




II MARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of September, the 9th Engineer Battalion, LtCol H. E. PAREA commanding, had as its primary missions the repair and upgrading of RVN Route from Chu Lai to Thang Binh, support of Marine Corps and Army units in the Chu Lai T.OR, and the construction of a road network at ROKMC connecting all outlying camps to Brigade Headquarters.

"A" Company remained under the OPCON of the 7th Engineer Battalion at Hill 63.

Primary responsibility for upgrading the 16 miles of RVN Route #1 from Chu Lai (BT 522043) to the Tam Ky bridge (BT 330209) was delegated to "D" Company. During this reporting period "D" Company, with one platoon working out of Hill 54 and one platoon out of the battalion area, laid 9355 cubic yards of 1 3/4" rock over a distance of 4.76 miles and prepared an additional 3.60 miles to receive rock. Sections of the road between Hill 54 and the Tam Ky bridge were widened and drainage ditches added. The better sections of road were patched with asphalt from Hill 54 to the Tam Ky bridge. On 30 September 1967 "D" Company



removed it's one platoon (rein) from Hill 54 and relocated at Hill 29 (BT 227320), where its mission is to repair RVN Route #1 from Tam Ky north to Van An (BT 242318) a distance of 7.8 miles. "D" Company has expended 20,694 man hours on the upgrading and repair of RVN Route #1 with the following distribution of equipment hours.

"B" Company was assigned the project of the construction of a 21 mile road complex within the ROKMC camp connecting all outlying camps to Brigade Head-quarters. One platoon (-)(rein) was sent on 29 August 1967 and returned on 21 September 1967 with road construction complete. While at ROKMC, "B" Company heavy equipment expended 1076 man hours and 128 equipment hours, and motor transport expended 772 man hours while covering 6742 miles and hauling 605 loads (3025 yards) of fill. The ROKMC water point produced 351,000 gallons of water.

The remainder of "B" Company was used primarily in support of Army units in the Chu Lai TAOR. One culvert on Route #22 was completed on 2 September 1967, and one helopad was completed on 14 September 1967. The company is now in the process of constructing four (4) messhalls, one for the 94th SES Battalion, one for the 221st SES Company, and two (2) for the 3/16th Artillery with 17 strongbacks. Also under construction is one shower and water tower for the 163rd Light Truck Company. On 29 - 30 September 1967 "B" Company replaced 4 culverts north of Tam Ky and on 2 October 1967 one platoon departed for Hill 29 to reinforce two tactical bridges from class 40 to class 60.

Between 1 September and 11 September 1967 "C" Company completed construction of one helopad end one 16' x 16' hut. Also under construction were two tropical huts, one maintenance shed, one ASF road, and one messhall for the 221st SaS Company. On 11 September 1967 these jobs were re-assigned to "B" and "D" Companies as "C" Company departed for Hill 10 (BT 199390) to repair RVM Route in from Hill 29 (BT 217320) to Thang Binh (BT 175418), a distance of 7.5 miles.



During the month even with increased enemy iniated incidents, the 9th Engineer Battalion was able to maintain the movement of traffic over RVN Route $\sqrt{1}$, the road never remaining closed for a period of greater than four hours.

2. CIVIC ACTION

Winth Engineer Battalion personnel with the assistance of one Vietnamese nurse, provided medical assistance to 165 residents of Tich Tay (BT 496053). Personal assistance to the villagers of Tich Tay consisted of 200 pounds of candy, 2 cases of cookies, 125 pounds of clothing, 20 pairs of shoes, 50 sewing kits, 2026 bars of soap, 6 volleyball kits, and 400 bottles of Micrin mouthwash. Thirtynine truck loads of scrap lumber were given to the Buddhist school in An Tan.

Two residents of Tich Tay were evacuated to Alang Ngai via 1st Hospital Company, one man for suspected appendicitis and one girl for suspected tuberculosis.

The wiring of a church in Chu Lai (BT 504052) has been completed, while repair and painting of the Tich Tay dispensary is 80% and 20% complete respectively.

