LIGHT HOUSES.

Commissioners for Light Houses in the Bay of Fundy :—Robert W. Crookshank, Thomas Barlow, John Ward, junior, Lauchlan Donaldson, and W. F. W. Owen, Esquires.

Commissioners for Partridge Island and the Beacon Light Houses :—John Ward, Junior, and Lauchlan Donaldson, Esquires.

Cape Sable Seal Island Light.—The first Light, in approaching the Bay of Fundy, is on the South Point of the Seal Island. This light is elevated about 80 feet above high water mark, and may be seen in approaching the island from any point of the compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks, called *Blonde Rock*, lies about two miles S. S. W. by compass, from the Light House. Between this rock and the island, there are some dangers—the ground is rocky throughout ; and large vessels, therefore, ought not to attempt passing between them.

Brier Island Light.—In advancing up the Bay, the next light is situated on Brier Island, about half a mile N.E. from the N.W. point thereof, with an improved Lantern and Lamp. This light will therefore be much more beneficial to the trade of the Bay than formerly.

Annapolis Gut Light.—The next Light on the coast of Nova Scotia is placed on the West side of the Gut of Annapolis—from Brier Island North Eastward. The coast is very bold and not indented : the Light is, therefore, chiefly intended as a guide into Annapolis Basin. The lamps and lanterns were renewed in the Spring of 1835, and reflectors furnished, so that the light is in excellent order.

* * The above three Lights are each single, fixed, and show *white* Lights.

Gannet Rock Light.—This Light bears from the Light on Brier Island, N. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 21 miles. It is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Island off Machias, a distance of about 20 miles.

Bearings from the Gannet Rock Light House.

- To the Old Proprietor, which dries at $\frac{3}{4}$ ebb, (very dangerous,) E. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. 7 miles.
- „ Black Rock, (always above water 25 feet), off White Head, N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E.
- „ South West Head of Grand Manan, N. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.
- „ Northernmost of the Murr Ledges, (dry at two thirds ebb,) N. W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.
- „ Southernmost of ditto, called St. Mary's Ledge, (always out of water), S. W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.
- „ Machias Seal Island Lights, distant about 13 miles, W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N.

NOTE.—Between the Northernmost and Southernmost of the Murr Ledges, there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them always above water, and which extend westward from the light house about four miles ; from this range, farther Westerly, about 8 miles, lies a dangerous breaker, called the Roaring Bull. This may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands, near the S. W. end of Grand Manan, open.—The red glass having been removed from the

Lantern, there is now a flash light, WHITE, and three times in each minute.

Head Harbour Light.—Next in order after passing Grand Manan, is Head Harbour Light. This is placed on the N. E. extremity of Campo Bello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the inner Bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels also at all times to enter Head Harbour, it is a fixed *white* Light.

Point Le Preau Lights.—Upon this projecting Head Land, two Lights have been lately placed, one above the other, and distant eighteen feet.

—Both lights can be seen from every point of the Compass, where they may be useful—both are fixed and *white*.

Partridge Island Light.—This Light, at the entrance of the River and Harbour of Saint John, having been established upwards of forty years, requires no particular notice, further than it is a fixed *white* Light.

Beacon Light.—Within Partridge Island, and upon a Spit or Bar, which extends about half a mile S. S. E. of Sand Point, and which dries at two thirds ebb, stands the Beacon Tower. Upon this Tower a Light is established, which is eminently useful to the coasting trade of Saint John, and to all other vessels having pilots on board, as it enables them to enter the harbour at all hours of the night.—It is a fixed *white* Light.

Quaco.—A revolving *white* Light is placed on a small rock off Quaco Head, shewing twice full and twice dark in a minute. The light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach.

West Quoddy Light.—This is an American Light, and is placed on the West side of the entrance into the Saint Croix by Lubec and Eastport;—a new light house has lately been erected here, and the Light much improved.

Two fixed *white* Lights, upon the Machias Seal Island, were put into operation in 1832—they are elevated about 45 feet above high water, and bear from each other E. S. E. and W. N. W. distant about 200 feet, by which they will be immediately distinguished from all other Lights upon the coast, (British or American,)—the following are the bearings from them, viz:—

To the Southernmost Murr Ledge, (St. Mary's) E. S. E. easterly.

