ARGUMENT BEGINS IN FISHERIES APPEAL

Counsel for Dominion Raises New Point Regarding Jurisdiction.

Vancouver, Dec. 2.—Lively passages between bar and bench marked the opening of argument to-day in the fisheries case involving the question of the respective rights of the province and Dominion to regulate the fisheries and to give undisputed ownership of the fish. The argument also raised the new point, with special reference to this case, that where John Kendall went fishing above Westminster bridge was over ground within the railway belt, and therefore as F. C. Wade argued, solely within the jurisdiction of the Dominion.

Kendall had both Dominion and provincial licenses. He fished at a time permitted by the Dominion and prohibited by the province. He was fined \$50 and costs, which fine Judge Howay set aside, holding that the Dominion had and the province had not the right to pass regulations in regard to fisheries.

The answer of the province is, in a word, that as it is undisputed owner of the fish it has the right to impose conditions as to how and when and where these fish shall be taken, and can even say that they shall not be taken at all. The Dominion replied: "When we have covered the field by legislation you can not interfere in the fisheries any more than in immigration."

In addition to the point, with special reference to this case, is raised that this alleged offence occurred in the railway belt and in the harbor.

Mr. Cassidy—That point wasn't raised in the proceedings in the lower courts. Mr. Justice Morrison—I am not surprised, for so far we have heard little from you except legal platitudes. Speaking for myself, I do not care to sit and hear counsel sweep the whole gamut of legal authority on irrelevant matters.

Mr. Cassidy—Of course, if your Lordship thinks that my argument is irrelevant I may as well sit down.

Mr. Justice Morrison—I merely wish to get at a concrete case. I would like to know at the outset wherein this case differs from that decided by the Privy Council in 1885. Judges, you know, have an equal right with counsel to express their views as the case proceeds.

Upon the main question Mr. Cassidy contended that the Dominion's only right to exact the license it does to fish in British Columbia was by way of a tax for Dominion revenue purposes. The right of the province is the right of the owner of the fish, with which the Dominion could not interfere. "The man who takes out a provincial license as Kendall cannot afterwards quarrel with its conditions," added Mr. Cassidy. "Our regulations are an appropriate exercise of our legislative right."

"Even if you repeal Magna Charta," said Mr. Wade.

"Yes," returned Mr. Cassidy, "the Magna Charta, like any other act of England, can be adopted or rejected by the province, which is supreme in its own orbit."

Mr. Cassidy added in effect that it was beyond the power of the Dominion parliament to pass regulations in regard to the fisheries of this province, assuming thereby to give or take away the right to fish to leave or take away that which belongs to the province. But it can impose a personal tax by way of license, and that license can have no further legal or other significance.

Mr. Wade—My learned friend so far has assumed that the province owns the ground. But this is a case within the railway belt, and we can also show that it is within the harbor, controlled by the federal authorities.

"If this place where Kendall was fishing is harbor, you may as well say that the whole Fraser river is the harbor," returned Mr. Cassidy. "As to the place being within the railway belt, I am not prepared to meet that point now. The Dominion should have raised that point in the lower court."

Mr. Wade—You should have raised it, not we.

SAYS CANADA SHOULD CONTRIBUTE TO NAVY

Captain Clive Philipps-Woolley Declares Dominion Must Act Quickly.

Vancouver, Dec. 2.—"Shall Canada have a Navy?" was the question asked in the lecture given by Captain Clive Philipps-Woolley at the city hall last night. The lecture was given under the auspices of the Navy League and the Daughters of the Empire.

Captain Clive Philipps-Woolley said the question he had in mind was of such national moment that it might be spoken of in a cathedral by a primate addressing a kneeling people. It was really a matter of national life, which went to the heart of the people, and he believed in the matter.

The navy fed her, the navy kept her from starvation, and she was allowed to expand and grow, and a common sense of duty should make her take some burden off the shoulders of the mother who had nursed her infancy.

Here was Canada with a floating wealth of 200 millions of dollars on the seas and virtually without protection, except such as the Mother Country gave. Here was Canada in such a position that she could not stand alone.

Could Canada compete for the trade of the Pacific with America, and yet Canada had not yet recognized that it was her duty by the insurance which a navy gave, to keep in check the predatory and competitive instincts of other nations.

By the aid of "Mercator's Projection," shown on the screen, the lecturer showed how the British Empire at present "held the seas." But other nations were jealous of Britain's maritime power. Germany had so increased her navy as to almost indicate that "the mailed fist" meant mischief, and wise men said that to be on the safe side Britain must have a fleet as strong as any two nations could boast—and a bit over. It had been proposed that Canada should build ships and contribute such vessels to the Imperial navy. He favored that plan, as it would put wages in the pockets of Canadians. But what was done it was—nothing—something was done quickly. They were not going to rely on the Monroe Doctrine, and be content with the protection of the United States. When it came to that he would take a ticket back to the country which had never asked for help to protect her

TIMBLY RECIPES. For Quinces, Spiced.—Seven pounds of fruit, four pounds of sugar, one pint of vinegar, half ounce of ginger root, one teaspoonful of ground cloves, two teaspoonfuls each of ground allspice and cinnamon, a half teaspoonful of ground mace. Pare and core the quinces. Put vinegar and sugar on to boil. Mix spices and divide them into four parts. Put each into a small square of muslin, tie tightly, then throw them in the sugar and vinegar. When this mixture is hot add the quinces; bring all to a boiling point; take them from the fire and turn carefully into a stone jar. Stand in a cool place over night. Next drain all the liquor from the quinces into a porcelain lined kettle, stand it over a moderate fire, and when boiling hot pour it back in the jar over again as before, do this for nine consecutive days; the last time boil the liquor down until there is just sufficient to cover the fruit. Add the fruit to it, bring the whole to a boil and put in jars or tumblers for keeping.
