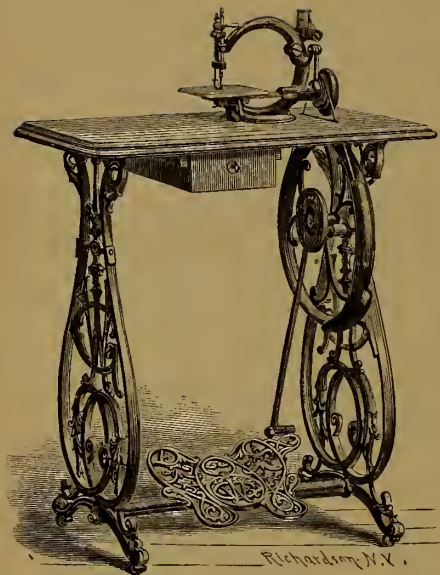

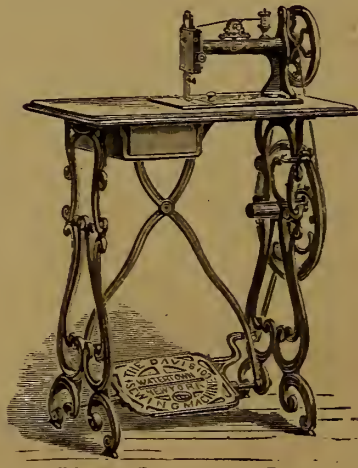

STREET CAR AND OMNIBUS ROUTES.

STREET CARS.

Visitors to the city will find street-car travel ample for nearly all their needs in the locomotion line. Cars run to almost every part of the city, at intervals of from two to twelve minutes and one hour, according to destination. The fare to all points inside the city limits is uniformly five cents, and that to points with which the "dummy" connects, ten cents extra.

The South Division.—All the South Side cars start at the intersection of State and Lake streets, and run as follows:

Via State street to Thirty-third street, connecting with Union Stock Yard cars.

Via State and Twenty-second streets and Cottage Grove avenue to Thirty-ninth street also *via* same route to Twenty-fifth street. The "through cars" connect at 1. Nineth street with Hyde Park dummy.

Via State and Eighteenth streets and Indiana avenue to Thirty-first street.

Via State street and Archer avenue to South branch Chicago river.

The West Division.—Cars leave the intersection of State and Lake streets for the West Side as follows:

Via Madison street to the limits.

Via Madison and Halsted streets and Blue Island avenue to Sixteenth street.

Cars leave the corner of Randolph and State streets as follows:

Via Randolph and Lake streets to the limits.

Via Randolph street and Milwaukee avenue to Bloomingdale street.

Via Randolph, Clinton and Jefferson streets to Sixteenth street.

Via Randolph, Fifth avenue and Van Buren street to Wood street.

HACK ORDINANCE.

The price to be charged by the owner or owners, or drivers of any hackney-coach, carriage or vehicle for the conveyance of passengers, except omnibuses, for hire within the city of Chicago, shall be as follows, to be regulated and estimated by the distance on the most direct routes, namely:

For conveying each passenger from one railroad depot to another railroad depot, fifty cents.

For conveying each passenger not exceeding one mile, fifty cents.

For conveying a passenger any distance over one mile and less than two miles, one dollar.

For conveying each additional passenger of the same family or party, fifty cents.

For conveying a passenger in said city any distance exceeding two miles, one dollar and fifty cents.

For each additional passenger of the same family or party, fifty cents.

For conveying children between five and fourteen years of age, half the above rates may be charged for like distances, but for children under five years of age no charge shall be made. Provided, that the distance from any railroad depot, steamboat landing or hotel, to any other railroad depot, steamboat landing or hotel, shall in all cases be estimated as not exceeding one mile.

For the use by the day of any hackney-coach or other vehicle drawn by two horses or other animals, with one or more passengers, eight dollars per day.

For the use of any such carriage or vehicle by the hour, with one or more passengers, with the privilege of going from place to place, and stopping as often as may be required, as follows: For the first hour, two dollars; for each additional hour or part of an hour, one dollar.