“ Gannet Rock Light, E. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. 13 miles.

“ Southern head of Grand Manan, E. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N.

“ Northern head of Grand Manan, N. E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

“ N. E. Rock, distant 2 miles, N. E. by N.

“ Little River Head, N. by W.

“ Libby Island Light House, (American,) N. W. by W.

☞ Vessels in standing in to the Northward, between these Lights and the Gannet Rock, should tack or haul off the moment they bring these Lights in one, as they will then not be more than three-fourths of a mile from the Murr Ledges, if more than five miles to the East of the Lights.

Light Houses in Nova-Scotia—in addition to those previously noticed.

Sambro—Sambro Island, mouth of Halifax Harbour—a fixed Light.

Roscoway—M'Nutt's Island, mouth of Shelburne Harbour—two Lights, one above the other.

Liverpool—Coffin's Island, mouth of Liverpool Harbour—one revolving Light.
Canso—Island, Gut of Canso, two Lights, one above the other.
Halifax—Meagher's Beach, Halifax—one Light.
Pictou—Entrance to Pictou Harbour—one fixed Light, for eight months in the year.
Cross Island—Cross Island, near Lunenburg.
Low Point—Entrance to Sydney Harbour—one fixed Light.

SIGNALS.

Displayed at Partridge Island, and repeated at the Tower in Carleton, on the approach of Vessels to the Harbour of Saint John :—

One Ball close, for one square-rigged Vessel.
 One Ball half hoisted for two ditto,
 Two Balls close, for three ditto,
 Two Balls separated for four ditto,
 A Pendant of any colour, for five ditto,
 A ditto under a Ball, for six ditto,
 A ditto over a Ball half hoisted, for seven ditto,
 A ditto under two Balls close, for eight ditto,
 A ditto under two Balls separate, for nine ditto,
 A Flag of any colour, for ten or more ditto,

The above are displayed at the East or West yard arm, according to the direction in which the Vessels are at first observed, and as soon as their rig can be distinguished, descriptive Colours will be hoisted at the mast head, in the following order:—

A Union Jack, with a white Pendant over, for a small armed vessel.
 A blue Pendant for a Merchant Ship.
 A red ditto, for a Merchant Brig.
 A white and blue ditto, for a Foreign Vessel.
 A white ditto, (without a ball,) for a Topsail Schooner or Sloop.
 A red Flag pierced white, for a Steam Boat from Saint Andrews and Eastport.
 A Ball at the mast head, Vessel is on shore or in distress.
 ☞ Should immediate aid be necessary, guns to be fired.
 In foggy weather, a gun will be fired from Partridge island, in return for each heard at sea. Should a vessel require a Pilot, her descriptive Pendant will be displayed at a yard arm, in the place of a Ball.

RATES OF PILOTAGE,

Established by a Law or Ordinance of the Common Council of the City of Saint John, passed July, 1835.

Five Shillings per foot, for bringing any ship or vessel into the Harbour of Saint John, and mooring her in a safe place or berth, or securing her alongside of one of the wharves; and five shillings per foot for removing and taking any ship or vessel out of the harbour.

In cases where Pilots shall be detained on board of vessels, under and by virtue of the Quarantine or Health Laws of the Province, they shall be entitled to demand and receive from the Masters of such vessels, the sum of Ten Shillings per day, for every day of such detention, in addition to the allowance aforesaid.

Coasting vessels, going from one part of the Bay of Fundy to another, British or Foreign steam-boats, or British vessels drawing under six feet of water, are not compelled to take Pilots: when employed, they are to be paid according to the rate above mentioned.

For removing vessels from any mooring ground to any wharf, or from one wharf to another wharf, and seeing them properly moored or secured, the following rates: For vessels not exceeding 100 tons, 7s. 6d.; for vessels over 100, and not exceeding 200 tons, 10s.; for vessels over 200, and not exceeding 300 tons, 15s.; and for all vessels over 300 tons, the sum of 20s.

