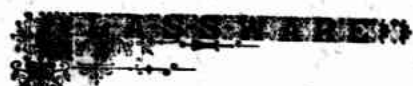

TO OUR READERS.

—:—

We are sorry to say that this, our first number, is not up to the standard that we intend to produce in a few weeks, when we get our office built and other things in working order.

It is not because our scissors and paste-pot are out of order, nor because we have no exchanges to dip from; nor is it because we have no local and original matter to publish that we give our readers less than we intended this week. It is because we require two more compositors. We hired one who disappointed us at the last moment, and although we have done our best, we have not yet been able to get one in his place.

In consequence of the scarcity of labour in Hillston, our office which should have been finished a month ago, is not yet commenced, and we cannot get our large machine at work until it is. We cannot get a carpenter to do some fitting up in our temporary office that would greatly facilitate matters, and enable the hands that we have employed, to work more expeditiously.

Our numerous friends and supporters are divided in opinion as to whether it would have been better for us to have postponed the publishing for a month longer, until we get the necessary arrangements completed for producing a first-class paper; or, whether it was better to adopt the present course. There is a good deal to be said on both sides; but considering that we had previously advertised it—that we had made arrangements for getting news, that our outlay would have been as great as if we were publishing, so we decided to produce something like this for a short time, when we will be prepared to produce a first-class country newspaper.

We hope that our numerous subscribers will overlook our shortcomings, and that the press will be lenient with us for the present and they will find that our promises are not like piecrusts.
