

It is the Board's view that implementation and enforcement procedures supplementing these minimum standards should be developed by each agency to fit its particular requirements.

To permit full consideration of each agency's problems in safeguarding classified information and to preclude the possibility of issuing minimum standards which might adversely affect operations in any agency, the Board would appreciate a careful study of the attached draft within your agency and the submission of any comments or suggestions you care to make. The Board is particularly anxious to be apprised of any problems likely to arise in your agency, which are not covered by the present draft, but which could appropriately be treated under such minimum standards. It is also anxious to have your