. TIME FOR GOING THROUGH THE FALLS,

(NEAR THE CITY OF SAINT JOHN.)

The Falls are level (or still water), at about 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ hours on the *flood*, and about 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ on the *ebb*, which makes them passable four times in twenty-four hours, about ten or fifteen minutes each time.—No other rule can be given, as much depends on the floods in the River Saint John, and the time of high water or full sea, which is often hastened by high winds, and in proportion to the height of them.

CULTURE OF THE MIND.

Mind makes the man—
Want of it, the fellow.

THIS motto, somewhat altered from Pope, has a peculiar bearing upon the agriculturist. The farmer possesses all the privileges, and most of the advantages, of other classes of the community; and if he will improve his mind, his influence will be as potent, and his example as salutary, as the influence and example of any other profession. The richest natural soil will produce neither bread nor meat without culture. The highest natural gifts of intellect will not profit the possessor, unless, like the rich soil, they are cultivated with assiduity and care. Good culture not only improves the mind, and fits it for high mental gratification and enjoyment, but it lightens the toils, and greatly increases the profits of labor. Franklin owed his fame, his fortune, and his usefulness, to his early habits of study, of industry, and of virtue. Without these early habits, he probably would have risen to neither fame nor fortune. Some minds, like some soils, are naturally richer than others; yet even apparently sterile minds, like infertile soils, may, by good culture, be made to yield great returns. Let the young farmer, then, aspire to the highest honors of the nation, by endeavoring to improve his intellectual faculties; and if he does not attain the goal of his wishes, he may be sure of greatly improving his condition and of benefiting others, provided always, that he is industrious and honest. Let, then; no young aspirant for fame and usefulness, shun rural employment, because it does not feed his hopes of distinction, and let no one engaged in this employment, forego the opportunity which his condition presents, of cultivating his mind, as the surest means of sinking *the fellow*, and rising to the dignity of *the man*.

WHO WOULD NOT BE A FARMER?—In that glad season, when the earth is all around bursting into life and beauty, and nature is keeping holiday—when winter is over, and vegetation is waking again from its deathlike sleep—when the birds sing their matin song from every bush, and man himself wakes to new life amid the activity around, *who would not be a Farmer?* For him, and almost for him alone, bloom the fair flowers in nature's field—for him the feathered songster pours her sweetest note, and for him the face of creation wears a constant smile.

Not so with the inhabitant of cities, or with the professional man or the man of business, any where. These are shut out from the blessed influences of nature. Their business is with men—restless, ambitious, and ostentive dishonest men—they themselves are all engaged in the eager scramble for wealth and distinction, sometimes caring little whom they thrust down with their unhallowed tread, so they may mount upon the wreck, and they lose the salutary lesson of benevolence which may be learned from the ways of Providence in the outward world. They must maintain a constant struggle with temptation, or yield to its power. Accustomed to so much of *evil*, they are sometimes almost tempted to deny the existence of *good*. But the farmer pursues the “even tenor of his way,” undisturbed by the passions of men. His dealings are with nature, and he may, if he will not shut his heart against it, learn true wisdom from its teachings. In the springing grass, the opening flower, and the ripening harvest—in sunshine and in shower—he may see a token of God’s love and goodness, and in the quiet of his own home, he may almost forget the existence of *evil*. Thus widely different are the conditions of the two classes spoken of. Yet we sometimes find farmers discontented with their lot, and eager to join with their fellows in the feverish excitement of trade and speculation. And very often we see young men impatient to leave their paternal acres, and to seek, as they vainly think, some more honorable or genteel mode of earning a living. They had rather show a lily-white hand to a lady, as they measure off a yard of tape, than exhibit a manly, muscular frame, with a hand which does not shrink from contact with implements of husbandry. It has, indeed, become one of the greatest errors of our time, that young men are deserting the true nobility of the country, for the sake of wearing a more delicate complexion, or living, as they vainly hope, more at their ease. Hence it is that all trades and professions are overstocked, that we have more lawyers than clients, more doctors than patients and more parsons than parishes. We hear men complain of hard times, mechanics cannot find situations, yet the country is actually suffering, and very severe too, for a want of proper attention to farming, and why is it? Because many a man who should have followed the plough, has become too proud for that, and in his aspiration to be a gentleman has undertaken to wield a pen or administer cataplasms and boluses. To this state of things, too, is to be attributed to some extent, the present scarcity and high prices of provisions. The production has been allowed to fall below the consumption, and this great producing country, with its spare population, has presented the strange anomaly of importing bread-stuffs from the thick settled countries of Europe. It is all wrong. Young men should be taught to regard the employment of their fathers as one of the most honorable in the world.