For conveying one or more passengers to or from any place in said city, between the hours of twelve o'clock midnight and seven A. M.—for each trip, without regard to distance or number of passengers, two dollars.

For the use of any cab or other vehicle drawn by one horse or other animal, by the hour, with the privilege of going from place to place, with one or more passengers, and stopping when required—for the first hour, one dollar; for each additional hour or part of an hour, fifty cents.

For the use of any such carriage by the day, four dollars.


Every passenger shall be allowed to have conveyed upon such vehicle, without charge, his ordinary traveling baggage, not exceeding in any case one trunk and twenty-five pounds of other baggage. For every additional package, where the whole weight of baggage is over one hundred pounds, if conveyed to any place within the city limits, the owner or driver shall be permitted to charge fifteen cents.

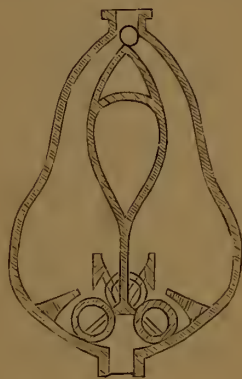

PUBLIC PARKS.

A magnificent system of Parks and Boulevards is being provided in and around Chicago. When finished, they will be unexcelled in the world for extent and general beauty. At present the work is being carried out, and they present an unfinished condition. The Parks, and routes to them, are as follows:

Lincoln Park—On N. Clark st. and the lake. Accessible by cars on N. Clark st. and North Side omnibus line.

Humboldt Park—In the northwestern part of the city, on California ave., bet. W. Division st. and W. North ave. Accessible *via* Milwaukee ave.

Central Park—In the western part of the city, on Central Park ave., between Kinzie and Harrison sts. Accessible by Madison and Randolph st. cars and omnibus line.

Douglas Park—Southwest, on California ave., bet. Twelfth and Nineteenth sts. Accessible by way of Twelfth st.

South Park—On the lake, south of the village of Hyde Park. Accessible by way of Cottage Grove ave. cars and Ill. Cent. R. R.

These Parks are connected by a system of splendid Boulevards, from 300 to 400 feet in width.

Besides the above system, Chicago has other Parks, viz.: Union Park, on W. Lake and W. Madison sts.; Jefferson Park, bet. Loomis and Throop and W. Monroe and W. Adams sts.; Ellis Park, on Vincennes ave., south of Douglas place, and the Lake Park, on the lake front and Michigan ave., bet. Randolph and Twelfth sts.

Union and Jefferson Parks can be reached by Madison and Randolph st. cars; Ellis Park, by Cottage Grove ave. cars, while the Lake Park is within easy walking distance of the old Court House.

CHICAGO TUNNELS.

Washington Street Tunnel—Extending from S. Market st. to S. Canal. First contract for building awarded to Messrs. Stewart & Ludlam, in the spring of 1866, but in the fall of same year, a section of about 80 feet caved in, and the work was then abandoned. New contract for building given June 20, 1867, to J. K. Lake & Co., who completed the work in the summer of 1868. Covered portion, 920 feet; extreme length, 1,650 feet; width of arches at river line, 24 ft. 6 in.; cost of building, \$400,000.

La Salle Street Tunnel—Extends from E. Randolph st. to N. Kinzie. Contract for building awarded May, 1870, to Robert E. Moss & Co., and was completed May, 1872. Covered portion, extending from Lake street to Kinzie, 1,000 feet long; river portion, 250 feet long; extreme length, 1,750 feet; cost of building, \$500,000.

Lake Tunnel—Contract for building awarded, 1862, to Messrs. Dull & Gowan. Tunnel, completed 1865, extending from Water Works to Crib, is two miles long; diameter, 5 feet 2 inches; total cost, \$450,000.

The New Lake Tunnel—(Now in course of construction.) Contract for building awarded to Messrs. Steel, McMann & Steel, fall, 1872; is to extend from corner 22d street and Ashland avenue to Water Works, and thence alongside of old Tunnel to Crib; extreme length, 6 miles; diameter, 7 feet 2 inches; estimated cost, \$500,000.

