







#### What is Wiki Loves Monuments?

Wiki Loves Monuments is a <u>global annual federated low-barrier</u> photo competition focused on freely documenting built cultural heritage (or, monuments).

- Partnerships, sponsorships, grants
- Campaign strategy and promotional material

- Legal challenges

#### What have we achieved so far?

#### Since 2010, we have:

- collected information about 1,455,127 monuments from 76 national competitions.
- onboarded 46,412 new volunteers to contribute to Wikimedia projects.
- built a global community of people who are passionate about built heritage and are ready to do unbelievable things for it.

We have developed and tested a formula that works!

#### So ... Are we done with Wiki Loves Monuments? No!

Our goal is to freely document and raise awareness for the world's built cultural heritage.

- Only 38% of all the monuments listed so far have at least one photo
- One photo is not enough for most of the monuments
- We are missing monuments lists from more than 100 countries around the world
- sustainability: make it as simple as possible to organize Wiki Loves Monuments (better tools, technical infrastructure, support system, contribution pathways)
- making the knowledge we gather accessible: to Wikimedians and beyond

#### International team projects in 2016

- Built a stable international team of people with diverse backgrounds and expertise
- Experimented with developing <u>Montage</u> to improve the experience of organizers and jurors



- Collecting data (via surveys and observations) on how we can improve Wiki Loves Monuments for organizers and participants
- And then we clearly defined the direction and what Wiki Loves
  Monuments international team will do in 2017

We will continue providing support in the following areas


- Onboarding new countries
- Basic infrastructure support for organizing the contest (campaign banners and beyond)
- Working with you on more complicated cases (FoP or other country-specific cases)
- International jury process and a backup pool of national jury members
- Tools and API (ErfgoedBot, wikiloves, Montage, etc.)
- ...



### Project 1: Migration to Wikidata

- As organizers of Wiki Loves Monuments we want to have easy ways to measure the state of monuments documentation. For example:
  - How many monuments in Sweden already have a picture?
  - For which monuments we do not have geo-coordinate information?
- We also want to provide a consistent layer for tools to be built upon.

#### Why not continue with the current model?

There are quite a few problems with the current approach.

- The data exists in and can be changed from too many places (consistency)
- The data that can be collected is limited (scalability)
- Creating lists in multiple languages is very hard
- Re-use is highly limited
- Mass edits of the data is hard
- Sources cannot be tracked easily

Expanding the data to include more countries is hard

Assuring data sanity and quality requires a lot of maintenance work

#### What is the solution?

- Move all monuments data (lists) to Wikidata
- Gather all future monuments data in Wikidata
- Generate lists of monuments for Wiki Loves Monuments participants directly from Wikidata

#### Project goals for 2017: We want to

- work with you to move your monuments data to Wikidata
- work with you to create your new lists based on data on Wikidata
- have at least one country's campaign to fully run using lists generated by data from Wikidata (a few countries have volunteered)

#### Project 2: Enrich monuments data

Freely documenting built cultural heritage is beyond collecting photos. Today, we are missing information about monuments from around the world:

- Geo-coordinates
- Year built
- Year registered
- Architectural style
- Commissioned by

- We are proposing to experiment with data enrichment events throughout August 2017 and prior to Wiki Loves Monuments contest in September.
- We will, in coordination with interested local organizers, define specific goals and infrastructure for events that can trigger larger contributions for documenting monuments data.

#### Project 3: Monumental

- A lot of monuments data is collected which is not explorable or discoverable
- The migration to Wikidata will allow us to build tools to change this
- Let's make exploration, discovery, and contribution more fun

### P4: Monitor your campaign

- Monitoring your Wiki Loves Monuments campaign is an important part of organizing Wiki Loves Monuments
- Very little tool/software support is available in this area. We need a tool to:
  - help organizers' have an overview of their campaign (finding all files with missing licenses, images with very small resolution, ...)
  - identify potential issues proactively (mass deletion of photos, for example)
  - Help participants track the status of their submission