Your farmer is the independent man. What cares he for hard times, or high prices? Banks may fail—merchants’ notes may be protested, and their drafts dishonored, but “Seedtime and Harvest,” that old and stable firm, shall never “fail”—drafts upon them are answered at sight; and the bank of nature, where the farmer makes his deposits, is “good as gold,” and always discounts liberally. He laughs at, or more likely pities, those who are left at the mercy of the times, and compelled to eat the bread of carefulness. Beer at eight pence a pound, and other edibles in proportion, does not worry him. He

takes the favors Providence so bountifully bestows upon him, and asks few of his fellows. While want afflicts the rest of the world, he may snap his fingers in his face, as much as to say, "Who cares for you?"

POTATOES.—The potato is unquestionably the most valuable root cultivated by man. It is grown with little care, yields good crops, can be grown in almost every variety of soil, and its nutritive properties are not exceeded by any other root either for man or beast. Though it can be cultivated with little care, and though almost any soil will produce potatoes, there are few crops that in both quantity and quality better repay an extra attention they may receive than this root.

The potato, like most other cultivated plants, delight in a strong rich loam, and other circumstances being equal, such a soil will usually produce one fourth more than one very tenacious and heavy, or very light and sandy. In new settled districts large crops of potatoes are grown in soils that contain great supplies of vegetable mould, but experience would seem to justify the opinion that in such soils the quality of the potato is rarely first rate. A grass ley—clover is the best—has been found when properly prepared and manured, to be excellent for this crop; and if the soil is rather moist than otherwise, it is considered as increasing the chances of a good yield. Countries that have naturally a cool moist atmosphere are found to produce far better potatoes than those that have a dry and high temperature. Thus Ireland, surrounded as it is by the ocean, and necessarily of a low and equable climate, is famous for its potatoes; and of this continent, the part most famed for the quality of this root is New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, which districts are noted for the moisture of the climate. With any part of the northern or middle States, however, the fault of not having them in sufficient quantity, must be traced to the negligence of the farmer, rather than to any deficiencies of soil or climate.

The preparation of a field for the potato is simple. If a grass ley sufficiently rich without manuring, a rare case with this crop, the sod may be carefully turned over, rolled down, and then the surface earth loosened with a fine harrow, in which the tubers or sets are to be planted. If it requires manuring, let the manure, and this should be long rather than short, be evenly spread over the ground; with the plough make a furrow, and into this let one hand haul the manure to the requisite width, while another drops the seed potatoes on the manure so placed in the furrow. This row is covered by the plough, and the operation is repeated until all are planted. Corn on the ley is generally preferred, and roots well manured after the corn. The first in the rotation may depend on convenience, as the turf is excellent for either.

Beans and Bean Poles.—Most bush beans should be planted in rotten, poor ground—otherwise they will run too much to top, and too little to fruit. But pole beans require a rich soil, as they are designed to run luxuriantly.

The best pole bean that runs—indeed the best bean of any sort—is the Sieva or Butter bean; but this requires a long season, and will not generally come to maturity in our climate, unless it can get a fair start pretty early in May. We succeeded, however, last year in ripening them, although not planted till June. The seed was sent us from

Philadelphia, and were different from the common Sieva bean, being speckled with purple. The common sort is entirely white, and we suspect is not so early.

