My dear Senator Bilbo:

I have received your letter of July 15, 1945 with which you enclosed a letter from the Mayor of Jackson, Mississippi, suggesting that the United States and the Soviet Union try to persuade Japan to transfer American prisoners of war to the Soviet Union or to some neutral country until the end of the war.

There is every reason to believe that the Soviet Government would be willing to assist this Government in any arrangement to have our prisoners of war transferred from the dangerous areas in Japan and Manchuria to the Soviet Union. There is also every reason to believe that most neutral countries would be willing to assist this Government in any arrangements which could be made to send American prisoners of war from Japan and Japanese-controlled territory to a neutral country. As you know, however, the Japanese Government has consistently rejected proposals of this nature. I do not think it likely that the Japanese Government will, in the future, consent to the release of able-bodied prisoners of war held by Japan, since the Japanese Government has refused to repatriate even seriously sick and seriously wounded prisoners in accordance with its commitments.

Please assure the Mayor of Jackson that his Government is doing everything possible for the protection of American prisoners of war held by the Japanese. It will not abate its efforts in any particular, no matter how discouraging the circumstances may appear. There is enclosed for your information ~~an information sheet~~ in

MEMORANDUM

HIS MAJESTY'S MINISTER, BERNE.

In its note No. 138/175/44 of 26th August, 1944, His Majesty's Legation in Berne requested the Swiss Government to protest to the Japanese Government against an order dated 11th February, 1944, issued to the Japanese forces in Siam, that all captured crews of enemy aircraft were not to be treated as prisoners of war and that all of them except those of whom special use could be made, were to be severely dealt with by the local military authorities.

In its note No. B. 52.GBr.(15) 5P CA/De of 15th December, 1944, the Federal Political Department were good enough to transmit a reply from the Japanese Minister for Foreign Affairs asserting that the order of 11th February, 1944 did not exist.

His Majesty's Government have now the honour to transmit a photostatic copy of the order in question together with a translation. The enclosed reproduction of a photograph (recovered from the wallet of a dead Japanese soldier) of an Allied airman being executed at some unstated place is further conclusive evidence that the order, or a similar one, was put into effect by the Japanese military authorities.

His Majesty's Government accordingly request that Monsieur Gorge will show the photostatic copy of the order to the Japanese Minister for Foreign Affairs and the reproduction of the photograph and renew his protest in the strongest possible terms against the policy laid down in the order, which is a flagrant violation of the customs of war and indeed of the ordinary rules of humanity.

TRANSLATION OF JAPANESE ORDER OF 11th FEBRUARY, 1944.

With the recent intensification of enemy counter-attacks, air-raids on operational areas in Burma have become increasingly severe. These raids are not made against troops or military establishments but are blind and savage attacks on innocent local inhabitants and non-combatants and their property. When crews of aircraft making these attacks are captured by us they will therefore not be treated as prisoners of war but, after the necessary investigations have been made, they will be handed over to the military police and all, except those of whom special use can be made, will be severely dealt with by the local military authorities. It is accordingly desired that these men should be treated separately from ordinary prisoners of war and that care should be exercised in regard to their quartering and also in regard to the handling of requests concerning the manner in which they are to be used and in the handling of reports (despatches), documents, etc. concerning them.

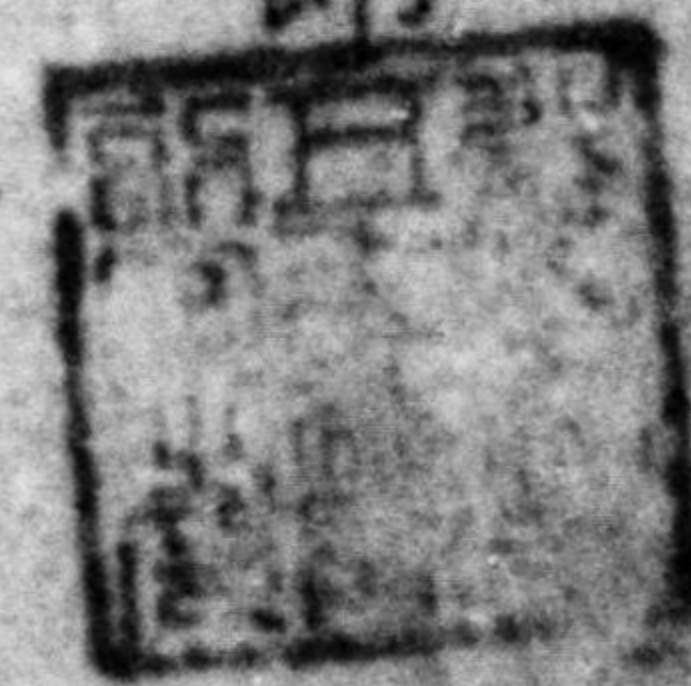

My dear Mr. Ranken:

I have received your letter of July 16, 1945, enclosing the text of a note, with its enclosures, which the British Government proposes to send to the Swiss Government requesting that the Swiss Minister at Tokyo renew his protest against the policy laid down in the order issued to the Japanese Commanding Officer of Kamibara Tai with regard to the treatment to be accorded to captured airmen in that theater. You ask whether this Government has any objection to this renewed protest being made, or any comment to make in this regard.

