

Miss Normand obviously was impressed by the importance at-tached to her version of the shooting, which she related, and upon which thousands of club women throughout the United States expect to judge her actions and the public attitude today toward her motion pictures.

Seek to Clear Greer As the hearing opened, defense

attorneys launched a determined fight to free Greer by tonight. The defense let it be known that they had five witnesses whom they would call at the conclusion of the prosecution testimony. It was asserted that the five nesses would establish Greer's claim of self-defense and clear him of the charge of attempted

murder.
Miss Normand went smilingly to the stand, and she was smiling when she left it. Once during her testimony, when she made an apt retort to an objection by Greer's lawyers, the crowd lustily applauded her with hand-clapping.

Judge Frowns at Her She shook her head at Greer. slouched down in a chair before her, like a mother reproving a naughty child, drew marks on the polished surface of the judge's desk at her elbow until his frowns stopped her, and brought laughter from the crowded courtroom by her manner of answering questions from attorneys.

Goes Up In \$100,000 Pittsburgh Blaze

PITTSBURG, Pa., Jan. 21 .-Seven firemen lost their lives, three others were injured, probably fatally, and thousands of gallons of oil were destroyed today in a fire which raged for more than seven hours in the Atlantic refining section of the Standard Oil company's plant here, causing a loss estimated at more than \$100,000.

The fire, starting from an explosion of undetermined cause in a 10,000 barrel oil tank, was still burning, but was under control at
