The health center program seems to be at a standstill. Districts which rejoice with new buildings are void of equipment. The prefectures do not make allotment for equipment until building is constructed; therefore, large, new buildings stand empty and turning patients away for lack of facilities.

Presently occupied, older buildings not suitable for clinics are in the minority. Inadequacy is most often due to lax management. Directors who have proposed plans for construction of buildings three times present size, often have wasted space in present buildings. In one case, the entire second floor of h.c. was unused, while plans for pretentious h.c. are approved for summer '50.

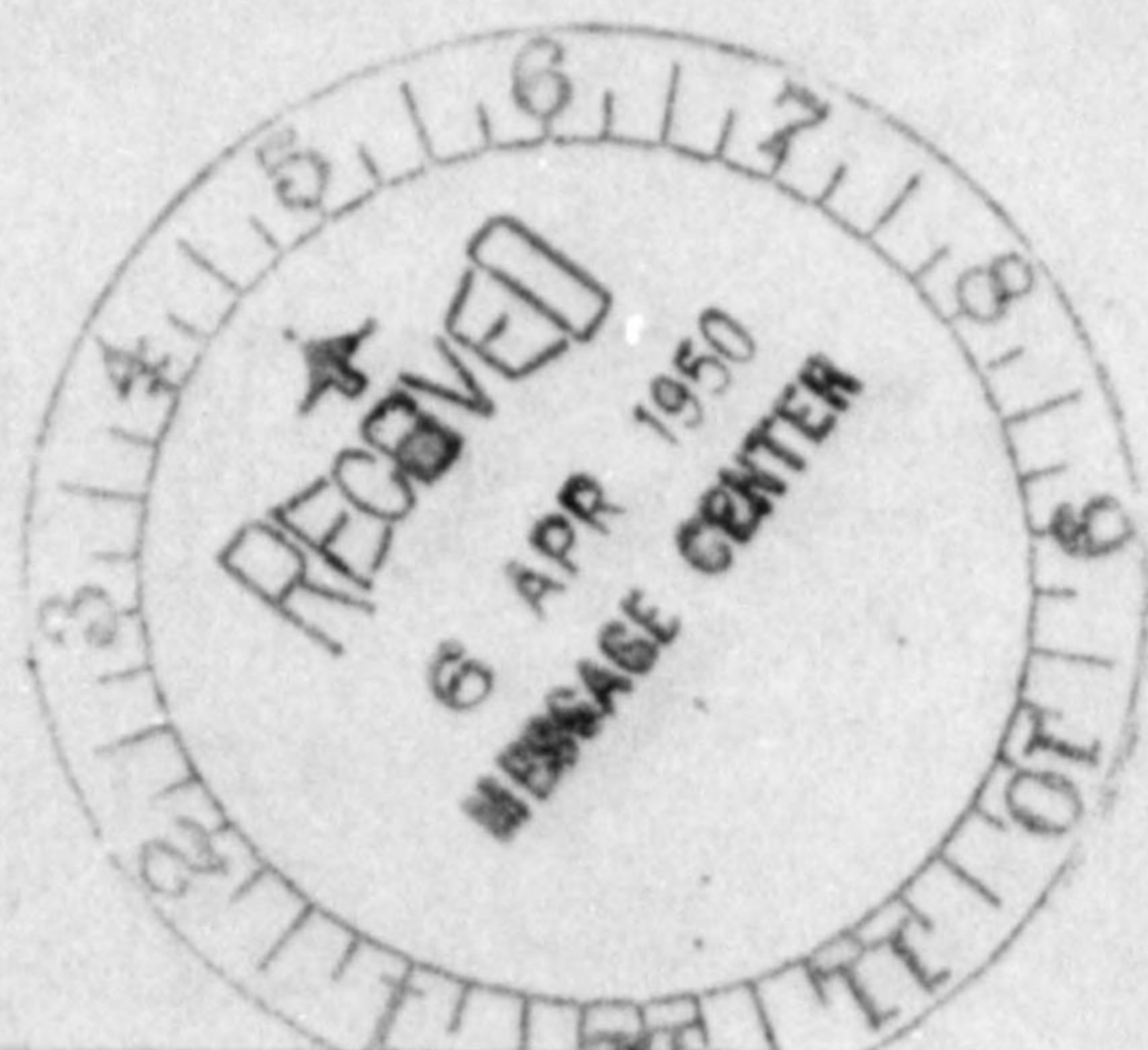
The personnel shortage, limited transportation and lack of laboratory equip. seems more critical than condition of building. By condition of building, building proper is meant. ✓ Notoriously bad housekeeping is evident - the maintenance is below standard. Directors in pre-war buildings have definitely lost interest in conservation, their programs are limited while they wait for new housing as conspicuous as their neighboring h.c. districts.

2. Purposes of the Trip:

Health Center Evaluation of Kanagawa Model Health Center.