Officers of the Department are of the opinion that on the basis of the new documentary evidence furnished by the British Government, a renewed protest should be made to the Japanese Government. Since the Japanese order refers to Allied military personnel and since the nationality of the airman in the photograph you propose to forward with your protest apparently is not known, I believe that it would strengthen Minister Gorge's position if he might inform the Japanese Government that the United States Government associates itself with the British Government in making this protest. If the British Government concurs with this point of view, suitable instructions will be sent to the American Legation in Bern.

My dear Senator Wagner:

I have received your letter of July 16, 1945 enclosing a copy of a letter dated July 5, 1945 from Mr. Henry Motyka, 144 Ralph Avenue, Brooklyn, New York. Mr. Motyka states that he has learned through the medium of the newspapers and radio of the capture in Europe of a group of Japanese diplomats who are to be exchanged for Lieutenant General Jonathan Wainwright, and protests such an exchange.

I can assure you that the Department has the greatest sympathy for those whose loved ones are prisoners of the Japanese and it is the responsibility of the State Department to do what can be done to alleviate the hardships of American citizens who are held by the Japanese Government. In this connection you may be interested to read the enclosed summary of measures that have been taken by the Department of State in behalf of American nationals in an endeavor to ship relief supplies to them and to bring about their repatriation.

There is no truth in the report that the Japanese officials captured in Germany are to be exchanged for General Wainwright to the exclusion of any other Americans. It is hoped, however, that the presence in American hands of these officials may be helpful to us in our efforts to bring about further exchanges of prisoners between our Government and the Japanese.

As I feel that if he could receive even a small amount of money that it would help him to obtain any extras that he or his companions might need. I would like to be advised whether I can remit a sum of money to him direct or through my friend, Mr. Fontanell.

If it is permissible, I would like instructions how to send remittance.

AMERICAN INTERESTS FAR EAST

Foreign Office note July 16 states according telegram from Gorge Suzuki has announced War Ministry agrees in principle Swiss Minister visits POW camps territories occupied Japanese. (Legation's 3529 July 12 and 3549 July 13)

Japanese envision authorizing to begin with visits camps Thailand, Singapore subject as regards dates military necessity.

Foregoing decision confirmed by note Japanese Legation, Bern reading follows:

"As regards internee and POW camps regions occupied Japanese forces, authorization visit will be accorded to extent not incompatible with strategic reasons and according principle reciprocity.

The Acting Secretary of State brings to the attention of the Legation the following instances in which prisoner of war lists received by the Prisoner of War Information Bureau of the War Department from the Japanese Government, through the intermediary of the International Red Cross Committee, have contained conflicting information, or letters received from the individuals named have been at variance with information transmitted by the Japanese authorities:

First Lt. John D. Mullaney, O-359508, US/202 POW P.I.; US/3197 transferred to Fukuoka (survivor Dec. sinking); US/3221 killed - sinking Dec. ship.

Pvt. Edgar H. Carter, 14045153, US/330 POW P.I. reported lost October ship on US/3189, but with ASN 17014186, assigned to James C. Carter who is reported US/916 as transferred P.I. to Tokyo.

CPHM Arthur Wells, Jr., 346-31-06, US/530 POW, P.I., US/3196 lost Dec. sinking, NOK has POW communication from him dated 1943 at Hoten Camp. There is a Pvt. Arthur Wells, 6978412 US/329 P.I. US/838 Hoten Camp who has also sent broadcast messages from Hoten July 17, 1944, and Feb. 22, 1945.

First Lt. Franklyn W. Bovey, O-398464, US/201 POW P.I.; US/3188 with ASN O-329357 as lost October ship sinking. Capt. Frank W. (Watter) Bovee, O-329357 US/196 POW P.I. on US/3197 as transferred to Fukuoka.

Second Lt. Thomas R. Kennedy, O-890346; US/3221 killed - sinking Dec. ship; letter from him indicated that he was a POW at Osaka in Sept. 1944.
