Middlesex where a large city is growing up in each. In both Carleton and York, however, with yet larger cities the rate has lessened. It becomes apparent, therefore, that while accidental circumstances, as patients from rural districts dying in city hospitals and charities will affect death rates to some extent there are yet other factors, as location, climate, drainage, class of population, length of periods of settlement in the age of a population which so affect mortality rates that it is quite impossible to dogmatize as to the supreme influence of any single fact as applied generally, although in any individual place it might be possible to adjudge such influences more exactly. Speaking generally there does seem to be a lessening on the whole of the prevalence of tuberculosis in Ontario; but it is apparent that if the cities multiply industries of certain types, wherein female labor is largely employed, more stringent sanitary regulations than at present exist will be demanded if deaths from this disease of house life are to continue to decrease.

Tuberculosis in Cities. The deaths per 1,000 from tuberculosis in the 14 cities of Ontario are seen in the following table:

While there are very marked variations in the death rates a due allowance must be made for deaths from outside places being registered at the several hospitals. It is further evident that with the smaller cities the population is too small not to be affected by some accidental cause. Taking them as a whole the cities show a decided decrease over 1901, the rate being 1.45 as compared with 1.78 per 1,000. Individual cities have varied still more.

The order of prevalence is seen to have changed, the rate in Toronto having shown the most remarkable decrease, while Brantford has advanced to the first place. The other cities have maintained much the same relative positions. The following is the order of this prevalence:

Here we have illustrated what has already been referred to regarding the high mortality rates along the St. Lawrence, while similarly the western inland towns have a notably less prevalence.

COMPLETENESS OF RETURNS.

The following tabular statement illustrates the amount and character of the routine work in the Department of the Registrar General, both in making the returns as complete as possible in respect to the records and in preparing the Annual Report.

The above 111,804 names have also been compared after indexing is done.

In all 14,000 marriages were registered from old county register books of date previous to 1860.

The total marriage cards received from license issuers was 18,072.

These have to be searched for and compared with index books. About 1,000 of these are yearly found unregistered by clergymen, who are written to, and on an average 405 of these marriages are secured and registered by this system. This requires some 1,500 letters to be sent and as many received. Some 310,000 blank forms are sent out yearly to about 1,800 Division Registrars and license issuers.

Compiling Annual Report and preparing and studying a series of special tables, of 260 pages and mailing 6,400 copies to Senators, M.P.'s, physicians, clergymen, judges, school officials, foreign exchanges, and takes several months' work.

Comparing 90,000 births, marriages and deaths indexed previous to 1893, when yearly comparing was adopted, was added to the regular work of the staff.

Forty books, averaging 600 pages, being records of Births, Marriages and Deaths arranged in counties for binding.

Letters sent out and filed were 2,212.

Circulars sent out, 1,600.

Seaching for returns Births, Marriages and Deaths for the whole Province for duplicate registrations, resulted in the finding of 485 duplicates.

Completeness of Marriage Returns. These returns, as may be judged from the high marriage rate per 1,000, may be said to be absolutely complete. The provision whereby license issuers are required to make returns of all licenses to the Registrar-General at the time they are issued, has completely eliminated the danger of marriages celebrated being omitted from the register. Owing to the provisions of the Marriage Act it is not in practice a requirement for one or other of the contracting parties to be resident in the municipality where the marriage takes place. Hence it happens that a

license is sometimes granted in one municipality and the ceremony is performed in another. By comparison of license and marriage returns any omissions in the latter may be traced by the return stating the name of the clergyman officiating. A circular letter sent out in every case where registration of the marriage has been neglected has resulted in finding 350 non-registered marriages in 1902 as compared with 441 in 1901. Duplications of registration have been found in seven municipalities, amounting in all to 54. This error has also been eliminated from the indexes before tabulation.

Completeness of Death Returns. These, with possible burials without permits in the frontier districts, where a death by drowning or other accident occurs many miles from settlement, are practically complete, although there may be occasional omissions to where a body dying in one municipality has been buried in another. An estimate of what the error is will be shortly obtainable through the comparison of the returns to the Registrar-General with those enumerated by the Census Commissioners. It is too much to hope that omissions will not be found, but it is hoped that they will not be found numerous. The chief errors discovered in the returns to the Registrar-General are of duplications, due to the provision whereby a burial permit in several districts may, for convenience, be granted by a Division Registrar in a municipality adjoining that where the death takes place. This took place in 41 municipalities and resulted in a total of 279 duplications. The error has been eliminated from the indexes and tabulations by the Registrar-General; and where a division has, as in six instances, duplicated the returns of the first half yearly returns in the second, the error has been corrected in the indexes and notification of the mistake been sent to the Division Registrar. It is regrettable that in the tabulation of causes of death defective returns continue to be made. It may be possible to correct such during the coming year, but when it is remembered that in England after 64 years, there were in 1901 1.81 uncertified causes or 9.986 in all, and that 5,762 answers to letters of enquiry re defective causes of death were received, it will be apparent that in Ontario this class of error will be one gradually eliminated. In too many cases there is reason to believe that secondary causes of death are put down instead of the primary or true cause and that in other instances the mode of death is given instead of the true cause. The terms "heart failure" and "atrophy" are sufficiently illustrative of what is meant.

Undoubtedly in practice the proper class to which a death in some cases is to be assigned is difficult of answer. It is, however, receiving much attention by statisticians, and since the adoption by the Census Bureaus of Washington and Ottawa of the Bertillon Classification of Diseases, the co-operative work being carried on by these departments co-operating with the Committees of the American Public Health Association, of the Conference of State and Provincial Boards of Health of North America, of American Medical Association and of Public Health and Marine Hospital Service of the United States, while a Manual has been published by the Bureau of the Census at Washington and distributed to Registrars.

In an appendix a scheme has been elaborated by which a numerical weight or rating according to its importance, is assigned to each title of a classification and each term under a title. Of course when physicians report primary and secondary causes determination is easy; but when each might have been the primary cause the determination on the part of the compiler is a matter of choice. The dissemination of the views of statisticians amongst physicians will gradually solve many of these points of detail in returns and in classification and must result in obtaining such accuracy of returns that a comparative study of diseases in the various States of the same country and in different countries will be possible and that most important results will be derived bearing upon the questions of supreme importance as regards causation of disease.