3. Brief Statement of Findings and Results:

The building used by Kanagawa Model Health Center was partially destroyed during the war. It has been repaired, but rather crudely; therefore the building is difficult to keep clean and nice appearing. The fact that the building is located on Yokohama-Tokyo highway creates additional maintenance problems. The street dust is an everyday menace. Generally the activities of Kanagawa Health Center seem well planned. There is a need for more nurses and adequate transportation.

Dr. Jankowski asked several questions:

Population: The Health Center is using also the figure based on the rice ration registration. However, The Health Center has completed the individual card system and now it is easy for them to have accurate figure of the population in his area.

Vaccination Program

1. Smallpox vaccination is already finished
2. Diphtheria vaccination is also finished.
3. Typhoid vaccination will be started from middle of May, because the instruction of Welfare Ministry came just 1 week ago. The instruction is to inoculate intracutaneous 0.1 cc.
4. BCG vaccination is almost finished but they will continue the BCG vaccination. The finished BCG vaccination is family member of TB patients and the students up to 16 years old.

TB patients in the Health Center area:

1. According to the thoroughly investigation, through case finding in clinic, Home visits and reporting of private physicians, the number of the TB patients in his area is male 445, female 269, in total 714. (in 1949)
2. He thinks this figure covers about 80% of existing actual TB patients.
3. Case management is also nearly perfect, because the PH Nurses are going out and visiting constantly.
4. Waiting list is about 30 at present.
5. Reported deaths in 1948 was 163 and most of the reported death was reported as TB case previously.
6. He thinks the reporting condition of the private doctors in his area is adequate.

- 2 -

Rabies Control:

1. The rabies control as far as the animal is concerned, is doing by prefectural Government and according to the Law # 29, issued in April of 1922, Livestock CD Prevention Law.
2. In this year this Health Center was reported 3 cases of human rabies. One is died, in spite of vaccination (Pasteur treatment).
3. The pasteur treatment was started 2 days after being bitten and continued 18 days.
4. The city office has secured ¥798,755 for rabies control, that include vaccination of 6000 dogs and catching and disposition of 10,000 stray dogs. The amount is not enough but the city office has income through the vaccination.

Dysentery ProblemDr. Jenkowski emphasized ~~xxx~~

1. This year will be highest peak of ~~xxxxx~~ dysentery in past many years.
2. General Sams has lectured in Sendai that the fly control and the strict inspection and control of the Ice-candy factory is most important measure.
3. The fly will be most important media carrying not only the dysentery or typhoid bacteria but also the trachoma and Polomyelitis.
4. The inspection and control of Ice-candy factory should be so strictly carried out that if any failure of minimum standard were found out, the factory should be closed down.

Dr. Fujita reported:

1. In 1949 dysentery case was reported in his area only 1 case and in 1950 up to to-day, no case was reported.
2. However his Health Center has plan to make following control ~~measure~~ measure against the dysentery.
 - a. Thoroughly physical examination, especially stool examination of food handlers.
 - b. Finding out of carriers.
 - c. Examination of well water.
3. In his area there are 34 ice-candy manufacturers, which have been approved in last year and met minimum standard.
4. His health center is intending to inspect at least 2 times until June
5. This health center has 6 teams for insect control constantly, however in summer will be increased to 8 to 10 teams (@ 6 men)

Food stalls Problem:

Definition of "Food Stalls" was discussed

1. There 3 kind of Food stalls, namely
 - a. Big restaurants.
 - b. Small restaurants, which sell prepared food stuffs and eat in the premisses. These kind of stalls need license.
 - c. Shops, which ~~as~~ only sell the prepared food stuffs. These kind of shops do not need license.

- 3 -

Dr. Jankowski asked about the minimum standard for small food stalls in which ~~some~~ the customers consume the food stuffs.

Dr. Fujita ~~answered~~ and Dr. Maruyama answered:

1. Up to March of this year, the license was given by prefectural government in prefectural level.
2. From 1st April, license business is transferred to city office.
3. The prefectural government has issued a prefectural regulation concerning food stalls.
4. City office has drafted a municipal regulation in municipal level.
5. Because the size of the food stalls differ, the minimum standard for small stalls or street stalls is lower than the minimum standard of "Food Sanitation Law", such as running water ~~supply~~, toilets, kitchen etc. cannot meet the minimum standard of ~~Food Sanitation Law~~.
6. At present, in his district there are about 130 small food stalls, including street stalls.

Dr. Jankowski pointed out:

1. The food stalls problem is a troublesome problem.
2. If the prefectural or municipal office revise the minimum standard in their own level, that means weakening of "Food Sanitation Law" in national level.
3. Unsanitary food stalls, or fail to the minimum standard, cause danger giving chance for spreading of CD such as dysentery or Typhoid.
4. Please send a copy of the draft of revised regulation in municipal level.

Dr. Jankowski inspected the Health Center, and asked what this Health Center is needed at present.

Dr. Fujita answered

1. More PH Nurses, at least 15 ~~more~~ nurses.
2. More clerks
3. More laboratory equipments and utensils.

Remarks:

This Health Center has the darkfield equipment for microscope and using for diagnosis of early stage of syphilis.
In last month the laboratory has diagnosed 2 cases by darkfield.