With regard to poles—these are an object to most gardeners, especially to persons in villages, who have to go considerable distance to cut and bring them in; and those which are procured seldom last over a single season. The best sticks for beans are cedar poles. Those who reside near cedar swamps would do well to cut therefrom a supply, of the right size, house them in winter, and they will last several years. When cedar poles are not to be had, it is a good plan to take a straight rifted cedar log, and split it up into sticks about two inches square. These may be made round by a draw shave, and will answer an excellent purpose for years. They will cost less than two annual visits to the forest for common bean poles. The poles should be inserted in the hills firmly, before the beans are planted. Let them be dropped in a circle round the pole, and covered. It injures the roots of the plant to drive down the poles after the beans are up.—*Maine Cultivator.*

EARLY PEAS.—If you desire early peas, reader, let us advise you not to plant the little hotspur variety. Of this you may, perhaps, obtain a mess a few days earlier than of the early Washington variety; but it is but a “mess”—one, or at the farthest, two stinted gatherings; and there is all the reward you get for your labour and pains. Better raise what is worth gathering whilst you are about it, even if you have to suffer the mortification of having your neighbour boast of eating green peas, five or six days earlier than you. The Early Washingtons are nearly as early as the Hotspurs, and when they are ready for gathering, there is something of them: the pods are larger, and the peas in them are more luscious. Besides they will continue to bear for three or four weeks before the vines die!

On the subject of Peas, suffer us to say a word in recommendation of the Dwarf Scimitar Peas. These are not very early—nor are they late; but they yield more abundantly than any other sort we have ever cultivated, and they are decidedly the richest peas grown. They are superior to the Marrowfat, and yield three times as much. Ordinarily, they grow but about three feet in height, and the pods are formed curiously in thick clusters at the top of the vines, and are gathered with great ease.

For two years past, we have gathered quantities of these peas, when green and tender, at the right age for boiling, shelled them, and spread them out in the shade to dry—stirring them occasionally. In the following winter we have caused them to be soaked till they swelled up to their summer size, and then had them cooked as usual. Thus we have *green peas in winter*, about as tender and luscious as you can have them from the vines in the month of July. The luxury is worth the pains.—*Id.*

SUGAR BEET FOR MILCH COWS.—It may not be generally known, that by giving cows a peck of sugar beets twice a day, cut up with their hay, we will be enabled to get just as rich milk and butter during the winter as in summer, when the pasture is at its best. Now, as an acre of ground well manured, planted in this root well attended, would yield beets enough to keep *ten cows* from the first of November till the first of May, should not every farmer make his arrangements

for planting beets next spring? From our own experience, we have no doubt that this addition of beets to the ordinary feed of the cows, would make a weekly difference of two pounds each in their product of butter. From the first of November to the first of May, there are twenty-six weeks. This number of weeks at two pounds additional butter, would give us fifty-two pounds for each new cow during the period named, or 520 pounds for the ten cows; and if we set down the butter as being worth 1s. 3d. per pound, it will give us £32 10s. as the value of additional yield brought about by the feeding with the product of an acre in beets. But this is not all—the proprietor of the cows, in the spring, would have the gratification to know that he had treated his animals well, and the satisfaction of seeing them in good condition.

RHUBARB.—This excellent plant which should have a place in every garden, is very easily raised, requiring nothing more than a rich loamy situation. It is an orchard in miniature, the stems of its leaves affording a substance which is an excellent substitute for apples, to make sauce or pies.

The sauce made from it, is very wholesome and palatable, and will be a good preventive of bowel complaints.

It is said that by stewing it with sugar and preparing it in the same manner as for the table, it may be bottled and corked up tight and preserved till winter.

Indeed, we do not see why it may not be kept as long as apple sauce, or any of the berries that are preserved in this way, without being bottled up. Some of our good housewives had better try the experiment.

A HINT IN HOUSEWIFERY.—In summer and autumn your soap grease is apt to accumulate beyond your immediate wants; if put away it is apt to be devoured by maggots, and if made into soap, you may not have pine or other appropriate vessels enough to hold it. Having suffered loss from being placed in such circumstances, we were much gratified with a piece of intelligence accidentally received, which relieved us from the disagreeable dilemma. By the boiling your soap with salt, about a quart of the latter to three gallons of the former, you can separate lye and water enough to make the soap hard. After boiling half an hour, turn it out into a tub to cool. Cut the cake which swims on the top into pieces, and having scraped off froth and other impurities, melt again, (without the lye and water underneath, of course) and pour into a box to cool. You may then cut it up into bars of proper dimensions for drying. By adding a proportion of resin, well pulverized, at the last boiling, you will have yellow soap like that made for market.

