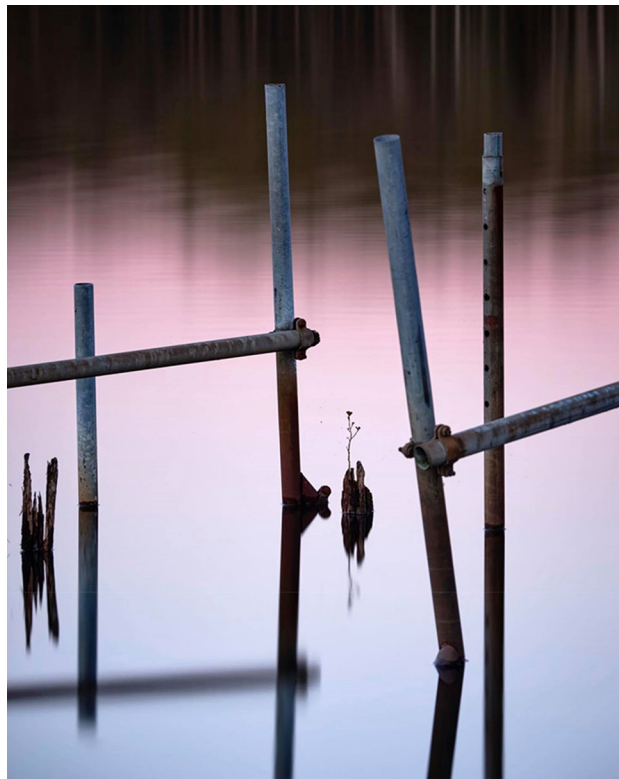


Dedekind-like