The health center directors seem to have completely lost sight of their responsibilities and outline of duties. The programs have been neglected, all attention seems to be centered on obtaining funds for newly constructed buildings. Without exception, the plans for new health centers are three times the size of presently occupied buildings.

The new buildings, that are completed, are void of equipment, but that fact does not seem important. The new, large building seems to be all they are striving for. Isawa Health Center, Yamanashi, does not even have an X-ray machine.

The utilization of space, in H.C.s with plans laid for new buildings, is distressing. In Minobu Health Center, Yamanashi, plans for new building have been approved, yet, the entire second floor (4 rooms) of the presently occupied building is unused.

All health centers are in need of transportation. At time of an epidemic (and other times as well) commercial busses are used. It is my opinion that money would be far better spent if used for motot cars, laboratory equipment and additional personnel.

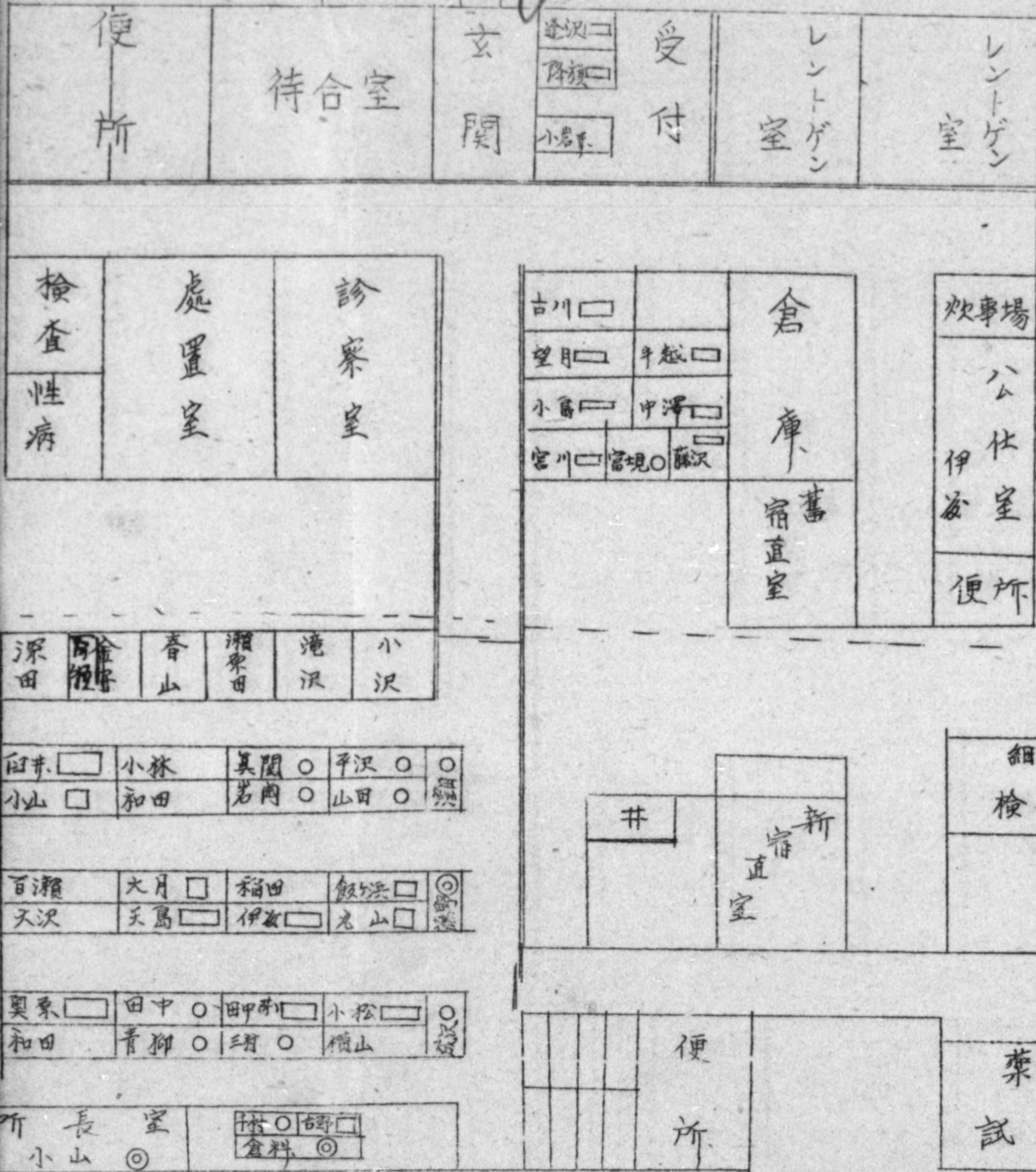
For the most, the presently occupied buildings are not too inadequate, providing they were properly organized and maintained.
