

1. In December 1947, Colonel O. D. Brown, who at that time was assigned to CIS Operations, received for distribution certain Secret Documents as follows: Five copies of The Third (Communist) International--Structure and Functions, four copies of The Third (Communist) International--Personnel, and five copies of The Illegal Apparatus of The Communist Party of Germany.

2. An entry in CIS log indicated that on 27 January 1948 a set of these documents was routed from CIS to EA/CIS, and at that time you were the Executive Assistant for CIS in G-2. A check of G-2 Central Files has failed to produce the documents which apparently were logged to you.

Ltr, AGRC 311.5, Hq 8th Army, APO 343, 18 Feb 49, subj:  
Report of Loss of Classified Document

1. The loss of certain documents emanating from Hq 5th AF resulted in an investigation and report thereon, and form the basis for present ltr fr Hqs 8th Army to AG DA thru CG, FEAF, dtd 18 Feb 49, subj: "Report of Loss of Classified Document", with 1st Ind thereon fr Hqs FEAF to AG DA thru CINCFE, dtd 28 Feb 49 denoting concurrence by CG, FEAF. Said loss came to the attn of CINCFE and G-2 on 7 Jan 49 under the following circumstances:

a. Hqs, 8th Army, fwded to CG, FEAF, thru CINCFE, ltr dtd 29 Dec 48, subj: "Loss of Classified Document", which reported the loss of a secret ltr fr Hqs, 5th AF, dtd 17 Jan 48, subj: "Request for Logistic Support". Said ltr requested Hqs, FEAF, to suggest recommendation to be used by the officer conducting the investigation in the preparation of his findings and the preparation of a recommendation to ~~the~~ the AG in compliance with Para 17, AR 380-5.

b. CINCFE by 1st Ind addressed to CG, FEAF, dtd 7 Jan 49, commented on the request contained in ltr mentioned in para a, supra, and recommended that the investigating officer be furnished pertinent available information relative to the case as an aid for finalizing the investigation and making a fitting recommendation thereon.

c. Hq, FEAF, by 2nd Ind to CG, 5th AF, dtd 27 Jan 49, fwded correspondence for compliance with request contained in ltr (para 1a) and recommendation contained in 1st Ind (para 1b).

d. CG, 5th AF and CG, FEAF, respectively, by 3rd and 4th Ind furnished the information requested in ltr (para 1a) and 1st Ind (para 1b).

e. CINCFE by 5th Ind fwded all correspondence to CG, 8th Army.

2. As a result of forwarding the correspondence as stated in 5th Ind (para 1e, supra), the investigating officer finalized the report of investigation and submitted the same to the CG, 8th Army. The CG, 8th Army thru CINCFE, is now forwarding the report of investigation to the AG, DA pursuant to para 17, AR 380-5.

3. A review of the file discloses that adequate measures have been taken to safeguard the security of the installations concerned and affected by the loss of the documents under consideration and further that adequate action has been taken to prevent similar recurrences.

4. CIS believes that the provisions of para 17, AR 380-5, have been fully complied with, concurs in the findings and recommendations of the investigating officer, and recommends that the Check 2nd Ind be fwded.