To find the weight of cattle.—Take the girth behind the shoulder, and the length from the fore part of the shoulder-blade to the buttock, both in feet. Multiply the square of the girth by 4 times the length, and divide by 21; the quotient is the weight, nearly, of the four quarters, in stones of 16lb., each lb. 17½ ounces avoirdupois.

A new way to fatten Turkeys.—The Ploughkeepsie Eagle tells a story of a man in New-York, who shut a turkey up in a box four feet by two, and three feet high, and excluded light as much as possible. He then fed him with small pieces of soft brick and charcoal, and six kernels of corn per day, and plenty of water. At the end of one month,

he was killed, and found to be filled with fat. He has since, says the writer, repeated the experiment with the same success. Now we do not know whether the story is all a hoax or not; but this we do know that the more quiet you can keep animals while fattening the better they will fatten. If kept in the dark, their attention will be less called upon, and as darkness also in some measure induces sleep, the animal doses more, and there can be no doubt, that less food will be necessary than when out in the open air roving about.

OBSERVATIONS ON THE WEATHER.

BY AN EMINENT PHILOSOPHER.

When there has been no particular storm about the time of the Spring equinox—March 22—if a storm arise from the east on or before that day, or if a storm from any point of the compass arise near a week after the equinox, then, in either of these cases, the succeeding summer is generally dry, four times in five.

But if a storm arise from the S. W. or W. S. W. on or just before the Spring equinox, then the summer following is generally wet, five times in six.

MISTS.—A white mist in the evening over a meadow with a river, will be drawn up by the sun next morning, and the day will be bright. Five or six fogs successively drawn up portend rain.—Where the mist which hangs over low lands, draws towards high hills in the morning, and rolls up to the top, it will be fair; but if the mist hangs upon the hills, and drags along the woods, there will be rain.

CLOUDS.—Against much rain, the clouds increase very fast, especially before thunder.—When they are formed like fleeces, but dense in the middle, and bright towards the edges, with the sky bright, they are signs of a frost, with hail, snow, or rain.—If they form high in air, in thin white trains, like locks of wool, they portend wind, and probably rain.—When a general cloudiness covers the sky, and small black fragments of clouds fly underneath, they are a sure sign of rain, and probably will be lasting. Two currents of clouds, always portend rain, and in summer, thunder.

DEW.—If the dew lies plentifully on the grass after a fair day it is a sign of another. If not, and there is no wind, rain must follow.—A red evening portends fine weather; but if it spread too far upwards from the horizon in the evening, and especially morning, it foretells wind or rain, or both.—When the sky in rainy weather is tinged with sea green, the rain will increase; if with deep blue, it will be showery.

HEAVENLY BODIES.—A haziness in the air which fades the sun's light, and makes the orb whitish, or ill-defined; or, at night, if the moon and stars grow dim, and a ring encircles the former, rain will follow.—If the sun's rays appear like Moses' horns, if white at setting, or shorn of his rays, or goes down into a bank of clouds in the horizon, bad weather is to be expected.—If the moon looks pale and dim, we may expect rain; if red, wind; and if of her natural colour, with a clear sky, fair weather.—If the moon is rainy throughout, it will clear at the change, and perhaps the rain return a few days after. If fair throughout, and rain at the change, the fair weather will probably return on the fourth or fifth day.

WIND.—If the wind veers about, much rain is pretty sure. If in changing it follows the course of the sun, it brings fair weather; the contrary, foul.—Whistling, or howling of the wind, is a sure sign of rain.

METEORS.—The Aurora Borealis, after warm days, are generally succeeded by cooler air. Shooting stars are supposed to indicate wind.

Rules for preserving health in eating and drinking.

