Fifteen Days' Continuous Fighting Twenty Thousand Troops Landed.

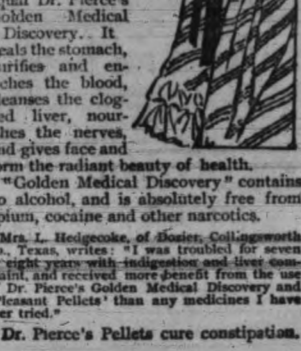
London, June 28.—The following were the casualties of the international force attacking Tien Tsin: British—Killed, 2; wounded, 1. Americans—Killed, 3; wounded, 25. Germans—Killed, 15; wounded, 2. Russians—Killed, 10; wounded, 35.

The gun fire of the British and Americans is described as beautiful. After the relief force pushed on to relieve Admiral Seymour, Chinese regulars under Gen. Nieh, says a dispatch from Shanghai, again attacked Tien Tsin severely, and bombarded the foreign settlement with a terrible fire.

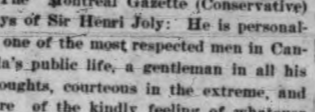
