Two Squadron Photo-Liberators were led from Agaña Field, Guam, by Lieut. G. H. CONOVER, USNR, 25 March 1945 at 0603 King. One hour and a half out from Guam, Conover's wing man, Lt. (jg) J. F. RATES, USNR, was forced to return to base due to an oxygen leak.

CONOVER continued the flight alone, arriving over Raha at 1215 King. Photo flight lines were run at 19 000 ft. above 5 tenths low cumulus with fair results. On proceeding north, Chichi Jima was found intirely overcast and photos were not possible.

No AA fire was met with, over either target.

Lt. Conover returned to base, Guam, 1730 King.
