## FISHERIES.

## Coarse Fish, Lough Erne.

1932. No. 33.

The Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Fisheries Acts (Northern Ireland), 1842 to 1928, and of every other power it thereunto enabling, being of opinion that it is expedient to establish an annual close season for certain kinds of fresh water fish in Upper and Lower Loughs Erne, makes and ordains the following By-Law:—

It is hereby prohibited to kill, capture, or attempt to kill or capture by any means whatever other than single rod and line any bream, pike, perch, roach, carp, tench or other fresh water fish except salmon, trout, pollen or eels in Upper or Lower Lough Erne between the 24th day of April and the 7th day of June in any year, both dates inclusive.

Each and every person offending against the above By-Law shall on conviction by a court of summary jurisdiction forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding £5 and every net, or other instrument used or attempted to be used in contravention of the By-Law shall be forfeited.