Immediate plans called for the replacement of bridges \$\frac{1}{2}\$1 (PT 185406), \$\frac{1}{2}\$25 (FT 196392), and \$\frac{1}{2}\$24 (BT 201384), all of which are currently under construction with bypasses in place. To date "C" Company has compiled 9,135 man hours and 520 equipment hours in establishing their camp site which is 95% complete. The three bridges being constructed are 60% (\$\frac{1}{2}\$1), 5% (\$\frac{1}{2}\$23), and 5% (\$\frac{1}{2}\$24) completed with an expended 1820 man hours and 524 equipment hours. "C" Company also replaced a double 36" culvert at BT 217363, and repaired the road at locations of 5 mine incidents.

During September the two rock crushers have been operated by 13 - 15 members of the Heavy Equipment Platoon from Headquarters Company. The 15 TPH crusher has operated 143 hours, producing 2020 yards of 2" rock. The 50 TPH has run 132 hours producing 2635 yards of 2" rock. Total man hours were 3512 and total equipment hours 1049. The 600 CFM compressor and rock drill have run 104 hours each, the M-37 crane 241 hours, the Euclid dump trucks 166 hours, and the TD-18 tractor 158 hours. The total amount of rock shot was 5673 yards using 6000 pounds of dynamite, 1500 feet of detonating cord, and 148 blasting caps.

The Utilities Platoon of Service Company has operated seven (7) water points producing 7,430,555 gallons of water. They have also done the electrical wiring and plumbing in conjunction with all work orders received by this battalion.

During the month of September there were five bridges and eight culverts blown on RVN Route #1 in the 9th Engineer Battalion's area of responsibility. There were also nine enemy mine incidents at locations other than culverts and bridges. Mines resulted in 19 USMC WIA, 14 Vietnamese KIA, and 1 Vietnamese WIA. The 9th Engineer Battalion captured four VC suspects and eight confirmed VC, all of whom were turned over to the Americal Division. There were seven incidents of sniper fire resulting in 2 enemy WIA probable, 1 enemy KIA probable and 1 USMC WIA. Company "C" received incoming mortar rounds at their position on Hill 10 on two occasions resulting in 20 WIA; 18 USMC, 1 USN and 1 USA. Fourteen casualties were medically evacuated.

There were three (3) two man demolition and mine detector teams sent to work with 1st Reconnaissance Battalion on Hills 403 and 707 resulting in two (2) 9th Engineer Battalion WIA.

During the month of September the 9th Engineer Battalion dropped 9 officers and 73 enlisted men and joined 9 officers and 68 enlisted men.

The 3rd Platoon, 1st Bridge Company remained in direct support of the battalion. On 29 September this platoon replaced a four (4) float, 118'4" long floating bridge with a class 70/75, 120 foot span M-6 bridge at BT 225348.





Eleven hours of Anglish language classes were held for 9 adults and 16 children. There are in addition 24 Vietnamese workers under vocational training and 4 Vietnamese workers attending a 7 week English language school. Those under vocational training include 14 carpenters, 7 masons, 1 carpenter tool room attendant, and 2 automotive servicemen.

The children's mid-autumn festival was attended by LtCol H. E. FERGA, Battalion Commanding Officer and Captain R. A. BLUTENKRANTZ, Civil Affairs Officer. All officials of Tich Tay Hamlet were present together with Mr DAT, committee member from Ky Lien Village. Two hundred pounds of hard candy and 500 cookies were distributed in conjunction with the cookies and candy given by officials of Ky Lien Village. After the ceremony the children and villagers in need of medical aid were treated by the 9th Engineer Battalion LEDCAP team. In all, forty-one people were treated. An ISO photographer was present during the entire ceremony and MEDCAP visit. The complete ceremony went smoothly and the people were very friendly and grateful.


4. TRAINING

In compliance with the 9th Engineer Battalion training SOP, each company holds three classes of General Military Subjects type training and two hours of technical training every week.
