Statement of Mr. YIEN WANG SZE, 47 years of age,
a native of Nanking, of 457 Ching Cheu Road -

My brother WANG SHIN YING was a member of the local Volunteer Corps, was caught by the Japanese when they first captured Nanking in 1937, and was bayoneted on the forehead about three times and several times on the spine. I saw this personally. He was in civilian clothes at the time, and was acting as a refugee. We were living at a refugee camp at time of the incident, situated YING YANG YING. He died almost immediately. The Volunteer Corps were raised to prevent looting. I saw bodies of other Chinese civilians nearby when this happened. The Corps was not a military body, but raised in city. This Statement was translated to me by Mr. George Lee and is correct.