All aged and decrepid persons ought to eat often, and but a little at a time; because weak and wasted bodies are to be restored little by little, and by moist and liquid food rather than by solid, because moist and liquid food doth nourish soonest, and digest easiest.

Keep constantly to a plain diet: those enjoy most health and live longest that avoid curiosity and variety of meats and drinks, which only serve to entice to gluttony.

The less food the sick person eats, the sooner he will recover; for it is a true saying, the more you fill your bodies, the more you hurt them.

All men find by experience, that in a morning before they have eaten, they are light and pleasantly easy in their bodies; but after they have indulged their appetites with plenty of food; they find themselves heavy and dull, and often sleepy, which sufficiently shows that those full meals are prejudicial to the welfare of the body.

The most unhealthy are found among those who feed high upon the most delicious dainties, and drink nothing but the strongest and most spirituous liquors; whereas others who want this delicate fare, are seldom sick, unless they have such unsatiable appetites as to eat too much.

To sup sparingly is most healthful, because of the experience of an infinite number of persons who have received the greatest benefit from light suppers. The stomach not being overburdened, the sleep is more pleasant. From sparing suppers, the breeding of those humours is prevented, which causes defluction, rheumatism, gouts, dropsies, giddiness, and corruptions in the mouth from the scurvy. Many indispositions are cured by fasting, or a very spare diet.

Two meals a-day is said to be sufficient for all persons after fifty years of age, and all weak people; (but it will be better to eat a little at a time and oftener) the omitting of supper conduces much to the benefit of the weak and aged. Misers, who eat and drink but little, always live long.

Nothing is so great a friend to the mind of man as abstinence. It strengthens the memory, clears the apprehension, and sharpens the judgment, and, in a word, gives reason its full scope of acting; and when reason has that, it is always a diligent and faithful handmaid to conscience. And therefore, when men look no further than mere nature, which many do not, let no man expect to keep his gluttony and his powers, his drunkenness and his wit, his revelings and his judgment, much less his conscience together. For neither nature nor grace will have it so; it is an utter contradiction to the methods of both. "Who hath woe? who hath sorrow? who hath contention?"

who hath babbling? who hath wounds without cause? who hath redness of the eyes?" says Solomon; which question he presently answers—"they who tarry long at the wine; they who seek after mixed wine." So say I. Who hath a stupid intellect, a broken memory, and a blasted wit, and, which is worse than all, a blind and benighted conscience, but the intemperate and luxurious, the opicure and the smell-feast? So impossible it is for a man to turn sot, without making himself a blockhead too. I know this is not always the present effect of these courses, but in the long run it will infallibly be so. And time and luxury together, will as certainly change the inside as it does the outside of the best heads soever, and much more of such heads as are strong for nothing but to bear drink; concerning which it ever was, and is, and will be, a sure observation that *such as are blest at the barrel are weakest at the book.*"

OVER-FEEDING.—Mr. Abernethy agreed with the opinion entertained by Franklin, who said that nine tenths of the diseases were caused by over-feeding. The learned surgeon, in one of his lectures in 1827, thus addressed his hearers:—"I tell you honestly what I think is the cause of the complicated maladies of the human race: it is their gormandising and stuffing, and stimulating their digestive organs to excess, thereby producing nervous disorders and irritation. The state of their minds is another grand cause; fidgeting and discontenting themselves about that which cannot be helped; passions of all kinds—malignant passions and worldly cares, pressing upon the mind, disturb the cerebral action, and do a great deal of harm."

TREATMENT OF ERYSIPELAS, BY RAW COTTON.—Dr. F. M. Robertson, of Augusta, Geo., reports, in the July number of the Southern Medical and Surgical Journal, two cases of erysipelas, successfully treated by the external application of raw cotton.

