Freight engineers and firemen, \$1.04 a day.

Yardmen, 18 cents an hour.

Passenger conductors, baggagemen, brakemen and flagmen,

Freight conductors, flagmen and brakemen, \$1.04 a day. All clerical and station employes received a similar increase as well as all employes on railway owned steamship lines.