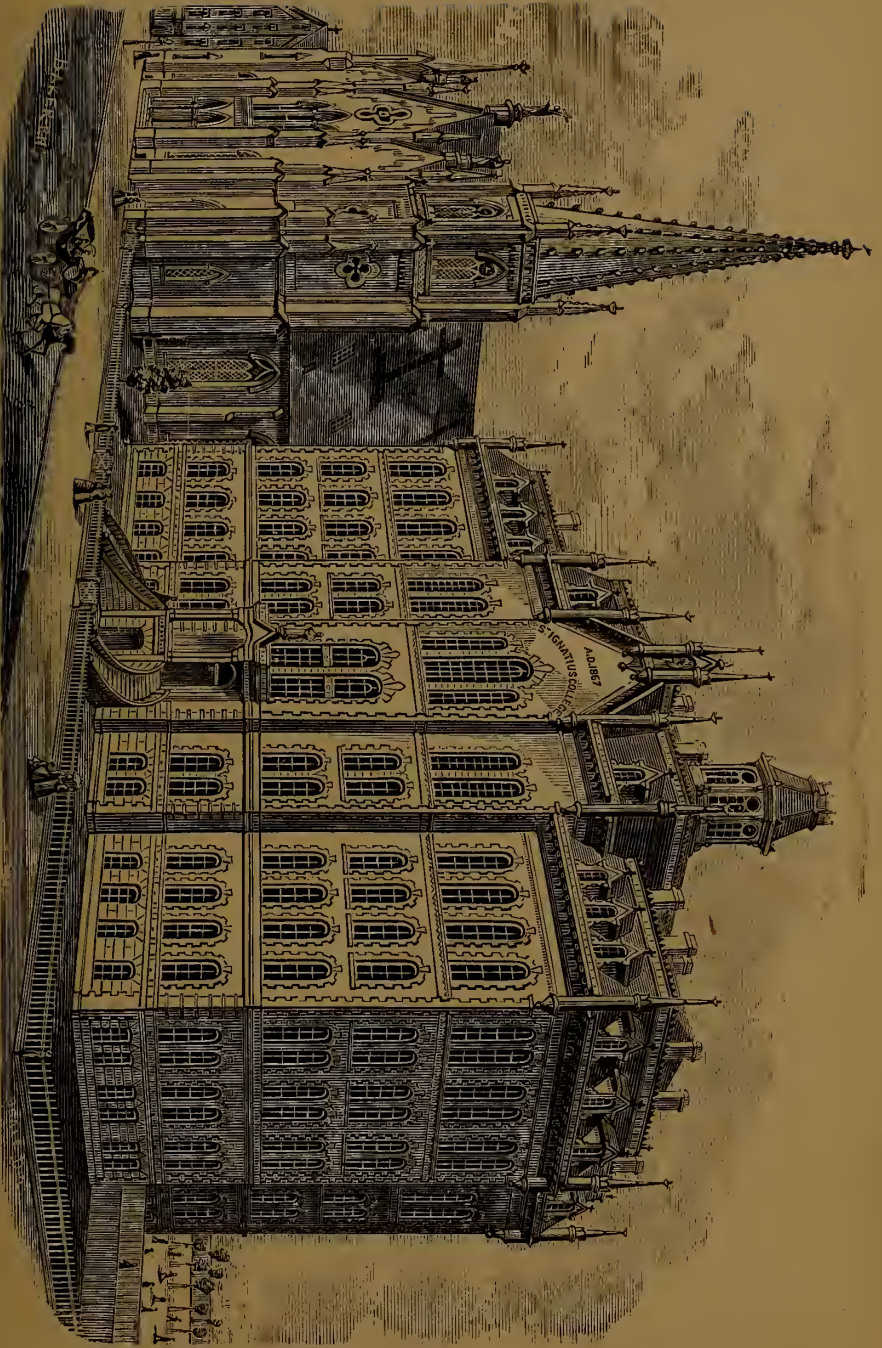

EXPLANATORY.

