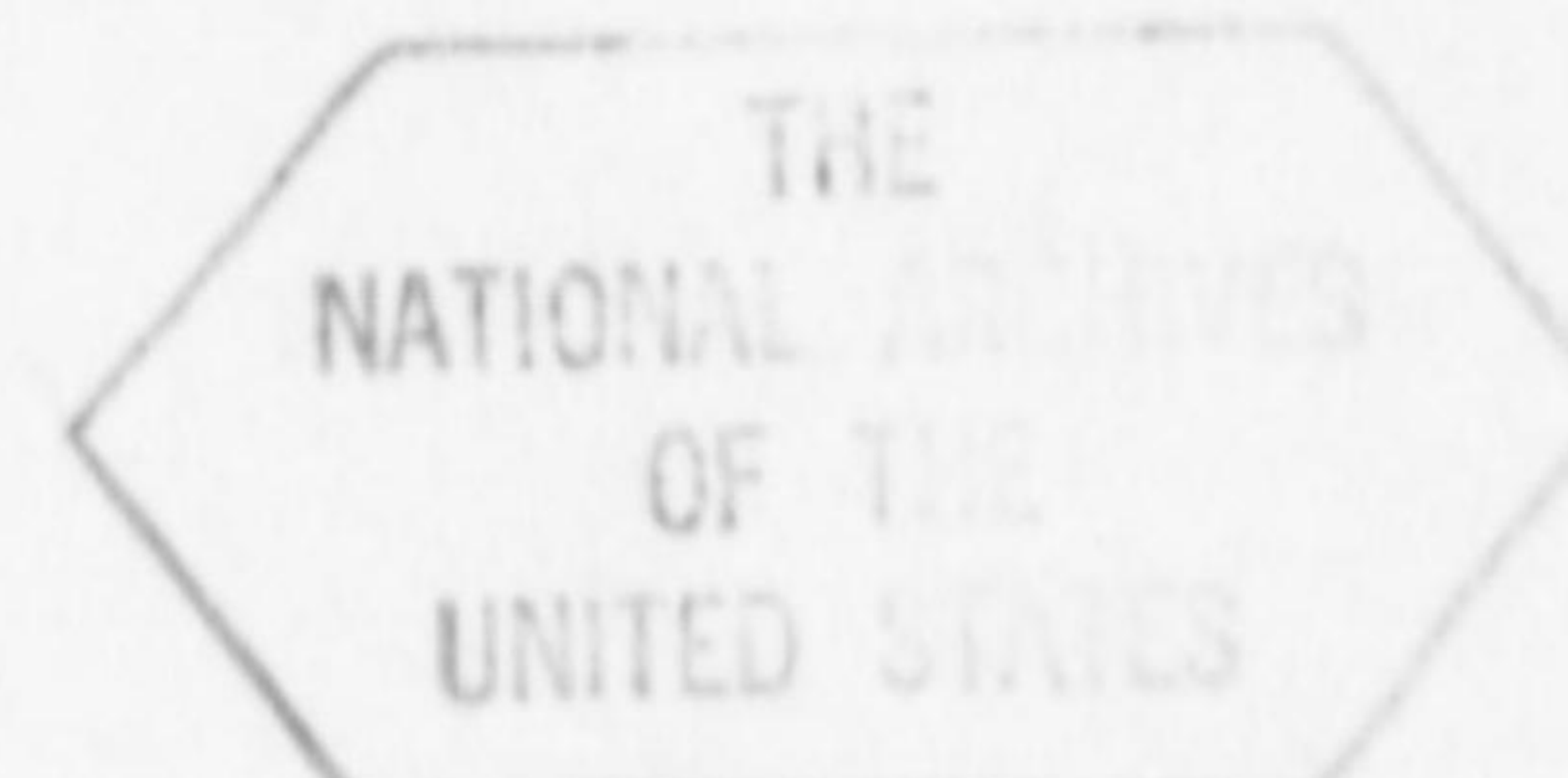

Mr. Scott reported 1/28/50
that he is leaving these
two men.

1. Mr. Scott says that this help is inadequate for the reason that no one of them can assume any responsibility. He would like to have one officer type DAC to handle nothing but courts and another officer type DAC to handle political parties and elections. The first political rumblings are heard in and around Osaka. It is so important to have some one with his finger on the pulse of political activity in that area. Mr. Scott is preparing a paper setting out a list of his activities and the things he has to do.

Some of the extraneous duties Mr. Scott is called upon to perform are listed below:-

- a. Koreans to be repatriated.
- b. Ryukyuan travel to and from the islands.
- c. Civil Guards used in dependent housing areas:
 - (1) Necessity for security.
 - (2) Payment of the Civil Guards.
 - (3) Procedures for acquiring.
- d. International Hunting Club.
- e. Foreign Traders Club - House Boat.
- f. Captive Balloons.
- g. Foreign Exchange Problems i.e., those of crew members and repatriates.
- h. Citizenship Problems
- i. Render opinions for other sections, personal as well as official.
- j. Questions from commercial entrants on housing extensions, etc.
- k. Japanese who lose lawsuits come in to ask for investigation of attorney or some other person wants a statement from a member of the occupation to use as a backing.
 1. Missionaries come in for advice.

- m. Questions that rightfully belong to G-2 or CIC, i.e., a Japanese reported the loss of a briefcase containing one and a half million yen and some secret papers. Mr. Scott was asked to find out what secret papers they were.
- ✓ n. Labor disputes, ruckus at plant, the Colonel says somebody should be arrested.
- o. Cases involving foreigners in general, some want to know how they can get to the USA etc.
- p. Korean School problem, both Japanese and Koreans come in with complaints and problems.
- ✓ q. Civil Liberties, a person is arrested and a newspaper article will say he was beaten and deprived of his rights - Mr. Scott refers him to Civil Liberties Committee.
- ? r. National Personnel Authority (this is a full time affair)
- s. Rehabilitation of persons who have served their time in jail or correctional institutions. Some come in wanting assistance. Premises have to be inspected etc.
- ✓ t. Fire Depts. - Fire Boards - want assistance in getting equipment or wish to have their premises inspected. There are 388 fire stations in Kinki Region.
- u. Venereal Disease - various units want the police to enforce V.D. control law, this problem has died down a bit.
- v. City Planning Commissions - working well on paper.
- ✓ w. Maritime Safety Commission - request for more ships to be used against smuggling craft which are diesel powered and believed to be armed, the present ships in use cannot compete with the smugglers.
- x. Customs people bring in problems i.e., requests for direct telephones to the Police. Disposition of items picked up (not so much lately)

2. Mr. Scott visits two prefectures each week, which means that he is out of his office two full days each week. Then, when he is in town, he spends about one half of his time in and around Osaka, visiting the Assembly, on surveillance of elections, with Public Safety Commission, Police and so on.

Mr. Scott reports that he is getting the Gazette very regularly now, but he simply does not get GHQ or FEC circulars.

Mr. Scott said he did not know that Mr. Cottrell was coming last week. Mr. Van Buskirk from PSD on prison investigation took his Dr. Ota, Japanese attorney, out for three days. Mr. Van Buskirk was due on the 21st but he came on the 13th. Mr. Fritz was due on the 20th, but he arrived on the 12th, etc.

A great number of topics were discussed with Mr. Scott. It was found in every instance that Mr. Scott had a thorough understanding of the problems being handled by Legal and Government Division. His main difficulty at the moment is not having any assistance in the great volume of work that comes into his office.
