In the N. Y. Herald of the 15th ult., we find a list and description of the vessels now in course of construction, from which we extract the following, as those in which our own commerce is more particularly interested:

Mr. W. H. Webb has just put up the frame of a clipper ship for Messra. Bucklin and Crane. This vessel is to be built with capabilities for any trade that her owners may see fit to place her in. At present it is contemplated to send her to California and China. She will be constructed with extra strength, with iron diagonal braces, and will be of about 2600 tons (carpenter's) measurement. Her length is 225 feet, 40 feet wide, and 22 feet deep. She will be launched about the end of June.

Mr. Webb has also just laid the keel of a clipper ship for Mr. Jas. W. Phillips. She will be a three decker, and will also be built with iron diagonal braces, and otherwise strongly built, so as to be fit for either California, Liverpool, or any other trade. She will be about 2000 tons; her length will be 220 feet, breadth 40 feet, and width 25 1-2 feet.

The same builder is also progressing with the large clipper ship for N. L. & G. Griswold. Her inside planking is nearly completed.

Messss. Westervelt & Mackey just put up the frame work of a clipper ship for Messrs. Chamberlain & Phelps' to be employed in the California and China trade. Length of her keel, 200 feet; breadth of beam 40 feet; hold

Aaron J. Westervelt, foot of Houston street, has just laid the keel of a China clipper ship, and has also on hand a boat for the Houston street and Williamsburgh ferry. W. H. Brown, foot of Twelfth street, has

nearly completed the yacht for the World's Fair. She is already planked, and will be launched in about three weeks. The other yacht, constructing for himself, is in the same state of forwardness, and will shortly be ready. The steamer for California, of the same size as the Pacific, (now about sailing for San Francisco) is also near completion. She is receiving

her outside planking.

Messrs. Perine, Patterson & Stack, of Williamsburgh, will have ready by the middle of next month, the clipper ship Lightning, built for Messrs. MANUFACTURE OF JEWELRY IN NEW JERsey .- The Newark Advertiser thus speaks of the extent and value of this branch of manufactures in New Jersey:

"A recent estimate puts the number of manufactories at eighteen, employing six hundred hands, whose average wages, including boys, amounts to \$12 a week. The weekly product of manufactured articles is about \$35, 000, or \$1,820,000 a year. In the manufacture of watch cases alone, about fifty hands are employed. In some manufactories chains are de, in others principally rings, while in others, almost every article yet invented for the adornment of the persons of both sexes, are manufactured. The gold used for a year past has been mostly the product of Culifornia, brought here assayed and in bars; the precious stones, forming a part of the ornaments, are imported from Europe ready cut for use. erroneous idea, we understand, is prevalent in relation to the increase of value of all the gold nanufactured into jewelry. A large number of articles prove to be unsalcable and out of fashion, and when that occurs they are remelted and sent to the mint for coinage.

The net amount we have not the means o rectly ascertaining, but it appears that the va-rious bounty land acts passed will absorb 79,000,000 acres, which the Secretary of the Treasury assures us will cut off the receipts of the Treasury for sixteen years to come. The grants of swamp lands to Missouri, Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Florida, and other States, will probably be equal to 40,000-000 acres more. Again, one-half of the Northwestern territory being elevated prairies, without wood or water, that amount should be deducted-for it is hardly to be presumed that for centuries to come, they can be turned to any practical account-that deduction reduces the Northwest territory to 188,000,000 acres. In Oregon, a free farm law to actual settlers exists; and besides, two-thirds of that territory is composed of uninhabitable mountains and deserts. New Mexico is out of the question. All accounts agree that there is not an acre of available public land in New Mexico. Mr. Downs himself leaves out Utah. No useful public domain is to be found there unappropriated. The Indian territory belongs to the ndians. And what with the claims of old Spanish and Mexican settlers, and all sorts of squatters in California, and taking into the estimate that three-fourths of her surface are mountains and deserts, California, too, may as well be left out of the estimate. Emigration to California.

The N. Y. Herald of the 13th ult., in very sensible article on the emigration to California, and the prospects of our new State, closes with the following remarks:

" As like causes produce like effects, and as human nature is much the same throughout the world, we may look for a very extensive emigration from the old world—especially from Great Britain and France—to California, during the ensuing season. Nor will it be a pauper emigration; for paupers cannot raise the amount necessary to transport themselves and families to New York, thence to the Isthmus of Panama, and thence to San Francisco. But many of thoso who, in those countries, are termed the middle classes, can scrape together the neces sary sum for the passage of themselves and families to the gold region; and of that class will the emigration of the ensuing summer be principally composed. California may, therefore, expect a vast accession to her population during the present year, and a preportionate addition of real, substantial wealth. What she needs are bone and sinew to develope her agricultural, as well as her vast mineral resources.
