Title: Copy of Telegram from Ambassador NOMURA to Foreign Minister TOYODA received on 7th of Sep. 1941. (Tel. No. 788)

Outline:

I have visited in the forenoon on 6th Mr. Hull, the Secretary of the States, privately, and delivered him "Our View towards the Problem between Japan and U.S.A.", explaining that the document was made for the purpose of promoting the present negotiation and realizing the meeting of the Heads of both countries as quick as possible. And I stated that the view of our government towards the adjustment of diplomatic relations was explained in the Proposal of 6th Aug. and the Message of the Prime Minister of 28th and its Annexed Document, and I believed it was the utmost concession

of our Government, so that I desired to co-²operate to realize the prompt meeting of the Heads of both countries by displaying the statesmanship from the side of U. S. A..

Mr. Hull said to this, that he would study thoroughly in the week-end on the GREW report, and he desired Japanese Government would lead the public opinion to the direction of the adjustment of diplomatic relations between Japan and U. S. A..

With regard to the problem of publication of the mentioned meeting, Mr. Hull said ~~on the~~ ^{4th} in case of the interview on the 4th that it would be sufficient to make public the Heads of both countries were going to study on the foundation of the settlement of the Pacific problems, in order that the third powers would not mis^{so}understand about the negotiation. I think ^{accordingly} it will not be necessary to propose the retraction of the

the publication concerning the ^{(mentioned} negotiation.