The city comprises three Grand Divisions, known as the North, South and West Sides. State street is the main artery to the South Division. Horse cars run its entire length, and also branch off for Indiana avenue, Cottage Grove avenue and Archer avenue; also for the West Division. North Clark street is the main artery to the North Division. Horse cars run its entire length, and also branch off for Chicago avenue, Division street, Sedgwick street, Larrabee street and Clybourn avenue. Madison, Randolph and Lake streets are the main arteries to the West Division. Horse cars, from corner State and Lake, in South Division, run on Madison street to Western avenue, branching off at Halsted street for Blue Island avenue S. W. to Mitchell street; also, from corner State and Randolph, South Division, run on Randolph street its entire length, thence on West Lake to Western avenue. Branches from Randolph street run on Clinton and Jefferson south to Burlington Crossing, on Van Buren street to Southwestern avenue, and on Milwaukee avenue to Division street. Horse cars and stage lines are noted in such streets as they run upon; also, on such streets as may be reached by those conveyances within a few blocks.

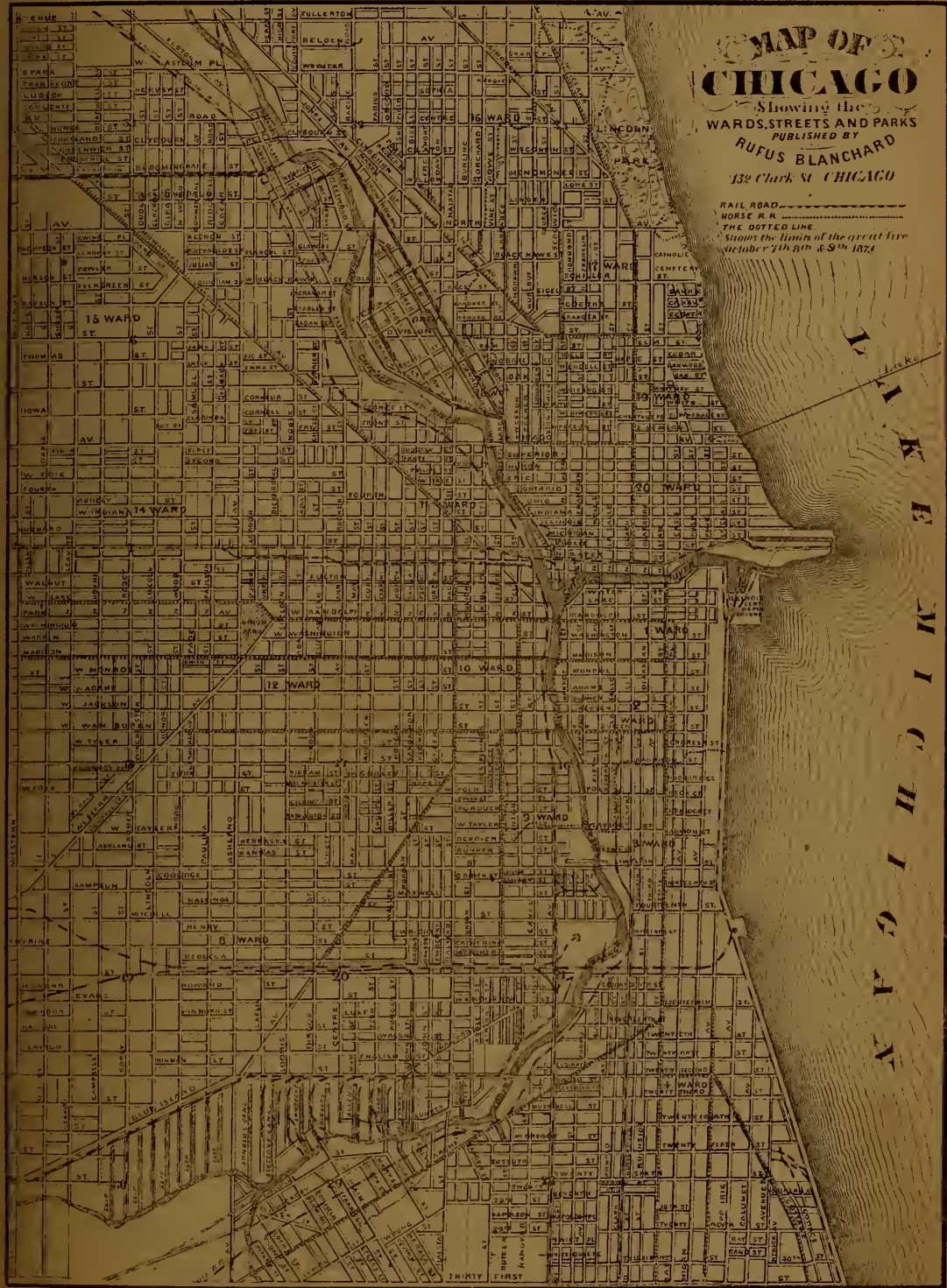