THE HUMAN BRAIN.—It is a curious fact, that in the brain of man, no less than 80 per cent. of the weight is water. According to the analysis of Vanquelin, 100 parts of human brain, consist of 80 parts of water; 4.53 of white fat; 0.7 of red fat; 1.12 of osmazone; 7 of albumen; 1.5 of phosphorus united with the fats; 5.15 of sulphur, biphosphate of potash, phosphates of lime and magnesia, and other salts. Of such materials is the thinking organ of man composed. The spinal marrow and nerves are similarly constituted. The ratio of water in the brain of the calf is also 80 per cent.—*Lardner.*

HAVOC OF WAR.—The siege of Troy lasted ten years, eight months. It is said there died 870,000 Grecians, 670,000 Trojans; at the taking of the city after, were slain 276,000 men, women, and children of all sorts. Cæsar killed a million, Mohammed the second Turk 30,000 persons; Sicius Dentatus fought in a hundred battles; eight times in single combat he overcame, had forty wounds before, was rewarded with one hundred and forty crowns, triumphed nine times for his various services. M. Sergius had thirty-two wounds; Scæva the centurion, I know not how many; every nation hath their Hector, Scipio, Cæsars, and Alexanders. Our Edward the Fourth was in twenty-six battles afoot; and as they do all, he glories in it; this is related to his honour. At the siege of Jerusalem 1,100,000 died with sword and famine. At the battle of Cannæ, 70,000 men were slain, as Polybius records, and as many at the Battle Abbey with us; and it is no news

to fight from sun to sun, as they did, as Constantine, and Lucinus, &c. At the siege of Ostend, a poor town in respect, a small fort, but a great grave, 120,000 men lost their lives, besides whole towns ruined, and hospitals full of maimed soldiers. There were engines, fire works, and whatsoever the devil could invent to do mischief, with 2,500,000 iron bullets, and shot of forty pounds weight, three or four millions of gold consumed. What plague, what fury, brought so devilish, so brutish a thing as war first into men's minds? "From whence come wars and fightings among you? come they not hence, even of your lusts that war in your members?" James iv. 1.—*Burton*.

PROCRASTINATION.—Sir Walter Scott, writing to a friend who had obtained a situation, gave him this excellent advice. "You must be aware of stumbling over a propensity, which easily besets you from the habit of not having your time fully employed;—I mean what the women very expressly call *dawdling*. Your motto must be *Horæ æge*. Do instantly whatever is to be done, and take the hours of recreation after business, and never before it. When a regiment is under march, the rear is often thrown into confusion because the front do not move steadily and without interruption. It is the same thing with business. If that which is first in hand is not instantly, steadily, and regularly dispatched, other things accumulate behind, till affairs begin to press all at once, and no human brain can stand the confusion. Pray mind this: this is a habit of mind which is very apt to beset men of intellect and talent, especially when their time is not regularly filled up, and left at their own arrangement. But it is like the ivy round the oak, and ends by limiting, if it does not destroy, the power of manly and necessary exertion. I must love a man so well, to whom I offer such a word of advice, that I will not apologize for it, but expect to hear you are become as regular as a Dutch clock,—hours, quarters, minutes, all marked and appropriated. This is a great cast in life, and must be played with all skill and caution."—*Lockhart's Life of Scott*.

MARRIAGE BROKERS.—In Genoa there are marriage brokers who have pocket-books filled with names of the marriageable girls of the different classes, with notes of their figures, personal attractions, fortunes, &c. These brokers go about endeavouring to arrange connections; and when they succeed, they get a commission of two or three per cent. upon the portion. Marriage at Genoa is quite a matter of calculation, generally settled by the parents or relations, who often draw up the contract before the parties have seen one another; and it is only when every thing else is arranged, and a few days previous to the marriage ceremony, that the future husband is introduced to his intended partner for life. Should he find fault with her manners or appearance, he may break off the match, on condition of his defraying the brokerage, and any other expenses incurred.

HURRISO SPIDERS.—There is a tribe of hunting spiders that leap like tigers on their prey, and what is more extraordinary, have the faculty of doing so sideways. One of these jumped two feet on an humble bee. They approach the object of their intended attack with the noiseless and imperceptible motion of the shadow of a sundial. If the fly move, the spider moves also, backwards, forwards, or sideways, and that with so much precision as to time and distance, that the two insects appear as if bound together by some invisible chain, or

Constitution of the Ladies' Anti-lace-too-tight Society. Established at Squantum, Anno Domini, 1837.
