Coins and Medals.- Another interesting collection of coins and medals, including a fine series of the Napoleon medals aud a magnificent set of Russian medals and medallions, from Rurick, A.D. 864 to the present Czar, Alexander II., was yesterday disposed of at the rooms of Messrs. Sotheby, Wilkinson, and Hodge, in Wellingtonstreet. The following were the more important lots :68 and 69. Brouzo Medals. - Kings of France, from Pharamond to Louis Philippe, obv. portraits, of very fine work by Caqué; rev., the principal events in the life of each monarch severally inscribed; a splendid series, all in the best state, of uniform colour and large size. Louis XIV. and XV. A grand series, illustrating the historical events of their reigns, uniform in size and all fine-11l. 10s. (Loth). 73. The Napoleon medals - the Grand Mint series of medalsby Audrieu, 1)roz, Jeuffroy, and other celebnated artists; (140) extra medals and pieces (45); Joachimo Napoleon (Murat) (5); Liberation of Brescia, 1797 ; Napoleon; Napoleon and Marie Louise, medallions, and others by Andricu, struck in lead (three being electrotypes) (12), all very fine, together with an elegant cabinet (in which the above series are neatly fitted on blue velvet) of mahogany, en. cased in purple japanned metal, with bronze borders and corners, containing eight slides and two deep drawers, the upper having a lifting tray, all with japanced metal fronts and ivory handles, and lock and key; size, $15 \frac{1}{2}$ by $16 \frac{1}{2}$ and 11 in . high.