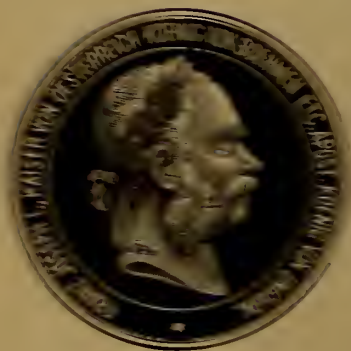

- Drop Letters, unless a three-cent postage stamp is affixed.
- Letters bearing requests to be returned, or bearing the name and address of the writer.
- Box Letters.
- Letters directed and sent to hotels, and thence returned to the Post Office as unclaimed.
- Letters returned from the Dead Letter Office to writers.
- Circulars, free packets containing printed documents, speeches, and other printed matter.
- Official Letters from any department of the government.
- Letters once taken from the Post Office by the proper parties, or delivered by the carriers, cannot be forwarded without again being prepaid.

SUGGESTIONS TO THE PUBLIC.

- Post all letters, etc., as early as practicable, first tying circulars in bundles with the addresses all in one direction.
- Make the address legible and complete, giving name of Post Office, County and State, and number of house if in a street.
- Letters for places abroad should have the name of the country, as well as the county and town or city.
- Dropping a letter into the letter box, see that it falls well in and does not stick in the passage. Never send money or other article of value through the post, except by money order, or in a registered letter securely sealed.

