


1.0 History

Approach




Start with: what's happening in the world around us? Look outward. Identify the key External Trends impacting our work.



Anchor in Movement Strategy. Tie to Knowledge Equity and Knowledge as a Service. Align more closely with the Movement Strategy recommendations.



Focus on Product + Tech. Re-center support for communities and volunteers through our unique role in enabling product and technology at scale.



Take a longer view. Ground our annual plan in multi-year planning. Consider longer-term trends for our revenue model, tech strategy, and movement roles / responsibilities.




2.0 External Trends

External Trends



Search and Content

Personality-driven social platforms (*TikTok*, *Instagram*) continue to draw younger audiences away from traditional search engines.

The explosion of sophisticated AI could benefit knowledge creation + consumption – but creates uncertainty for our role in the knowledge ecosystem.



Disinformation

Information warfare is intensifying. Wikimedia has become a target, with dedicated attacks against the movement + individual volunteers.



Regulation

Our legal environment is shifting. More is demanded of hosting providers than ever before – and lawmakers aren't considering the impact on Wikipedia.


