

Boston, April 26, 1864.

Dear friend Webb,

I am sending forward to you to-day, per Steamship 'Asia' wh. leaves here tomorrow for Liverpool, a parcel of Pamphlets, &c. &c. which I hope may reach you in good order. ^{It} ^{consists} of (1st) The "Decade" Pamphlet, as we call it, just out; - "Proceedings of the 3^d Dec. Meetg. of Anti-Sl. Socy," &c. &c. I have addressed copies to a number of persons in ^{the} County, & shall send beside, a number blank, wh. you will favour as by distributing according to ^(about 50 copies in all.) ^{your} good judgment. All expenses on this parcel (the freight of wh. to Liverpool I shall prepay here) you will please charge to us, including the expenses of distributing, & whatever else; (2^d) Some copies of Liberator & Standard (rather old news) containing report of our 30th Anniversary; (3^d) Some few documents, such as I have had time to collect, wh. possibly may be of use to your friend who desires Statistics on Charitable & other matters in this County. (4th) A tolerably complete file of the United States Sanitary Commission Bulletin (published twice a month)

together with many other documents relating to the work of that Commission. These too may afford some assistance (particularly the "Bulletin") to your friend. (3.) A complete set of the "Advocate", which you some time since asked for. (6.) A parcel from H. C. Wright, (who has not sent to me, as he said he should, certain photographs for you). (7.) A copy of Parton's History of the Administration of Genl. Butler in N. Orleans, - from our Sec. Comtee, at H. C. W.'s suggestion; and I was glad to learn from you that it would be acceptable to you. I cannot doubt you will read it with much interest, - for it is, at least, a "live" book. (8.) I believe you will acquit me of ever having troubled you with "theology" - either in person, or by proxy; - not that I hold it, in itself, in any disesteem, - nor need I stop now to tell what I do think about it; but say at once that I am lending you a little book, of Wm. H. Furness's, which, knowing you as well as I do, I

believe you will find satisfaction and interest in, even tho' you do not adopt the writer's particular theory or opinions about Jesus. I like ^{it} because of its deep and affectionate study of the life and mind and heart of Jesus, and for the many beautiful lights it throws upon his character; and so I think you will enjoy the book, for such reason, and shall be glad to know just what you think about it. — The parcel is addressed to care of J. R. Graves, Baltic Building, Liverpool, as heretofore; and I suppose I had better send to him, rather than to you, the Steamship Co's receipts for the parcel. — I also put in the parcel a photograph or two of some New Orleans Slave children, emancipated by our Government (among thousands of others), and who have been recently brought to several of our Northern cities. — I omitted (I fear) to address one of the Decade pamphlets to the "Edinburgh Ladies' Emancipation Society"; —

will you oblige us by so addressing one, "with the
respects of the Exec. Comtee of the American Anti-Slavery
Society". I hope I have sent you as many of
the Decade Pamphlet as you can advantageously

use. - I have sent 2 extra copies, with her own, to Miss
Estlin. - I shall doubtless think of some, whom I would
wish to have remembered in this way, after my letter
is gone. - I will now name Harriet Lupton, as one

whom I would like to have a copy sent with our
respects. - Also, please address one thus, & send per
"Samuel A. Goddard Esq. with respects of S. May Jr.

& send it to Birmingham. - Also to Mrs. Foster
M. P. for Bradford, with our "Committee's" respects.
Perhaps James Haughton would not reject a copy. &
as you think best, about sending one in our name.

I have to-day received a note from Mrs.
Frances D. Gage, from St. Louis, Missouri, ack-
nowledging receipt of the money from Mrs. Anne
- amounting to over 47 dollars; perhaps I shall
soon be able to put her letter with this. [I now remember