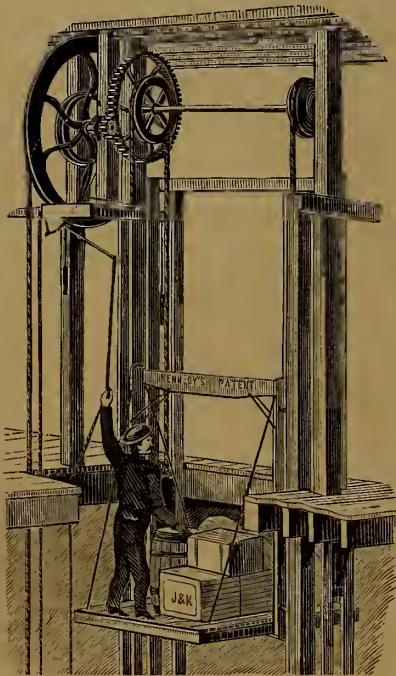

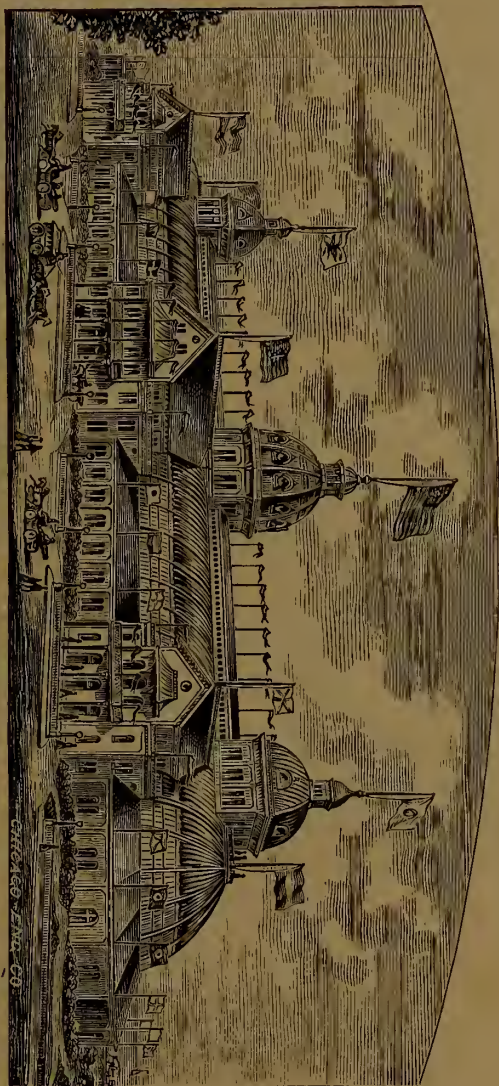

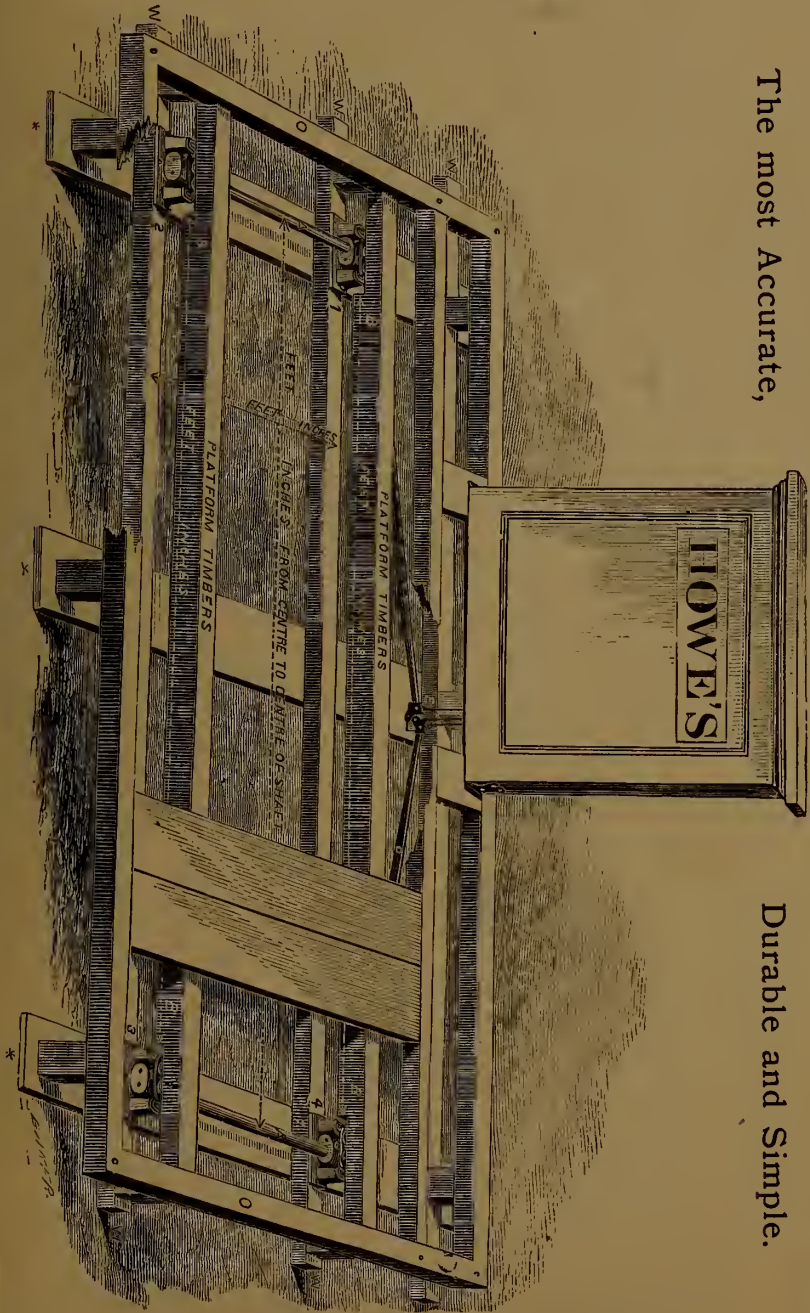
