
### NEW CATALOGUE


HINTS FOR FORCING: Buy only the very best at least 1½ inch up and order early. The bulbs for forcing are looked after in the fall, every one is examined and stored away at the right temperature until shipping time. YOUNG HIGHCROWNED BULBS are essential. Plant around the middle of January and put the Glads 5-6 inches apart. DON'T WATER THEM TOO MUCH, just keep them moist, you can give them plenty of water, when the buds show. Keep the buds at a carnation temperature. Sunshine is essential. Don't plant them where they are shaded too much. One of our customers planted his forcing Glads between his rows of Sweet Peas; at both ends the bulbs flowered well, in the middle many came blind.
